#### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS AS AMENDED THROUGH APRIL 1982

#### CONSTITUTI ON

#### Preamble:

From long experience we the Original Free Will Baptists Churches, are convinced of the advantages of cooperative programs and united efforts for advancing the cause of cour Lord; do purpose to establish and maintain an association of churches for the purpose of spiritual fellowship, united efforts in missions, Christian education and church extension upon the following plan:

I. This association shall be named the Coastal Association of Original F.W.B. Churches of North Carolina and shall be composed of such well regulated F.W.B. Churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.

II. The acting members of this association shall be five (5) delegates from each organized church, chosen by the members of the respective churches while in session, together with all ordained and licensed ministers who appear on the roll of Ministers of the association, belonging to any church composing this body and associational officers.

III. The officers of this association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk and a treasurer and who shall superintend the printing of the minutes. These officers shall be elected annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected, an Executive Board of four (4) members elected from the laity, whose term of office be as follows: one elected for one year, one elected for two years, one elected for three years, and one elected for four years: and at the expiration of each of these terms, one shall be elected for four years. The Officers of the Association

namely Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer shall also be members of the Executive Board, and shall meet with the Board and shall have a vote on any and all matters that shall come before the Executive Board.

IV. Any regular organized F.W.B. Church maintaining gospel order agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practive as set forth in the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association, in favor of benevolent enterprises such as S. S., Missions, Temperance, Christian education, etc., may be received into this body by presenting a Petitionary letter requesting membership and upon examination and recommendation of the Examining Committee, and by a majority vote of the body in session. Moreover, any church holding membership in this Association reserves the right to participate, or refrain from participating in any of all programs of the body or may withdraw from the Association at her own pleasure.

V. This Association shall have the power to discipline its churches, exclude them for disorderly conduct, if labor proves unsuccessful, to license and ordain ministers as they are requested to do so by the churches, (such as give evidence of qualification); to settle questions of doctrine and discipline as the churches may refer to it; to make any rules and bylaws necessary to its regulation and not inconsistent with its constitution, but in no case shall this association reverse a decision of one of its churches, nor in any way interfere with its internal regulations, nor exert any ecclesiastical authority over the churches composing this association. (See National Treatise).

VI. This association shall convene quarterly at 10:00 a.m. on the fourth Saturday in January, July and October for fellowship and the conducting of such business as may be deemed necessary. The annual business meeting shall be on the fourth Saturday of April beginning at 9:30 a.m. at which time the association shall act upon questions and topics as may be referred to its committees and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, or to the usages of the denomination as in their judgment may promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches within the limits of the association. The churches shall make such reports of their works as required by the association.

VII. It is the duty of this association to provide for general union of churches, to point out their interests and to aid them in securing pastors when requested to put evangelists and other ministers in places where the gospel is most needed, and require an annual written report from each minster belonging to this association.

VIII. Duties and job descriptions of the Boards of the Coastal Association:

A. THE MISSIONS BOARD - It shall be the responsibility of the Missions Board of this association to promote the cause of Home and Foreign Missions among the churches of the association through information provided them at the associational meetings, references from the mission boards of the National Association, inquiries from various churches, and actively promoting the actual ministry of various missionaries by scheduling services for them in the churches when requesting them to do so. In addition, the mission board shall maintain an up to date listing of all missionaries, both Home and Foreign, with their addresses and current needs so as to be of use to the churches as a source of information.

B. THE EXAMING BOARD - It shall inquire as to the qualifications of ministers, approving or disapproving them for recommendation accordingly. They shall be the investigating committee for new churches wishing to unite with this association, and upon satisfactory recommendation, the churches shall be recommended to the association. They shall examine the credentials of ministers transferring into this association and shall make recommendation to the association as to their reception.

- C. THE CHURCH TRAINING AND YOUTH RELATIONS BOARD -It shall promote the training program for the youth among the churches of this association; shall be responsible for conducting team and individual competitions for the various youth competitive programs offered by the National CTS Department; and shall be responsibile for conducting youth camp sessions on behalf of the youth of this association, the time and frequency to be determined by the Board. They shall encourage area youth rallies.
- D. THE EXECUTIVE BOARD It shall transact all the business of the association when this body is not in session. If any vacancies occur between sessions of the association the board shall fill such vacancies until the next session of the association; all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve such officers, or directed by the association in session.
- E. The general responsibility of all boards of this association shall be to promote the good of the cause of Christ among the churches of the association and seek to help the churches to become more effective in the work of the Gospel.

IX. This constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds majority of all members voting at any regular session of the association, written notice having been given at the last previous session.

