PROCEEDINGS

MORNING SESSION

The Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 234th annual session with the First Free Will Baptist Church of Greenville, North Carolina, Pitt County, on November 10, 1982.

The moderator called the Conference to order. The Rev. Harry Grubbs, host pastor, led the Conference in the singing of "Onward

Christian Soldiers." The Rev. Ed Thornton conducted the opening devotions.

A welcome was extended by the Rev. Harry Grubbs.

Response was made by Mrs. Lou McLawhorn.

The moderator gave a brief address to the Conference.

The moderator appointed the following temporary committees: Nominating: The Revs. Walter Reynolds, Jack Mayo, Leon Harris. Temperance and Resolutions: The Revs. O. B. Jones, Ed Thornton, Tom Miller, and Ray Williamson.

Parliamentarian: The Rev. C. L. Patrick.

The roll of churches was called.

The roll of ministers was called.

Visiting ministers were recognized. From the Cape Fear Conference: Bryant Hines, Frank Harrison, Dr. Burkette Raper, Ed Taylor, Mark Hobbs, David Hill, and Ed Miles; Eastern: Walter Sutton, Scott Sowers, and James Sowers; Albemarle: Ronnie Mohn and Steve Hargrove; Western: John Williams and Harold Jones.

Mr. Charles Watt was recognized as a visitor representing the Children's Home.

Three changes to the Constitution were proposed:

- 1. All places in the Constitution that have the name of the 1955 revision of our treatise, Statement of Faith and Discipline for Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, be changed to bear the name of the newly revised treatise, The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage).
- 2. The committee representing our memberships in the Free Will Baptist Press be increased from three to five members and that Article IV. Standing Boards and Committees, be revised accordingly.
- 3. Article IX. Meetings, be amended to read: "The Central Conference shall meet annually on Thursday following the first Sunday in November." It presently reads: "The Central Conference shall meet annually on Wednesday following the first Sunday in November."

By motion all three proposed changes were placed on the table until the afternoon session.

Reports of the denomination and its enterprises were given as follows: State Convention, by the Rev. Gary Bailey, president; Superannuation and Church Finance Association, by the Rev. Walter Reynolds, director of those enterprises; Mount Olive College, by Dr. Burkette Raper, president; Cragmont Assembly, by the Rev. John Williams, manager; Children's Home, by Mr. Charles Watt, fund raiser; Retirement Homes, by the Rev. Walter Sutton, director;

Foreign Missions, by the Rev. Harold Jones, director; and Home Missions, by the Rev. Charles Crisp, director.

The report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Rev. Harry Grubbs. By motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Conference adjourned its business session for worship. A hymn was sung, an offering received, and the Rev. Harry Grubbs rendered a solo. The Rev. Harold Jones brought the introductory message.

Following the worship service, the Conference adjourned for lunch.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The Conference reconvened following lunch with devotions conducted by the Rev. Allan Sterbin.

The Obituary Committee reported that no minister in the Central Conference had passed away since the Conference's last annual meeting.

By motion the proposed constitutional changes that had been presented in the morning session were brought off the table for debate, one at a time. Each was adopted by vote of the Conference. (See "Morning Session".)

The report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood. By motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Executive Board was made by the Rev. Leon Grubbs. By motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Central Conference Missions Board was given by the Rev. Cedric D. Pierce Jr. By motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Temperance and Resolutions Committee was made by the Rev. Tom Miller. By motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The following resolution was presented from the floor: BE IT RESOLVED, that all committees and boards be composed of at least one-third laymen and laywomen. After some discussion it was noted that this would pose a problem for the Board of Ordination. The moderator asked the presenter, with her consent, to rewrite the resolution. While she did that other business was carried out.

The report of the Conference treasurer was given by the Rev. Leon Grubbs in the absence of Mr. Boyd Barrow, who could not attend. By motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. Walter Reynolds. The report contained the names of the Rev. Leon

Grubbs for clerk and Mr. Boyd Barrow for treasurer, but it was pointed out that each had served two consecutive terms and according to the Constitution and By-Laws were not eligible for re-election at this time. By motion the names of the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood for clerk and Mrs. Lou McLawhorn for treasurer were substituted in the report. Because no person may serve on two standing boards or committees at the same time, the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood resigned from the Credentials Committee. The name of the Rev. Allan Sterbin was added to the report, by motion, to take his place. The Rev. L. B. Manning stated that he wished for his name to be deleted from the report for a place on the Obituary Committee. His wishes were met and, by motion, the name of Mrs. C. L. Patrick was added in his place. With these changes, the report was adopted. (See Reports.) The persons named therein were elected by acclamation.

