PROCEEDINGS

MORNING SESSION

The Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 238th annual session with the Black Jack Free Will Baptist Church, Pitt County, on November 6, 1986, at 9:30 a.m.

Leah McGlohon led the congregation in singing a hymn. Mrs. Alice Barrow, of Hull Road Free Will Baptist Church, gave a devotion and led in prayer.

The Rev. W. Scott Sowers, clerk, called the annual session to order. The Rev. Dan Rivers, pastor of the host church, extended a warm welcome, which was responded to by the Rev. Donald Ribeiro, of Winterville Free Will Baptist Church.

Cherry The Rev. Ronnie Hobgood, moderator, addressed the Conference. The roll of churches was called, which was followed by the calling of the roll of ministers.

Visiting ministers were recognized as follows: From the Cape Fear Conference: Ed Miles, and Ed Taylor; from the Eastern Conference: Walter Sutton, Frank Brinson, David C. Hansley, James Evans, and Donald Fader; from the Western Conference: John Williams, J. C. Yates, Harold Jones, and Dennis Sherrod.

The moderator made the following appointments—Parliamentarian: the Rev. J. B. Narron; Resolution and Temperance Committee: the Revs. Willis Wilson, Mike Tart, and Mr. Lester Terry; Nominating Committee: the Revs. Gary Bailey, N. Bruce Barrow, and Mrs. C. L. Patrick; Timekeeper: the Rev. Ed Taylor.

The clerk gave the Executive Committee Report. Upon proper motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Reports of the denominational ministries were given as follows: Free Will Baptist Press by Mr. R. Clifford Gray, executive director; Foreign Missions by the Rev. Harold Jones, director; Cragmont Assembly by the Rev. John Williams, manager; and the Ministers' Program by the Rev. Donald Fader, director.

The report of the Ordaining Council was given by the Rev. Ray Williamson. A motion was made and seconded that the report be adopted; that the names of Calvin Heath, Royce Reynolds, and Ray Everton be removed from the list of ordained ministers; that the name of Dan Rivers be added to the list of ordained ministers; that the Conference adopt the recommendation of the Certified Lay Speaker Program and that the Ordaining Council be authorized to promote and supervise its implementation. (See Reports.)

The report of the Central Conference Missions Board was given by the Rev. Cedric Pierce. Upon proper motion the written report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Miss Leah McGlohon led the congregation in the singing of a hymn.

Denominational ministries reports resumed as follows: Home Missions by the Rev. David C. Hansley, director; Church Finance Association by the Rev. Walter Reynolds, director; Mount Olive College by Dr. Michael Pelt; Children's Home by the Rev. Bobby Taylor, director; and Retirement Homes by the Rev. Walter Sutton, director.

WORSHIP SERVICE

Worship was begun with the singing of a hymn. An offering was received and special music was rendered by the Sonlight Singers. The Rev. Dan Rivers brought the message and gave the benediction and grace for the meal.

The Conference adjourned for lunch, which was served by the host church.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The Conference reconvened after lunch, with the Rev. Ron Braxton serving as moderator because the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood had a funeral. Miss Leah McGlohon led the congregation in singing a hymn.

Mr. Ted Harrison, of La Grange Free Will Baptist Church, gave the afternoon devotion.

The Rev. Ron Braxton appointed the Rev. N. Bruce Barrow to serve as Parliamentarian because the Rev. J. B. Narron was involved in a funeral.

The report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Rev. Bryant Hines. Upon proper motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The right hand of fellowship was extended to the Rev. Dan Rivers.

The report of the Finance Committee was given by Mrs. Lou McLawhorn. Upon proper motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

Mrs. Lou McLawhorn gave the treasurer's report. Upon proper motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Resolutions and Temperance Committee was given by the Rev. Willis Wilson. Upon proper motions each of the resolutions was adopted separately. (See Reports.)

Upon proper motion the recommendation concerning the Certified Lay Speaker Program was lifted from the table. Upon proper motion the recommendation was adopted.

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. N. Bruce Barrow. Upon proper motion the report was adopted and the names placed in nomination. (See Reports.)

