PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION

The Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 228th annual session with the Elm Grove Free Will Baptist Church in Pitt County on Wednesday and Thursday, November 10, 11, 1976.

The clerk, the Rev. Hubert Burress, officially opened the conference and presented the moderator, the Rev. James Lupton, who presided over this session of the conference.

The devotional was conducted by the Rev. Jack Mayo.

The welcome address was given by the Rev. Gary Bailey. The response was given by the moderator, the Rev. James Lupton.

The conference, by motion, voted to accept the printed program with the moderator having the privilege of making any change he deems necessary.

At this time the moderator addressed the conference.

A motion was made and passed for the conference to send a sympathy card to the Rev. Robert Rollins in the loss of his wife.

The following visiting ministers were recognized: Cape Fear Conference—the Revs. Swade Benson, R. W. Allman, and Kemery Ard; Western Conference—the Revs. Douglas Skinner, Bobby Futrell, Joe Ingram, F. B. Cherry, and Luther Bissette; Eastern Conference—the Rev. David Charles Hansley; Albemarle Conference—the Rev. Robert May and the Rev. Royce Reynolds.

Parliamentarian: The Rev. C. L. Patrick.

The report of the Board of Foreign Missions was given by the Rev. Joe Ingram.

The report of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation was given by the Rev. R. T. Sasser.

The report of the Board of Superannuation was given by the Rev. R. T. Sasser.

The report of Mount Olive College was given by Harold Herring.

The report of the Church Finance Association was given by the Rev. Hubert Burress.

A motion was made and passed to amend the Constitution as follows: Article IX—Meetings: The Central Conference shall meet in annual session on Wednesday before the second Sunday in November of each year. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the Executive Committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the Executive Committee, should such a change become necessary.

Section 10—Bylaws: This Constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendment shall be presented in the morning session for action in the afternoon session. This item was placed on the table for action in the Thursday session.

The changes as recommended were removed from the table and adopted by motion passed in the session on Thursday.

The Central Conference Mission Board's report was given by the Rev. R. T. Sasser. (See report.)

An offering for Mount Olive College was received in the amount of \$47.23. The conference sermon was delivered by the Rev. Wiley Lewis.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon devotional was conducted by the Rev. Bobby Taylor.

A partial report of the Credentials Committee was given by Mr. Leo Tripp. (See report.)

The report of the Executive Committee was given by the clerk, the Rev. Hubert Burress, and was adopted by motion. (See report.)

The report of the Church Extension was given by the Rev. Jack Mayo.

The Board of Trustees had no report.

The report of Cragmont was given by the Rev. Douglas Skinner.

A motion was made and passed to increase mileage allowance to twelve cents per mile.

The minutes of the Wednesday session were read and approved by motion.

The day's session adjourned with prayer.

THURSDAY MORNING SESSION

The Thursday morning session opened with a devotional by the Rev. Bobby Futrell.

The State Convention's report was given by its president, the Rev. Robert May.

The report of the Obituary Committee was given by Mrs. J. T. Beddard Jr. (See report.)

The Resolutions Committee's report was given by the Rev. Leon Grubbs. (See report.)

A motion was passed to keep the roll of ministers as it is, but to include the things mentioned in the resolution.

A motion passed that each minister is to be responsible for sending his name, address, current church, and phone number to the clerk, and any change in the above is to be mailed to clerk.

The report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Rev. C. L. Patrick. (See report.)

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by Mr. M. S. Cowan. (See report.)

The report of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home was given by the Rev. Sam Weeks, superintendent.

The Retirement Homes report was given by the Rev. Sam Weeks.

The Children's Home offering amounted to \$53.50

The conference rendered thanks to Brother Leo Tripp for 51 years of service to the conference. Tribute was made by the Rev. C. L. Patrick.

The final report of the Credentials Committee was given by Mr. Leo Tripp. (See report.)

The report of the treasurer was given by Mr. S. N. Highsmith.

The conference gave a rising vote of thanks to the outgoing officers.

A motion was passed to leave all unfinished business to the Executive Committee.

The Ordination Board had charge of the final service.

Willis Keith Cobb of Dilda's Grove Free Will Baptist Church was ordained. Invocation was pronounced by the Rev. Jack Mayo.

The Rev. C. L. Patrick presented the candidate, and the ordination sermon was delivered by the Rev. F. B. Cherry. The Rev. C. L. Patrick spoke the charge and presented the Bible to the candidate, a gift from his home church, Dilda's Grove.

The prayer of consecration was prayed by the Rev. N. B. Barrow, followed by the laying on of hands by the ministers who were present.

The Central Conference voted to meet with the Hugo Free Will Baptist Church in its next session.

A motion was passed to publish the morning message in THE FREE WILL BAPTIST.

We, your Mission Board, would like to express our sincere appreciation to each church that has supported our conference's mission program this year, and to each church, who in past years has backed up our efforts with your prayers and support. REPORT OF ORDAINING COUNCIL

To the Central Conference, Elm Grove Church, November 11, 1976:

The Ordaining Council has met on numerous occasions since the last session of the Central Conference. This Council has been given the responsibility to examine candidates for license and also candidates for ordination. We have met with a number of men either seeking license or ordination, and it has been quite a rewarding year since November of last year.

The Council met at the Press on June 8, 1976. The purpose of this meeting was to examine Brother Johnny Taylor of the Saratoga Free Will Baptist Church for license. By motion it was decided to ask the church to grant him license to preach for one year.

On August 9, 1976, the Council met the Press in Ayden. The Rev. Robert Rollins came with his letter of transfer from the Eastern Conference. By

motion it was decided to recommend that he be received into full fellowship by the Central Conference.

The Rev. Bobby Futrell of Winterville, pastor of the Winterville Free Will Baptist Church came to the Council for clearance to work with the Winterville church. The Council was most appreciative of his attitude.

On September 13, 1976, the Council met at the Press in Ayden. Brother Clarence Harris and Brother Franklin Robbins, of Tarboro Free Will Baptist Church, appeared before the Council seeking license to preach. By motion it was decided to ask the First Free Will Baptist Church of Tarboro to grant these men a license to preach for one year.

By motion it was decided to receive Beverly Ballard, son the the Rev. and Mrs. L. E. Ballard, into full fellowship as an ordained minister. The Council so recommends this to the Conference.

On October 25, 1976, the Council met again at the Press. Keith Cobb of Dilda's Grove church met with the Council and was given an oral test for ordination. Having done an excellent job on his test, the Council voted to ordain him on the second day of the Conference. Keith requested that the Rev. Floyd Cherry preach the ordination sermon.

By motion a letter of transfer was granted to the Rev. Larry Barbour to the Western Conference.

On Wednesday, November 10, 1976, the Council met at the Elm Grove church on the first day of the Central Conference.

By motion it was decided to recommend that the Rev. Wiley Lewis, pastor of the Roanoke Rapids church, be received into full fellowship by the Central Conference and that his credenitals of ordination from the National Association be recognized by our Conference.

By mistake on the part of the secretary, the name of Ray Shepherd was left off of the list of licensed ministers last year. We regret this mistake and gladly add it this year.
