## This Minute Dedicated to Mrs. Daisy Harris Moore

The Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists, in its two-hundred-twenty-second annual session, voted to dedicate this 1970 minute to the loving memory of Mrs. Daisy Harris Moore of Greenville, North Carolina, who passed away on January 12, 1970.

It was early in life that Mrs. Moore pledged her love, faith, and loyalty to God and united with the Gum Swamp Free Will Baptist Church, Route 6, Greenville. She was a devoted and faithful member at Gum Swamp for many years, having been a charter member of the auxiliary of the church. In later years, when her family moved to Greenville, she moved her membership to the First Free Will Baptist Church of Greenville. Here she continued to be very active and influential in all phases of the church's activities. Her greatest ambition was to learn the gospel thoroughly, live it daily, and serve her Lord.

In her early Christian life, Mrs. Moore was a youth leader in the Greenville church and performed good teaching, training, and different Christian activities for the young people. She was the teacher of the adult ladies Sunday school class at the time of her death. She had been the teacher of this class for many years. For several years she prepared the communion services for her church. She was very attentive and interested in seeing that Christian pamphlets, which could be given away, were kept in the vestibule of her church.

A few years ago Mrs. Moore donated a lighted cross which was placed on top of the Greenville church. In her last will and testament she remembered the Gum Swamp church and the Greenville church, along with five enterprises of the denomination. Her greatest ambition and happiness were in serving her Lord and doing for others. From the life she lived and the way she served her church and denomination, we can say, "She was a faithful laborer in the vineyard of her Lord." She was a very mission-minded person with constant prayers and donations to missionaries here and abroad.

Mrs. Moore was the daughter of the late Rev. C. J. Harris Sr., who preceded her to the glory world twenty-seven years ago.

Funeral services were conducted at the Wilkerson Funeral Chapel in Greenville, January 14, by her pastor, the Rev. Floyd B. Cherry; assisted by the Rev. Harry Jones, pastor of Gum Swamp church. Burial was in the Pinewood Cemetery in Greenville.

# PROCEEDINGS

## WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION

The Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 222nd session with the Daniel's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Route 3, Wilson, North Carolina, on Wednesday and Thursday, November 4, 5, 1970, at 10 a.m.

The clerk officially opened the conference and presented the moderator, the Rev. N. D. Beaman.

The devotional was conducted by the Rev. Kemery Ard, with the Rev. R. P. Harris as song leader and Ralph A. Bowen as organist.

The welcome address was given by the host pastor, the Rev. J. W. Everton. The response was by Lt. Col. J. B. Narron, chaplain in the U. S. Air Force.

The conference, by motion, voted to accept the printed program with the moderator having the privilege of making any change he deems necessary.

The moderator's address was given by the Rev. N. D. Beaman.

The following committees were appointed by the moderator:

*Resolutions:* F. B. Cherry, Harry Jones, and N. D. Wiggs.

*Temperance:* C. L. Patrick, Charles Crisp, and Willis Wilson.

*Nominating:* L. E. Ballard, R. P. Harris, and Jack Mayo.

*Western Conference:* W. L. Poythress, J. B. Starnes, Joseph Ingram, R. H. Jackson, Clarence Bowen, and Floyd Futrell.

The report of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation, Inc. was given by the manager, the Rev. Walter Reynolds. (See report No. 1.)

The report of the Superannuation Board was given by the Rev. Walter Reynolds. (See report No. 2.)

The report of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home at Middlesex, North Carolina, was given by the superintendent, the Rev. Edward Miles. He stated that the Central Conference had given a total of \$31,051.60 to the Home during the church year, 1969-1970.

An offering was received for the Children's Home in the amount of \$76.48.

The Rev. L. B. Manning brought the morning message on the subject, "The Christian's Journey," using Scripture from Numbers 10:29.

## AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon devotional was conducted by Lt. Col. John B. Narron.

A partial report of the Credentials Committee was given by Leo Tripp. (See report No. 3.)

The report of the Executive Committee was given by the Rev. Hubert Burress. This report was approved by motion and vote of the conference. (See report No. 4.)

The report of Mount Olive College was given by Dr. W. B. Raper. (See report No. 5.)

The report of the Central Conference Mission Board was given by the Rev. R. T. Sasser. (See report No. 6.)

The Board of Trustees stated that it had no report to be given.

