

Proceedings

- The Central Conference, being the continuation of the General Conference of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened in its 258th annual session with Marlboro Free Will Baptist Church of Farmville, North Carolina, on Thursday, November 9, 2006, at 9:30 a.m.
- The Conference opened with the hymn, "Majesty." Opening scripture and prayer were offered by Rev. David Allen.
- The Reverend Brad Williamson, clerk, called the 258th annual session to order. The Reverend Ronnie Mohn, pastor of the host church, extended a cordial welcome to the Conference.
- The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, moderator, shared several points using 1 Samuel 2:35 as his text. The Reverend Hobgood reminded the Conference that the priest Eli has failed in his duties and that God was going to clean house. God would not do away with the office of priest, but He would choose someone who is faithful. The text tells that this faithful servant would do what God wanted to be done. The Reverend Hobgood stated that we must be careful to carry out the work of our Lord. It must be His work because it is His Church. He exhorted us to keep this in mind as the Conference meets; that our desire would be to faithful to carry out His work. He exhorted us to do God's will God's way.
- The roll of churches was called with 35 churches responding with delegates.
- 14 visitors were recognized and welcomed by the moderator.
- The moderator appointed temporary committees as follows: Nominating Committee: Reverends Frankie Baggett, Frank Cockrell, Barry Williamson Resolutions Committee: Reverends Leon Grubbs, Tony Glass, Philip Wood Parliamentarian: Dr. Michael Pelt
- The report of the Executive Committee was read by the clerk. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]
- The report of the Board of Ordination was read by Reverend Tony Glass. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]
- The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, moderator, along with the Conference extended a welcome to membership in the conference to Reverends David Allen, Marc Boswell, Bobby Jones, and Arnold Price as ordained ministers. Welcome was also extended to Devlyn McCreight, Bryan Perry, and James Wiggins as licensed ministers.
- At 10:15 a.m. the Conference business was set aside for the worship service. The service was opened with a responsive call to worship led by Reverend Ronnie Hobgood. The prayer

of invocation was given by Reverend Doctor Franklin Baggett. The congregation was then led by Reverend Philip Boykin in the singing of "Praise Him! Praise Him!", "Praise the Name of Jesus," and "Let's Just Praise the Lord." The offering for the conference was then received and the offertory prayer was given by Reverend Kevin Jackson. Special music was presented by the Reverend Grady Tucker. The Reverend Phillip Boykin led in the morning prayer. The congregation was then led by Reverend Boykin in the singing of "Sanctuary." The Reverend Johnny Sullivan delivered the conference sermon entitled, "Enabled by the Spirit." His text came from Isaiah 41:8-13. Reverend Sullivan stated that every minister of God must be ready to face the spiritual battles around. However, we have hope knowing that God will be with us every step of the way. We must look to God knowing that He is the One Isaiah spoke of concerning Israel's safety. We must rely upon the Spirit of Almighty God to enable us everyday to minister in the local church. He stated that God is able to do all things, but we must make a commitment to surrender everything to His will. The text of Isaiah shows us several promises that we can claim as our own as we serve the Lord. Christians must be students of prayer and Bible study, and young and old alike must make the most of the opportunities given to us. Reverend Sullivan exhorted the Conference to be a people of vision trusting that God will bring His plans to completion. Christians must take a stand for the things of God and rely upon the Bible as we operate under God's care. If the Church has been enabled by the Spirit, then let us be proactive. Since we have been enabled by God's Spirit we have nothing to fear. Reverend Sullivan stated that he sought to encourage the Conference and remind the Conference what an Awesome God we serve. He also stated that now is the time for us to move forward for Christ.

The worship service concluded with the singing of "Breath on Me" and a corporate reading of an affirmation of faith based on our Articles of Faith.

The service closed in prayer by Reverend Brad Williamson.

The business session continued at 11:10 a.m.

The Reverend Doctor Franklin Baggett, assistant moderator, presented certificates to the following ministers in recognition of years of service: Reverend Norwood Furtrell [55 years], Stewart Humphrey [40 years], Reverend Stanley Buck [35 years], Reverend Bruce

Jones [35 years], Reverend Clifford Ball [25 years], and Reverend James Owens [25 years], Reverend Ed Thorton [25] years.

The Conference recessed for the noon meal at 12:00 p.m. with the singing of "I Love to Tell the Story" and a prayer by Reverend Charles Branch.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session was called to order at 1:00 p.m. with singing of "He Leadeth Me."

The Reverend Charles Branch, Miss Leah McGlohon, and Reverend Charles Russell gave the report of the Memorial Committee. By motion the report was adopted. [see Reports]

Reverend Marc Boswell gave the report of the Credentials Committee. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

The roll call of ministers was called with 55 ministers present.

