CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF MINISTERS' CONFERENCE

ARTICLE 1

This organization shall be known as the Ministers' Conference of the Central Western Missouri and Southeastern Kansas Association.

ARTICLE 2

The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the Ministry and their work in the Central Western Missouri and Southeastern cansas Association.

ARTICLE 3

The Ministers' Conference shall consist of ordained and licensed minsters in good standing.

ARTICLE 4

Representation to the Ministers' Conference is to be standing delegates of this Association.

ARTICLE 5

A free will offering is to be taken during each session of this Ministers Conference which is to be used to defray the expense of this organization.

ARTICLE 6

The officers of this Ministers' Conference shall consist of a president, rice president and secretary, treasurer, each which shall be elected at the beginning of each regular session. Sec. 2. The program committee shall be composed of above officers, whose duty it shall be to prepare the program of the Ministers' Conference for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 7

The Ministers' Conference shall hold its regular session annually durng the time of the setting of the Central Western Missouri and Southmass Association.

ARTICLE 8

This constitution and By-Laws may be amended or altered at any regular session of the Ministers Conference by a two-thirds vote of members present.

Alice Dickey: I have preached 69 sermons, pastored one church half time, witnessed 6 professions, baptized 5, traveled 7,160 miles, received \$420.64.

Lowell Martin: I have preached 93 sermons, pastored 2 churches, held 1 revival, preached 2 funerals, traveled 4,270 miles, received \$637.59.

Marie Hyatt: I have preached 28 sermons, traveled 2,630 miles, conducted 2 Daily Vacation Bible Schools, received \$157.

Arthur Kicenski: I have preached 63 sermons, held 4 revivals, witnessed 11 professions, baptized 9, preached 3 funerals, received \$203.92.

Arlie E. Hoover: My report is very short as my work was very limited. I acted as superintendent of our Sunday School part of the year and I am now teacher of a class. I have been active on both State and Local Executive Boards.

CONSTITUTION

- Art. I. This body shall be known as the Central Western Missouri and Southeastern Kansas Association of Free Will Baptist, and shall be composed of such consistent, well regulated Free Will Baptist churches as shall from time to time, unite with the body and agree to this constitution.
- Art. II. The acting members of this Association shall be such as are chosen by the several churches of which it is composed. Each acting church being entitled to one delegate, and each church having twenty-five (25) resident members two delegates, and one delegate for each additional twenty-five resident members or major part thereof, together with all ordained deacons, ordained and licensed ministers, and their companions who are members in good standing with the Free Will Baptist Church, and church clerks of the several churches composing this Association.
- Sec. 2. A resident member shall be a member in good standing who discharge his or her obligations to the church, and who reside near enough to attend churuch services, or who reside at a distance, but discharge his or her obligations to the church; unless feeble minded or invalids. All other members shall be considered non-resident members.

Art, III. The officers of the Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk and treasurer, all of said officers to be elected annually at the regular session of the Association, and shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified.

Art. IV. This Association shall elect a board of five members, two of them shall be ministres. This board shall be called the Home Mission and Executive Board of this Association. One member of this board shall be elected to hold office for one year, one for two years, one for three years, one for four years. After the first election one member shall be elected each year and hold office for five years, or until his successor is elected. This board shall have charge of the work of the Association when it is not in session.

Sec. 2. The Home Mission Board of this Association shall be Trustees of the Association, and shall have charge of its property.

Art. V. This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall meet with the approval of the Association, and it shall be the dure of the churches of which it is composed to represent themselves by letter and delegates.

Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of all ministers of the Association to et tend each session or report by letter. All ministers reporting by letter or in person shall be entitled to Annual certificates of Ministerial Standing by the Association.

Art. VI. This Constitution may be altered, or amended by vote at any regular session of the Assocation, notice of such intended change having been given in writing not less than three months before such change shall be voted on to the Executive Board.

