

CONSTITUTION

Preamble

From long experience, we, the Original Free Will Baptist Churches, being convinced of the advantages of cooperative programs and united efforts for advancing the cause of our Lord, do purpose to establish and maintain an association of churches for the purpose of spiritual fellowship, united efforts in missions, Christian education and church extension upon the following plan:

I. This Association shall be named the *Coastal Association of Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina* and shall be composed of such well-regulated Free Will Baptist churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.

II. The acting members of the Association shall be five (5) delegates from each organized church (chosen by the members of the respective church, while in session), associational officers and board members, and all ordained and licensed ministers, whose names appear on the roll of ministers of the Association belonging to any church composing this body.

III. The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a treasurer, and a clerk, who shall superintend the printing of the minutes. These officers shall be elected annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. An Executive Board of four (4) members is elected from the laity, whose term of office shall be as follows: one elected for one year, one elected for two years, one elected for three years, and one elected for four year; and at the expiration of each of these terms, one shall be elected for four years. The

officers of the Association are named: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer and shall be members of the Executive Board, and shall meet with the Board and shall have a vote on any and all matters that shall come before the Executive Board.

IV. Any regular organized Free Will Baptist church maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practice as set forth in the *Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptist*, and in favor of benevolent enterprises such as Sunday School, Missions, Temperance, Christian Education, etc., may be received into this body by presenting a Petitionary Letter requesting membership and upon examination and recommendation of the Examining Board, and by majority vote of the body in session. Moreover, any church holding membership in this Association reserves the right to participate, or refrain from participating in any or all programs of the body, or may withdraw from the Association at her own pleasure.

V. This Association shall have the power to discipline its churches; exclude them for disorderly conduct if labor proves unsuccessful; to license and ordain ministers (such as give evidence of qualifications); to settle questions of doctrine and discipline as the churches may refer to it; and to make any rules necessary to its regulation and not inconsistent with its internal regulations. The Association may not exert any ecclesiastical authority over the churches composing it (see National Treatise).

VI. This Association shall convene quarterly at 10:00 A.M. on the fourth Saturday in January, July, and October for fellowship and the conducting of such business as may be deemed necessary. The annual business meeting shall be on the fourth Saturday of April, beginning at 9:30 at which time the Association shall act upon questions and

topics as may be referred to its committees and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, or to the usage of the denomination as in their judgment may promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches within the limits of the Association. The churches shall make such reports of their work as required by the Association.

VII. It is the duty of this Association to provide for general union of churches, to point out their interests, and to aid them in securing pastors when requested, to put evangelists and other ministers in places where the gospel is most needed, and require an annual written report from each minister belonging to this Association.

VIII. Duties and job descriptions of the Boards of the Coastal Association:

A. THE MISSIONS BOARD: It shall be the responsibility of the Missions Board of this Association to promote the cause of Home and Foreign Missions among the churches of the Association through information provided them at the associational meetings, references from the mission boards of the National Association, inquiries from various churches, and actively promoting the actual ministry of various missionaries by scheduling services for them in the churches when requesting them to do so. In addition, the Mission Board shall maintain an up-to-date listing of all missionaries, both Home and Foreign, with their addresses and current needs so as to be of use to the churches as a source of information.

B. THE EXAMINING BOARD: It shall inquire as to the qualifications of ministers, approving or disapproving them for recommendations

accordingly. They shall be the investigating committee for new churches wishing to unite with this Association, and upon satisfactory recommendation, the churches shall be recommended to the Association. They shall examine the credentials of ministers transferred to this Association and shall make recommendation to the Association as to their reception.

C. THE CHURCH TRAINING AND YOUTH RELATIONS BOARD: It shall promote the training program for the youth among the churches of this Association; shall be responsible for conducting team and individual competitions for the various youth competitive programs offered by National C.T.S. Department; and shall be responsible for conducting youth camp sessions on behalf of the youth of this Association, the time and frequency to be determined by the board. They shall encourage area youth rallies.

D. THE EXECUTIVE BOARD: It shall transact all the business of the Association when this body is not in session. If any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association, the board shall fill such vacancies until the next session of the Association; all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve to such officers, or as directed by the Association in session.

E. The general responsibility of all boards of this Association shall be to promote the good of the cause of Christ among the churches of the Association and seek to help the churches to become more effective in the work of the Gospel.

IX. This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of all members voting at any regular session of the Association, written notice having been given at the previous session.

Bylaws

1. At every setting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded with prayer by the moderator or whomever he may request.
2. These By-Laws shall be distinctly read by the clerk immediately after the convening of the Association and a copy has been placed in the hands of all delegates, both standing and elected.
3. The moderator shall call his assistant to fill the chair when he wishes to speak or otherwise vacate his place.
4. The moderator shall declare out of order any speaker who fails to speak on the subject, or who makes unkind use of personalities.
5. The moderator shall not succeed himself more than once within a period of five (5) years.
6. All committees shall be elected by the body unless otherwise provided by the Association.
7. While the Association is in session, no member shall absence himself without permission from the moderator.
8. Anyone wishing to speak shall rise and address the moderator and be reconized by him before speaking.

