PROCEEDINGS

MORNING SESSION

The Central Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, being the continuation of the General Conference, convened in its 241st annual session with First Free Will Baptist Church, Greenville, Pitt County, North Carolina, on Thursday, November 9, 1989, at 9:30 a.m. The Conference was opened with a hymn, "Praise Him! Praise Him!," led by the Rev. Bass Mitchell. Glenn A. Mills read Scripture and led in prayer.

The Rev. Leon Grubbs, clerk, called the annual session to order and presented the moderator, the Rev. Ronnie Hobgood, who presided over the session.

Mrs. Ruth Taylor extended a warm welcome to the Conference on behalf of the host church.

The moderator addressed the Conference. His comments were based on Acts 8:1-8. The roll of churches was called with thirty-three responding.

Fourteen visiting ministers were recognized and welcomed by the moderator. From the Albemarle Conference: Wayne Hargrove; from the Eastern Conference: A. B. Bryan, James A. Evans, David Hines, Ralph Sumner and Walter J. Sutton; from the Western Conference: Luther E. Bissette, Jeffery L. Cockrell, De W. Eakes, Dennis E. Sherrod, John Williams and Aubrey Williamson.

The moderator appointed temporary committees—Parliamentarian: the Rev. N. Bruce Barrow; Resolutions and Temperance: the Rev. J. B. Narron, chairman; the Rev. David Hill; and Mr. Billy Gurkin; Nominating: the Rev. Doug Skinner, chairman; the Rev. Walter Reynolds; and Mrs. Alice Barrow; Timekeeper: the Rev. Gary Bailey.

Certificates of Recognition were presented to Conference ministers having twentyfive or more years of ordained ministry to our denomination: 27 years—Billy Ray Jordan; 30 years—Melvin Moore; 34 years—Raymond T. Sasser and Willis Wilson; 36 years—James Lupton and Dan Rivers; 37 years—C. H. Overman; 39 years—J. B. Narron and Michael Pelt; 40 years—Earl H. Glenn and Walter Reynolds; 42 years—C. L. Patrick; 54 years—N. Bruce Barrow and N. Dan Beaman; 56 years—R. P. Harris.

The report of the Executive Committee was read by the clerk. By motion, it was adopted. (See Reports.)

At 10 o'clock Conference business was set aside for the worship service. The Rev. Bass Mitchell led the congregation in singing "Holy, Holy, Holy," followed by the receiving of an offering for the Conference. The New Life Quartet, from Stoney Creek Church near Goldsboro, brought special music. The Rev. Willis Wilson preached the worship sermon, entitled "The Four Most Difficult Lessons in the Ministry," based on Nehemiah 4 and Romans 12:1-2. The worship service ended with the congregation singing "Draw Me Nearer" and the prayer of benediction led by the Rev. Earl Glenn.

Conference business resumed with reports from denominational ministries: State Convention by the Rev. De W. Eakes, president; Denominational General Secretary by the Rev. C. H. Overman; Cragmont Assembly by the Rev. John Williams, manager; Church Finance by the Rev. Walter Reynolds, president; Home Missions by the Rev. Bruce Jones, board member; Children's Home by the Rev. Bobby Taylor, executive director; Retirement Homes by the Rev. Walter J. Sutton, director.

Reports were temporarily halted as the congregation sang the first verse of "Love Lifted Me."

Reports continued: Mount Olive College by Dr. David Hines, director of Education for Christian Ministries; Ministers' Program by the Rev. Earl Glenn, board member.

The Conference adjourned for lunch with prayer led by the Rev. Bobby Taylor.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session of the Conference opened with singing "When We All Get to Heaven."

Reports from denominational ministries continued: Foreign Missions by the Rev. Gary Bailey, board member; Free Will Baptist Press by Mr. Clifford Gray, executive director; Sunday School Board by the Rev. Bass Mitchell, field secretary; Camp Vandemere by the Rev. Ralph Sumner, manager.

The Obituary Committee conducted a service memorializing two ministers of the Conference who died during the past year: the Rev. Walter Pollard and the Rev. Robert Rollins. Mrs. C. L. Patrick read Revelation 14:13, made personal comments about the dedicated service rendered by each of the two deceased ministers, and read Tennyson's poem, "Crossing the Bar." The Rev. C. H. Overman led in prayer. By motion, the report of the Obituary Committee was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Board of Ordination was given by Dr. Michael Pelt, secretary. By motion the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The clerk called the roll of ministers, with 39 ordained ministers and 7 licensed ministers answering. Three ministers sent letters asking to be excused from the Annual Conference.

The right hand of fellowship was extended by officers of the Conference welcoming newly received ministers as members of the Conference: Norwood Futrell, David Parrish, Tony Parrish, Howard Starling and Joe Ratcliffe.

