PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY MORNING

The Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 230th annual session with the Hull Road Free Will Baptist Church, Route 2, Snow Hill, North Carolina, Greene County, on November 8, 1978.

The Conference clerk, the Rev. Hubert Burress, officially opened the Conference and presented the moderator, the Rev. Gary Bailey, who presided over this session of the Conference.

A devotional was conducted by the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood.

The welcome address was given by the Rev. Leon Grubbs, pastor of the host church. The response was given by the Rev. Willis Wilson.

The moderator gave his message to the Conference.

By motion, the Conference voted to accept the printed program with the moderator having the privilege of making any change he deemed necessary.

The following visiting ministers were recognized and welcomed:

Cape Fear Conference: Taylor Hill, Cedric Pierce, and Curtis Jones.

Eastern Conference: Scott Sowers and Frank Brinson.

Western Conference: Joseph Ingram, Larry Barbour, Luther Bissette, Fred Rivenbark, and Ralph Aycock.

The roll call of ministers was made followed by the roll call of churches.

The moderator appointed the temporary committees:

Nominating: The Revs. Leon Grubbs, Bobby Taylor, and O. B. Jones.

Resolutions: The Revs. Willis Wilson, D. C. Hansley, and Bobby Futrell.

Temperance: The Revs. Tom Miller, Stewart Humphrey, and James Lupton.

Parliamentarian: The Rev. Jack Mayo.

The following amendment to Article III of the Constitution entitled, "Officers," was proposed to the Conference: "The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two years. After serving two full terms of two (2) years each, no member shall be eligible for nomination until after an interval of one (1) year. The duties of said office shall be entered into at the close of the session in which they are elected." (The italicized sentence was the proposed change.) On motion, the Conference voted to lay the proposed amendment on the table until the afternoon session.

The report of the State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina was given by the Rev. D. C. Hansley.

The Rev. Walter Reynolds gave the reports of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation and the Board of Superannuation.

The report of Mount Olive College was given by Dr. W. Burkette Raper.

The report of the Central Conference Executive Board was given by the Rev. Hubert Burress. The report was adopted.

The Rev. Stewart Humphrey gave the reports of the Free Will Baptist Retirement Homes and the Children's Home.

The report of Cragmont Assembly was given by the Rev. Willis Wilson.

The report of Foreign Missions was given by the Rev. Joseph Ingram.

The report of the Church Finance Association was given by the Rev. Hubert Burress.

The report of Home Missions and Church Extension was given by the Rev. Taylor $\mbox{\rm Hill}.$

The report of the Board of Ordination was given by the Rev. Jack Mayo. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The Obituary Committee did not give a report.

An offering was received. It was followed by the introductory sermon by the Rev. Leon Grubbs. His sermon was based on Philippians 3:7-14.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Devotions were conducted by the Rev. Royce Reynolds.

The report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Rev. Joseph Lehmann. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The report of Central Conference Missions was given by the Rev. R. T. Sasser. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by the Rev. Tom Miller. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given by the Rev. Bobby Futrell. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The treasurer's report was given by Mr. S. N. Highsmith. The report was adopted. (See report.)

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. Leon Grubbs. The report was adopted by acclamation. (See report.)

The proposed amendment to Article III of the Constitution entitled, "Officers," was taken off the table. After a period of lengthy discussion, the proposal was tabled again. The Executive Board was instructed by the Conference to use the proposal as a guide and to bring back to next year's Annual Conference a more clearly defined instrument by which the Conference could work.

The Conference voted to send \$100 to the Rev. L. E. Ballard.

The Conference adjourned leaving the approval of today's minutes and any unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Board.

REPORTS

REPORT OF THE ORDAING COUNCIL TO THE CENTRAL CONFERENCE (NOVEMBER 8, 1978)

The following action has been taken since the last Conference and awaits the approval of this Conference.

On November 9, 1977, the Ordaining Council met at the Hugo Free Will Baptist Church after the close of the Conference for election of officers. The Rev. N. Bruce Barrow was elected chairman and the Rev. Jack Mayo was elected secretary.

On November 16, 1977, the Ordaining Council met at the Saratoga Free Will Baptist Church and ordained Rex Edwards as a minister of the gospel. Motion passed for the Ordaining Council to meet quarterly during the coming year. The date set was the Tuesday after first Sunday in January, April, July, and October at the Free Will Baptist Press in Ayden, North Carolina.

On January 3, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Free Will Baptist Press, Ayden, North Carolina. Gerald Perry's license had lapsed, so his name was dropped from our list of licensed ministers. Joe Hudson came before us for examination for license. It was passed for the Black Jack Free Will Baptist Church to grant him license for one year. Bryant Hines came before us for examination for license. It was passed for the Greenville Free Will Baptist Church to grant him license for one year. Stanley Sowers came before us for examination for license. It was passed for the Winterville Free Will Baptist Church not to proceed with licensing him at this time due to the conflicts in his interpretation of Scriptures concerning speaking in tongues. David Hines came before us for examination for license. It was passed for the Winterville Free Will Baptist Church to grant him license for one year.