A motion was made and carried that one page of the 1970 minutes be used to give special recognition to the memory of Mrs. Daisy Harris Moore, along with her picture and any other information relevant to her contribution to the Central Conference, Missions Board, and other enterprises of the denomination.

The report of Cragmont Assembly, Inc. was given by the Rev. Cedric D. Pierce Jr.

The report of the Central Conference Historian was given by Mrs. H. L. Spivey. (See report No. 7.)

Ralph A. Bowen gave a report of the Publicity Chairman.

The report of the Church Finance Association was given by the Rev. Hubert Burress. (See report No. 8.)

A motion was made and passed to call off business until 9:30 a.m., Thursday, November 5, 1970.

## THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

The Thursday morning devotional was conducted by the Rev. H. Adrian Grubbs.

The minutes of the previous day's session were read by the clerk and adopted by motion and vote of the conference.

Clyde Hines and Randolph Harris were appointed to serve today on the Board of Finance.

A motion was made and carried that our retired and disabled ministers not be required to write a letter or be present to maintain their membership in the conference.

A motion was made and carried to have special prayer for our sick ministers, and to have the clerk write them a letter.

The Obituary Committee had no report to be given.

The Rev. C. F. Bowen gave a report of the State Convention.

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by the Rev. C. L. Patrick. (See report No. 9).

The report of the State Mission Board was given by the Rev. Joe Ingram. He reported that the churches of the Central Conference had given a total of \$23,215.48 to state missions during the church year of 1969-1970.

The report of the Ordination Board was given by the Rev. Willis Wilson. (See report No. 10.)

The report of the treasurer was given by the treasurer, the Rev. L. B. Woodall Jr., and adopted by the conference. (See report No. 11.)

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. L. E. Ballard. (See report No. 12.)

A motion was made to expunge all motions in regards to nomination, and to receive the Nominating Committee's report with a provision for the Executive Committee to correct any discrepancy.

A motion was made and passed to elect by acclamation the nominees.

A motion was made and carried to accept the resignation of the Rev. Harry Jones as the representative of stock in the Church Finance Association; also the resignation of Mrs. J. T. Beddard on the Board of Finance. The Rev. H. Adrian Grubbs was elected to represent membership in the Church Finance Association and the Rev. R. C. Proctor elected to the Board of Finance.

A motion was made and carried for the clerk to write a letter of appreciation to Daniel's Chapel Church for their hospitality in entertaining this session of the Central Conference.

A motion was made and carried to accept the invitation to meet with Hull Road Church near Snow Hill, North Carolina, for the next annual session.

The final report of the Credentials Committee was given by Leo Tripp. (See report No. 13.)

The report of the Finance Committee was given and received by vote of the conference. (See report No. 14.)

A motion was made to dispense with the afternoon devotional and to leave all unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Committee. This motion was passed.

A rising vote of thanks was extended to the retiring officers.

The minutes of this session of the conference were read by the clerk and approved by the conference.

The Board of Ordination was in charge of the morning worship service. A forum was held on the subject, "How to Solve the Problem of Full-Time Christian Workers." Members of the panel were: the Revs. N. B. Barrow, C. L. Patrick, Clarence Bowen, and J. W. Everton.

The conference adjourned with prayer by the Rev. Clarence Bowen.

# CONSTITUTION

## PREAMBLE

We, the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination of North Carolina, desiring to be in fellowship in a bond of union, do ordain this constitution.

## NAME

This shall be the constitution of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Church of North Carolina.

## PURPOSE

The object of the Central Conference shall be to promote Christ's Kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

## ARTICLE I. COMPOSITION

This Conference shall be composed of affiliated ordained ministers and churches within its bounds, who are in good standing, and of all general officers, and members of standing boards or committees of the Conference. It shall operate under the *Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina*. No church corporation whose articles of incorporation or constitution and bylaws conflict with the *Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina* shall be permitted membership in the Central Conference.

## ARTICLE II. REPRESENTATION

Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church, together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denominational and benevolent purposes during the year.

## ARTICLE III. OFFICERS

The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years, entering upon the duties of said office at the close of the session in which they are elected.

## ARTICLE IV. STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the policy of this Conference to elect as many boards and committees as may be necessary in carrying out its program. These shall keep records of their proceedings and make a report at each annual session of the Conference.