9. All visiting bretheren may have the privilege to speak on any subject before the body, but not to vote unless ruled otherwise by the body.
10. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association and not longer than five (5) minutes.
11. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second and the question having been stated by the moderator.
12. When a motion has been made and seconded and stated by the chair, and any member opposes its discussion, the moderator shall put the question, "shall it be discussed?". If negative, the question shall be dismissed.
13. A motion shall be put in writing if any member of the body request it.
14. No report shall be adopted except by motion and second and a vote to that effect.
15. Any member of the Association violating any of these rules shall subject himself to the forfeiting of voting privileges for the remainder of the day.
16. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order.
17. A minister seeking membership in the Association; and, after he has been recommended and approved by the Examining Board, and upon a majority vote of the Body in session, his name shall be placed on the "Roll of Ministers of the Association". Each new minister coming into the Coastal Association shall be contacted

by the Examining Board and notified of a date to appear before the board for approval. This should be done within two (2) months after he has arrived and begun his pastorate in the Association.

18. No one shall be licensed or ordained to the Gospel ministry or received into our Association who is divorced or married to a divorcee, homosexual, or immoral in his lifestyle; who uses tobacco, alcoholic beverages, or illegal narcotics; or who has a tolerant attitude toward liberalism, modernism, communism, Catholicism, or tongues speaking as a part of the practice of the Christian life and evidence of the Holy Spirit's presence and approval. One who seeks to be licensed to preach must be recommended by his local church to this body for membership. He should possess same standards as the ordained minister. The license must be for a period of one (1) year.
19. The ministers are required to attend the Coastal Association meetings unless prohibited by a legitimate reason, approved by the body. If a minister does not report to the meetings over a continuous period of two (2) years by presence or letter, or he begins to pastor a church outside the Coastal Association, his name shall be dropped from the roll. Before the name is dropped, the moderator must contact him.
20. Each member church shall be required to make an annual report to the Association. Any church failing to report for two (2) consecutive years shall be declared out of fellowship with the Association until such a time as report is made. Churches affected by this action shall be notified by the clerk and given one month to report. If a church fails to respond, a visit shall be made by the General Officers to the pastor. Those churches then failing to comply shall

be notified that they are out of fellowship until such a time as they report.

21. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order* shall govern this body in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Bylaws of this Association.
22. These rules may be amended and the order of business may be temporarily suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the body.

Proposed Guidelines for Organizing and Accepting New Churches into The Coastal Association of North Carolina Free Will Baptist.

- I. When a church or mission church desires the fellowship with the Coastal Association, the following procedures should be followed:
 - A. The church presents a written request at a regularly scheduled associational session.
 - B. The church provides for this session.
 - C. The representatives of the church meet with the Examining Board for questioning pertaining to the church's former association, present organization, purpose, and doctrine practices.
- II. If the Examining Board recommends the church to our fellowship, the following procedure

should be followed:

- A. The church coming from other denominations or associations shall be taken under the watch care of the Association for one year.
 - B. The church submits a statistical report to the Examining Board's chairman at the end of each six months.
 - C. After one year's watch care, the Examining Board may recommend that the church be taken into full fellowship of the Coastal Association.
 - D. During the year of watch care, the church should send non-voting representatives to the Coastal Association.
- III. When a Mission Church desires fellowship with the Coastal Association, the following procedure should be followed:
- A. The mission church should follow the above guidelines, with the exception of the one year waiting period, plus:
 - B. After becoming established enough to operate as a church and having twenty-five charter members, organize into a church with a organizational service. The Coastal Association Moderator, Chairman of the Mission Board, and Examining Board should participate in the service.
 - C. Recognize the KJV Bible as the only rule of

faith and practice.

- D. Adopt the Free Will Baptist Church Covenant.
- E. Adopt a Constitution and Bylaws based upon the National Association Treatise.
- F. Request to be accepted by the Coastal Association in full fellowship at the next session.

July 29, 1995

The Coastal Association of Free Will Baptist meet on July 29, 1995 at the New Hope Free Will Baptist Church. The session was opened with the singing of "Victory in Jesus". The moderator then recognized the host pastor, Don Craft, who extended the who extended the welcome.

Rev. Henry Potter brought the morning devotion out of Ex 3:18 and Mark 14.

The morning session began with the reading of the Bylaws and minutes of the previous meeting by Ernest Laxton in place of the clerk who was absent. After the roll call of ministers and churches and the seating of the delegates the Moderator was given the power to appoint the committees for the day which were as follows: Finance: Walt Golding, Braxton Mason, Buster Radford; Digest: Bill Kellum and Glenwood Kennedy; Resolutions: Johnny Pike, Phil Long, Kenny Talman.