The previously mentioned resolution was again presented to the body as follows: BE IT RESOLVED, that all committees and boards be composed of at least one-third laymen and laywomen with the exception of the Ordaining Council. By motion the resolution was passed.

The Rocky Mount Church extended an invitation for the Conference to meet with them in 1983. By motion the invitation was accepted.

A discussion concerning the financial woes of the Press ensued. Several questions were raised. There was not an official representative of the Press present, so there were no answers to be obtained. In view of this fact the following motion was passed: That the Central Conference ask the Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation to call for an immediate meeting of the Memberships of the Press. A later motion passed asking that this meeting take place within thirty days of reception of this written request. (A letter stating this request was mailed by the clerk on November 15, 1982.)

The clerk read a letter from the Press Board stating that memberships in the Press may be purchased at the cost of \$100 per membership.

By motion we adjourned, leaving all unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Board.

REPORTS

REPORT OF THE ORDAINING COUNCIL

We, the Ordaining Council, are in a very delicate position. We have been elected to this capacity to serve the Conference, but we must also serve those individuals who come before the Council for any reason. In order to serve individuals, we do not divulge highly personal and very sensitive information in this report, and we will divulge such information only under the following circumstances:

- 1. The individual requests it;
- 2. The Conference requests it and the information is first examined by the Executive Committee;
- 3. The individual has made some disparaging or untruthful statement(s) about the Council's handling of his case;
 - 4. The Council requires a minister to surrender his credentials.

There are times when charges are leveled against a minister of the Conference. These charges must be made in writing and signed by the person making the charge. Generally, we do not deal with unsigned accusations; however, we may notify a minister of such accusations.

It is the policy of the Central Conference for all pastors in the Conference to appear before the Ordaining Council to be approved for pastoral work in the Conference *before* they begin work in the Conference. So if your church calls a minister from outside the Conference, please notify the secretary of the Council and have the minister notify the secretary. In most cases this proves to be a formality, but it just might save your church some heartaches later.

Since last Conference Annual Session, the Council has recommended three men for licensing. On January 12, the Council recommended that Saratoga Church license Frank Thigpen on or after March 15, 1982, the date he would have been a member of that church for one year. On March 16, the Council recommended that Williamston Church license Ray Everton. On October 11, the Council recommended that Marlboro Church license Jeffery Harrison.

James Owens was ordained into the Gospel Ministry on November 10, 1981, at Otter's Creek Church. He is the only minister ordained since last Annual Session of the Conference.

Two ministers have transferred into the Conference and two have transferred from the Conference. On April 19, Dale Albertson was received into the Conference pending a letter of transfer from the Western Conference. That letter was received, dated May 5, 1982. On October 11, James Reb Lancaster brought a letter of transfer from the

Eastern Conference to the Council. He was received into the Conference. Vance Link joined the Western Conference in 1979. Neither he nor the Western Conference notified the Central Conference until this year. We granted a letter of transfer on March 31. David C. Hansley requested a letter of transfer to the Eastern Conference on September 10. We granted that request on September 20.

Three ministers were cleared this year to serve churches in the Central Conference without membership. Steve Hargrove was approved on January 12 to serve as pastor of Elm Grove Church. On October 11, Ronnie Mohn was approved to serve as pastor of Williamston Church and David DeHart was cleared to serve as pastor of Watery Branch Church.

The Council has worked long and diligently to prepare a new ordination examination. The new examination was approved on July 27. This is a comprehensive examination of Free Will Baptist history, doctrine, and polity. In addition, the candidate for ordination will have to demonstrate that he has given serious thought to the very difficult issues of today.

Sir, I move the adoption of this report and that the names of Frank Thigpen, Ray Everton, and Jeffery Harrison be added to the list of licensed ministers, and the names of James Owens and Charles Lacher be dropped; and that the names of James Owens, Dale Albertson, and Reb Lancaster be added to the list of ordained ministers in that order of seniority, and the names of Vance Link and David C. Hansley be dropped.

REPORT OF THE CENTRAL CONFERENCE MISSIONS BOARD

Thank you very sincerely for your support of our Central Conference Missions Program this year as well as what you have done in the past. A special thanks to the Woman's Auxiliary Convention for their contributions, too! Note that our total income was up significantly this year. Your help has made it possible for your Missions Board to move forward again this year in its work.

