PROCEEDINGS

MORNING SESSION

The Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 239th annual session with the First Free Will Baptist Church of La Grange, Lenoir County, on November 5, 1987, at 9:30 a.m.

The Conference was opened with a hymn led by Miss Leah McGlohon. The Rev. C. L. Patrick gave a devotional and led in prayer.

The Rev. Leon Grubbs, clerk, called the annual session to order and presented the moderator, the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood, who presided over the session.

Mrs. "Pete" Vose of the host church extended a cordial welcome to the Conference.

The Rev. J. B. Narron, pastor of Ayden Church, responded on behalf of the Conference. The moderator addressed the Conference. The roll of churches was called followed by the roll of ministers.

Visiting ministers were recognized: From the Eastern Conference: Bruce Dudley, Walter Sutton, Frank Brinson and Harry Jones; From the Cape Fear Conference: Foy Futrelle, Ed Miles, and Ed Taylor; From the Western Conference: Ray Wells, De W. Eakes, Dennis Sherrod, and Luther Bissette.

The moderator appointed temporary committees: Parliamentarian: The Rev. J. B. Narron; Resolutions and Temperance Committee: The Rev. Bass Mitchell, chairman, the Rev. Leon Harris and Mr. George Harrison; Nominating Committee: The Rev. C. H. Overman, chairman, the Rev. Willis Wilson and Mrs. Lou D. McLawhorn; Timekeeper: The Rev. Gary Bailey.

The clerk read the minutes of Executive Committee meetings. Upon proper motion and second, the minutes were received and the recommendations therein were adopted. (See Reports.)

The moderator opened the floor for the transaction of miscellaneous business. The Rev. James Lupton requested that his name be placed on the retired ministers' list.

The worship service was held at 10 a.m. The organist played a prelude and the host pastor gave the Call to Worship from Psalm 95:1-2. Following the invocation, the worship hymn, "Love Divine," was led by Miss Leah McGlohon. An offering was received for the Conference. Donna Sowers provided special music. The Rev. N. Bruce Barrow delivered the worship sermon based on Galatians 3:1. The worship was concluded with a hymn of affirmation, "I Am Thine, O Lord," followed by the benediction.

The Conference reconvened its business with reports from denominational ministries: State Convention by the Rev. De W. Eakes, President; Children's Home by the Rev. Bobby Taylor, Executive Director; Church Finance Association, by the Rev. Walter Reynolds, President; Cragmont Assembly by the Rev. Harry Grubbs, Board Member; Foreign Missions, by Mrs. Sandra Jones; Free Will Baptist Press Foundation, by Mr. Cliff Gray, Executive Director.

The Conference was led in the singing of a hymn by Miss Leah McGlohon.

Reports of Denominational Ministries continued: Home Missions, by the Rev. David C. Hansley, Director; Ministers' Program, by the Rev. Donald Fader, Director-Treasurer; Mount Olive College, by Dr. Michael Pelt; Retirement Homes, by the Rev. Walter Sutton, Director.

The Conference adjourned its business for lunch.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session of the Conference was opened by a hymn led by Miss Leah McGlohon followed by devotions and prayer given by the Rev. David Langley, pastor of Bethany Church.

A report on Camp Vandemere was given by the Rev. Bruce Dudley, Manager.

The Rev. Harry Grubbs gave the report of Board of Ordination. By proper motion and second, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Rev. David Langley was extended the right hand of fellowship by the moderator and other officers of the Conference.

The Rev. Cedric Pierce gave the report of the Conference Missions. Upon proper motion and second, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Obituary Committee was given by Mrs. C. L. Patrick. Upon proper motion and second, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The Rev. Bryant Hines gave the report of the Credentials Committee. Upon proper motion and second, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The moderator opened the floor for the transaction of business. A motion was offered by the Rev. J. B. Narron that the Executive Committee of the Central Conference make an in-depth study of ways and means to involve the ministers and churches of the Conference in better attendance at its annual sessions and to design ways to involve the ministers and churches in outreach and evangelism in the Conference. After a proper second, the motion was passed.

