

Rev. S. R. Kennedy asked for a letter of recommendation to the Eastern Conference and by motion it was granted.

The report of the digest committee was given by the clerk and by motion it was adopted.

Mrs. J. C. Moye named Revs. C. H. Overman and C. L. Patrick to work with her on the special Children's Home committee, and by motion they were elected.

A motion was made to print the conference minutes with those of the State Convention.

A substitute motion was made and passed to proceed as before with the printing of the minutes.

A motion was made and passed that the conference recommend to the secretary of the State Convention the preparing of a list of North Carolina Free Will Baptist ministers.

Mrs. J. C. Moye was recognized as chairman of special Children's Home committee who discussed the raising of the \$25,000.

Whereas the various media of communication such as radio, television, bill boards, daily and weekly papers and magazines have been used as a means of advertising the sale of alcoholic beverages, and whereas grocery stores and super markets display beer and wine among their other products for sale; be it resolved that we go on record in this 1958 session of the Central Conference as opposing and detesting such advertising.

Be it further resolved that copies of this resolution be sent to our church papers, and to representatives of the various newspapers which serve the area of the Central Conference.