The floor was opened for nominations from the floor. Upon proper motion the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood was elected moderator by acclamation. Upon proper motion that those positions without nominations from the floor be elected at the close. Mr. Billy Churchill was nominated from the floor to serve on the Board of Missions. Upon proper motion the nominations for the Board of Missions ceased. By proper vote Mr. Billy Churchill was elected. Upon proper motion that all nominations cease and that the remaining nominees be elected by acclamation.

By consensus the Conference gave all the outgoing officers a rising vote of thanks.

Upon proper motion that the Conference adjourn and leave all unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Committee.

REPORTS

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on January 23, 1986, at the Free Will Baptist Press in Ayden, at 3:18 p.m. The following members were present: the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood, the Rev. Ron Braxton, Lou McLawhorn, and Leah McGlohon.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. Ron Braxton.

In the absence of the clerk, Leah McGlohon read the minutes, which were approved with the suggestions of changing the phrase "until they are deceased" on page 7, paragraph 6, under the afternoon session to "for their lifetime."

Lou McLawhorn reported a balance of \$1,648.93 in the treasury. She also reported receiving a letter from the Church Finance Association of our funds in that program.

The moderator presented the "Five Year Plan" of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists and requested that we read over it to see things that our Conference can do and suggest how we can do them.

Two particular things pertaining to the plan were discussed. The first was a proposed pamphlet, "Is God Calling You to the Ministry?" The pamphlet was approved by motion. Ron moved that we also ask the Ordaining Council to prepare a handout that spells out the suggested courses and the hours in each particular discipline to give people entering the ministry. The motion was seconded and passed.

The second thing discussed was a telephone tree for ministers. The moderator will make a telephone tree of ministers of the Conference and ministers pastoring in the Conference to inform them of things of denominational interest and of the death of ministers.

The moderator reported that the Maury Church property, which is not being used, needs to be dealt with. He had copies of two deeds he had found at the Greene County Courthouse. After some discussion, it was decided that the moderator should contact the Board of Trustees of the Conference to look into the matter.

The meeting adjourned at 5 p.m. Ronnie prayed the benediction.

(September 11, 1986)

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on September 11, 1986, at the Free Will Baptist Press, at 3 p.m., with all members present.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Ron Braxton.

Lou McLawhorn reported a balance of \$701.66 in the treasury.

By consensus each member of the Executive Committee to obtain three delegates to the State Convention, with the moderator to secure four.

By concensus that Scott Sowers, Ron Braxton and Lou McLawhorn work on the possibility of a seminar to help ministers and church leaders minister to people with drug-related problems.

The Executive Committee worked on the program for the annual session. The meeting was adjourned.

REPORT OF THE ORDAINING COUNCIL

The Ordaining Council is elected and authorized by the Central Conference to examine and certify each candidate for license and ordination, to give clearance or receive transfer of membership of each minister from another conference, and to grant letters of recommendation to ministers transferring to another conference. The Ordaining Council is also charged with the proper exercise of ministerial discipline as set forth in the *Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists*. The members of the Ordaining Council presently serving are: Harry Grubbs, chairman; Dr. Michael Pelt, vice chairman; Ray Williamson, secretary; Dan Beamon; and Bruce Jones.

Since the last session of the Conference, the Rev. Calvin Heath has transferred to the Cape Fear Conference, the Rev. Royce Reynolds has transferred to the Albemarle Conference, the Rev. Ray Everton has transferred to the Western Conference, the Rev. Dan Rivers has transferred to the Central Conference from the Paul Palmer Fellowship Conference, and the Rev. Franklin Brinson of the Eastern Conference was given clearance to work in the Central Conference.

There were no newly licensed or ordained ministers during the year.

The Ordaining Council completed its work, as directed by the Central Conference Executive Committee, on the brochure, "The Call to the Ministry." It was turned over to the Executive Committee.

Considerable time was given during the year to the finalization of the proposed Certified Lay Speaker Program, as approved by the Conference in its last session. The addendum to this report provides an outline of the proposal, which the Council recommends to this session.

The Grifton Mission, which was started in October, 1982, is continuing to grow under the capable leadership of its pastor, the Rev. Jimmy Sowers. The total payment is \$800.27 per month, \$500.27 of which the Mission is paying.