The Rev. Leon Harris gave the report of the Resolutions and Temperance Committee. The two resolutions were read separately. After each was read a motion was made, seconded and passed to adopt it. (See Reports.)

The Rev. C. H. Overman gave the report of the Nominations Committee. Upon proper motion and second, the report was received. The moderator opened the floor for further nominations. A motion was made to elect the slate of officers offered by the Nominating Committee by acclamation. Upon proper second, the motion was passed. (See Reports.)

Mrs. Hilda Sasser gave the report of the Treasurer. Upon proper motion and second, it was adopted. (See Reports.)

Mrs. Hilda Sasser gave the report of the Finance Committee. Upon proper motion and second, it was adopted. (See Reports.)

A motion was made that we adjourn, leaving any unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Committee. Upon proper second the motion was passed.

The Rev. N. D. Beaman was called upon for the benediction.

REPORTS

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(December 8, 1986)

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on December 8, 1986, at the First Free Will Baptist Church in La Grange. All members were present.

The meeting was opened with prayer led by Gary Bailey.

The treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$1,870.25. Upon proper motion and second, the report was received.

The moderator presented an invitation from the La Grange Church for the Conference to meet with them in 1987. Upon proper motion, the invitation was accepted.

The moderator reported that the Free Will Baptist Press is printing a denominational calendar for 1987. They are requesting that each Conference aid them with the expense of the calendar by donating \$5.00 per entry. The Central Conference has five entries. After discussing this matter at length, a motion was made that we purchase a \$25 membership in the Press Foundation and extend our thanks to them for the five entries on the calendar. After a proper second, the motion passed.

The moderator reported that the Board of Ordination was having cooperation problems with the National Association minister called to pastor Saints Delight Church and they are requesting our help in solving the problems. After a lengthy, in-depth discussion, a motion was offered that we write to Saints Delight Church to let them know they are out of order in having called a pastor who is not a member in good standing with our Conference and denomination; that we include in the letter the proper procedures for rectifying the situation as stated in *The Articles of Faith*; and that we request a response within sixty days. After a proper second, the motion was passed.

Scott Sowers read the minutes of the Central Conference. Minor errors were corrected.

The section containing the mailing addresses of Conference ministers was discussed. It was pointed out that this section is repetitious since the addresses of all the ministers of the State Convention are in the "Directory of Ministers" in the front of the *Yearbook*. Upon proper motion, this section will be deleted.

It was noted that the Board of Finance has a vacancy since Calvin Heath has transferred his conference membership. Upon proper motion, Mrs. Alice Barrow will be asked to fill this position.

It was suggested that the roll of churches be changed to show whether or not each church represented at the Conference by delegate, by letter, and to list the amount of contribution. Upon proper motion, this action will be taken.

Upon proper motion the minutes were approved with the changes as indicated.

Upon proper motion the clerk's annual salary will increase to \$50.

A motion was made that the Conference reimburse \$.15 per mile to anyone who incurs authorized travel expenses on behalf of the Conference on approval of the Executive Committee. Upon proper second, the motion passed.

We adjourned with prayer led by Leon Grubbs.

(March 23, 1987)

The Central Conference Executive Committee met on March 23, 1987, at the Skylight Inn in Ayden following the meeting of the Central Conference Ministers' Fellowship. All members were present.

The moderator called the meeting to order. Scott Sowers led in prayer.

Ray Williamson, secretary of the Board of Ordination, met with the Committee to give details of the Board's involvement with the pastor of Saints Delight Church, Mack Humbles.

The clerk read to the Committee a letter he had written and had been sent by the moderator to Saints Delight.

The moderator shared two letters with the Committee from Saints Delight. The first, dated March 1, 1987, was in response to the letter to them concerning their pastor. They expressed a desire to meet with the Executive Committee and Board of Ordination in an effort to resolve the difficulties that have arisen. The second letter, dated March 20, 1987, informed the Committee that their pastor had resigned in order to restore the church to good standing with the Conference.

