ANNUAL MINUTES

The Central Texas District Annual Conference was held at the Fellowship FWB Church on February 9, 1985. Matt Klunkert led the congregation in singing "Deeper, Deeper" accompanied at the piano by Sherry Anderson and at the organ by Joy Jones. Duard Davidson led in prayer. The congregation sang "Sunshine In My Soul."

Bro. Herbert Richards gave a partial report of the Credential Board. A mmc to receive the report and seat the delegates.

Bro. Bill Jones, host pastor, extended a hearty welcome. A mmc to adopt the program with any necessary changes throughout the day.

The clerk read the minutes of the previous meeting and they were approved as read. The treasurer's report was examined and a mmc to adopt them as presented. The clerk gave an oral report of the annual giving totals.

The moderator appointed the Resolutions Committee as follows: Sam Clements, Ed Morris and Kurt Hoch. The Obituary Committee was also appointed at this time as follows: Sherry Anderson, Elwyn Trant and Margaret Richards.

The clerk read the General Board Minutes. A mmc to accept the report and act on it item by item.

1. We recommend to the district a set of guidelines for administering the Retirement and Insurance Fund. Carried.
2. We recommend that the district make accommodations to Bill Jones and Wesley Bigelow for the work they did to assist the Home Mission Board in the Cedars of Lebanon matter. Carried.
3. We recommend an increase in the clerk's yearly salary to \$180.00 this year. Carried.
4. We recommend a change in Coop breakdown as follows and cease direct district support of the State Office. Coop breakdown: 64% State Office, 20% Camp, 15% Retirement & Insurance and 1% District Office. Tabled until afternoon session.
5. We recommend that this district adopt the annual report form used by the national. Carried.

The moderator declared a recess for 15 minutes.

Word was received that Mr. Clyde Goen had just passed away. We paused to pray silently for the family. After a few moments, Dr. Charles Thigpen led in prayer.

The congregation sang "The Solid Rock" and "Come Thou Fount." An offering in the amount of \$89.00 was received by the ushers, Duard Davidson and Kurt Hoch with Kurt leading the offertory prayer.

Raymond Lee read a "thank you" note from Bro. Everett Hellard thanking the district for the beautiful Azalea sent to him after his surgery.

For special music Everyl Getz sang "Whatever It Takes" accompanied

at the piano by Joy Jones.

Raymond Lee introduced Dr. Charles Thigpen, the speaker for the worship hour. His text was taken from John 20:30,31. After our hearts were fed with spiritual food, Bro. Bill Jones gave instructions for the noon meal. He asked God's blessings on the food.

After a delicious lunch the meeting opened for the afternoon session by the congregation singing "Nothing Is Impossible."

A partial report of the nominating committee was given. A mmc to accept and offices be filled as reports are given.

Bro. Billy Walker, State Executive Secretary, reported on the work throughout the state.

Bro. Raymond Getz gave the Camp Board Report and Bro. Eugene Richards reported on their finances. A mmc to accept the report. Bro. Raymond Getz was recommended by the board for the 1985 Camp Director. The body voted to accept their recommendation. Bro. Eugene Richards was elected by acclamation to serve on the Camp Board until 1988.

A mmc to remove from the Table the item concerning the Coop breakdown. A mmc to amend the Coop breakdown as follows: State Office from 64% to 59%, Camp from 20% to 25%, Retirement & Insurance remaining at 15% and the District Office at 1%. A mmc to accept the motion as amended.

Charles Denman spoke on behalf of the Master's Men. He announced a Master's Men Retreat to be held on March 29, 30 at our camp in Carlos. His report was received as information.

In the absence of Judy Smith, Sherry Anderson reported on the District Auxiliary work which was received as information.

A.V. Jennische gave the Student Loan Board Report. A mmc to receive the report. Charles Denman was elected to serve on the board until 1988.

Bro. Raymond Getz reported for the District Home Mission Board. A mmc to receive the report and act on the recommendations item by item.

1. We recommend that all monies coming in from royalties from the Cedars of Lebanon property be placed in the District Mission Account. Carried.
2. We recommend that all monies coming in from Cedars of Lebanon property, i.e. rent and royalties, be used for mission work anywhere as recommended by the board and accepted by the district and not restricted to a possible future work at Cedars of Lebanon. Carried.

Bro. Raymond Getz was elected by acclamation to serve on the Home Mission Board until the year 1988.

Two Christian Education Board members were elected as follows: Bro. Paul Dean until 1989 to replace Bro. Mike Mize and Everyl Getz to serve until 1991.

Mr. Estal Lewis gave an oral report of the Board of Trustees as information. David Reed was elected by acclamation to serve on this board until 1991.

Ed Morris reported on District Retirement & Insurance. A mmc to accept the report. He was re-elected to serve as director for another year.

A mmc to receive the Resolutions Committee Report submitted by Sam Clements, Ed Morris and Kurt Hoch and act on it item by item.