Our phase-out program at Roanoke Rapids was completed on December 31, 1981, as planned. However, upon a change in pastoral leadership the church needed some additional assistance. Acting upon an official request from the church, the Missions Board approved a supplement to the Roanoke Rapids Church in the amount of \$67.50 per week beginning on April 4, 1982, for a period of six months after which an evaluation was made. Noting encouraging progress, the Board approved for the assistance to continue at the same rate for an additional six months or until the church is able to undertake more of the financial load. Both the congregation and the Missions Board are pleased with the very capable leadership being provided by the new pastor, the Rev. J. Carlton Lucas, who resides in Roanoke Rapids.

As was announced in the 1981 sitting of the Central Conference, the new Free Will Baptist Mission in Rocky Mount was closed by vote of the State Home Missions Board on November 2, 1981. The Central Conference Missions Board received \$462 in refunds upon the final settlement of this work.

A new work has been started in Grifton, North Carolina, and is meeting in the old St. Jude Catholic Church. This work is a joint venture of the State Home Missions Board and the Central Conference Missions Board. Our assistance is based on \$50 per week supplement toward the pastor's salary which is shared equally between the State Board, the Conference Board, and the Mission. Our commitment is for 11 months (48 weeks) beginning on October 31, 1982—after this period a careful evaluation will be made by the State and Conference Missions Boards. The pastor is the Rev. Jimmy Sowers.

Your Missions Board has made every effort to fulfill the goals established by this Conference:

- (1) "AN ORIGINAL F.W.B. CHURCH IN EVERY TOWN";
- (2) Stand ready to assist any church in our Conference that might need help; and
- (3) Be prepared to launch out in the establishment of another mission or supporting a propsective group which feels led to organize.

To accomplish this we have committed more than our present rate of income, believing that our people in our Central Conference churches will support our efforts! To meet our obligations we project that we will need approximately \$6,750 during the next year. CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE

We, the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist denomination of North Carolina, desiring to be in fellowship in a bond of union, do ordain this constitution revised at annual session held November 10th and 11th, 1976.

NAME

This shall be the constitution of the Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist Church of North Carolina.

PURPOSE

The object of the Central Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures.

Article I. COMPOSITION

This conference shall be composed of affiliated ordained ministers and churches within its bounds, who are in good standing, and of all general officers, and members of standing boards or committees of the conference. It shall operate under *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)*. No church corporation whose articles of incorporation or constitution and bylaws conflict with the *Articles of faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)* shall be permitted membership in the Central Conference.

Article II. REPRESENTATION

Each church shall represent with one delegate for each one hundred members or fraction thereof. The delegation from each church shall carry to the conference a letter certifying their appointment, and giving the statistics and financial condition of the church, together with a statement of all funds received and disbursed for denominational and benevolent purposes during the year.

Article III. OFFICERS

The officers shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of two (2) years. After serving two (2) full terms of two (2) years each, no

member shall be eligible for nomination to the same office until after an interval of one (1) year. The duties of said office shall be entered into at the close of the session in which they are elected.

Article IV. STANDING BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

It shall be the policy of this conference to elect as many boards and committees as may be necessary in carrying out its program. These shall keep records of their proceedings and make a report at each annual session of the conference.

A board of trustees, a board of ordination, a board of finance, and a board of missions, consisting of five members each, shall be elected. The term of office for members of these boards shall be five years but shall be adjusted to terminate the office of one member annually.

A committee to represent the conference's memberships in the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation, Inc., a credentials committee, and an obituary committee shall be elected. There shall be five representatives of memberships in the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation, Inc., their five-year terms so adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually. There shall be three members each on the credentials and obituary committees. Their terms of office shall be three years but shall be so adjusted as to terminate the office of one member annually.

A committee of one shall be elected to serve as conference historian; the term of office shall be two years.

A committee of one shall be elected to serve as publicity committee; the term of office shall be two years.

The executive committee shall be composed of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, treasurer, and one member elected by the conference at the time of the official election of officers.

Temporary committees shall be appointed at the option of the conference for whatever purposes may be deemed necessary.

No member of a standing board or committee shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms on the same board or committee. He may, however, serve on said board or committee again after an interval of at least one (1) year.

Article V. FINANCE

Each church shall contribute to the conference according to its membership.

