

The Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened its two hundred fifth annual session with the Hugo Church, Lenoir County, November 4 and 5, 1953. The Moderator, Rev. C. L. Patrick, presided over the meeting.

The song leader, Rev. R. P. Harris, opened the Conference by leading the congregation in singing a number of hymns.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. R. B. Crawford. Prayer by Rev. Henry Melvin.

Rev. Clifton Rice, the pastor of the host church, gave the Conference a very hearty welcome and Mrs. Frank L. Walston gave the response.

The Moderator, in his message, urged that full cooperation be practiced in carrying on the activities of the Conference.

All visiting ministers and brethren were asked to sit with us in this Conference and they were given all the rights and privileges of the Conference save that of voting.

The minutes of the Executive Committee were read and adopted.

Rev. S. A. Smith spoke concerning the activities at the Orphanage. An offering was taken for the Orphanage amounting to \$206.88.

Rev. Herman Hersey brought greetings from the State Sunday School Convention.

Rev. Burkette Raper gave a report of the state promotional Secretary (See Report).

Rev. R. P. Harris brought a special message in song.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. D. W. Alexander.

On motion we appointed a committee to study and recommend the course of action in determining when the church year should begin and end.

The report of the State Promotional Secretary as given in the morning session was received as information. On motion the recommendation in the report be adopted (See Report).

On motion that the chairman of the Ordaining Council assist the State Committee to set up a uniform examination for ministers.

On motion we elected a Conference Historian. Rev. Hubert Burress was elected Historian.

THURSDAY MORNING

Reassembled at nine-thirty with congregational singing, conducted by the song leader, Rev. Henry Melvin.

Rev. Charles Craddock conducted the devotions. Prayer by Rev. Frank Davenport.

The minutes of yesterday's activities were read and approved.

By motion Rev. Henry Melvin was enrolled as an ordained minister.

Rev. N. Bruce Barrow gave a report of the Ordaining Council and by motion the report was adopted (See Report).

Rev. W. B. Raper gave a report of the Orphanage Committee and by motion the report was adopted (See Report).

The Resolution Committee presented a resolution pertaining to the revision of our church report blanks and by a motion the resolution was adopted (See Resolution).

Rev. D. A. Windham gave a report of the Board of Education and after some revision the report was adopted (See Report).

Rev. Charles Craddock gave a report of the Mission Board and by a motion the report was adopted (See Report).

Rev. R. B. Crawford gave a report of the Temperance Committee and by a motion the report was adopted (See Report).

Special music was rendered by Mrs. J. C. Moye and Rev. Henry Melvin.

. The Conference sermon was preached by Rev. N. Bruce Barrow.

Dismissed for lunch by Rev. Charles Edward Keith.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

Reassembled at one o'clock with song service conducted by Rev. Henry Melvin.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. Ralph Osborne. Prayer by Rev. J. C. Griffin.

On motion we stood with bowed heads of silent recognition to the memory of our deceased brother, Rev. J. W. Wooten, and asked the Obituary Committee to prepare suitable resolutions for the minutes and for the Free Will Baptist Paper.

On motion we extended to this church and community a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality in entertaining the Conference.

Hull Road asked for the next Conference and by a motion we accepted the invitation.

Rev. Frank Davenport offered his resignation as a member of the Mission Board, and by motion his request was granted.

On motion we give Rev. Frank Davenport a rising vote of thanks for his service as a member of the Mission Board. Rev. Hubert Burress was elected to fill the vacancy created by Rev. Frank Davenport.

Rev. N. D. Beamon offered his resignation as a member of the Mission Board, and by a motion his request was granted. Rev. D. W. Alexander was elected to fill this vacancy on the Mission Board.

Rev. Charles Craddock also offered his resignation as a member of the Mission Board, and his request was also granted. Rev. Charles Edward Keith was elected to fill the vacancy created by his resignation.

The Moderator appointed Revs. N. Bruce Barrow, Charles Craddock, and Henry Melvin as a committee to make recommendations concerning a uniform time to begin the church year.

Rev. J. D. Vernelson gave a report of the Finance Committee, and by a motion the report was adopted (See Report).