The Reverend Kevin Jackson gave the Treasurer's Report. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

By motion, it was agreed to accept the proposed Conference budget for 2006-2007. [see Reports]

The Reverend Jack Weathersby gave the report of the Church Growth Committee. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

The Reverend Johnny Sullivan gave the report of the Continuing Education Committee. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

The Reverend Doctor Franklin Baggett gave the report of the Nominating Committee. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

The floor was opened for other nominations. By motion, the nominations ceased, and the nominees were elected by acclamation.

The Reverend Leon Grubbs gave the report of the Resolutions Committee. By motion, the report was adopted. [see Reports]

The moderator called for miscellaneous business. By motion, it was agreed to accept the recommendations of the Executive Committee. [see Reports]

The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, moderator, gave challenging closing remarks concerning the work of Conference and the need for us to rely upon the Lord as we seek to serve Him in the coming year.

A love offering was received for a family whose baby has had three liver transplants within

the last month. By motion, it was agreed for the Conference to add two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) to the offering of \$679.17 received.

The Conference was adjourned by singing "He Is Lord."

The Conference was dismissed with prayer by the congregation as they recited "The Lord's Prayer."

The Conference in connection with the Central District Youth Fellowship reconvened at 6:30pm for a time of worship and fun as the youth of our Conference met together at Black Jack Free Will Baptist Church for a lock-in. Several churches were represented at the lock-in and had a wonderful time.

Reports

Report of the Executive Committee

November 28, 2005

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on November 28, 2005, at 9:30 a.m. at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Greenville. Present for the meeting were the Reverends Ronnie Hobgood, Frankie Baggett, Brad Williamson, Phillip Boykin, and Kevin Jackson. The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood called the meeting to order and read from Isaiah 9:6-7. The Reverend Kevin Jackson opened with prayer.

The minutes of the 257th session of the Central Conference were read, corrected, and approved.

By motion, it was agreed to send the Board of Ordination the roll call of ministers from the Conference meeting for them to make appropriate responses to those absent without excuse. It was also decided that Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, moderator, would send a letter to the ministers who were absent.

By motion, it was agreed to contact those churches that did not send a letter or contribution this past Conference informing them of this oversight.

The Reverend Kevin Jackson presented the treasurer's report and by motion the report was approved.

Discussion was given concerning the upcoming workshop "Facing Today's Ethical Issues." It was noted that one presenter had a conflict with Tuesdays. For the workshop that will be

divided into two parts, the first session will be March 7th and the second session will be March 16th. Other details were worked out as well.

It was mentioned that a letter would need to be sent out reminding the ministers of Central Conference of the dues now required.

Discussion was given concerning a Central Conference church. A member of that church has written a letter to the Executive Committee concerning some questions about the procedures of the church. The Executive Committee examined the letter and discussion followed.

Discussion was given concerning the request to examine the wording of the Conference's Constitution in regards to the Church Growth Committee and who that committee is able to help financially. The Executive Committee decided to continue this discussion at later meetings.

By motion, it was agreed Reverend Kevin Jackson will continue to serve as an appointed representative to the Church Growth Committee, and Reverend Phillip Boykin will continue to serve as an appointed representative to the Continuing Education Committee.

The next meeting of the Central Conference Executive Committee will be February 6, 2006 at 9:30am at the First FWB Church, Greenville.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Reverend Phillip Boykin.

February 6, 2006

the North Carolina Foundation For Christian Ministries. This money will be for the Michael R. Pelt Endowed Scholarship Fund. The funds from the scholarship will be used by Original Free Will Baptist ministers enrolled in seminary or divinity school.

Discussion was given concerning other business. It was decided that the Board of Ordination and the Executive Committee should meet jointly to discuss a few issues.

The next meeting of the Central Conference Executive Committee will be March 13, 2006 at 10:00am at the First FWB Church, Greenville.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Reverend Kevin Jackson.

March 13, 2006

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on March 13, 2006, at 10:00 a.m. at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Greenville. Present for the meeting were the Reverends Ronnie Hobgood, Frankie Baggett, Brad Williamson, Phillip Boykin, and Kevin Jackson. The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood called the meeting to order and read from Matthew 5:13-16. The Reverend Phillip Boykin opened with prayer.

Discussion was given concerning other business. It was brought to the attention of the committee that Reverend Scott Satterfield, an Original Free Will Baptist minister, has begun a ministry for East Carolina University students. Any church that would like to help support this ministry is encouraged to do so. Attendance at each Conference was also discussed with a decision to continue the discussion at later meetings.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Reverend Kevin Jackson.

