PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION

The Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 227th annual session with the Free Union Church in Greene County, on Wednesday and Thursday, November 5, 6, 1975. The Rev. Harry A. Jones served as song leader with the Rev. R. P. Harris as pianist.

The clerk, the Rev. Hubert Burress, officially opened the conference and presented the moderator, the Rev. James Lupton, who presided over this session of the conference.

The devotional was conducted by Mr. Rex Edwards.

The conference, by motion, voted to accept the printed program with the moderator having the privilege of making any change he deems necessary.

The welcome address was given by the Rev. C. L. Patrick, host pastor. The response was given by the Rev. N. B. Barrow.

At this time the moderator addressed the conference.

The following committees were appointed by the moderator:

Resolutions: The Revs. Harry A. Jones, L. E. Ballard, and Mrs. Rosa Proctor.

Nominating: The Revs. Jack Mayo, Gary Bailey, and Miss Ina Ruth Langston.

Temperance: The Rev. Bobby Bazen, Mr. D. W. Barrow, and Mrs. Alice Barrow.

The following visiting ministers were recognized: Albemarle Conference—The Rev. Royce Reynolds; Western Conference—The Rev. Billy Jordan; Eastern Conference—The Revs. Rudy Shepard and Noah Brown; Cape Fear Conference—The Rev. R. W. Allman.

The Revs. F. B. Cherry and James Lupton resigned from the Ordaining Board. By motion and vote their resignations were accepted becoming effective at the end of this conference.

The report of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation was given by the Rev. Walter Reynolds, manager.

The report of the Superannuation Board was given by the Rev. Walter Reynolds.

The report of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home was given by the superintendent, Mr. Sam Weeks.

The report of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Homes was given by Mr. Sam Weeks.

The report of the Church Finance Association was given by the Rev. Hubert Burress.

The report of the North Carolina State Convention was given by the president, the Rev. Robert May.

The Rev. Stewart Humphrey gave the report of the Foreign Missions Board.

The Rev. Noah Brown gave a report on the work at the Roanoke Rapids Church.

The report of the Board of Home Missions and Church Extension was given by the Rev. Taylor Hill and received by motion and vote of the conference.

The report of the North Carolina Historical work was given by Dr. Michael Pelt.

A partial report of the Credentials Committee was given by Mr. Leo Tripp. The report was received by motion and vote of the conference.

An offering for the Children's Home was received in the amount of \$110.66.

The conference sermon was delivered by the Rev. N. D. Beaman, reading - Scripture from 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and 2 Timothy 4:2.

The clerk gave the Executive Committee report which was received by motion and vote of the conference.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon devotional was conducted by the Rev. Clinton Davis.

The Board of Trustees had no report to be given.

The historian had no report to be given.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the ordination procedures and requirements recommended by the State Convention.

A report of Cragmont Assembly was given by the Rev. L. E. Ballard.

The Central Conference Missions report was given by the Rev. R. T. Sasser.

The Nominating Committee's report was given by the Rev. Jack Mayo. All were elected as nominated.

The day's session adjourned with prayer by the Rev. C. L. Patrick.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

The Thursday morning session opened with a devotional by the Rev. Dale Albertson.

The Obituary Committee had no report to be given.

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by the Rev. Stewart Humphrey.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given by the Rev. Harry A. Jones.

The Rev. Willis Wilson gave the report of the Ordaining Council.

A report of Mount Olive College was given by the president, Dr. W. Burkette Raper.

A final report of the Credentials Committee was given by Mr. Leo Tripp.

The report of the Finance Committee was given by Mr. S. N. Highsmith. The report was received by motion and vote of the conference.

The treasurer's report was given by Mr. S. N. Highsmith and received by motion and vote of the conference.

The conference voted to meet with the Elm Grove Free Will Baptist Church near Ayden for its 1976 session.

A motion was made and passed by the conference giving the Executive Board the privilege to take care of any unfinished business of the conference.

An offering for Mount Olive College was received in the amount of \$48.12.