In view of the actions taken by Saints Delight and their pastor's resignation, a motion was made that we write a letter to Saints Delight acknowledging receipt of the two letters from them; that we inform them that they are now in good standing with the Conference; that we inform them they can find a list of ordained ministers in good standing with our denomination in the 1987 Yearbook: and that we include a copy of the original letter we mailed to them in January. The motion passed.

By proper motion, a copy of the letter we sent to Saints Delight in January will be included in these minutes.

The treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$1.795.

We adjourned with prayer led by Gary Bailey.

To Saints Delight Original Free Will Baptist Church

Greetings in the Name of Christ:

It has been brought to the attention of the Executive Committee of the Central Conference that Saints Delight has called as its pastor Mack Humbles, a man who is not recognized as a duly ordained Original Free Will Baptist minister. We have been informed that he is not in good standing with the Central Conference and has refused to cooperate with the Ordaining Council of the Conference in meeting the necessary requirements to come into good standing.

The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists, page 70, states, "The church shall call its own pastor, from among the duly ordained Original Free Will Baptist ministers who are approved by the Conference of which the church is a member." Since Mr. Humbles does not meet these requirements, the church is out of order in having called him as its pastor. It is not our desire as Executive Committee of the Central Conference to place any unnecessary hardship upon you as a church. It is only our desire to assist the church in correcting this matter as soon as possible.

According to the rules and regulations of the Conference you have two possible courses of action. 1) Encourage Mr, Humbles to cooperate with the Conference Ordaining Council. They will be glad to assist him in meeting all necessary requirements for being approved for pastoral work in the Conference (see Articles of Faith, "Examination and Procedures for Transfer from Another Denomination" and "Relationship to the Conference," pp. 89 and following). No requirements are made of Mr. Humbles that have not been met by every other minister in our Conference and denomination. If he has the best interest of Saints Delight at heart, he will cooperate with the Ordaining Council.

2) If Mr. Humbles has an unChristian spirit and refuses to cooperate with the Ordaining Council, the church can terminate their pastoral call to him and call a pastor who is in good standing with the Conference.

Either course of action will put the church in good order.

Our prayers are with you as you undertake this responsibility. If we can be of assistance to you in any way, let us know. Please contact us within sixty days to let Las construct us know what course of action you are taking.

(August 6, 1987)

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on August 6, 1987, at Hull Road Church, at 10 a.m. The following members were present: Ronnie Hobgood, Scott Sowers, Hilda Sasser and Leon Grubbs.

The moderator called the meeting to order and Scott Sowers led in prayer.

The clerk read the minutes of the two previous meetings of the Executive Committee. The treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$1,228.93.

The moderator reported that he had met with Mrs. Jean Spivey of the Maury Free Will Baptist Church in Greene County. She and her children are the only remaining members of the church. She expressed a desire to have the church officially disbanded and the property properly disposed of by the Conference. In response to this meeting, the moderator contacted Mrs. Spivey by letter and asked her to sign a document stating that the church had not met in four years; that there were no plans to reactivate; and that, to the best of her knowledge, Mrs. Spivey and her children are the only members of the church. Mrs. Spivey signed the document and returned it. She also turned over to the Conference the church treasury, a Communion set and other properties. We were informed that pews, pulpit furniture, a plano, etc., were still in the church building and could be disposed of as we desired.

The moderator also reported that he had been contacted by potential buyers of the real estate. Mrs. Helen Gaydek, who recently bought the house adjacent to the church building, expressed a desire to meet with us concerning a problem encountered following a survey of the lot on which the house stands. It seems the house is partially standing on church property.

A motion was made that, based on signed statements by Mrs. Jean Spivey, we declare the Maury Church disbanded; that we claim all property of said church to belong to the Central Conference; and that we recommend to the Conference that said property be sold. Upon proper second, the motion was passed.

Upon proper motion, the moderator and clerk are instructed to take the necessary steps in securing the property, including an inventory of the buildings and their contents.

The Committee worked on the program for the Conference. The theme, "Opportunities for Service," was adopted in keeping with the theme of the State Convention. The Conference will convene with the La Grange Church on Thursday, November 5. Registration will begin at 9 a.m. and the Conference will start at 9:30. It was decided that the worship service begin at 10 a.m. followed by reports from denominational ministries. Other portions of the program will be the same as last year. The Rev. C. L. Patrick will be asked to do morning devotions, the Rev. N. Bruce Barrow to bring the worship sermon, and the Rev. David Langley to conduct afternoon devotions.