April 10, 2006

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on April 10, 2006, at 10:00 a.m. at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Greenville. Present for the meeting were the Reverends Ronnie Hobgood, Brad Williamson, Phillip Boykin, and Kevin Jackson. The Reverend Ronnie Hobgood called the meeting to order and read from Proverbs 3:5-6. The Reverend Kevin Jackson opened with prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Reverend Kevin Jackson presented the treasurer's report and by motion the report was approved.

An update was given concerning the Boards and Committees of the Conference.

Discussion was given concerning other possible events and workshops. The possibility of a dinner for ministers and their wives was again discussed. It was decided that Reverend Ronnie Hobgood would begin to work on planning this dinner.

Discussion was given concerning the upcoming Conference and a possible speaker for the Conference.

It was noted that the Conference will be sending at least two delegates to the 2006 Convention.

Present for the meeting were the Reverends Frankie Baggett, Brad Williamson, Phillip Boykin, and Kevin Jackson. The Reverend Frankie Baggett called the meeting to order and read from Proverbs 3:5-6. The Reverend Phillip Boykin opened with prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Reverend Kevin Jackson presented the treasurer's report and by motion the report was approved.

It was noted that Reverend Walt Tyndall has resigned from the Board of Ordination and the Reverend Doctor Franklin Baggett will serve until the November Conference.

Discussion was given concerning the upcoming Conference and it was stated that the letter to the Churches and Ministers need to be sent by September 15, 2006.

Discussion was given concerning the publication of a book on Conference policies and procedures. These would include all committees and the motions passed at each Conference. The minutes for the last twenty-five years will be examined with each Executive Committee member taking five years apiece.

It was noted that the Church Growth Committee has met through email several times. The Continuing Education Committee has not had a need to meet since nothing has been sent in by any minister.

Discussion was given concerning the Churches in the Conference that are in need of a Pastor.

At that time the Executive Committee met jointly with the Board of Ordination. Discussion was once again given concerning the format and other considerations of the Ordination Service of Ministers. Other concerns such as a revision of the ordination exam and educational requirements were discussed as well.

The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Reverend Kevin Jackson.

September 26, 2006

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met on September 26, 2006 at 9:00 a.m. at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Greenville. Present for the meeting were the Reverends Ronnie Hobgood, Frankie Baggett, Brad Williamson, Phillip Boykin, and Kevin Jackson. The Reverend Frankie Baggett called the meeting to order and read from Zachariah 4:6 and Acts 1:8. The Reverend Phillip Boykin opened with prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Reverend Kevin Jackson presented the treasurer's report and by motion the report was approved.

Discussion was given concerning the last joint meeting with the Board of Ordination, as well as the Church Growth Committee and Continuing Education Committee.

Discussion was given concerning the November 2005–October 2006 Conference budget. The November 2006 – October 2007 budget was then discussed and finalized for final approval at the Conference.

Discussion was given concerning the upcoming Conference. It was noted that Reverend Johnny Sullivan would bring the morning message during the Conference. The Reverend Doctor Franklin Baggett agreed to serve as chairman of the Nominating Committee. It was noted that Conference reports should be given to the Moderator, Reverend Ronnie Hobgood, by October 15, 2006. A Central District Youth Fellowship lock-in was discussed to coincide with the Conference meeting. The Reverend Brad Williamson agreed to represent the Executive Committee to work with the Central District Youth Fellowship leaders in planning the event. The Reverend Doctor Franklin Baggett agreed to prepare the certificates for Central Conference ministers serving twenty-five years or more on a five year interval. The Reverend Charles Branch will oversee the Memorial Service. Discussion was also given concerning the Conference format.

Discussion was given concerning the publication of a book on Conference policies and procedures. These would include all committees and the motions passed at each Conference. The minutes for the last twenty-five years will be examined with each Executive Committee member taking five years apiece. Report of the Memorial Committee

In II Timothy 4:6-8, Paul says, "For I am now ready to be offered, and the time of my departure is at hand. I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only but unto all them also that love His appearing".

In our memorial service today, we want to remember those who have faithfully served the Lord through the Central Conference of Original Free Will Baptist. We have had one of our ministers to enter his eternal reward along with many brothers and sisters from our local churches. We thank God today for the lives and influence of these individuals.

We remember the Reverend Billy Ray Jordan.

The Reverend Billy Ray Jordan was born March 27, 1941 and passed away on March 15, 2006. He was a native of Wayne County. He graduated from Nahunta High School, attended Mount Olive College and received an associate degree from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary in 1966. He accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior at the age of 14. He was licensed to preach at the Union Grove Free Will Baptist Church and was ordained by the Western Conference on October 17, 1962. He later transferred to the Central Conference.

