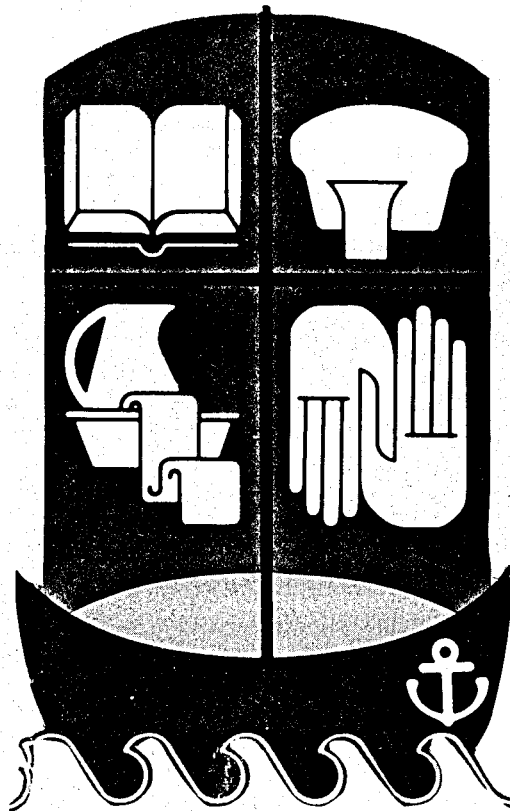

ANNUAL MINUTES
February 11, 1989

The Annual Session of the Central Texas District Association of Free Will Baptists met at the First Houston FWB church on February 11, 1989 at 10:00 A.M.

The meeting was opened with a hymn, "Bringing in the Sheaves", led by Bro. Dale Smith, with Charlene Denman at the piano and Ava Hellard at the organ. Bro. Luther Sanders led in prayer.

The moderator, Bro. Bobby Ferguson, declared the body in session. He read the Preamble to the Constitution and Article VIII of the By-Laws.

The congregation sang "I Just Keep Trusting My Lord".

Bro. Herbert Richards gave the Credential Board Report. A mmc to receive the report and seat the delegates.

Bro. Bobby Ferguson, host pastor, extended a warm welcome and reported on the District Youth Rally held at his church Friday night and Saturday morning.

A mmc to adopt the program allowing for any changes required throughout the day.

The minutes were read and approved. The treasurer's report for the quarter was examined. The clerk reported that total receipts for the year 1988 were \$42,638.60, plus balance brought forward of \$347.84, making a total of \$42,986.44 to be accounted for. Total disbursements were \$42,605.31, leaving a balance of \$381.13. A mmc to accept the report as given.

Kenneth Mayo, assistant moderator, appointed Bro. Morris Proctor, Jesse Ellis, and Charles Denman to serve on the Resolutions Committee. Ruth Jennische, Cynthia Biddle, and Bro. Luther Sanders were appointed to serve on the Obituary Committee.

The clerk read the General Board Minutes of the January Board Meeting. A mmc to defer action on the recommendation that the District Retirement & Insurance Board give \$100.00 per month to each recipient to a later date. A motion was made and carried that the appreciation fee given to the clerk and assisting clerk remain the same for another year.

A.V. Jennische reported for the Student Loan Fund. A mmc to receive the report with a recommendation that each person owing money to the Loan Fund be contacted with a registered letter to remind them that they owe a debt.

Bro. Morris Proctor dismissed the meeting for a recess with prayer.

The worship service was held in the original F. church building with the District Youth, led by Mark Brawley and Larry Wood, providing the program. The worship hour opened with a song "To God be the Glory". Bro. Mark Brawley led in prayer. Several young people read various scripture verses, followed by various songs to emphasize the scripture. The District Youth Choir sang "There Is a Reason". The congregation sang several selections. Larry Wood and Mark Brawley presented a reading, after which the congregation sang "Thank You, Lord". Bro. Bobby Ferguson closed with prayer.

Ushers, Kenneth Mayo and Roger Yates, were called to receive the morning offering. Bro. Yates led the offertory prayer.

Bro. Bobby gave instructions for the noon meal. Bro. Herbert Richards asked God's blessings on the food and dismissed for lunch.

The afternoon session opened with Mark Brawley leading "Heaven Came Down and Glory Filled My Soul". Jesse Ellis led in prayer. Special music by Heather Poole and Lauren Garrett was most touching and beautiful. They performed sign language accompanied by a tape.

Bro. Morris Proctor gave the Nominating Committee's report. A mmc to receive the report and elect board members as each board gives a report.

Charles Denman reported for Master's Men and Ava Hellard for Woman's Auxiliary. These reports were received as information.

A.V. Jennische reported for the Student Loan Board in the morning session, however, a board member wasn't elected. Mr. Jennische was reelected at this time to serve on the board until 1992.

Bro. Paul Dean reported for the Christian Education Board. Elected to serve on this board were Mark Brawley to replace Sherry Anderson and Paul Dean to replace himself. Their terms to expire in 1991 and 1995 respectively.

Sam Clements gave the District Home Missions Board report. A mmc to accept the report. Bro. Charles Reeves spoke of his work in Temple. Bro. Dale Smith was elected to fill the unexpired term of Bro. Frank Cope, ending in 1990. A mmc to elect Bro. Ned Graham by acclamation to extend his position on the board to the year 1992.