The meeting adjourned with prayer led by Leon Grubbs.

(September 17, 1987)

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on September 17, 1987, in College Hall on the Mount Olive College campus, at the close of the State Convention. All members were present.

The moderator and clerk reported that they have taken the necessary steps to secure the Maury Church property including an inventory. There are two buildings on the site. One is the original sanctuary and Sunday School rooms. The other is a block building on a cement slab with a shingle roof. The sanctuary building is in very poor shape with rotting floor joists and sagging roof. The block building is in good condition except for the edge of the roof where overhanging trees and shrubs have caused minor damage.

The contents of the buildings reveal that little of value remains in them. There is an old piano, 26 Free Will Baptist Hymnals, 1 piano stool, 4 light fixtures, 16 folding carry

stools (nursery size), 1 three-brick gas heater, 2 new wood doors (never used), approximately 1,000 square feet of carpet, homemade pulpit stand (in poor condition), 29 homemade pews, and other odds and ends with little or no value.

Copies of the two deeds to the property show the property to be one hundred seventy five feet by one hundred fifty feet on the corner of Mayo and Fourth streets in Maury, Greene County. Luther Barrow of Barrow Surveying and Mapping in Snow Hill has examined the property, determined the locations of the corners, and provided a map of the property. (Mr. Barrow's work was done with no charge to the Conference.) The property and buildings have been appraised to be valued at between seven thousand and eight thousand dollars. Several parties have been in contact with the moderator and clerk expressing interest in purchasing the property.

After the report by the moderator and clerk, a discussion ensued on what course of action to recommend to the Conference concerning the disposal of the property.

By proper motion, the moderator will contact Home Missions and allow them to pick up any items they deem useful for their department.

It was decided that the easiest and least expensive way for the Conference to sell the property would be to offer it for sale to Mrs. Helen Gaydek, a member of Grimsley Church, who owns the house and lot adjacent to the sanctuary building. By proper motion, the clerk will contact Mrs. Gaydek and offer to sell the property, as is, at a price of \$7,500, pending approval of the Conference in session on November 5, 1987. She will be given thirty days to decide whether the offer will be accepted.

By motion, we adjourned.

(November 5, 1987)

The Central Conference Mission Board has experienced the greatest and most productive year in its entire history! We want to thank all of you very sincerely for making this possible through your prayer and financial support of your Conference Mission Program! A very special "THANK YOU" is extended to our ladies who, through the State Woman's Auxiliary Convention, have continued their generous support. We depend greatly upon all of you to make it possible for your Mission Board to move forward in the areas of responsibility you have assigned to us!

Our financial report will reveal receipts of \$7,213.62 and expenditures of \$9,827.11 of which \$9,290 went to the support of the Grifton Mission. Also during this fiscal year, as we reported last year, "THE CENTRAL CONFERENCE MISSION BOARD ENDOWMENT FUND" was established in the amount of \$60,000 and we show an accountability for \$72,617.56. PLEASE REMEMBER: It is our desire and aim to use wisely all that which you have committed to our trust!!! Accordingly, the sole purpose of the Endowment, as stated in the Certificate, is to further fulfill the goals and responsibilities of the Mission Board as assigned by this Conference which are:

1. "AN ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH IN EVERY TOWN";

2. Stand ready to assist any church in our conference that might need help; and

3. Be prepared to launch out in the establishment of another mission or supporting a prospective group which feels led to organize.

Please encourage your people to give additional funds to help build the Endowment to the point that it will be possible for your Board to provide an even greater mission program for the Kingdom of Christ through the Central Conference. We urge our people to take advantage of the services available through your Mission Board, as stated in our goals above.

The Grifton Mission is continuing to grow under the able leadership of the Rev. Jimmy Sowers. During this year your Mission Board has continued its supplement to the

property payment in the amount of \$300 per month and provided \$5,690 to underwrite the air conditioning of their building.
