I have said this to you so many times in the past that it may seem trite, however, I will say once more how thankful I am of our Central Texas District, its churches and fine people who make up the congregations.

The need for a different set of values begins to come into focus. Have we as pastors really lost some of our desires for the Church and placed our values in other things?

Some of our churches are rather new and others are old as age goes and have been in existence for a long time, we may find that we have to stop and reset our sights. Human nature left to itself will drift away from the higher goals. So it is occasionally necessary to reevaluate and to determine whether we are still on target.

Paul sets before us the right goal: "If you then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above. Set your affection on things above not on things on the earth." Colossians 3:1,2.

Paul suggests we rise far above the level that has occupied our attention until now; give attention to spiritual matters; learn of Christ. We will be renewed in our hearts and minds as we sit in the Lord's presence. We must seek after those things that please God alone.

Without exception we will all lose the fruits of our earthly efforts. We cannot take them into eternity with us, but if we seek those things which are above, we will be laying up for ourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal. Matthew 6:19,20.

Minutes of the February 14, 1981 Annual District Conference
Fellowship Free Will Baptist Church, Bryan, Texas

The Central Texas District Association of Free Will Baptists met on February 14, 1981 at the Fellowship FWB Church in Bryan, Texas. Rev. Everett Hellard led in singing "At Calvary" and "Hiding In Thee" accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Ava Hellard and at the organ by Mrs. Sheila Leighman to open the meeting. Rev. Dennis Henderson led in prayer.

Mr. Raymond Lee, moderator, called the session to order to conduct business. He called for church letters after which he read Articles of interest in the By-Laws.

The Credential Board gave a partial report and a M/S/C to receive it. The delegates were seated.

In the moderator's message, he expressed his thankfulness for the people in the Central Texas District and read Matthew 19:20,21.

Rev. Johnny Williams, host pastor, extended a hearty welcome.

A M/S/C to adopt the program with any necessary changes to be made throughout the day.

The clerk read the minutes of the last meeting and they were approved after the correct date for the state meeting was recorded.

The treasurer's report was examined and adopted.

Mrs. Geneva Walker, Mrs. Judy Smith and Mrs. Alpha Sheffield were appointed to serve on the Obituary Committee. Rev. Everett Hellard, Mrs. Sherry Anderson and Mr. Steve Gregory were appointed to serve on the Resolutions Committee.

The clerk read the General Board Report and a M/S/C to accept it and act on item by item.

1. Recommendation that Rev. Johnny Williams work with the Student Loan Board to work out a more efficient method of collecting monies due and that they report back to the May quarterly meeting. Carried.

2. That only speakers from outside our district be given an honorarium. Carried.

3. That the clerk and assistant clerk's salaries remain at \$75.00 and \$20.00 respectively for the year 1981. C.

4. That the Camp Board investigate the feasibility of insurance for the camp property with coverage to meet eighty per cent (80%) of replacement cost and liability insurance. Carried.

5. That the proposed budget of \$1,200.00 for the district office be adopted. Carried.

State Executive Secretary, Rev. Allen Moore, read Joshua 1:7-9 and spoke about the state work and the state bookstore. He challenged the pastors to encourage their people to support the bookstore with orders on a regular basis. He also requested prayer for Vivian who has labored sacrificially for the bookstore. He reported that Dr. Melvin Worthington will be the speaker for the Wednesday night service of the state meeting. State Home Missions will be emphasized that night and an offering will be received for that purpose.

The moderator declared a recess.

Bro. Lee expressed a Happy Valentine's Day wish to all the ladies.

The congregation sang "To God Be the Glory" after which Rev. Billy Walker led in prayer. Another congregational song "Higher Ground" was sung.

The ushers, Mr. Duard Davidson and Mr. M.B. Horn, received the morning offering with Mr. Horn praying the offertory prayer.

Special music by Mrs. Thelma Anderson accompanied by Mr. Mike Calvary on the guitar was enjoyed by all. She sang "How Great Thou Art."

Rev. Dennis Henderson requested prayer for Sandy Calvary and introduced the speaker for the worship hour, Rev. Wesley Bigelow. Rev. Bigelow used passages from Acts 8 and Ezekiel 34 as background for his message. He brought a good message primarily to pastors and church leaders. He closed his sermon with prayer extending an invitation during a congregational hymn.

Rev. Johnny Williams gave instructions concerning lunch and asked God's blessings on the food.

The afternoon session was opened with the hymn "Tis So Sweet To Trust in Jesus."

Mr. Verlan Pegues gave a report on Master's Men and it was received as information.

The clerk read the report of the Student Loan Board sent in by Mr. A.V. Jennische and a M/S/C to accept it.

For a change of tempo Rev. Everett Hellard sang "All Because of God's Amazing Grace" accompanied by Mrs. Hellard at the piano.

Rev. Wes Bigelow gave an oral report of the Camp Board with the promise of a financial report at the May meeting.

Rev. Johnny Williams announced a FWBBC Choir Concert to

be held at the Brazos Center in Bryan on March 18, 1981. He made a request for financial aide from area churches for publicity on radio and TV. Area rural churches were asked to send money to pay for supper for the choir .

The final Credential Board Report was given by Rev. Raymond Getz as follows:

We recommend that Kurt Hoch of the Cornerstone Church be recommended for license to preach for one year upon maintenance of sound doctrine and good moral character.

A M/S/C to accept.

Sherry Anderson read the Resolutions Committee Report and a M/S/C to receive it and act on it item by item.

1. Be it resolved that we give \$25.00 to the Longview Home Mission Account and encourage our churches to give to this account. Carried.

2. Be it resolved that we remind our churches to give their \$100.00 for the National Association to be held in Ft. Worth in 1982. Carried.

3. Be it resolved that we express our thanks to the local congregation for their gracious hospitality. As usual, the food was outstanding and the people were friendly. Carried.

4. Be it resolved that we encourage our churches and individuals to order their literature, books and supplies as needed from our state bookstore. Carried.

The Obituary Report was given by Mrs. Geneva Walker. She read II Timothy 4:6-8 and led in prayer after a few moments of silent prayer. Members deceased in 1980 were Noel Mason, Evergreen, Harvey McNeil, Luther Maxwell, First Houston and Irene Putty, Pine Prairie.

Bro. Billy Walker, chairman of the Nominating Committee, gave their report and a motion was made to accept the report and vote on it item by item. Bro. Henderson, the assistant moderator, called the meeting to order. Those present to conduct business were Bro. Raymond Getz, Bro. Johnny Williams, Mr. Verlan Pegues, Bro. Dennis Henderson, Bro. Billy Walker and Mrs. Rita McDuffie. Bro. Dale Smith was there as a visitor.

The Board discussed the Co-op allocation for the Student Loan Fund and determined that it remain the same (5%) as before.

Raymond Getz made a motion that the Board recommend that Johnny Williams work with the Student Loan Board to work out a more efficient method of collecting monies due and further recommend that they meet and report back to the May Quarterly Meeting. Motion was seconded and carried.

The Board wishes to remind the body that the Resolutions Committee or individuals from the floor consult with the clerk as to money available before proposing to pay out a good sum of money.