An offering was taken for the Building Funds of the Grifton, Williamston, and

Tarboro Churches. The offering to be divided equally. The offering amounted to \$70.52.

Rev. D. W. Alexander gave a verbal report of the Board of Trustees concerning the Arthur Church property.

The two hundred fifth session of the Central Conference was dismissed by Rev. Graham Baker.

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met at the Free Will Baptist Church, Ayden, Pitt County, on Tuesday, August 20, 1953, with all members present. The Moderator, Rev. C. L. Patrick, presided over the meeting. Prayer by Rev. Burkette Raper.

The Conference Mission Board was present and presented a request that a Free Will Baptist church be organized in the town of Tarboro, on Sunday, September 6, at 3:30 o'clock.

By a motion the request of the Mission Board was granted.

The Executive Committee was given the privilege to make any investigation as they see fit.

The Mission Board was asked to arrange the program for organization.

The Mission Board also presented a similar request asking that a Free Will Baptist church be organized in the town of Greenville.

After some three hour discussion the following motion was passed: On motion the Executive Committee of the Central Conference delayed the request of the Greenville Free Will Baptist Mission for organization until ninety (90) days from now, at which time the Executive Committee will investigate this Mission with the idea of organizing it into a Free Will Baptist church provided it qualifies for such organization as stipulated by the North Carolina Treatise.

As there was no other business the meeting was adjourned.

RESOLUTION No. 1

The following is a copy of Resolutions passed by the Ministers' Fellowship, and ratified by the Executive Committee of the Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina:

Whereas, in the past we have suffered as a result of infiltering of different winds of doctrine; whereas the Cape Fear Conference was hopelessly divided due to religious cults using our churches and pulpits; and whereas even at this time we are having to fight to save church property; and whereas at the present time we have men about which little is known in our bounds holding meetings and getting material support from our people which is badly needed for the support of our

own cause, and whereas some of these men do not have the endorsement and cooperation of their own denomination, be it resolved:

- 1—That, we, the ministers of the North Carolina Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists, go on record as being definitely opposed to our church endorsing, cooperating with, or supporting any person or group of persons by tendering them use of our churches or pulpits unless it is a person or group of persons of sound doctrine and a good Christian reputation.
- 2—That no pastor or church in the Conference accept any man or group into the service of the church unless they are acquainted with the individual or individuals and are satisfied concerning his or their character and doctrine to the extent that they are willing to answer to the Conference for the result of any service rendered.
- 3-Any pastor or church violating these resolutions shall be reported to the Conference for disciplining.
- $4\mathrm{--}$ These resolutions shall be in effect when ratified by the Executive Committee of the Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

Many items of un-ethical practices have been brought to us only in forms of rumors. We have advised and counciled in these cases if we deemed it wise. However, we can not deal with rumors except in advisory capacity.

We have met three times due to call of either church or individual with charge, but these have been found to be without basic facts or proof, thus no official indictment on any minister.

During the year we have examined the following for license and recommended to their churches that they be issued licenses: J. C. Smith, Joseph Leahman, G. W. Hart, J. P. Ballard, J. R. Tripp, W. F. Davidson, W. W. Wilson, and Carroll Alexander.

We recommend these be enrolled.

We recommend the names of Luther and Carson Tyson be dropped because of inactivity and licenses have expired.

We are asking the conference to purchase a steel cabinet to preserve all records of the board; the same to be kept by the secretary of the board.

We are requesting all licenses be dated as of date of examination.

We want the conference to give us the authority to require all candidates for ordination to take a course of study if they have less than two years of formal Bible or seminary training.

We have met and examined for ordination the following and recommend they be placed on our list: Charles Keith and R. L. Norville.

We are asking the chairman to correct in the minutes our list of ministers.

We have received letters of recommendation from conferences or associations for the following ordained ministers and recommend they be seated with us: R. B. Crawford, J. B. Narron, S. R. Kennedy, and Henry Melvin.

The following ordained ministers are recommended to a seat in our conference

subject to the reception of a letter from them from their respective body: R. P. Harris and Michael Pelt.

- 6. In order that the needs of the Home may be taken care of the year around, we recommend that our churches seek to make a monthly contribution to the Orphanage.
- 7. Finally, we recommend that our people pledge their prayers and moral support to the Home.
