COMMITTEE ON YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

Your committee on young people's work feel greatly encouraged by reports of work accomplished. Youth activities have gone forward rapidly in every department this year. We have four young people leagues: Bryan, North Zulch, Keith and Cross, with approximately 175 members. We urge where it is possible to organize leagues.

Probably the most outstanding youth activity sponsored by the churches was that of the sponsorship and organization of a camp training school. This association is proud of its accomplishments. Their camp was held at Wood Lake the first week in August with an enrollment of 32 boys and girls with six teachers. As you know most of these come

from our association. We feel that the spiritual development and physical training of these boys and girls received was well worth the efforts extended in its promotion.

It is through this constructive program that we may meet the challenge of our youth.

If we, as a denomination develop leaders in the field of church activities we must educate our young people. A study course is recommended for every church, Sunday School and League that we might carry on the work in a more efficient way.

It is our duty to accept this challenge and meet it with enthusiasm and courage.

Report of Christian Education Committee of Central Texas Free Will Baptist Association

We your committee on Christian Education beg leave to submit the following report:

We feel that there is just cause for sounding an optimistic note. As most of us know, already, there is a plan being worked to the end of establishing a centrally located training school for the training of our talent. This work is sponsored by the National Board of Christian Education. It is gratifying to be able to report the fact that this District Association is leading all others of like organization, in cash raised and pledges made and turned over to the National Board. Practically all the churches have responded, and support has been by practically every organization in the district.

The total amount of cash turned over to the board is\$ 229.55
The total amount pledged to the board is 1088.00

We further find that there has been quite a bit of cash raised toward assisting Brother Aston Pegues in going to school, and that those who are active in the quarterly meeting work are drawing plans to continue such assistance. The amount of cash raised by the quarterly meeting for this purpose to date is \$51.00 and the amount raised through the L. A. S. District is \$15.00, total \$66.00.

Your league committee wishes to commend our people for their sentiment and work in this field of noble endeavor, and recommend a greater sacrifice on the part of our people as a whole to the end of a constructive educational program.

We understand that there was a meeting held of representatives in the State of Texas at the National Association held last July, and that this group agreed that the State of Texas would endeavor to raise 25 cents per member by the sitting of the next National Association and

turn same over to our National Board of Education. Half of this was to be raised by January 1, 1940, and the other half by July 1, 1940. Your education committee wishes to recommend that the Central Texas Association assume its proportional part of this responsibility, and that each church be urged to rally to its support.