The report of the Conference Board of Missions was given by the Rev. Leon Harris, treasurer. By motion, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Resolutions and Temperance Committee was given by the Rev. J. B. Narron, chairman. The four resolutions were read and adopted separately by proper motions. (See Reports.) Mr. Narron also pointed out, in conjunction with resolution number 1, that pamphlets entitled "Have You Been Called to the Ministry?" were available to be taken back by ministers and delegates to all Conference churches.

The report of the Credentials Committee was given by the Rev. Donald Ribeiro. By motion, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

By motion, that the Board of Ordination take into consideration allowing all ministers and delegates at the Annual Conference to offer the right hand of fellowship to new ministers received into the Conference. The motion passed.

The Rev. C. L. Patrick reported that the Board of Trustees had conducted no business during the past year.

The report of the Conference Treasurer was given by Mrs. Hilda Sasser. By motion, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Conference Finance Committee was given by Mrs. Hilda Sasser. By motion, the report was adopted. (See Reports.)

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by the Rev. Doug Skinner. By motion, the report was received and the names in it placed in nomination. (See Reports.)

After the moderator opened the floor for further nominations, a motion was made that nominations cease and that the nominees in the report of the Nominating Committee be elected by acclamation. The motion passed.

By motion, we adjourned leaving all unfinished business in the hands of the Executive Committee.

The Rev. N. Bruce Barrow pronounced the benediction.

REPORTS

(November 30, 1988)

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met at Hull Road Church on November 30, 1988, at 10 a.m. The following members were present: Ronnie Hobgood,

Scott Sowers, Gary Bailey and Leon Grubbs.

The moderator called the meeting to order and presented the agenda for the meeting. Scott Sowers led in prayer.

The clerk read the minutes of the Annual Conference. By motion, they were approved.

The lay speaker program was discussed. It was decided to ask the Ordaining Council for an update on how they are progressing with the planned brochure explaining the program for the churches of the Conference.

By motion, the clerk will also ask the Ordaining Council for clarity on the status of several ministers: Robert Murray, Roger Heath and Allen Sterbin.

Possible subjects for a continuing education seminar/workshop were discussed: 1) the lay speaker program; 2) the minister's personal life; 3) the ministry of the deacon.

By motion, Robert Rollins was excused from the last Annual Conference due to his confinement in a nursing home.

By motion, the Ordaining Council will be informed that Jerry Campbell has missed three consecutive meetings of the Annual Conference and that his credentials be called for unless he can give valid and satisfactory reasons for his absences.

By motion, the clerk will notify each church that did not represent by letter at the Annual Conference and ask that a letter be sent as soon as possible.

By motion, we adjourned. Gary Bailey prayed the benediction.

(September 15, 1989)

The Executive Committee met at Hull Road Church on September 15, 1989, at 10 a.m. The following members were present: Ronnie Hobgood, Leon Grubbs, Gary Bailey and Scott Sowers.

The moderator called the meeting to order and gave the agenda for the meeting. Gary Bailey led in prayer.

The minutes of the last Executive Committee meeting were read by the clerk. By motion, they were approved.

The clerk gave the treasurer's report on behalf of Mrs. Sasser who could not attend the meeting; Checking Account-Balance on hand 8/31/89-\$2,742.27; on deposit with Church Finance Association 1/1/89-\$15,526.18.

The moderator extended an invitation for the Annual Conference, scheduled for November 9, 1989, to meet with the Greenville Church. By motion, the invitation was accepted.

The program for the Annual Conference was discussed. Bass Mitchell will be asked to direct congregational singing and provide special music. Glenn A. Mills will be asked to conduct morning devotions. Willis Wilson will be asked to bring the message during the worship service. Janie Sowers will be asked to be the organist and Elma Beddard the planist for the meeting. The clerk will contact the head of each denominational ministry and inform them they will be allowed five minutes if they wish to report to the Conference, and request that they provide the clerk with the name of the individual who will be giving the report.

The moderator reported that contact had been made on three separate occasions with the Campus Ministries of East Carolina University for the purpose of possibly beginning a Christian fellowship for interested students. This would provide an excellent opportunity to establish a ministry, especially for the Free Will Baptist students. It was noted that an East Carolina Fellowship could be easily funded by using the interest earned from monies on deposit with Church Finance (about \$825 annually). By motion, a committee from the Conference composed of Ronnie Hobgood, Janie Sowers and Doug Skinner be asked to meet with the State Convention's Commission on Free Will Baptist Fellowships for the purpose of establishing an East Carolina Fellowship.

The continuing education workshop was discussed. Gary Bailey will contact David Hines about the possibility of holding a seminar on the ministry of the deacon and report back to the Executive Committee.

Possible ways to give special recognition to our ordained ministers who have twentyfive or more years of service to the denomination were discussed. By motion, certificates of appreciation will be presented at this year's Annual Conference to each minister who is a member of the Central Conference who has twenty-five or more years of ministry to our denomination as an ordained minister. Hereafter, the Ordaining Council and Executive Committee will present, at the Annual Conference, appropriate certificates of appreciation to ministers with twenty-five, thirty, thirty-five, forty, forty-five, fifty, etc., years of ordained ministry in our denomination.

