#### Minutes of the Central Illinois Yearly Meeting of Free Baptist.

The Central Illinois Yearly Meeting of Free Baptist met with the first Free Baptist Church of Murphysboro, Ills., Friday, at 8:00 o'clock A. M., Oct. 1st, 1909, and was called to order by Rev. G. A. Gordon, standing clerk. After devotional exercises Rev. J. J. Tatum was elected moderator, Rev. J. F. Kirk assistant moderator and Rev. S. A. Bradley assistant clerk.

Letters called for, and Looney Springs, Lebanon, Wayne County, Franklin County, Freedom and Williamson County Quarterly Meetings presented letters, which were read, and the delegates seated. Also read the constitution and by-laws and minutes.

The Chair appointed Frey, Kirk and Bundy a committee to select committees.

Met and opened by singing and prayer by Brother T. J. Mayer. Minutes read.

Committee on Temperance made report Discussed, amended and adopted (see report) The matter referred by the Institute to this body, "The Heresy of Tongues," was brought up and referred to Committee on Doctrine.

Committee on Home Missions made report and adopted (see report).

Committee on Publications made report and adopted (see report).

Committee on Doctrine made report and adopted (see report).

Committee on Ciedentials made report. Adopted.

Committee on Sunday Schools made report and adopted (see report).

Rev. G. A. Gordon made report as member of the General Conference Board. Talked of Home and Foreign Missions, emphasizing the importance of contributing to the Home and Foreign Mission fund, portraying the needs. Rev. J. J. Tatum reported the work moving on nicely in Iowa, and brought us Christian greeting. Rev. L. C. Chase of Nebraska Yearly Meeting, who has moved into our bounds, spoke cheeringly of their work. Rev. J. M. Glasson of Ohio was with us throughout and preached two very acceptable sermons. All adding very much to the pleasure bleness of the occasion. Adjourned.

Rev. J. J. Tatum preached at 7:30 p. m.

MORNING SESSION, 8:30 A. M.

Met and opened by singing and prayer by Rev. L. C. Chase. Minutes read. Roll called and 86 responded.

Notice was given by G. A. Gordon that a change would be asked at next session of Article 6 of the Constitution, changing time of holding Yearly Meeting from Oct. 1st to Sept. 1st Sunday. Voted that the rules be suspended, and that the next session be held on 1st Sunday in Sept. Ministers' Institute to begin on Tuesday before.

Request of J. N. Allen was referred to Committee on Requests.

Committee on Requests reported and report adopted (see report).

R. E. Williamson was elected Treasurer to succeed J. F. Hanna.

Rev. D. H. Wells was elected on the Board of Examiners.

The Treasurer was instructed to pay the 1 cent tax of \$137.07, now past due, as soon as possible; \$50.00 of which he paid.

Rev. Wm. Barringer was elected on the Home Mission Board to succeed himself.

Voted that the Examining Board be requested to furnish the Yearly Meeting Sessions a synoptical statement, giving a brief review of the examination of each candidate for license or ordination, showing candidate's educational and doctrinal qualifications; said statement to be submitted before the Yearly Meeting votes on granting or rejecting applications for license or ordination.

Rev. G. A. Gordon was elected State Agent.

Committee on Requests made report as follows: That Rev. J. N. Allen be granted a letter of recommendation, and that the request of Freedom Quarterly Meeting to withdraw from the Yearly Meeting be not granted. Report adopted.

The following committee was appointed to enquire into the dissatisfied condition of the Freedom Quarterly Meeting and report next year: Revs. J. W. McKinney, Fred Comber and A. J. Rendleman.

Adjourned to 1:30 p. m.

Rev. H. F. Carter preached at 11 o'clock.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Met and opened by singing and prayer by Rev. W. A. Pitman. Minutes read and roll called.

Voted that Julia Humphrey is hereby silenced from preaching, and the Clerk instructed to call in her credentials. Also Peter Pilson's license is hereby called in by vote of this Yearly Meeting and they both are hereby silenced as Free Baptist preachers for preaching the "Heresy of Tongues."

Voted that Rev. A. J. Rendleman be elected moderator to fill vacancy for one year.

Institute called to order by the standing clerk Rev. Fred Comber at 2 p. m.

Rev. G. V. Frey was elected Moderator, Rev. W. W. Barringer elected Assistant Moderator and Rev. J. H. Bagwill elected assistant clerk.

On motion the program was adopted, and the committee instructed to substitute or make any change necessary.

On motion the hour for opening the Institute be 8:30 a. m. and closing at 4 p. m.

On motion by Bagwill the order of business was suspended long enough to give Rev. Glasson the hand of welcome and Christian fellowship.

On motion by Bagwill, Brothers Warren Holmes and Robert Smith be invited to sign the constitution.

