

CONSTITUTION

Preamble:

From long experience we, the Original Free Will Baptist Churches, are convinced of the advantages of cooperative programs and united efforts for advancing the cause of our Lord; do propose to establish and maintain an association of churches for the purpose of spiritual fellowship, united efforts in missions, Christian education and church extension upon the following plan:

- I. This association shall be named the Coastal Association of Original F.W.B. Churches of North Carolina and shall be composed of such well regulated F.W.B. Churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.
- II. The acting members of this association shall be five (5) delegates from each organized church, chosen by the members of the respective churches while in session, together with all ordained and licensed ministers who appear on the roll of Ministers of the association, belonging to any church composing this body, and associational officers.
- III. The officers of this association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk who shall be treasurer and shall superintend the printing of the minutes. These officers shall be elected annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected; an Executive Board of four (4) members elected from the laity, whose duty shall be to transact all the business of the Association when this body is not in session, and whose term of office shall be as follows; one elected for one year; one elected for two years, one elected for three years, and one elected for four years; and at the expiration of each of these terms, one shall be elected for four years; And further if any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association the board shall fill such vacancies until the next session of the Association; all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve upon such officers, or directed by the Association in setting. The Officers of this Association, namely Moderator, Asst. Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer shall also be members of the Executive Board, and shall meet with the Board and shall have a vote on any and all matters that shall come before the Executive Board.
- IV. Any regular organized F.W.B. church maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practice as set forth in the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association, in favor of benevolent enterprises such as S.S., Missions, Temperance, Christian education, etc., may be received into this body by presenting a Petitionary letter requesting membership and upon exam-

ination and recommendation of the Examining Committee, and by a majority vote of the body in session. Moreover, any church holding membership in this Association reserves the right to participate, or refrain from participating in any of all programs of the body, or may withdraw from the Association at her own pleasure.

V. This Association shall have power to discipline its churches, exclude them for disorderly conduct, if labor proves unsuccessful; to license and ordain ministers as they are requested to do so by the churches, (such as give evidence of qualification); to settle questions of doctrine and discipline as the churches may refer to it; to make any rules and by-laws necessary to its regulation and not inconsistent with its constitution, but in no case shall this association reverse a decision of one of its churches, nor in any way interfere with its internal regulations, nor exert any ecclesiastical authority over the churches composing this association. (See National Treatise)

VI. This association shall convene quarterly at 10:00 a.m. on the fourth Saturday in January, April, and July for fellowship and the conducting of such business as may be deemed necessary. The annual business meeting shall be on the fourth Friday and Saturday of October beginning at 9:30 a.m. at which time the association shall act upon questions and topics as may be referred to it through its committees, and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, nor to the usages of the denomination as in their judgment may promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches within the limits of the association. The churches shall make such reports of their works as required by the association.

VII. It is the duty of this association to provide for general union of churches, to point out their interests and to aid them in securing pastors when requested to put evangelists and other ministers in places where the gospel is most needed, and require an annual written report from each minister belonging to this association.

VII. This constitution may be altered or amended by a twothirds majority of all members voting at any regular session of the association, written notice having been given at the last previous session.

BY-LAWS

- 1. At every setting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded with prayer by the moderator or whomever he may request.
- 2. These by-laws shall be distinctly read by the clerk immediately after the organization of the association and a copy in the hands of all delegates, both standing and elected.
- 3. The moderator shall call his assistant to fill the chair when he wishes to speak or otherwise vacate his place.
- 4. The moderator shall declare out of order any speaker who fails to speak on the subject before the body, or who makes use of unkind personalities.
- 5. The moderator shall not succeed himself more than once within a period of five (5) years.
- 6. All committees shall be elected by the body unless otherwise provided for by the association.
- 7. While the association is in session no member shall absent himself without permission from the moderator.
- 8. Any one wishing to speak shall arise and address the moderator and be recognized by him before speaking.
- 9. All visiting brethren may have the privilege to speak on any subject before the body, but not to vote unless ruled otherwise by the body.
- 10. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the association and not longer than five (5) minutes.
- 11. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second and the question stated by the moderator.
- 12. When a motion has been made and seconded, and stated by the chair, and any member opposes its discussion, the moderator shall put the question "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall be dismissed.
- 13. A motion shall be put in writing if any member of the body requests it.
- 14. No report shall be adopted except by motion and second and a vote to that effect.
- 15. Any member of the association violating any of these rules shall subject himself to the forfeiting of voting privileges for the remainder of the day.
- 16. A motion shall always be in order to adjourn, but shall not be discussed unless it is necessary to do so.