The clerk will provide a card requesting each minister to provide the Executive Committee with his date of ordination. These cards will be mailed with the letters informing Conference ministers of the meeting of the Annual Conference.

We adjourned with prayer led by Leon Grubbs.

(November 9, 1989)

The Executive Committee met at First Free Will Baptist Church of Greenville on November 9, 1989, at 8:30 a.m., prior to the meeting of the Annual Conference. Members present were Ronnie Hobgood, Scott Sowers and Leon Grubbs.

The moderator called the meeting to order. Leon Grubbs led in prayer.

The clerk read the report of the Executive Committee to be given at the meeting of the Annual Conference. By motion, it was approved.

The program for the meeting of the Annual Conference was discussed. It was decided to present Certificates of Recognition to ministers with twenty-five or more years of ministry to our denomination as ordained ministers, prior to the report of the Executive Committee. It was also decided that the roll call of ministers be made following the report of the Ordaining Council.

We adjourned with prayer led by Scott Sowers.

ORDAINING COUNCIL

The Ordaining Council of the Central Conference has the responsibility of examining and certifying each candidate for license and ordination, granting clearance or receiving transfer of each minister from another conference, and properly exercising ministerial discipline as set forth in *The Articles of Faith and Principles of Church Government for Original Free Will Baptists.* The Council held four meetings during the past year to conduct its business.

Mike Tart, after having resigned as pastor of Piney Grove Church (Pitt County), met with the Council and voluntarily surrendered his credentials as an Original Free Will Baptist minister due to medical reasons.

Thomas Bowen, a member of Reedy Branch Church, was examined and recommended for license. He was asked to work toward the completion of the educational requirements of this Conference, namely sixty-four semester hours of accredited work, including Bible, church history, theology, and Free Will Baptist history, as well as courses in general education.

Norwood Futrell, who was approved last year to serve as supply pastor of Piney Grove Church (Beaufort County), has been approved for membership in the Conference and is hereby recommended for membership. David Parrish, who has been serving as supply pastor of Bethany Church, has been examined and approved for membership and is hereby recommended to this body. Each of them has been issued a certificate of ordination.

Three ministers met with the Council to request membership in the Conference: Tony Parrish from the Piedmont Conference, who is serving as pastor of Pleasant Hill Church; Howard Starling from the Western Conference, who is serving as pastor of La Grange Church; and Joe Ratcliffe from the Western Conference, who is serving as pastor of Piney Grove Church (Pitt County). Each of these was received by the Council and granted approval to serve as pastor until they are formally received into the Conference at this session. Letters of transfer for each of them have been received. We recommend each of them for membership in the Conference.

The Council approved two ministers to serve as pastors in our Conference: Aubrey Williamson, a member of the Western Conference, to serve as pastor of Saratoga Church; Jeff Cockrell, also a member of the Western Conference, to serve as pastor of Harrell's Chapel Church.

Jerry Campbell was granted a letter of transfer to join the Piedmont Conference.

It was agreed that David Langley could continue his membership in this Conference while serving as pastor of Virginia Beach Free Will Baptist Church.

We recommend that the names of Norwood Futrell, David Parrish, Tony Parrish, Howard Starling, and Joe Ratcliffe be added to the list of ordained ministers of this conference; that the name of Thomas Bowen be added to the list of licensed ministers; and that the names of Mike Tart and Jerry Campbell be dropped from the list of ordained ministers.

We move that this report be adopted.

CENTRAL CONFERENCE MISSIONS BOARD November 9, 1989

The Central Conference Missions Board has experienced a very productive year. We want to thank all of you for your prayers and your financial support this past year. A very special "Thank You" is extended to our ladies who, through the State Woman's Auxiliary Convention, have continued a most generous support. We also want to express our deep appreciation to the churches who send monthly gifts. We depend greatly upon all of you to make it possible for us to continue down an aggressive path toward the goals of your Central Conference Missions Board. These goals as assigned by this Conference are as follows:

- 1. "An Original Free Will Baptist church in every town";
- 2. Stand ready to assist any church in our Conference that might need help: and
- 3. Be prepared to launch out in the establishment of another mission or supporting a prospective group which feels led to organize.

Our financial report reveals deposits in our checking account of \$2,854.54, and expenditures of \$2,252.98; \$2,100 was used to support the Grifton Mission. We also have monies in a savings account and "The Central Conference Missions Board Endowment Fund" with the Church Finance Association. The interest from these savings has enabled us over the last two years to purchase central air conditioning units for Hillside as well as replace a roof. The Grifton Mission is continuing to grow under the able leadership of the Rev. Jimmy Sowers. During this last year your Missions Board has continued its supplement to the property payment in the amount of \$200 per month from July to December, and \$150 per month from January to June. The Grifton Mission has requested that we begin a phase-out program of support by reducing our supplemental support. In January we will reduce our support by \$50 per month and continue to reduce every six months until all our support is phased-out!