The Treasurer's report reflected: A Beginning Balance - \$383.58, Total Receipts - \$1,751.13, Total Disbursements - \$1667.65, Leaving and Ending Balance of - \$467.06.

A motion was made to start the association meetings at 9:30. The motion was tabled.

Molly Barker gave report on the work in Uruguay. She also read from the book of Exodus and shared from her heart.

After the singing of "Beulah Land" by the Joint-Heirs the message was brought by Dennis Wiggs from Rev. 3:1-6 and Neh. 1:1-5 on the topic formula for revival.

The afternoon session began with the singing of "When we all get to Heaven". The floor was then open for testimonies.

The afternoon business began with the various committee and board reports. They are as follows: The Finance Committee report was as follows: Beginning Balance - \$467.06, Total Receipts - \$417.22, Total Disbursements - \$690.00, Ending Balance ----- \$194.28

The Digest Committee report was as follows: Reporting - 12 Churches. Received - 17, Lost by death 4, by transfer - 1, Total members -1,903, Sunday School -1,262, C.T.S. - 166, WNAC - 114, Master's Men-24, Mid Week Ser. 576, Amount - Dues \$280.00.

The Resolution Committee report was as follows: 1>Whereas, we have enjoyed the gracious hospitality and food of the New Hope FWB Church of Jacksonville N.C. Be it therefore resolved, that we give the host church a rising vote of thanks.

All the committee reports passed as presented.

Dennis Wiggs gave the youth board report.

The Examining Board report was as follows: We recommend that Brother Henry Potter be received into our association as an ordained minister and pastor of Calvary FWB church, pending the acceptance of the Examining Committee questionnaire. The Examining Board report was accepted as given.

After some brief announcements the Association was adjourned.□

Resolutions: 1>Whereas, the trend of this age is for churches to participate in social demonstrations, to condone or overlook the sins of homosexuality and lesbianism, to

cooperate with the Catholics and Charismatics, to neglect Biblical Evangelism, to challenge the inspiration of the Scriptures, to Question the need for true revival, to endorse the beat and sound of the world's music and call it Christian, to fail to cry aloud against the murder of unborn children, and to be content with spiritual apathy and liturgy; Therefore, be it resolved that the Free Will Baptist of the Coastal Association continue to preach and teach the whole counsel of God, Condemn the modern-day compromise of the teachings of God's Word, Commit ourselves to evangelism of the unsaved and revival of the church, Confess our sins of the weaknesses of crying aloud against the social transgressions of our society, and Confirm our believe in the soon return of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. 2>Whereas, Palmetto Chapel has provided their church facilities and an excellent meal on the grounds, thanks to the Lord for clearing up the rainy weather; Therefore, we recommend that we give the host church a standing vote of thanks. All committee reports were passed as presented. Tom Lilly brought report on the status of the work within our state. The Emmanuel Church expressed their concerns over giving a letter of good standing for Brother Harold Moore. The Coastal Association was informed and that time that the Emmanuel Church had revoked Brother Moore's Ordination papers. The Coastal Association has recorded their action and filed their official letter concerning the

matter. The association was dismissed with prayer around the altar.

Digest: Churches Reporting - 14, Number Received - 126, Number Lost - 47, Total Membership - 2892, Sunday School Enrollment - 1610, CTS Enrollment - 303, Woman's Auxiliary - 235, Master's Men - 14, Baptisms - 106, Amount Sent to Coastal - \$1000, Ordained Ministers - 24, Licensed Ministers - 9, Ordained Deacons - 65. Resolutions: 1>Whereas there is a tendency toward apathy regarding the slaughter of innocent babies, created in the image of God; And whereas President Clinton recently vetoed a bill that would have banned partial birth abortion, thus condoning this abominable practice; And whereas the Word of God clearly condemns the shedding of innocent blood; Be it resolved that we renew our opposition to the great sin of abortion through increased prayer, through influencing

others regarding the evils of this crime, and by encouraging our people to share their deep opposition to this enormity with our public officials. 2>Whereas Ruth's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church has extended hospitality in providing facilities and a delicious meal, we recommend that a rising vote of thanks be given to this church. The nominating committee report was as follows: Moderator - Don Craft, Assistant Moderator - Earl Hanna, Clerk - Tim Osborn, Assistant Clerk - Joe Haas, Treasurer - Alvin Keener, Assistant Treasurer - Jerry Rackley, Mance Cason - Examining Board till 1999, Dennis Wiggs - Youth Board till 1999, Mike Gray - Missions Board till 1999, Gil Fann - Executive Board till 2000. The Examining Board report was as follows: The Examining Board has met with Mr. Willey Coleman and recommends that he be licensed by the First Free Will Baptist Church of Morehead, after which he will be placed on the Roll of Licensed Ministers. The Examining Board report was passed as given.