The Board of Trustees had nothing new to report. They are still negotiating with TMPA concerning the camp property. James Ray Trant was elected to remain on the board until 1995.

Ed Morris was elected by acclamation to serve as Retirement & Insurance Chairman until 1990.

Danny Davis reported for the Camp Board. He announced that teen camp will begin at 4:00 P.M. on June 18th and close at noon on Friday, June 23rd. Marcia Lightsey will serve as director. Junior camp will begin at 4:00 P.M. on June 25th and run through noon on Friday, June 30th. Bro. ~~Ray Trant~~ ^{Roger Yates} will be the director for that week. A mmc to accept the report. Bro. Roger Yates was elected to serve on the Camp Board until 1992.

The Resolutions Committee Report was given by Bro. Morris Proctor. A mmc to receive the report and act on it item by item.

1. Be it resolved, in as much as our treasurers of various boards or committees have in their charge large amounts of money, in order to be more business like, and for their protection and accountability, in as much as, an annual security bond and audit of books be considered for all persons who are responsible for over \$1,000. The cost being very reasonable for such service. Tabled.

2. In as much as, our ministers retirement is in need of new ideas, be it resolved, that we recommend that the local church support their pastor after

he reaches age 65, if indeed the former pastor lives that long. The idea is only a recommendation that he be paid \$10.00 per month, per year he has served the church. This should be an honorable and fair gesture on the local church's part. The amount could vary from \$10.00 per month to \$1.00 per month. Tabled.

3. A. We resolve to move the youth activities from Friday evening to Saturday afternoon and evening. We believe this would be more convenient for both parents and churches and to better be able to obtain our goal of having more youth attend the quarterly meetings. Carried.

B. We would propose that the activities would begin after the noon meal and end by 9:00 P.M. This would enable all meetings and activities to be held on one day and everyone be able to be home by midnight. Carried.

C. We recommend that the C.E. Board be responsible for overseeing the coordination of the quarterly youth activities and be extended to 5 members to help carry the added responsibilities. Tabled.

4. Be it resolved that we give the host church a rising vote of thanks and appreciation for their splendid hospitality and especially for the ladies for their hard work in preparation of the meal. Carried.

Bro. Herbert Richards gave the Ordaining Council's report. A mmc to accept and act on it item by item.

1. That the Credentials of Rev. Dale Smith be accepted in the Central Texas District upon receipt of a letter of good standing from First Oklahoma Association. Carried.

2. That the license of Rev. Curtis McCurry be extended for one year. Carried.

Bro. Bill Jones was re-elected to serve on the Ordaining Council until 1992.

The Obituary report was given by Cynthia Biddle. A total of ten departed saints from Fellowship, United, Pine Prairie, Eastside, and Conroe were reported. After a moment of silent prayer, Bro. Everett Hellard led in prayer.

A letter from missionaries to Ivory Coast, Africa, Ernest & Elaine Holland, was read by the clerk.

New Business:

A written motion was submitted by Kenneth Mayo as follows:

"Have a finance committee to work up a program to help generate more funds and better distribute these funds. This committee to be made up of four (4) people--Moderator, Clerk and two(2) from the floor. Also look into restructuring fees." A mmc to Table this item, in compliance with the Constitution, until the next meeting.

A final report of the Nominating Committee was given by Bro. Morris Proctor. A mmc to accept the report and elect the remaining officers by acclamation. The following officers were elected to serve until February, 1990:

GENERAL BOARD MEETING
MINUTES
JANUARY 28, 1989

The 1989, annual board meeting was opened at 2:00 P.M. with prayer led by Danny Davis. The meeting took place at the Fellowship church.

The moderator called for the report from the Student Loan Board. A.V. Jennische gave the report and a mmc to receive it.

Bro. Paul Dean gave the Christian Education Board report. He said that competition registration deadline is April 1, 1989 and competition will be on April 15th. His report was duly received.

Home Missions

Sam Clements represented the board, however had no information to give us at the time. Bro. Bill Jones spoke briefly on a Foreign Missionary, Dwain Crosby, who has agreed to change his field of service from Japan to Spain. There will be a Walk-A-Thon on April 8, 1989, to raise money for the Crosby account. It was also reported that the Temple church is now assuming part of Bro. Charles Reeves' salary.

Danny Davis reported for the Camp Board. He stated that the buildings need some repair, but due to the position with TMPA, it isn't feasible to put much into the camp at this time. Camp directors are needed for the 1989 camp sessions. A dorm parent for FWBBC has expressed interest in working with our teen camp.

The Ordaining Council was represented by Bro. Bill Jones, however there was nothing to report.

Bro. Paul Morris reported for the Board of Trustees. The title of Cedars of Lebanon has been transferred from the District to the District Home Mission Board. David Reed reported that negotiations are still being made with TMPA on our camp property. The district churches need to help pay the insurance and bills of the camp.

Ed Morris reported on Retirement & Insurance. He turned in a recommendation that we give \$100.00 per month to each recipient. A mmc to present this recommendation to the body at the quarterly conference. He also suggested that a place be provided on the program for any board to report at each quarterly meeting instead of only once a year if they so desire.

A mmc to leave the Clerk's appreciation fee at \$300.00 and the assisting clerk's fee at \$10.00 per meeting.

A mmc to adjourn. Bro. Roger Yates dismissed with prayer.