BY-LAWS

- 1. Each annual session of this Association shall be called to order by the clerk, or in his absence, the assistant clerk, and in his or her absence, the standing member having seniority in years in service. After the clerk, or the one calling the assembly to order, shall declare a quorum, he of she shall call the moderator to the chair, and in his or her absence the standing member having seniority in years of service.
- 2. Each session of this Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five (5) delegates from three (3) or more churches, shall constitute a quorum to transact business for the Association, but any less number may adjourn from time to time.
- 4. A member wishing to speak in conference shall arise and address the moderator, and shall be recognized by him, and shall not be allowed to speak longer than five minutes nor more than twice on the same subject without consent of the conference.
- 5. New churches may be admitted to this Association by a majority vote of the Association.
- 6. The yeas and nays may be taken on any question when requested by one third of the members present.
- 7. A committee of five laymembers, delegates present at the Association, shall be elected to look into the standing of the ministry of the Association and shall report to the Association before it adjourns, for approval.
- 8. No one shall be ordained to the ministry in this Association until they have carried ministers' license at least one yeer and must receive a call to pastor some church or be active in evangelistic efforts. The call for ordination must come from the church that called him or her to pastor it or from the church in which he or shee holds membership.
- 9. All committees or a Committee on Committees shall be appointed by the moderator or assistant moderator, unless otherwise provided for by the Association.
- 10. Whenever practicable, all business of importance coming before the local churhes shall be decided by secret ballot, a majority vote shall decide.
- 11. It shall be the duty of the churches of this Association to collect during the month of July each year, a sum of money not less than ten cents (10c) per member, to comply with the Budget System enacted by the Missouri State Association, and all of the money collected to be turned over to the Treasurer of this Association who shall send half to the Treasurer of the State Association. It shall be the pastor's duty to see that this "budget" of ten cents per member is collected and turned in so will be on hand for associational expenses.
- 12. It shall be the duty of the ministers and the churches of this Association to try to work in harmony with the Home Mission Board of this Association.

- 13. A request from the church that a brother or a sister be examined for license or ordination to preach the Gospel shall not mean that he or she shall be licensed or ordained, but that a council be appointed to examine him or her and if after examination, the council thinks best, he or she may be licensed or ordained.
- 14. Each minister belonging to this Association shall be required to make a report in person at least once in every three years. Otherwise his or her name shall be dropped from the minutes.
- 15. It shall be the duty of each church of this Association to have its pastoral year and with the annual session of the Association and to hold its annual business meeting before the Association meets each year.

16. When a church fails to report to the Association, its last report

shall be carried in the minutes.

17. All old afflicted ministers, who so desire, may be enrolled on a superannuated list, and not be required to report to the Association in order to receive an Annual Certificate of Ministerial Standing.

18. It shall be the duty of the ministers belonging to this Association to present their ordination papers to the clerk, that a correct copy can be secured and become a part of our permanent record for a future reference and use.

19. No one shall be licensed or ordained to preach the gospel, or

deacen ordained, who is a user of tobacco.

20. These By-Laws may be amended at any session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

FREE WILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. THE BIBLE.— The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of fait and practice.

2 Timothy 3:16.

2. GOD—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father. Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

1 Cor. 8:6; Matt. 28:19.

3. CHRIST.— Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Savior and Lord.

St. John 1:1-12.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT.— The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD.— Good exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.

Psalm 22:28; 97:2.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN.— Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God.

Gen. 2:17: 3:19.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST.— The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and ressurrection affected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

1 John 2:2.

8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION.— The conditions of salvation are: 1. Lepentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

2 Cor. 7:10; Pro. 28:13.

9. ELECTION.— God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.

1 Tim. 2:4.

10. FREEDOM OF WILL.— The human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish

Joshua 24:15.

11. SALVATION FREE.— God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of Life freely.

Rev. 22:17.

12. PERSEVERANCE.— All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.

St. John 15:6; 2 Peter 2:20-22.

13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES.— Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel: Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

Mark 16:15; 2 Cor. 4:5; St. John 13:14.

14. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH.— The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest. worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.

Gen. 2:3; Exod. 20:8-11.

15. WAR — War destroys the lives of the innocent, and is contrary to the New Testament, therefore, we are opposed to war.

16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION.—/The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked shall "go away into eternal punishment, but the rightcoous into eternal life."

John 5:29; Matt. 25:46.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church concrences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls, and the conversion of the world.