17. A Minister seeking membership in the Association shall present a petitionary letter to the Association, and after he has been recommended and approved by the Examining Board, and upon a majority vote of the Body in session. his name shall be placed on the roll of Ministers of the Association. Each new Minister coming into the Coastal Association shall be contacted by the Examining Board and notified of a date to appear before the Board for approval. This shall be done within two (2) months after he has arrived and begun his Pastorate in the Association. 18. No one shall be ordained to gospel ministry who is divorced and remarried, who uses tobacco, alcoholic beverages, narcotics or has a tolerant attitude toward liberalism, modernism, communism, catholicism, etc. Each candidate must carry license for at least one year. Then if request comes from the church to which he belongs and he be found worthy, he may be ordained, provided the candidate has been called to some definite work. All ministers called to pastor churches in this association shall be required to hold certificates of Ministerial Standing in force during their term of service as pastors. This certificate shall be issued upon request of the church in which they hold membership.

19. Each member church shall be required to make an annual report to the association. Any church failing to report for two consecutive years shall be declared out of fellowship with the association until such time as report is made. Churches affected by this action shall be notified by the clerk and given one month to report. If the church fails to respond, a visit will be made by the General Officers to the pastor. Those churches then failing to comply shall be notified that they are out of fellowship

until such time as they report.

20. These rules and the order of business may be temporarily suspended or permanently altered by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the body.

The Annual meeting of the Coastal Association met October 22-23, 1971, at Mt. Olive Free Will Baptist Church of Plymouth, N. C. The meeting opened with the singing of the hymn "Standing on the Promises," led by Rev. Roger Tripp. Rev. Charlie Dixon led in prayer. The devotion, taken from Acts 1:10-11, was given by Rev. James Dixon, of the Stacy Free Will Baptist Church.

The business meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. Wayne Smith, at which time the Clerk read the Constitution and By-Laws of the Association to the body. The Moderator then welcomed everyone and the delegates were properly seated, following the roll call of Churches. The roll of Ministers was then read.

The following committees were appointed to serve throughout the day:

Resolutions: Rev. Gene Outland, J. D. Brickhouse, Sister Cathy Severs

A partial report of the Examining Committee was given in which Rev. Glen Thomas petitioned the Coastal Association for membership. A motion was made to receive him into our fellowship following a letter from his former Association. (We are pending receipt of this letter). Motion carried.

Rev. Ronald Creech gave a report of the State Work.

The report of the Executive Committee was given and adopted. There being no miscellaneous business, a time of testimony was enjoyed until time for the Worship Service to begin. Rev. Wayne Smith brought the message at the 11:00 hour from John 9 and I Samuel 21:8, after which the session adjourned for the noon meal.

Friday Afternoon October 22, 1971

Session opened with the song "At the Cross," led by Rev. Dennis Wiggs. Prayer followed. Rev. Gene Outland brought the devotions from Proverbs 3:5-6.

Business resumed with the partial report of the Nominating Committee.

Rev. Wayne Smith was elected Moderator with Rev. Roger Tripp as Assistant Moderator. Rev. Roger Russell declined nomination as Clerk-Treasurer and the nomination was referred back to the committee for others.

Motion was made to elect both a Clerk and a Treasurer. Motion carried.

Motion was made to elect an Assistant Clerk and an Assistant Treasurer. Motion carried. These motions were to lay on the table until the next Quarterly Meeting, since they involve a change of the Constitution.

The Treasurer's Report was given and approved. The Finance Report was given and adopted.

The report of the Youth Board was given and adopted. The recommendations of the Youth Board were also given and adopted.

Motion made and carried to give a rising vote of thanks to Reverends Gene Outland, Rev. Roger Tripp, and Albert Rollins for their fine work among the Youth of the Association.

Meeting adjourned.

Saturday, October 23, 1971

The meeting opened with the song "Whosoever Meaneth Me," led by Rev. Roger Tripp. Prayer was offered by Rev. Tommy Godly, who was visiting from Kannapolis, N. C. The morning devotion was given by Bro. Wade Congers.

Business began with the Moderator calling the roll of Churches and Ministers, and the reading of the minutes of the previous day.

Motion was made to receive Bro. Wade Congers into the Association as a licensed Minister. Motion carried. Rev. Wayne Smith extended to him the right hand of fellowship into the Association.

The Final Report of the nominating committee was given and a motion made to elect each one individually. Motion carried.

The Digest Committee gave its report which was approved and adopted. There were 17 Ministers present and 12 absent from the session.

Rev. Tommy Godly, from the State Board of Care, made a plea to the Association for support of the care of the aged.