A board of trustees, a board of ordination, a board of finance, and a board of missions, consisting of five members each shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years but shall be adjusted to terminate the office of one member annually.

A committee to represent the Conference's stock in the Free Will Baptist Press, a credentials committee, and an obituary committee, consisting of three members each, shall be elected. The term of office for members shall be three years but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually.

A committee of one shall be elected to serve as Conference historian; the term of office shall be two years.

A committee of one shall be elected to serve as publicity committee; the term of office shall be two years.

The executive committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, treasurer, and one member elected by the Conference at the time of the official election of officers.

Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the Conference for whatever purposes may be needed necessary.

#### ARTICLE V. FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the Conference according to its membership.

#### ARTICLE VI. ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and desires to help promote the program and work of the Central Conference and the North Carolina State Convention, may present its petition to the regular session of the Conference. If the petition for membership is approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates.

#### ARTICLE VII. DISMISSION OF CHURCHES

A church may be dismissed from membership in the Conference by vote of the Conference.

#### ARTICLE VIII. VISITORS

The Central Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting.

#### ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

The Central Conference shall meet in annual session on Wednesday and Thursday before the second Sunday in November of each year. The host church shall be selected by vote of the Conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

#### ARTICLE X. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 1. The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Central Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates, and representatives;

to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and committees; and in general to perform the duties of the office of moderator.

Section 2. The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and he shall assist the moderator when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the moderator, the assistant moderator shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the Conference.

Section 3. The clerk shall record and preserve a permanent record of the proceedings of all sessions of the Central Conference. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the Conference, hold in trust all documents not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the Conference. He shall conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature.

Section 4. The duties of the assistant clerk shall be the duties of the clerk when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the clerk when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the clerk the assistant clerk shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the Conference.

Section 5. The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the Conference, except that held by other boards and committees of the Conference. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the Conference.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to transact the business of the Conference when the Conference is not in session. The executive committee shall plan the program for the annual session of the Conference.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of the board of trustees to hold in trust title to all tangible property belonging to the Conference. It shall have power to convey such property when authorized by the Conference.

Section 8. It shall be the duty of the board of ordination (1) to examine and recommend the license of ministers; (2) to examine, ordain, and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of the *Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina*, and (3) examine ordained ministers seeking membership in this Conference and make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the board of finance to check and verify all money to be received by the treasurer; they shall make recommended allocations and report same to the Conference.

Section 10. It shall be the duty of the board of missions to cooperate with the churches and the Conference in furthering the establishment of churches within the bounds of the Conference. The mission board shall endeavor through cooperating with the State Board of Missions to raise money, arrange itineraries, and keep the work of missions before our churches.

Section 11. It shall be the duty of the Free Will Baptist Press Founda-

tion committee to represent the Conference's stock in the Free Will Baptist Press and to do so at any stockholders' meeting.

Section 12. It shall be the duty of the credentials committee to check each church report for verification as to their delegates and make recommendations to the Conference as regarding their seat during the annual session. The credentials committee shall check registration cards of the enrolling minister and make recommendations of same to the Conference.

Section 13. It shall be the duty of the obituary committee to prepare suitable memorial services for all ministers who die during the year preceding the Conference and to present to the Conference a suitable obituary for publication in the Conference minutes and in *The Free Will Baptist*. Copies of the obituary are to be presented to the family of the deceased and to his local church.

Section 14. It shall be the duty of the Conference historian to collect and preserve any historical data concerning the Conference.

Section 15. It shall be the duty of the publicity committee to see that proper publicity is given to the activities and work of the Conference.

# BYLAWS

Section 1. A board or committee will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting, providing all the members of said board or committee have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

Section 2. All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the Conference in written form only.

Section 3. Each minister and delegate in good standing shall duly attend each day while the Conference is in session or be subject to censure by the Conference and reported to his local church.

Section 4. If any member, in the judgment of the Conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that session.

Section 5. No member shall be excused from any session of the Conference without leave of the moderator.

Section 6. The Conference shall adjourn by a majority vote.

Section 7. Each officer and member of standing committees and boards in good standing shall be entitled to a seat and vote in the Conference.

Section 8. The Conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services.

Section 9. The minutes of the Conference shall be signed by the moderator and clerk.

Section 10. This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendment shall be presented on the first day of the annual session for action on the following day.
