Minutes of the February 9, 1980 Annual District Conference
First Houston Free Will Baptist Church, Houston, Texas

The annual meeting of the Central Texas District Association of Free Will Baptists was held at the First Houston FWB Church on February 9, 1980. The congregation sang "To God Be the Glory" led by Mike Calvery and accompanied by Carolyn Osborne at the piano and Laverne Lee at the organ. Rev. Palmer led in prayer after which the song "Redeemed" was sung.

The moderator declared the meeting into conference to transact business. He read James 1:1-19 and made a few remarks.

The Preamble to the Constitution was read by Bro. Lee.

A call for church letters was made. The Credential Board gave a partial report. There were twelve churches represented by letter and ten with proper duos.

Rev. Bobby Ferguson gave the welcome.

A mmc to adopt the program with any necessary changes to be made throughout the day.

The following were appointed to serve on the Resolutions Committee: Mr. A.J. Brown, Mr. Danny Davis and Mr. Marvin Wampler. The moderator appointed Mrs. Everyl Getz, Mrs. Sherry Anderson and Mrs. Ruth Jennische to serve on the Obituary Committee.

The clerk read a partial report of the General Board and a mmc to act on it item by item.

Item 1--We recommend a Camp Board to become effective July 15, 1980. Mmc to table until after lunch.

Item 2--Constitutional change--Article XIII - Boards, Section 1-- The board of trustees of the Student Loan Fund shall be composed of three members. Their term of office shall be for a term of three years. One member shall be elected for a term of one year, one for a term of two years, and one for a term of three years, after which each member shall serve three years. Mmc to table until after lunch.

Item 3--Constitutional change-- Article XIII - Boards, Section 9-- The Camp Board shall consist of three members to serve three, two and one year respectively and each year thereafter for three years.

- A. It shall be the duty of the board to supervise and maintain the operation and formulate immediate and long range plans for the development of the camp.
- B. They shall be responsible for the care-taker and his duties.
- C. They shall recommend to the District in August the camp director for the next year.
- D. This board shall approve any gifts given to camp. Mmc to table until after lunch.

Rev. Allen Moore gave a brief report on the Bookstore.

The moderator declared a recess.

Mike Calvery led the congregation in singing the song "'Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus". Rev. Dale Smith led in prayer. "The Banner of the Cross" was sung after which the offering in the amount of \$62.81 was received by the ushers, David Reed, Michael Hill and Jerry Fling. Mr. David Reed led the offertory prayer.

Mr. Raymond Lee sang "If You Need Him" for the special music.

Rev. Charles Reeves introduced the speaker for the worship hour. Rev. Eugene Richards read Colossians 4:2-6 for his text and preached a very good sermon on Paul's talk of Tongues.

Rev. Bobby Ferguson made the announcement about lunch and called on Rev. Charles Reeves to ask God's blessings on the food.

The afternoon session opened with the song "Just a Little Talk With Jesus".

Rev. Allen Moore gave a final report on the state work and read Luke 9:23.

A motion was made and carried to receive the balance of the General Board Report and act on it item by item.

Item 4--We recommend that the general board be given the responsibility of examining the Constitution and By-Laws and report back to the August meeting with any necessary changes to be voted on by the body. Carried.

Item 5--We recommend that an honorarium of \$25.00 and \$10.00 be given to the clerk and assistant clerk respectively for the year 1980 in addition to the present amount of \$50.00 and \$10.00. Carried.

Item 6--We recommend that the Co-operative breakdown remain the same--50% to State Office, 30% to Christian Education, 10% to Retirement & Insurance, 5% to Student Loan and 5% to District Office. Carried.

Item 7--We recommend that when a board is called to a special meeting that 12¢ a mile be reimbursed for travel expense. Carried.

A motion was made and carried to remove Items 1, 2, & 3 from the Table and act on them item by item. All three items carried.

Mrs. Everyl Getz gave the Woman's Auxiliary Report as information.

Mr. Verlan Pegues gave the Home Mission Report and a nmc to accept.

Mrs. Thelma Anderson sang "Born Again" accompanied by Mrs. Kristy Thompson.

Bro. Lee gave a Master's Men Report as information.

A motion was made and carried to accept the Student Loan Board Report read by the clerk.

Bro. Randy Cox and Rev. Eugene Richards gave a Christian Education Board Report and a motion carried to act upon it. Item 1--The board recommends that no charge be required from Central Texas District Free Will Baptists or from the Davis family to use the camp facilities. A substitute motion was made and carried to refer the recommendation to the Camp Board to be taken care of.

Mr. Jerry Fling gave the CTS Report as information.

The Resolutions Committee reported the following resolutions:

1. Be it resolved that we recommend to each church to give monthly to the camp ground in the amount of at least \$15.00. Carried.
2. Be it resolved that we as a body give the host church a rising vote of thanks for the fine food and hospitality. Carried.

"Learning to Loan" was sung by the congregation led by Bro. Lee.

The Obituary Report was given by Mrs. Everyl Getz. She read I Thes. 4:13-18 and asked the body to join her in silent prayer after which she led in prayer.

Rev. Raymond Getz gave the final report of the Credentials Board and a nmc to act on it item by item.

Item 1--Bro. Palmer is presently fulfilling requirements for receiving credentials from the Central Texas District Association of Free Will Baptists. No action necessary.

Item 2--United Church requests acceptance of Rev. Dale Smith, their new pastor, into our district. Request awaits recommendation from previous district.

Item 3--Cedars of Lebanon requests the Liscensing of Oscar Cortinos to preach. Bro. Cortinos is fulfilling necessary requirements for liscense.

Item 4--Cornerstone Free Will Baptist Church requests acceptance into the Central Texas District. We recommend their acceptance. Carried.

The right hand of fellowship was extended to the members and pastor of the Cornerstone Church attending the meeting.

The Nominating Committee Report was given and acted on item by item. The following officers and Board Members were elected:

As you know, a few years back, we voted to combine our efforts with other districts in the state and support missions on the state level. The state board decided that it would limit financial support to only one work until such time that work became self-supporting or when the board felt the finances were sufficient to support another work. I believe the first work begun under this system was a Joint Project between the State & National boards and that was the work in McAllen. During 1979 the McAllen mission was organized into a church and financial support was discontinued from the state board. In 1979 the state home mission board again entered into a joint project with the national home mission board and Bro. Harold Teague was approved as the missionary to begin a work in Longview.

However, there have been works started within our district without any financial support from the district board and we praise the Lord for these. At present we have the Northwest Free Will Baptist Mission of Houston which was accepted into the District in 1978 and the Mission in Arcadia which was accepted into the District in 1979. We also have the Mission in Temple which was begun under the National Board but is no longer under the supervision of the National and is a member of our district. In October 1979 a group of believers began having services in College Station and have now organized into the Cornerstone Free Will Baptist Church and will petition the district at this meeting for membership. Again I say Praise the Lord for these new works in our district.
