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PROCEEDINGS

The Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina convened its two hundred sixth session with the Hull Road Church, Greene County, November 10 and 11, 1954. The Moderator, Rev. C. L. Patrick, presided over the meeting. In the absence of the musical director, Mrs. J. C. Moye was asked to take his place.

Devotions and prayer were led by Rev. Graham Baker. Rev. W. B. Raper gave the conference a hearty welcome, and Rev. Hubert Burress gave the response. The Moderator, in his message, urged that the activities of the conference be carried out in an orderly and Christlike manner.

The minutes of the Executive Committee were read and adopted. (See meetings)

Rev. S. A. Smith, superintendent of the orphanage, brought greetings and a verbal report of the activities at the orphanage. An offering was taken for the orphanage amounting to \$134.86.

The Ordaining Council reported that Rev. I. J. Blackwelder, Rev. J. C. Lynn, and Rev. F. B. Cherry had met the necessary requirements to become members of this conference and recommended that their names be added to the list of ministers. The Moderator gave them the right hand of welcome.

The Grace Church at Greenville asked to become a member of this conference, and by a motion it was accepted. The Moderator gave the right hand of welcome to the church.

Rev. Burkette Raper told us of the activities at the Mount Allen Junior College, after which Mrs. Frank Hawkins directed the College Chorus in singing two beautiful selections entitled, "Help from the Mountain Top," and "Wonderful Grace of Jesus."

Rev. J. R. Davidson made a few remarks regarding the Goldsboro Church which was destroyed by fire.

Mrs. J. C. Moye introduced Mrs. Gilbert Jones and Mrs. Lucy Jenkins who brought us a special message in song.

The introductory sermon was preached by Rev. J. C. Lynn, pastor of Elm Grove Church. His subject was "Evangelism," based on Genesis 4:7.

Wednesday Afternoon

The afternoon devotions were conducted by Rev. Rashie Kennedy, prayer by Rev. Willis Wilson.

Memorial tributes were conducted by Rev. D. A. Windham, assisted by Mrs. N. A. Clark and others. Rev. D. A. Windham asked that the message given by Mrs. N. A. Clark be recorded as an obituary report, which was accepted. (See report)

Rev. J. E. Wooten was asked to install the new officers tomorrow in the absence of W. L. Hart. Rev. L. B. Manning was asked to conduct the devotions in the absence of Rev. I. J. Blackwelder.

The report of the meeting of the Board of Trustees was read and adopted. (See meetings)

Rev. N. Bruce Barrow gave a report of the State Mission Board. He reported that during the year \$2,398.78 has been sent in by the Central Conference for mission work.

Rev. Hubert Burress brought greetings from the State Sunday School Convention.

Rev. D. W. Alexander made a few remarks concerning the Free Will Baptist Press, and also told how happy he was to be the president of the State Convention.

Rev. F. B. Cherry made a few remarks about the Bible College at Nashville. Rev. James A. Evans brought greetings from Mount Allen Junior College.

Mrs. Loy E. Ballard brought greetings from Cragmont.

Motion that we elect a delegate from this conference to sit with the Executive Committee of the State Convention to establish boundaries of the various conferences.

Motion that we accept the recommendation of the State Convention in regard to a uniform report blank. An amendment motion was carried that we elect a committee of three with our present secretary as chairman to make the necessary additions to this report blank to fit the needs of this conference. The other committee members appointed were: Revs. W. B. Raper and R. P. Harris.

Dismissed by Rev. M. A. Woodard.

Thursday Morning

Reassembled at nine-thirty p. m. with devotions and prayer by Rev. R. B. Crawford.

The ministers who were not present yesterday were enrolled as follows: Rev. J. O. Fort of the South Georgia Association, Rev. Wilbur Everton of the Eastern Conference, Rev. C. F. Bowen of the Tennessee Cumberland Association, and Rev. R. N. Hinnant of the Western Conference. Each of these brought a few words of greetings.

The minutes of yesterday's activities were read and approved.

- Rev. R. N. Hinnant, secretary of the State Convention, spoke briefly giving some figures showing that a number of churches in this conference were not represented or sent in reports to the State Convention. Brother Hinnant urged all the churches to send in a report of their church work to the State Convention so that it would be easier to fill out reports for the state and national work.

Rev. Rashie Kennedy gave a report of the Resolution Committee and by a motion resolutions one and three were accepted. (See report)

A motion was made and carried that we take an offering for Christian Education to be divided between the Bible College at Nashville and Mount Allen College. The offering amounted to \$136.40.

Mrs. J. C. Moye sang a beautiful solo, "The Holy City."

Rev. N. Bruce Barrow introduced Rev. J. O. Fort who preached the conference sermon, using as his text Acts 26:28.

Dismissed for lunch by Rev. J. R. Davidson.

Thursday Afternoon

Reassembled at one o'clock with devotions conducted by Rev. L. B. Manning, prayer by Rev. Clarence Little.

Rev. Hubert Burress, the conference historian, presented some interesting historical data and recommended that the old records be permanently bound without any expense to the conference. By a motion the recommendation was accepted.

Two petitions were presented for the 1955 session of the confernce, and by a motion the invitation of Aspin Grove was accepted.