On April 4, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Free Will Baptist Press, Ayden, North Carolina. The Rev. Frank Brinson from the Eastern Conference came before us for clearance to pastor the King Cross Roads Free Will Baptist Church near Falkland; permission was granted. Motion was passed that all licensed ministers must wait a full twelve months of licensing before taking the test for ordination. Ray Williamson came before us for examination for ordination. After careful examination the council voted to ordain him. The date of May 11, 1978 was set for his ordination service. The Rev. T. C. Farmer from the Eastern Conference came before us seeking membership into our Conference, since he was now pastoring the Community Free Will Baptist Church, Weldon, North Carolina. Motion was passed to accept him into our Conference pending a letter from the Eastern Conference. His letter has been received. It was noted that the license of Steve Dickens had lapsed. His name was dropped from our list of licensed ministers.

On May 11, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Rock of Zion Free Will Baptist Church, Grantsboro, North Carolina, and ordained Ray Williamson as a minister of the gospel.

On July 11, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Free Will Baptist Press, Ayden, North Carolina. The Rev. Bob Fader from the Eastern Conference

came before us for clearance to pastor the Grimsley Free Will Baptist Church; permission was granted. The Rev. A. G. Smith from the Eastern Conference came before us for clearance to pastor the Watery Branch Free Will Baptist Church; permission was granted. Ronnie Hobgood came before us for his ordination examination. After careful examination the council voted to ordain him; date was set for August 13, 1978. Motion was passed to publish in The Free Will Baptist an article reminding all ministers that if they desire to serve as a pastor in the Central Conference they must receive clearance from the Ordaining Council before accepting the pastorate. Motion was passed to have candidates for ordination to come in to the Secretary of the Ordaining Council from one to two weeks before the meeting time to take a written test in theology and church ordinances. The candidate must show proof that license has been renewed by a letter from his church clerk so stating. Motion was passed to take William Murphy's name off the list of licensed ministers due to the five-year renewal limit for licensed ministers.

On August 10, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Free Will Baptist Press, Ayden, North Carolina. The Rev. John Melancon from the Western Conference came before us for clearance to work in our Conference. It was decided not to clear him due to his conviction of speaking in tongues in his private prayer life. Motion passed to drop Johnny Taylor's name from our list of licensed ministers due to his moving his church membership from the Saratoga Free Will Baptist Church to a National Association church.

On August 13, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Ayden Free Will Baptist Church, Ayden, North Carolina, and ordained Ronnie Hobgood as a minister of the gospel.

On October 3, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Free Will Baptist Press, Ayden, North Carolina. Motion was passed to reaffirm its stand with the Treatise on page 46 concerning the first paragraph under "Pastor." "The church shall call its own pastor out of the duly ordained ministers." It was brought to our attention that Tom Everton's license had lapsed; therefore, his name was dropped from our list of licensed ministers. Motion was passed to grant a letter of transfer for the Rev. Bobby Bazen to the Western Conference.

On October 23, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Free Will Baptist Press at 1:30 p.m. Frank Robbins and Clarence Harris from the Tarboro Free Will Baptist Church came before us for examination for license. Mr. Robbins and Mr. Harris had allowed the renewal time to expire on their old licenses; they wanted to be licensed ministers again. After examination, motion was passed for the Tarboro Free Will Baptist Church to grant them license to preach for one year.

On November 8, 1978, the Ordaining Council met at the Hull Road Free Will Baptist Church. The Rev. Ralph Aycock from the Western Conference came before us for clearance to pastor in our Conference; permission was granted. The Rev. Cedric D. Pierce Jr. came before us for membership in the Conference, bringing a letter of transfer from the Cape Fear Conference; permission was granted. The Rev. Curtis Jones came before us for membership in our Conference, bringing a letter of transfer from the Cape Fear Conference; permission was granted.

- 1) Lost since last Conference: Gerald Perry, William Murphy, Johnny Taylor, Tom Everton, and Steve Dickens.

We, your Mission Board, would like to express our sincere appreciation to each church that has supported our Conference Mission program this year; and to each church, who in past years, has backed up our efforts with your prayers and support. Our total gifts by churches, Sunday schools, the Woman's Auxiliary, and the Second Union Meeting increased 27 percent over last year.

Once again, in this message of thanks we include a special tribute to the mission zeal of the Central Conference Woman's Auxiliary Convention. This year most of the auxiliaries have sent special contributions to our program. They have a true vision of missions, as they also support our state mission programs, home and foreign.

We should always keep before us the motto adopted by our board a few years ago, and received by our Conference; "AN ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH IN EVERY TOWN." Referring to the above list of our churches, only 11 are in towns. The field is white to harvest, as many of our denomination can attest. They have moved to these and other towns and found no church of their faith. Jesus said "pray ye therefore the Lord of the Harvest, that He will send forth labourers into his harvest." There are two things you can do: (1) pray for your board and for young pastors to get a vision of home missions; (2) support Conference missions in your church, Sunday school, or Woman's Auxiliary budget.

This year our youngest church at Roanoke Rapids has almost been on its own. This has allowed our treasury to begin to build up so when there is a good mission prospect we will be able to back it financially. Our State Home Mission has been advised that we stand ready to help support any mission work that may open up in our Conference.

The Roanoke Rapids mission is adequately described in 1 Corinthians 15:58 "... stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord" We should make them the beneficiary of our daily prayers.
