Minutes of the February 10, 1979 Annual District Conference  
Eastside FWB Church, Houston

Brother Ed Morris, music director for the day, opened the meeting at 10:00 A.M. with a congregational song "Onward Christian Soldiers" accompanied by Beverly Welker, pianist, and Charlene Denman, organist. Rev. Bill Zamora led in prayer. Another song "I Would Not Be Denied" was sung after which the moderator called the meeting to order for business.

The Constitution & By-Laws were read by the moderator according to Article Thirteen of the By-Laws.

Bro. Charles Denman gave a partial report of the Credentials Board. Fifteen churches reported with proper dues and fourteen church letters were received. A mc to receive the report.

A motion was made and carried to adopt the program with any necessary changes to be made during the day.

The moderator appointed Rev. Sanford Davis, chrnm., Mrs. Alpha Sheffield and Mrs. Thelma Anderson to serve on the Resolutions Committee. The Obituary Committee was appointed by the moderator as follows: Mrs. Marjorie Morris, chrnm., Karen Spores and Mrs. Geneva Ladnor.

Copies of the Financial Report were passed out and examined after which a mmc to accept it.

The Woman's Auxiliary report by Rita McDuffie was received as information.

Rev. Allen Moore, State Executive Secretary, read Titus 2:11-12 and reported on the State Work. He reported that the preachers for the Worship Services of the State Meeting will be Rev. Billy Walker, Rev. Roy Norrie and Rev. Keith Woody.

Recess was declared by the moderator.

Bro. Ed Morris led the congregation in a song after which Rev. Sanford Davis led in prayer. Two more congregational songs were sung and the offering in the amount of \$62.79 was received. Rev. Billy Walker prayed the offertory prayer.

The morning special in music, "The Blood Will Never Lose It's Power", was sung by Bob Morris accompanied by Charlene Denman.

Rev. Billy Walker gave instructions about the noon meal and called on Bro. Marvin Wampler to lead in prayer to dismiss and for the food.

After lunch the song "When the Roll Is Called Up Yonder" was sung by the congregation.

Mrs. Betty Kelly gave the CTS Report and it was received as information.

A mmc to receive the following reports: Retirement & Insurance, Rev. Paul Meyer; Student Loan Board by Bro. A.V. Jennische; Christian Education, printed, and Home Mission Board by Verlan Pegues.

Rev. Sanford Davis presented the following Resolutions to the body and a mmc to act on them item by item:

1. Article 13 under the By-Laws be ammended to read as follows:

"The preamble only shall be read at each Annual meeting of this association. Any article or part thereof may be read as deemed necessary by the moderator. Tabled.

2. That in the Constitution, the word "his" in Section 2 and Section 4 be deleted. Tabled.

3. That Bro. Moore be given a \$25.00 honorarium in addition to regular state office support. Carried.

4. That churches be encouraged to mail letters to clerk at least 2 weeks in advance. Tabled.

5. That each church be encouraged to send a minimum of \$20.00 to the

District Clerk to apply toward the expense of the state meeting as soon as possible. Carried.

6. In response to the request of the Lighthouse FWB Church, regarding an associated Press release printed in the Temple Daily Telegram on Monday, January 8, 1979, said article having been confirmed by Mr. Charles Pinchman, Public Information Editor with Reader's Digest, Inc., Pleasantville, N.Y., concerning the condensation of the Bible. As Christians we believe the Bible to be the Holy Inspired Word of God, given by God to man as a rule of faith and practice. We do not believe that any of the Bible is unnecessary. In light of the final warnings given to man in Revelation 22:19 ("And if any man shall take away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God shall take away his part out of the book of life, and out of the holy city, and from the things which are written in this book."), we wish to go on record with the following resolutions:
  1. That the Reader's Digest, Inc. be informed of our opposition to this work.
  2. That each and every church member be encouraged to respond to this action individually by every means at their disposal.  
(Address: Reader's Digest, Inc., Pleasantville, New York, 10570)
  3. That other Christians be encouraged to express their feelings to this work, both individually and collectively.
  4. That this matter be passed on to our State and National bodies with a request that similar action be taken." Carried.
7. That each church be encouraged to channel their outside giving through the District Clerk to facilitate bookkeeping and reports. C.
8. That a rising vote of appreciation be given to the host church for their hospitality. Carried.

The General Board minutes were read and a mmc to accept the recommendations and act upon them item by item.

- Item 1. That Article IV, Composition, of the Constitution be changed to read--This association shall consist of the delegates duly appointed or elected by regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Churches or Missions who may embody themselves under this constitution; ordained Free Will Baptist ministers and their wives; ordained deacons and their wives and all elected district board members, who are members of Free Will Baptist Churches or Missions composing this association. Tabled.
- Item 2. That the word "previous" in Article XV, Amendments, of the Constitution be replaced with the word "morning" and adding after the word "association" the words--"however, by two-thirds vote of the body any amendment to the Constitution can be postponed until the next regular District Meeting". Tabled.
- Item 3. That the words "last previous" be removed from Article 14 of the By-Laws and replaced with the word "morning" and adding after the word "association" the words--"however, by two-thirds vote of the body any amendment to the By-Laws can be postponed until the next regular District Meeting". Tabled.
- Item 4. That \$300.00 be taken out of the District Home Missions Account and given to the Christian Education Board to apply toward the installation of a trailer home for the care-taker of the camp grounds. Carried.