The Resolutions Committee Report was given and adopted Item by Item.

The Ladies' Auxiliary Report was given as information by Sister Peggy Outland, Moderator.

The Final Report of the Examining Committee was given and adopted.

A motion was made to remove the name of Henry Hagan from the roll of Ministers. Motion carried. The Clerk was charged to write a letter to Rev. Hagan to inform him of the action taken.

The 11:00 Worship began with the Mission Board in charge. Rev. Thomas Johnson led the singing. Rev. Dennis Wiggs challenged the Pastors and delegates with a summary of the blessings of God upon the Mission work of the Charleston, S. C. church where he formerly pastored. Rev. Ervin Hyman brought a wonderful message.

The delegates to the State Association June 12-14, 1972, Liberty Free Will Baptist Church, Durham, N. C.,

were chosen as follows:

A motion was made to elect these as delegates with power given the Moderator to appoint any alternates who may be needed.

A motion was made and carried to let the Executive Committee choose the Friday speaker at the next annual session of the Association.

A motion was made and carried to send \$30.00 as dues

to the State Association in 1972.

The meeting adjourned with prayer offered by Rev. Wayne Smith.

THE REPORT OF THE CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE AND YOUTH RELATIONS BOARD

We, your Board, submit the following report:

Part I We thank the Lord for His blessings during the past year and for the priviledge of service to Him in the area of Church Training and Youth Camp Program. We appreciate the interest and co-coperation of many of our churches in regards to the work of our committee. It is our desire to see all our churches improve their Church Training Service Program and to do more in reaching and guiding young people to yield their lives to Christ.

Under the direction of our committee, two Associational C.T.S. Rallies were held. At our Rally held in April 3, 1971 several young people from various churches within our Association entered competitive activities to determine winners who would represent our Association at the State level of competition. The number of contestants entering the competitive activities was down last year, however, the winners did a fine job representing us at the State Rally and two of our contestants won at the State and represented our State at the National Youth Competitive Activities.

Part II The Youth Camp Program being the responsibility of our committee, our committee endeavored to provide a good Camp Program. We are glad to report that we had two great weeks of camp, with both the Junior and teenage weeks being outstanding weeks of our several years of youth camp work. We witnessed many decisions for Christ as Juniors and Teen-agers were saved and many rededicated their lives to the Lord.

The first week of camp seventy-five (75) teenagers attended. The staff, which consisted of, Irvin Hyman, Robert Edwards, Sigbee Dilda, Gerald Corbett, James Dixon, Jonathan Thigpen, Rodney Whaley. Mary Dilda, Sybil Trip, Eva Jean Dixon, Cathy Severs, Opal Boyd, Carolyn McRay, and Roger Tripp and Gene Outland served as Directors. All workers did a great job working with the Teen-agers.

The second week of camp, one-hundred-five (105) Juniors attended. Our staff consisted of, Gordon Hart, Roger Russell, Dennis Wiggs, Jim Sturgill, Billy Hill, Vickie Sturgill, Cynthia Allen, Ruth Russell, Pamela Gillen, Cathy Severs, Mary Etta Hill, Estelle Parker, Opal Boyd. Janie Moore and Albert Rollins and Gene Outland as directors.

Peggy Outland, Mary E. Blackman, Virginia Waller, Annie Heath, Lavenia Basnight, Virginia Hart, June Lewis, and other ladies from some of our churches did a wonderful job in preparing fine meals for the two weeks of camp. Part III In that we trust and want to see our Church Training Service in all our churches improved to provide a good camp program for our young people, we offer the following recommendations:

- 1. We recommend that each church exert every effort necessary to maintain an active Church Training Service Program with special emphasis given to reaching our youth. We offer our service to help in organizing youth work in your church or area.
- 2. We recommend the devotional guide, Depth, available through our National office, and that our people use it for devotional time in the home.
- 3. We recommend that two Association wide CTS rallies be held during the coming year, one on December 4, 1971 and one on April 8, 1972.

4. We recommend that all our churches endeavor to have entries in all youth Competitive Activities.

- 5. We recommend that the district run-offs for the competitive activities be held at the April 8, rally and that all contestants must be registered by March 15, 1972.
- 6. We recommend that our churches order their Church Training Service materials from out National Church Training Service Dept.
- 7. We recommend that the Coastal Association sponsor, under the direction of the Board, two weeks of Youth Camp for our young people next summer, and that we endeavor to rent the Presbyterian Camp at Bogue Sound.
- 8. We recommend that the Camp fee be \$18.00 per camper.
- 9. We recommend that each church in our Association make a contribution of \$25.00 or more to the Youth Work of our Association.
