WORSHIP SERVICE

Upon proper motion that the report be adopted; that the names of James Lupton, Robert Burke, Steve Hargrove, Jerry Campbell, and Jack Scarboro be added to the list of ordained ministers, that the name of Mike Tart be changed from the list of licensed ministers to that of ordained ministers; and that the names of Robert Strickland, Dale Albertson, Frank Thigpen, Jack Mayo, and Reb Lancaster be removed from the list of ordained ministers; and that the Conference approve the concept of the certified lay speaker program, authorize the Council to continue work on it, and present a detailed proposal to the Conference when the work is complete. The report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. J. B. Narron. Upon proper motion the report was adopted and the names placed in nomination. (See Reports.)

Upon proper motion the nominees were elected by acclamation.

Mrs. Lou McLawhorn gave the Treasurer's Report. Upon proper motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Finance Committee was given by Mrs. Lou McLawhorn. Upon proper motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

It is our desire and aim to use wisely *all* that which you commit to our trust.

Your Missions Board has made and will continue to make every effort to fulfill the goals established by this Conference:

- 1. "AN ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH IN EVERY TOWN";
- 2. Stand ready to assist any church in our conference that might need help; and
- 3. Be prepared to launch out in the establishment of another mission or supporting a prospective group which feels led to organize.

We urge our people to use the services available through your Missions Board to assist churches in need and to establish new churches. We need your help!

The Grifton Mission, which was started in October, 1982, is progressing nicely and experiencing steady growth under the very capable leadership of the Rev. Jimmy Sowers, pastor. Please remember that this work is a joint venture of the State Home Missions Board and the Central Conference Missions Board. As we reported our plans to you last year, we are happy to be able to report complete implementation of those plans during this year. We ended our pastor's salary supplement on December 31, 1984. Then in early January, 1985, your Missions Board paid \$5,200 toward the down payment to enable the Grifton Mission to purchase their property, consisting of the old St. Jude Catholic Church building and approximately four (4) acres of land. The interests of the Central Conference are protected by deed restriction as promised.

Your Missions Board has agreed to assist the Grifton Mission further in the amount of \$300 per month during the next twelve months (December 1, 1985—November 30, 1986) toward the payment on the property. The total payment is \$800 per month, \$500 of which the Mission will pay. The Mission is also providing payment for all utilities, maintenance and upkeep, improvements, and one-third of the pastor's salary. Please continue to pray for the Grifton people and support them in every way you can!

THE ORDAINING COUNCIL

The Ordaining Council is elected and authorized by the Central Conference to examine and certify each candidate for license and ordination, to give clearance or receive transfer of membership of each minister from another conference, and to properly exercise ministerial discipline as set forth in the *Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists*. The members of the Ordaining Council presently serving are: Harry Grubbs, chairman; Dr. Michael Pelt, vice-chairman; Ray Williamson, secretary; Dan Beaman, and Bruce Jones. The council met six times since the last session to fulfill its duties.

During the year four ministers were given clearance to pastor churches within the Central Conference: Robert Jones of Watery Branch, Luther Bissette of Edgewood, Dennis Sherrod of Dilda's Grove, and Ed Miles of Spring Branch.

Letters of transfer to the Central Conference were received from two ministers: Robert Burke from the Eastern Conference, and Jack Scarboro from the Western Conference. Memberships were also received pending the transfer of letters for Steve Hargrove from the Albemarle Conference, Jerry Campbell from the Eastern Conference, and James Lupton from the Western Conference.

Three ministers were given letters of transfer from the Central Conference: Robert Strickland and Dale Albertson to the Western Conference, and Frank Thigpen to the Albemarle Conference.

The ordination credentials of two ministers became null and void during the year: Jack Mayo surrendered his credentials for pleading guilty to criminal charges, and Reb Lancaster's credentials were automatically revoked for joining a church of another denomination.

One candidate for ordination was approved, and credentials were issued to Mike Tart on February 4, 1985.

The council also began work, upon direction by the Central Conference Executive Committee, on a brochure about the call to the ministry to be distributed among our churches, layman's leagues, youth convention, etc. to call attention to the need for Godcalled people to the ministry.

The council spent considerable time in study and discussion concerning a new concept of ministry for Original Free Will Baptists: a certified lay speaker program. The need exists for a place within our work for those who feel God's call to preach His Word, have natural abilities, and a desire for deeper study and increased service, but do not necessarily feel led to accept the position and responsibility of an ordained minister. Many new and wonderful opportunities and challenges could be offered through such a program. Areas discussed include: (1) recommendation by the local church, (2) courses of study, (3) oral examination, (4) certification, and (5) listing of certified lay speakers in the Conference minutes and *Yearbook*. Other areas need to be more fully explored, but the need is real and full of possibilities which can give the lay people of our churches an avenue for greater service and personal growth in the faith.