The Executive Board Report was read and a mmc to act on the recommendations item by item. Item one that a camp board be set up was defeated, so

there was no action taken on the others. After some discussion a nmc to recall the previous question. A motion was then made and carried to table the recommendations made by the Executive Board until the Executive Committee and the Christian Education Board can meet with the Camp Director and discuss the matter in detail. The recommendations as presented are:

1. That a District Camp Board be set up.
2. The Camp Board will consist of three. The Camp Director for a one year term and two members - one for one year and one for two years, one member being elected each year for a two year term.
3. That the Christian Education Board make the recommendations for members of the Board to the District Association.
4. That the Camp Board draw up camp rules governing camp each year, revising any rules in effect at present time.
5. That the Camp Board along with the Christian Education Board set a fee for all campers using camp including church and family groups.

Under old business a nmc to remove the proposed Constitutional change, Article 6, Finances from the table and act on it. The Article to read as amended, Each church or mission entitled to three delegates shall send to the clerk of the association ten dollars together with a written report of its spiritual condition, benevolent work and statistics for the year. Each church or mission entitled to more than three delegates shall send one and one half dollars for each additional delegate to which it is entitled. Carried.

Mrs. Marjorie Morris gave the Obituary Report and Bro. Marvin Wampler led in prayer after a few minutes of silent prayer for the families of the ones who passed on during 1978.

A motion was made that Rev. Raymond Getz be Camp Director for 1979. It was amended that he also be given the authority to spend the money necessary to operate the camp. The motion was passed as amended.

The Credentials Board reported that 14 ministers turned in their minister's report and would receive a card after the meeting. Any ministers not turning in his card will be notified by the Credentials Board to do so by the next District Meeting and receive a card at that time.

Bro. Charles Denman announced a State Layman's Day meeting the same time of the State Woman's Auxiliary Meeting at the State Convention.

A motion carried that Bro. Duard Davidson serve as Head Usher and be responsible for the other ushers needed for the State Meeting.

The Nominating Committee Report was given and a motion carried to act upon it item by item. The following officers and Board Members were elected:

Moderator, Raymond Lee; Assistant Moderator, Rev. Charles Reeves; Clerk-Treasurer, Rita McDuffie; Assistant Clerk, Jeanette Hale; Parliamentarian, Rev. Dennis Henderson; Student Loan Board, A.V. Jennische, Charles Denman; Home Mission Board, Sam Clements; Trustee, Estal Lewis; Christian Education Board, Rev. Eugene Richards; Credentials Committee, Rev. Billy Walker; Retirement & Insurance, Rev. Paul Meyer.

A motion carried that the District heartily commend the 1978 slate of officers for a job well done.

A special offering from the floor in the amount of \$230.00 plus a pledge of \$100.00 was received to finance the completion of the camp buildings. Two hundred fifty dollars were turned in earlier in the day to be given to the Christian Education Board to use as needed.

A motion carried to adjourn. Rev. Paul Meyer prayed the benediction.

The meeting in May will be in Huntsville at the Pine Prairie FWB Church.

1978 ANNUAL REPORT TO THE DISTRICT

The Auxiliary met on March 18, 1978 at the Conroe Church with approximately thirty-six in attendance. The theme for the program was "Keep on Keeping On" based on Galatians 6:9 and James 1:22. Marvis Eagleton, missionary to Brazil, was the speaker for the worship hour. The District Auxiliary presented her with a money tree for her own personal use.

Our district was well represented at the State Retreat at Pinoywoods in April. Marvis Eagleton and Everyl Getz were in charge of the Retreat Program and activities.

The semi-annual meeting was at the First Bryan Church on September 16, 1978 with forty-eight in attendance. The theme was "The Book of Books" based on Hebrews 4:12. Geneva Walker was the speaker for the worship hour. In the afternoon session our president, Everyl Getz, shared a burden she had for Marvis Eagleton's need for a clothes dryer in Brazil. An offering in the amount of \$394.60 was received and a motion carried to give \$75.00 out of the District Auxiliary Treasury. Later an auxiliary who was not represented at the meeting sent \$30.40 to complete the \$500.00 needed to purchase a clothes dryer in Brazil.

Dues for ninety-three members was sent to the State Woman's Auxiliary. Our State Project for 1978-79 was \$10.00 per member to be divided among the Texas Foreign Missionaries who have deficit accounts.

Total receipts for the year 1978 were \$3288.10 plus balance in the treasury of \$81.08, making a total of \$3369.18. Our disbursements amounted to \$3362.06 leaving a balance of \$7.12 in the treasury at the close of 1978.