Article VI. ADMISSION OF CHURCHES

Any properly organized church that gives evidence of adherence to the doctrines of Christianity as taught by Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina and desires to help promote the program and work of the Central Conference and the North Carolina State Convention, may present its petition to the regular session of the conference. If the petition for membership is approved, the moderator shall extend the hand of fellowship to the delegates.

Article VII. DISMISSION OF CHURCHES

A church may be dismissed from membership in the conference by vote of the conference.

Article VIII. VISITORS

The Central Conference may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting.

Article IX. MEETINGS

The Central Conference shall meet in annual session on Thursday following the first Sunday in November. The host church shall be selected by vote of the conference in annual session or by the executive committee. The place of a future meeting thus selected may be changed by an act of the executive committee should such a change become necessary.

Article X. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 1. The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the Central Conference; to appoint temporary committees, delegates, and representatives; to serve as ex officio member of all standing boards and committees; and in general to perform the duties of the office of moderator.

Section 2. The duties of the assistant moderator shall be the duties of the moderator when that officer is not present and he shall assist the moderator when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the moderator, the assistant moderator shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 3. The clerk shall record and preserve a permanent record of the proceedings of all sessions of the Central Conference. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual sessions of the conference, hold in trust all documents not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the conference. He shall conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature.

Section 4: The duties of the assistant clerk shall be the duties of the clerk when that officer is not present, and he shall assist the clerk when called upon. In the event of the resignation or death of the clerk, the assistant clerk shall fill the vacancy until the next session of the conference.

Section 5. The treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the conference, except that held by other boards and committees of the conference. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and paid out and make an annual report accordingly to the conference.

Section 6. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to transact the business of the conference when the conference is not in session. The executive committee shall plan the program for the annual session of the conference.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of the board of trustees to hold in trust title to all tangible property belonging to the conference. It shall have power to convey such property when authorized by the conference.

Section 8. It shall be the duty of the board of ordination (1) to examine and recommend the license of ministers; (2) to examine, ordain, and discipline ministers in keeping with the provisions of *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists (of the English General Baptist Heritage)*, and (3) examine ordained ministers seeking membership in this conference and make recommendations in keeping with their findings.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the board of finance to check and verify all money to be received by the treasurer; they shall make recommended allocations and report same to the conference.

Section 10. It shall be the duty of the board of missions to cooperate with the churches and the conference in furthering the establishment of churches within the bounds of the conference. The mission board shall endeavor through cooperating with the State Board of Missions to raise money, arrange itineraries, and keep the work of missions before our churches.

Section 11. It shall be the duty of the Free Will Baptist Press Foundation committee to represent the conference's stock in the Free Will Baptist Press and to do so at any stockholders' meeting.

Section 12. It shall be the duty of the credentials committee to check each church report for verification as to their delegates and make recommendations to the conference as regarding their seat during the annual session. The credentials committee shall check registration cards of the enrolling minister and make recommendations of same to the conference.

Section 13. It shall be the duty of the obituary committee to prepare suitable memorial services for all ministers who die during the year preceding the conference and to present to the conference a suitable obituary for publication in the conference minutes and in *The Free Will Baptist*. Copies of the obituary are to be presented to the family of the deceased and to his local church.

Section 14. It shall be the duty of the conference historian to collect and preserve any historical data concerning the conference.

Section 15. It shall be the duty of the publicity committee to see that proper publicity is given to the activities and work of the conference.

BYLAWS

Section 1. A board or committee will be recognized as having a quorum when there is a majority of the members present for a meeting, providing all the members of said board or committee have been duly notified concerning the said meeting.

Section 2. All reports, resolutions, and recommendations shall be considered properly presented to the conference in written form only.

Section 3. Each minister and delegate in good standing shall duly attend each day while the conference is in session or be subject to censure by the conference and reported to his local church.

Section 4. If any member, in the judgment of the conference, shall show anger in his discussion on any subject, he shall forfeit his seat in that session.

Section 5. No member shall be excused from any session of the conference without leave of the moderator.

Section 6. The conference shall adjourn by a majority vote.

Section 7. Each officer and member of standing committees and boards in good standing shall be entitled to a seat and vote in the conference.

Section 8. The conference shall open and close with suitable devotional services.

Section 9. The minutes of the conference shall be signed by the moderator and clerk.

Section 10. This constitution and its bylaws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds favorable vote of the members present, provided that said amendment shall be presented in the morning session for action in the afternoon session.