The Rev. Gary Bailey delivered the morning message, taking his Scripture from Luke 24:13-15, 30-32.

The conference adjourned with prayer by the Rev. Harry A. Jones.

EXECUTIVE BOARD (July 10, 1975)

Present for the meeting were the Revs. Gary Bailey, Hubert Burress, Jack Mayo, proxy for the Rev. N. B. Barrow; and the Rev. Buddy Sasser, proxy for Mr. S. N. Highsmith.

The Rev. Gary Bailey, assistant moderator, presided. (The Rev. James Lupton, moderator, was a patient in Wayne Memorial Hospital due to a heart attack.)

The board discussed a letter received from some of the members of Saints Delight Church in Greene County. The secretary called the Rev. Walter Pollard, pastor of the church, who stated he would like for the Executive Board to meet with the church. Mr. Pollard was advised to have the church set a date for the board to meet with them and notify the board by letter.

The program for the 1975 session of the conference was arranged.

A motion was made and passed to place the \$38 in the Five Dollar Builder's Club (no longer active) in the Central Conference treasury.

Charges by some of the members of Saints Delight Church against the pastor, the Rev. Walter Pollard, were turned over to the Rev. C. L. Patrick of the Board of Ordination.

The board adjourned with prayer by the Rev. Gary Bailey.

EXECUTIVE BOARD (August 14, 1975)

The Executive Board met at Saints Delight Church, Greene County, August 14, 1975, at 6:45 p.m. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Hubert Burress.

The purpose of the meeting was for the board to sit in conference with the church for a retrial of Mr. Glenn Bowen who had been tried by the church on May 7, 1975. A retrial was requested by the Executive Board due to some people voting at the previous trial who were not members, not having been properly received into the church.

Board members present for the meeting were the Rev. Jack Mayo, proxy for the Rev. James Lupton; Mr. S. N. Highsmith; the Rev. Gary Bailey; the Rev. Buddy Sasser, proxy for the Rev. N. B. Barrow; and the Rev. Hubert Burress. Mr. Burress, secretary, was elected spokesman for the board. Mr. Burress was also requested by the church to act as moderator for the conference. The pastor, the Rev. Walter Pollard, called the church conference to order and turned the meeting over to Mr. Burress.

A list of charges were read to Mr. Bowen whose plea was not guilty to charges one through five, but guilty of charge six. The church, after the charges were considered one by one, found Mr. Bowen guilty by a majority of votes, to all six charges.

A motion was made and passed to exclude Mr. Glenn Bowen as a member of Saints Delight Church, and declare any office he held in the church vacant. (Mr. Bowen was a trustee of the church.) The vote was 20 for and 8 against.

The meeting adjourned with prayer by the Rev. Jack Mayo.

REPORT OF THE ORDAINING COUNCIL

Since the last session of the Central Conference, the Ordaining Council has had several meetings for the purpose of meeting with candidates for license and also for ordination.

On January 20, 1975, the council voted to recommend to the Harrell's Chapel Church that Edwin Wayne Griffin be granted license to preach for one year.

On April 14, 1975, the council met with the Rev. W. S. Burns who wanted to come back to the Free Will Baptist Denomination. By motion it was decided not to reinstate him at this time.

On November 5, 1975, at the Free Union Free Will Baptist Church, the council met on the first day of the conference.

The Rev. Wiley Lewis of the National Association was requested to unite with the Roanoke Rapids Church and then appear before the council.

The Rev. Bobby Taylor was received into the Conference pending a letter from the Eastern Conference.

The Rev. Leon Grubbs was recommended to the Central Conference upon the basis that he has already received his letter of transfer from the Eastern Conference to the Central Conference.

Beverly Ballard was asked to give proof of his ordination by getting a letter from the Eastern Conference.

The Rev. F. B. Cherry was granted a letter of transfer from this conference to the Western Conference.

Rev. Royce Reynolds was received into the conference from the Albemarle Conference pending a letter of transfer.