#### BY-LAWS

- 1. At every setting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded with prayer by the moderator or whomever he may request.
- 2. These by-laws shall be distinctly read by the clerk immediately after the organization of the association and a copy in the hands of all delegates, both standing and elected.
- 3. The moderator shall call his assistant to fill the chair when he wishes to speak or otherwise vacate his place.
- 4. The moderator shall declare out of order any speaker who fails to speak on the subject before the body, or who makes use of unkind personalities.
- 5. The moderator shall not succeed himself more than once within a period of five (5) years.
- 6. All committees shall be elected by the body unless otherwise provided for by the association.
- 7. While the association is in session no member shall absent himself without permission from the moderator.
- 8. Any one wishing to speak shall rise and address the moderator and be recognized by him before speaking.
- 9. All visiting brethren may have the privilege to speak on any subject before the body, but not to vote unless ruled otherwise by the body.
- 10. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the association and not longer than five (5) minutes.
- 11. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second and the question stated by the moderator.
- 12. When a motion has been make and seconded, and stated by the chair, and any member opposes its discussion, the moderator shall put the question, 'shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall be dismissed.
- 13. A motion shall be put in writing if any member of the body requests it.

- 14. No report shall be adopted except by motion and second and a vote to that effect.
- 15. Any member of the association violating any of these rules shall subject himself to the forfeiting of voting privileges for the remainder of the day.
- 16. A motion shall always be in order to adjourn, but shall not be discussed unless it is necessary to do so.
- 17. A minister seeking membership in the Association shall present a petitionary letter to the Association, and after he has been recommended and approved by the Examining Board, and upon a majority vote of the Body in session, his name shall be placed on the roll of Ministers of the Association. Each new Minister coming into the Coastal Association shall be contacted by the Examing Board and notified of a date to appear before the Board for approval. This shall be done within two (2) months after he has arrived and begun his Pastorate in the Association.
  - 18. No one shall be licensed or ordained to the gospel ministry or received into our association who is divorced or married to a divorcee, one who uses tobacco, alcoholic beverages, narcotics or has a tolerant attitude toward liberalism, modernism, communism, catholicism, and tongues speaking as a part of the practice of the Christian life and evidence of the Holy Spirit's presence and approval. One who seeks to be licensed to preach, his local church should recommend him to this body for membership. He should possess the same standards as the ordained minister. The license must be for one year.
  - 19. The ministers are required to attend the Coastal Association meetings unless prohibited by a legitimate reason, approved by the body. If a minister does not report to the meetings over a continuous period of two years by presence or letter or he begins to pastor a church

outside of the Coastal Association, his name shall be dropped from the roll. Before the name is dropped, the moderator must contact him. 20. Each member church shall be required to make an annual report to the Association. Any church failing to report for two consecutive years shall be declared out of fellowship with the association until such time as report is made. Churches affected by this action shall be notified by the clerk and given one month to report. If the church fails to respond, a visit will be make by the General Officers to the pastor. Those churches then failing to comply shall be notified that they are out of fellowship until such time as they report. 

21. These rules and the order of business may be temporarily suspended or permanently altered by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the body.

PROPOSED GUIDELINES FOR ORGANIZING AND ACCEPTING NEW CHURCHES INTO THE COASTAL ASSOCIATION OF NORTH CAROLINA FREE WILL BAPTISTS:

- I. When a Church or a Mission Church desire the fellowship with the Coastal Association, the following procedure should be followed:
- A. The church present a written request at a regularly scheduled associational session.

B. The church provide representatives from the church for this session.

- C. The representatives of the church meet with the Examining Board for questioning per-
- taining to the church's former association, present organization, purpose, and doctrine and practices.

- II. If the Examining Board recommends the church to our fellowship, the following proceduce should be followed:
  - A. The church coming from other denominations or associations be taken under the watchcare of the association for one year.
  - B. The church submits a statistical report to the Examining Board's chairman at the end of each six months.
  - C. After one year watchcare, the Examining Board may recommend that the church be taken into full fellowship of the Coastal Association.
  - D. During the year of watchcare, the church should send non voting representatives to the Coastal Association.
- III. When A Mission Church desires fellowship with the Coastal Association, the following procedure should be followed:
  - A. The mission church should follow the above guidelines, with the exception of the one year waiting period, plus:
  - B. After becoming established enough to operate as a church and having twenty-five charter members, organize into a church with an organizational service. The Coastal Association Moderator, Chairman of the Mission Board and Examining Board should participate in the service.
  - C. Recognize the KJV Bible as the only rule of faith and practice.
  - D. Adopt the Free Will Baptist Church Covenant.

E. Adopt a Constitution and By-Laws based upon the National Association Treatise.

F. Request to be accepted by the Coastal Association in full fellowship at the next session.

#### APRIL 26, 1980

The eighteenth annual session of the Coastal Association of Free Will Baptist of North Carolina met on April 26, 1980 at 9:30 a.m. with the Calvary Church in Jacksonville, N. C.

The session began with congregational singing led by Bro. Hershel Allen. Rev. Dennis Wiggs led in prayer. The moderator, Rev. Sigbee Dilda, introduced Rev. James Shields, the host pastor, who gave a warm welcome to the conference.

In the absence of Rev. Buford Pierce, Chaplain Walt Golden was introduced by the moderator for the morning devotions. He spoke from II Timothy 3:1-5, on the topic "Religion without power."

The session was called to order by the Clerk by reading the By-Laws. The minutes of the last session was read and approved by the body. The rolecall was made of churches, ordained and licenses ministers. A motion was made and seconded to drop the names of Rev. Harvey Luke and Rev. Phillip Jones from the role of ordained ministers of the Coastal Association. The motion was passed.