Among the churches he served were Northern, Trinity, Shiloh, New Sandy Hill, May's Chapel, Community, Spring Branch, Piney Grove (Albertson) and Indian Springs.

Reverend Jordan is survived by his mother, Annie Talton Jordan, two sisters, Roseitta Holland and Lillian Starling and several nieces and nephews.

Report of the Church Growth Committee

This past year we were able to assist Central Conference Churches as follows:

- 1) Elm Grove OFWB Church requested \$491.70 for the purchase of 300 God's Sacrifice for You books to pass out during the Lenten Season. Church members were encouraged to pass out the books to those who do not attend church and who do not know Christ as Savior. The books are written by Billy Graham and Max Lucado. They are divided into small chapters; the first dealing with the need for salvation, then the sacrifice that Christ made, how one can be saved, and what it means to be saved.
- 2) Friendship OFWB Church requested \$500.00 toward a Hispanic Revival in Walstonburg, May 11-14. The money was used to assist with outreach, music, speakers, and materials.

- 3) Rose Hill OFWB Church requested \$500.00 to assist with a family outreach program in August. The funds were used to reestablish the family unit at Rose Hill. Activity equipment was rented and information was mailed into the surrounding community. The hopes of the project were to connect the past, present, and future church together. It was to be a day for the entire family.
- 4) Free Union OFWB Church requested \$500.00 toward its annual trip to Winter Xtreme in Gatlinburg, Tennessee. The program is geared toward teenagers and the challenges they face in their personal evangelism. The leaders of the conference include Johnny Hunt, Josh McDowell, and Dave Edwards. The youth have been blessed during the past two years and have come back motivated toward deeper Christian service and outreach. Last year 2 youth made first time decisions and 13 rededicated their lives from Free Union.

We would like to encourage our churches to take advantage of this opportunity for assistance. The limit is one request per church per quarter. Up to \$500.00 may be requested to assist with church evangelism projects.

Report of the Continuing Education Committee

Continuing Education Units

The purpose of the Central Conference Continuing Education Program is to help our ministers with the practice of life-long learning. By continuing their education Central Conference ordained ministers will continue to grow in their spiritual walk with Christ and as they grow they will be better equipped to serve the churches of the Central Conference. As the leadership of the churches grow the church itself will grow, therefore the growth and continuing education of the ministers is vital to the growth of the church. It is imperative that the ministers of the Central Conference follow the advice given to Timothy by Paul when he said, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

Guidelines

Continuing Education Units (henceforth referred to as CEU's) will be based on educational opportunities. These would include reading a book, attending a seminar or class, or taking a college or seminary class. Books that are read must be submitted with the following information: name of book, author, publisher, dates the book was read and a typed 150-word summary and application of the book. Seminars must be submitted with the following information: organization that sponsored the seminar, presenter's name, length

of seminar, and a typed 150-word summary and application of the seminar. College or seminary courses must be submitted with the following information: College or seminary where class was taken, professor's name, copy of the syllabus, and typed 150-word summary and application of the class.

Credits

CEU credits will be given according to the following scale:

Books: up to 200 pages $\frac{1}{2}$ CEU; 200-400 pages 1 CEU. Books over 400 pages will be considered on an individual basis.

Seminars: 3-5 hour seminar $\frac{1}{2}$ CEU; 6-10 hour seminar 1 CEU. Seminar over ten hours will be considered on an individual basis.

College or Seminary Class: If the class is taken from an accredited institution (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools or Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada) one will receive 4 CEUs for each credit hour. (Credit hour equals one hour per week in class for sixteen weeks; for example if you take a 3 credit hour course you will receive 12 CEUs.) If the course is taken from an institution that is not accredited by SACS or ATS, then it will be considered on an individual basis.

Areas of Study

Biblical Studies: This includes any area of study from the Bible such as books of the Bible, themes, authors, or historical information from the Bible.

Historical Studies: This includes History of the Christian Church, Free Will Baptist Denomination, or Local Churches.

Theological Studies: This includes areas of studies from the following: Prolegomena, Bibliology, Theology Proper, Christology, Pneumatology, Anelology, Anthropology, Soteriology, Ecclesiology, Eschatology, etc.

Practical Studies: This includes area of studies concerning the working and growth of the local church, pastoral care, counseling, leadership, administration, evangelism, preaching and worship.

Spiritual Formation Studies: This includes area of studies concerning maturity of Christians.

Procedures

To receive credit work must be submitted to the Continuing Education Committee. Proper documentation must be submitted along with the Continuing Education Committee Form. The committee will review all work and the committee will send notification to the one who submitted the work and also the Board of Ordination.
