REPORT ON SOCIAL JUSTICE

To the Central Texas Association while in session at Bright Light Church, October 18, 1941.

As temporary directors of Social Justice in the bounds of our Association, I wish to submit the following: By general observation, it is readily seen that this is a field of Christian Service, which challenges the best effort possible within us.

The cause of Temperance has been seriously neglected by far too many who bear the name Christian, and the social and moral status of American life seems to be approaching deplorable proportions. I, therefore, wish to recommend to the membership of the Central Texas F. W. B. Association, that we list this cause as a special object of prayer, and that in word and in deed we discourage the legislation of any business that tends to deplete the moral and social life of our Nation, State, Counties, and local communities. That we further register our sentiments as against any form of legalized business which is now so operating, and use our influence to get such laws passed as may be instrumental in cleaning up some of the moral corruptions which seem to be the fruit of such traffic. It is, however, the sentiment of your director that the best approach to the solution of such problems is a vigorous campaign in proclaiming the delivering power of Jesus as a personal Saviour.

Miss Barnard, who has been in India for the past five years, doing a great work, is here at the present time, and very anxious to return. She wants at least six workers in India. We have in our denomination a number of young people who have had the call, and are ready to go. We feel like we should make it possible for them to carry the Word of God and the teachings of Jesus Christ to the uttermost parts of the earth. REPORT ON CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

I am glad to report that during the year of 1941 a growing and increasing interest has been shown in our Christian Education work. The contributions of the past year have been encouraging, because they have increased in volume, and these contributions have come from the entire district.

The interest that many churches of this district has shown is due to the efforts and cooperation of our National Chairman, Rev. J. R. Davidson. It was through his encouragement that some of the churches adopted the bank plan, that is churches with full time service raise \$1.00 per day, half time service, 50c per day, and one fourth time service, 25c per day. The churches that adopted this plan were Bryan, Blue Lake, Cross, and Plainview. Bryan and Blue Lake have gone over the top each month with their contributions. Churches making contributions, but using other plans were: Bright Light, North Zulch, Keith, Pine Prairie, and Edge.

In cooperation with the National Association of Free Will Baptist and the United States, be it recommended that we support this National Training School in every way possible to give it a firm foundation, and make it something every Free Will Baptist will be proud of.

Since the bank plan has proven a success by those churches who have adopted it, be it also recommended that all churches in this District adopt this plan, and use the funds for the support of the National Unified Program.

THE BRIGHT LIGHT CHURCH

Subject:— Prospects of an Organized Free Will Baptist Church in Houston, Texas.

Brethren:

This subject has been brought up and discussed for the past year with no definite steps having been taken to really get started to work. As you probably know one of the most important things in connection with organizing a church, or business, is having a central place to work. This we have not had and as the situation stands the

known few here in Houston are not in a financial position to go ahead and rent a building that would be adequate even for a beginning. It is my sincere belief that if we have a place to worship we will be, within a period of approximately six months, in a position to go ahead and bear the expense of all our activities. But until such time as we do have some financial assistance from some source other than the few here in Houston, it will be very difficult to get our people organized. With all the other churches so well established and working so diligently to increase their membership, we must begin at once and work hard to get any results.

As you know the Free Will Baptist organization, even though we do not press our finances enough, do have some excellent workers in the field who are getting real results. I believe once we could get started here that Houston is a rich territory. This, due to the fact that there are approximately 400,000 people here and my guess is, that about 150,000 have no church affiliations whatsoever. Bearing this in mind I believe it to the advantage of this association to give due consideration to the possibility of bearing at least a portion of the rent of a building in Houston for a trial period of not less than six months time, taking inventory to see just what results have been obtained at the end of this period before going further.

Your prayers in the matter are what mean more than any other one feature which might come out. May God give us all great minds and sincere hearts with which to weigh this matter in God's cause and see if it is not found wanting. And if found wanting, pray God for aid to overcome this difficulty.