The moderator recognized all standing delegates then seated the elected delegates and charged them with the business of the day. Then the moderator recognized the visiting delegates and welcomed them to our conference, after which he called for petitionary letters.

A motion was made, seconded and passed to empower the chair to appoint the Digest, Finance and Resolutions Committees for today. The following were appointed:

Rev. Freeman Edwards was recognized to give the Treasurer's report. Motion was made, seconded and passed to adopt the report as read. The moderator called attention to an article in the News and Observer paper stating their objection to Christians getting involved in politics. The moderator urged all Christians to get registered and vote in the elections.

The moderator recognized Rev. Guy Owens, Minister-At-Large, who gave a report of his work through the state, and urging each church of the need for sending their \$25.00 registration fee to the State Association. A motion was made, seconded and passed to receive the report as information.

The Worship Service began with congregational singing, "Won't It Be Wonderful There" led by Bro. Hershel Allen. Prayer was offered by Rev. Rudolph Outlaw. The offering was received and special music. The moderator introduced Rev. Guy Owens, who brought the morning message from Deuteronomy 6:12, I Cor. 10:1-10 on the subject "Remember, Not To Forget."

Moderator called for host pastor to give instruction concerning the morning meal after which Rev. Freeman Edwards dismissed the session in prayer until after the noon meal. A special request for prayer was given for Rev. Johnny Floyd, Sr., who is suffering from cancer.

The afternoon session was opened with congregation singing led by Bro. Hershel Allen. The song was entitled "When I See The Blood." Rev. Don Craft led in prayer. The moderator introducted Rev. Mike Tart, pastor at Cove City, who brought the devotions from Heb. 12:12-13, "The Hebrew Christians."

Rev. Don Craft gave the finance report as

follows: Total offering from the churches, \$185.00, today's offering \$44.00 for a total of \$229.00 to be disbursed as follows: Mission Board \$75.00; Youth Board \$45.00; Minister-At-Large \$45.00; Witness \$45.00; leaving \$19.00. Motion was made, seconded and passed to adopt report as read.

Rev. Harold Moore gave the report of the Resolutions Committee as follows:

- 1. Be it resolved that each member of the Coastal Association register and vote in the primaries and November election.
- 2. Be it resolved that each church member of the Coastal Association consider the candidate's in the light of the Bible and vote according to Biblical standards and principles.
- 3. Be it resolved that the Coastal Association offer special prayer in connection with the hostage situation in Iran.
- 4. Be it resolved that we give the host church a rising vote of thanks for their fine hospitality during this meeting.

Motion was made, seconded and passed to receive the report and adopt it item by item. All items were passed. Rev. Buford Pierce led the conference in prayer for the hostages in Iran.

The Digest report was given by Rev. Rudolph Outlaw as follows: Churches reporting 17; number baptised 146; number added by letter or by statement of faith 60; members lost 190; total present membership 2,481; Sunday School enrollment 2,291; C.T.S. enrollment 459; Ladies' Auxiliary 317; Master's Men 33.

Rev. William Sealy gave the report of the Youth Relations Board as follows: District youth eliminations will be next Saturday at Beaufort at 10:00 a.m.; first and second place winners of the

previous eliminations of this association year in Bible Bowl and Tic-Tac-Toe are eligible to compete. Sword Drill Swordsmen are eligible to compete. All those who have competed already in Bible Memory are eligible. This is also the time for all Music and Arts festival contestants to compete.

The Coastal Association youth camp will be August 4-9 at Spencewood Camp, information and reservations will be forthcoming. Please be much in prayer for our youth and for the Youth Relations Board as the new board tries to revive the youth work in our Association. Also encourage your youth to get involved in the activities. Motion was made and seconded and passed to receive the report.

Rev. Dennis Wiggs gave the report of the Examing Board as follows: having met with Rev. James Shields, we recommend that he be added to our list of ordained ministers, pending a letter from the Southeastern Association of Alabama. Motion was made, seconded and passed to receive the report. Then the moderator gave the right hand of fellowship to Rev. Shields and welcomed him to our Association.

Rev. Billie Jackson made a motion that the next session (in July) be moved to August 2 due to the National Association and the problem of travel. Seconded and passed.

Motion was made, seconded and passed that the moderator be given the power to appoint our delegates from those attending the State Association.



He stated that last year was the best year in the history of our college, with 613 students attending. There was a \$494,610.94 general fund giving and a \$206,668.08 in the building fund. This was a record total income of \$701,279.02. With an operating budget of over \$1,950,000.00 the difference is what the students pay to attend the college, He expressed his greatfulness to God and our people for this record income year, in light of the overall economic situation in our country. He considered this nothing less than a miracle.

Bro. Creech reported that 581 students have registered this year with 107 coming from N. C. N. C. is No. 1 in students, 85 are from Tenn., and 57 for Ala.

He also expressed his appreciation to our Coastal Association for the great job that we are doing in raising money for the general fund. He stated the Memorial Auditorium is our current building fund project, taking two years to raise the \$400,000 that it will cost to expand and referbish the auditorium. 