1. Be it resolved that the Home Mission Board of our District sponsor Bro. Bill Jones and Bro. Bill Fulcher in a visit to the Rio Grande Valley to evaluate the work of Bro. James Munsey and the Weslaco church's missionary endeavors to report to us the next district meeting. Carried.

2. Be it resolved that we give Bro. Thigpen an honorarium of \$50.00. Carried.

3. Be it resolved that we give the host church a rising vote of thanks for the delicious food and hospitality. Carried.

Bro. Herbert Richards gave the final report of the Credential Board. A mmc to receive the report and act on it item by item.

1. We recommend Paul Dean for ordination. Carried.

2. That Clyde Eldridge be accepted into fellowship upon acceptance of a letter of good standing. Carried.

3. That Mike Mize be granted a letter of good standing. Carried.

Bro. Bobby Ferguson was elected to serve on the Ordaining Council until 1988.

Sherry Anderson gave the Obituary Report and asked for a time of silent prayer after which Raymond Lee led in prayer.

A mmc that the Camp Board look into and study the possibility of another camp for our kids until our camp buildings are brought up to standards. After much discussion a second motion was made and carried to refer the previous motion to the Camp Board to study and bring their findings back to the body at the May meeting.

The final report of the Nominating Committee was given by Bro. Herbert Richards. A mmc to receive and elect office by office.

GENERAL BOARD MEETING
FEBRUARY 2, 1985

The Central Texas District General Board met on February 2, 1985 at the Fellowship FWB Church.

The meeting was opened with a time of devotion led by Bro. J.D. O'Donnell. He read II John, verse 8 and stressed the need for us as individuals, churches and district to look to ourselves that we don't lose ground in our work for the Lord. He closed with prayer.

The meeting was poorly attended because of weather conditions. Members who braved the elements to attend were Raymond Lee, J.D. O'Donnell, Dennis Henderson, A.V. Jennische, Ed Morris and Rita McDuffie. Bill Jones and Ruth Jennische were also there.

A.V. Jennische gave the Student Loan Board Report. A mmc to accept the report. A mmc that the General Board direct the Student Loan Board to make contact by letter with the people who have borrowed money and failed to repay and their co-signers. If this fails the Student Loan Board is authorized by the authority of the General Board to get together and come up with a plan of attack whereby this money will be recovered. II. BOARD ACTION IN 1984

A. Cedars of Lebanon Evaluated

1. Under the directive of the District in the November meeting, the Board evaluated the possibilities of a continuing Spanish work at the Cedars of Lebanon Church in Bryan.
2. The Bryan area pastors, along with national Spanish-American missionary, Bill Fulcher, met in Bryan to determine the best possible solution to the Spanish work in that city. Their recommendation was:
 - a. Since there is presently no active membership at Cedars of Lebanon, and since it appears that none of the existing members are interested in reviving the work, we recommend that no action be taken at this time.
 - b. We further recommend that one year be given for preparation of a Spanish speaking pastor to assume responsibilities of a Spanish work in Bryan.
3. The Board accepted and approved the recommendation of the Bryan area pastors and missionary, Bill Fulcher.

B. Cedars of Lebanon Rented

1. In December, the Board was informed of a church group who was interested in renting the Cedars of Lebanon Church for church purposes.
2. A meeting was arranged in December with representatives of the church group and agreement made for the rental of the church.
 - a. The church was rented for \$300.00 a month on a one-year lease.
 - b. A deposit of \$300.00 was also required and given.
3. The money from the rent is being placed directly into the District Home Mission savings account at First Bank and Trust in Bryan.

GUIDELINES FOR ADMINISTERING
CENTRAL TEXAS DISTRICT ASSOCIATION
OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS
RETIREMENT FUND

1. Eligibility

- a. An applicant must be an ordained Free Will Baptist minister or a widow/widower of a Free Will Baptist minister.
- b. The applicant must have been ordained for the previous ten years and must have served as a pastor in the Central Texas District Association for at least five years.
- c. The applicant must be sixty-five years of age, or be the widow/widower of a minister sixty-five years of age, and have retired from pastoring.
- d. The applicant must be recommended by the church of which he is a member and be approved by the district association.

2. Application

- a. Applications will be furnished by the Director of the Retirement Fund upon request. The completed application will reflect the applicant's need.
- b. An applicant may apply in person. However, signatures of recommendation must be obtained from a local church.

3. Disbursement

- a. An attempt will be made to honor all request for assistance based on the recommendation of the church and the need of the applicant.
- b. Each applicant will receive \$50.00 per month as funds are available. This amount will be increased as funds are provided and approved by the district association.
- c. Recipients should live within the Central Texas District.
- d. Applicants will be given emergency assistance on an individual basis when funds are available. An application must be approved by the director of retirement and the moderator and assistant moderator of the district.

4. Should the time come when there is no longer a recipient of these funds, a committee will be appointed by the moderator of the Central Texas District Association for the purpose of making a recommendation to this body regarding the disposition of the funds.
