The purpose of the meeting was to examine the credentials of Rev. W. H. Holman of Texas. His credentials were satisfactory and he was granted a certificate of ministerial standing, good till the convening of the Association at Stockton in September, 1915. Bro. Holman has since been living at Chanute. Kans., and preaching to churches in Kansas and also the Verdella church in Barton county, Mo.

As far as I know all our churches and preachers are in harmony and nearly all our churches the past year have been pretty well supplied with preachers and some have reported good revivals.

I have filled most of my wife's appointments at the Wagoner and Stockton churches. I have held short meetings at the following places: Jerico Springs, Zodiac, Seldom. Seen school house, Flowing Springs, school house and other places. I have visited the following churches within the bounds of the Association: Stockton, Wagoner, Neola, Hannon, Verdella and Bluff. I attended one meeting of the Home Mission Board at the Verdella church. I have married three couples the past year. In meetings the past year about 50 professed and about 20 were baptized and joined the churches.

CHURCH COVENANT

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures. secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, fath, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work. We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bond of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel. We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business in

life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and his will be done on earth as it is in heaven, and has society that the Kingdom of God may come, and his will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sabbath schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls and the conversion of the world. # CONSTITUTION FOR SAME AND THE CONSTITUTION

ho of education of the control of th

ART. 1. This body shall be known as the Central Western Missouri and Southeastern Kansas Association of Freewill Baptists, and shall be composed of such consistent well regulated Freewill Baptist churches as shall, from time to time, unite with the body and agree to this constitution.

ART. 2. The acting members of this Association shall be such as are chosen by the several churches of which this Association is composed. Each church being entitled to one delegate and each church having twenty-five members two delegates, and one delegate for each additional twenty-five members or major part thereof, and all ordained deacons, ordained ministers and licensed ministers of the several churches of the Association.

ART. 3. The officers of this Association

shall be a Moderator who shall be elected at each session and shall hold office until his successor is elected, a Clerk and a Treasurer, who shall be standing officers of the Association.

-commART. (1) 4. SEC. (1-1.0) This a Association (1) shall elect a board of five members, two of which shall be opreachers. This alboard shall be called the Home Mission and Executive Board of the Association. One member of the board shall be elected to hold office for one year, one for 2 years. one for 3 years, one for 4 years, and one for 5 years. After the first election one member shall be elected each year and each shall hold office for 5 years or till his successor is elected. This board shall have charge of the work of the Association when it is not in session.

SEC. 2. The Home Mission and Executive Board of this Association shall be the trustees of the Association and shall have charge of its pro-

perty.

ART. 5. SEC. 1. This Association shall meet annually at such a time and place as shall meet with the pleasure of the Association and it shall be the duty of all churches of which it is composed to represent themselves by letters and delegates.

It shall be the duty of all ministers SEC. of this Association to attend each session or report by letter. And all ministers reporting by letter or in person shall be entitled to a certificate of ministerial standing from the Association.

6. This constitution may be altered or amended by vote of any session of the Association. notice of such intended change having been given in writing at least three months before such change shall be voted upon, to the Executive Board.

  - 2. Each session of this Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
  - 3. Delegates from three (3) or more churches shall constitute a quorum to transact business for the Association but any less number may adjourn from time to time.
  - 4. A member wishing to speak in conference shall arise and address the moderator, and be recognized by same, and shall not be allowed to speak longer than five minutes nor more than twice on any subject without the consent of the conference.
  - 5. New churches may be admitted to this Association by majority vote of conference.
  - 6. The yeas and nays may be taken on any question by the request of one-fourth of the members present.
  - 7. These by-laws may be amended at any session of the Association by a two-third's vote of the members-present.
  - 8. A committee of five lay members, delegates present at the Association, shall be elected to look into the standing of the ministry, and make

their report to the Association; before it adjourns for approval or rejection. It is a great make of finish