Rev. H. M. Loar, pastor of the First Methodist church of Murphysboro, was invited to give a report of the work done at the annual conference, held at Centralia, Illinois. He briefly stated some of the work done during the year.

Rev. Frey read a paper on "The Divorce Evil," discussed by Bagwill, Gordon, Loar and Barringer.

On motion by Barringer, Rev. Frey's paper on "The Divorce Evil" be sent to the Morning Star for publication.

Motion to adjourn until 8:30 a.m. Preaching at 7:30 by Rev. Frey; subject: "Ye are God's Building."

WEDNESDAY-8:30 A. M.

Devotion services led by Rev. Shaw. A short time was given for testimonies, all present participating. Minutes read and approved.

On motion by Bagwill, the clerk was instructed to send a telegram of condolence to Rev. Wells expressing the sympathy of the Institute to him in his illness.

On motion by Gordon, Rev. Wells' paper "Should Every Member Contribute to Missions" was read by Rev. Brown. The paper was discussed by Gordon and Blythe.

Rev. Comber read a paper on "Pastoral Theology," discussed by Pitman, Franklin, Blythe, Bagwill, Frey, Barringer, Gordon and Jeffry. On motion by Bagwill the paper was ordered sent to The Star for publication.

Rev. Reynolds, pastor of the M. E. South of Murphysboro, was introduced and invited to a seat in counsel.

Sermon outline by S. A. Bradley, John 1:17, discussed by Gordon, Comber and Shaw. Adjourned by prayer by W. A. Pitman. Preaching 11 a. m. by W. W. Barringer, subject; "The Gospel of Jesus Christ;" text, Mark 16:14.

Institute convened at 2 p. m. by devotional services conducted by S. A. Bradley. Several testified to the time, place and age of their conversion. Minutes read and approved.

On motion by Barringer, all who were candidates for examination were invited to sign the constitution.

J. A. Wise read an outline on John 3:3, discussed by Franklin, Blythe, Gordon, Frey, Shaw, Kirk, Andre, Carter and Pitman.

Gordon gave a talk on "Higher Criticism" instead of a paper on the same subject by J. L. Meads, discussed by Frey and Jeffry.

Kirk gave a talk on Isaiah 62:4.

Gordon read a paper on "Denominational Loyalty."

Bagwill read a paper on "Homiletical Theology," discussed by Pitman and Blythe.

Adjourned by prayer by Kirk. Preaching at 7:30 by C. A. Brown; Text, Acts 16:6-10; Subject, "Divine Guidance."

THURSDAY-8:30 A. M.

Institute called to order by devotional services by C. H. Andre. Minutes read and approved. Reports read by ministers of work done.

Bills from Gordon and Comber for clerk and printing expenses to the amount of \$8.70 allowed and the amount was immediately raised by the members present.

Barringer read a paper on "Systematic Theology," discussed by Kirk, Frey and Gordon.

Talk by Pitman, "Should We Preach on the Doctrines of Our Church More?" discussed by Comber and Gordon.

Adjourned by prayer by Carter. Preaching at 11 by Kirk, text, John 14:1-6; subject, "The Only Way."

THURSDAY-1:30 P. M.

Institute convened. Devotional exercises led by Pitman, minutes read and approved.

Committee to visit McMillan reported their visit and committee discharged.

Committee on obtaining report blanks for preachers reported. Report received and committee discharged.

On motion by Gordon the following resolution was adopted: Resolved. that Brother J. W. McMillan be restored to membership in this Institute and that his papers surrendered a year ago be restored to him when he unites with the church.

J. W. McKinney's paper, "Is the Socialistic Theory of Government a Danger to the Church?" was read by the secretary in the absence of the writer, discussed by Kirk and Frey.

Sermon outline by Charles H. Andre, I Corinthians 15:20.

Franklin read a paper, "Relation of the Christian Endeavor and Sunday School to the Church." On invitation John Jeffry, president of the Jackson County Sunday School Association, gave some very encouraging remarks upon the importance of the Sunday School and Christian Endeavor work.

Sermon outline, I John 3:1, by J. H. Blythe. Character of ministers passed upon.

On motion by Barringer, amended by Bagwill, that the hand of fellow-

ship be withdrawn from Sister Humphrey and all others who are teaching the doctrine of Tongues, and the matter be referred to the Yearly Meeting for further consideration.

Committee on Program appointed to arrange program for next session, Wm. Barringer, J. H. Bagwill and G. A. Gordon.

Resolved that we have the Clerk of the Yearly Meeting have the papers that were read before this body printed in the minutes of the Yearly Meeting session.

On motion by Bagwill the papers ordered sent to the Morning Star be withheld.
