CONSTITUTION

1996-1997

Preamble

From long experience, we, the Original Free Will Baptist Churches, being convinced of the advantages of cooperative programs and united efforts for advancing the cause of our Lord, do purpose to establish and maintain an association of churches for the purpose of spiritual fellowship, united efforts in missions, Christian education and church extension upon the following plan:

I. This Association shall be named the *Coastal Association of Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina* and shall be composed of such well-regulated Free Will Baptist churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.

II. The acting members of the Association shall be five (5) delegates from each organized church (chosen by the members of the respective church, while in session), associational officers and board members, and all ordained and licensed ministers, whose names appear on the roll of ministers of the Association belonging to any church composing this body.

III. The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, an assistant moderator, a treasurer, and a clerk, who shall superintend the printing of the minutes. These officers shall be elected annually, and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. An Executive Board of four (4) members is elected from the laity, whose term of office shall be as follows: one elected for one year, one elected for two years, one elected for three years, and one elected for four year; and at the expiration of each of these

terms, one shall be elected for four years. The officers of the Association are named: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer and shall be members of the Executive Board, and shall meet with the Board and shall have a vote on any and all matters that shall come before the Executive Board.

IV. Any regular organized Free Will Baptist church maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practice as set forth in the *Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptist*, and in favor of benevolent enterprises such as Sunday School, Missions, Temperance, Christian Education, etc., may be received into this body by presenting a Petitionary Letter requesting membership and upon examination and recommendation of the Examining Board, and by majority vote of the body in session. Moreover, any church holding membership in this Association reserves the right to participate, or refrain from participating in any or all programs of the body, or may withdraw from the Association at her own pleasure.

V. This Association shall have the power to discipline its churches; exclude them for disorderly conduct if labor proves unsuccessful; to license and ordain ministers (such as give evidence of qualifications); to settle questions of doctrine and discipline as the churches may refer to it; and to make any rules necessary to its regulation and not inconsistent with its internal regulations. The Association may not exert any ecclesiastical authority over the churches composing it (see National Treatise).

VI. This Association shall convene quarterly at 10:00 A.M. on the fourth Saturday in January, July, and October for fellowship and the conducting of such business as may be deemed necessary. The annual business meeting

shall be on the fourth Saturday of April, beginning at 9:30 at which time the Association shall act upon questions and topics as may be referred to its committees and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, or to the usage of the denomination as in their judgment may promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches within the limits of the Association. The churches shall make such reports of their work as required by the Association.

VII. It is the duty of this Association to provide for general union of churches, to point out their interests, and to aid them in securing pastors when requested, to put evangelists and other ministers in places where the gospel is most needed, and require an annual written report from each minister belonging to this Association.

VIII. Duties and job descriptions of the Boards of the Coastal Association:

A. THE MISSIONS BOARD: It shall be the responsibility of the Missions Board of this Association to promote the cause of Home and Foreign Missions among the churches of the Association through information provided them at the associational meetings, references from the mission boards of the National Association, inquiries from various churches, and actively promoting the actual ministry of various missionaries by scheduling services for them in the churches when requesting them to do so. In addition, the Mission Board shall maintain an up-to-date listing of all missionaries, both Home and Foreign, with their addresses and current needs so as to be of use to the churches as a source of information.

B. THE EXAMINING BOARD: It shall inquire as to the qualifications of ministers, approving or disapproving them for recommendations accordingly. They shall be the investigating committee for new churches wishing to unite with this Association, and upon satisfactory recommendation, the churches shall be recommended to the Association. They shall examine the credentials of ministers transferred to this Association and shall make recommendation to the Association as to their reception.

C. THE CHURCH TRAINING AND YOUTH RELATIONS BOARD: It shall promote the training program for the youth among the churches of this Association; shall be responsible for conducting team and individual competitions for the various youth competitive programs offered by the National C.T.S. Department; and shall be responsible for conducting youth camp sessions on behalf of the youth of this Association, the time and frequency to be determined by the board. They shall encourage area youth rallies.

D. THE EXECUTIVE BOARD: It shall transact all the business of the Association when this body is not in session. If any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association, the board shall fill such vacancies until the next session of the Association; all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve to such officers, or as directed by the Association in session.

E. The general responsibility of all boards of this Association shall be to promote the good of the cause of Christ among the churches of the

Association and seek to help the churches to become more effective in the work of the Gospel.

IX. This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of all members voting at any regular session of the Association, written notice having been given at the previous session.

Bylaws

1. At every setting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded with prayer by the moderator or whomever he may request.
2. These By-Laws shall be distinctly read by the clerk immediately after the convening of the Association and a copy has been placed in the hands of all delegates, both standing and elected.
3. The moderator shall call his assistant to fill the chair when he wishes to speak or otherwise vacate his place.
4. The moderator shall declare out of order any speaker who fails to speak on the subject, or who makes unkind use of personalities.
5. The moderator shall not succeed himself more than once within a period of five (5) years.
6. All committees shall be elected by the body unless otherwise provided by the Association.
7. While the Association is in session, no member shall absence himself without permission from the moderator.

8. Anyone wishing to speak shall rise and address the moderator and be recognized by him before speaking.
9. All visiting brethren may have the privilege to speak on any subject before the body, but not to vote unless ruled otherwise by the body.
10. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association and not longer than five (5) minutes.
11. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second and the question having been stated by the moderator.
12. When a motion has been made and seconded and stated by the chair, and any member opposes its discussion, the moderator shall put the question, "shall it be discussed?". If negative, the question shall be dismissed.
13. A motion shall be put in writing if any member of the body request it.
14. No report shall be adopted except by motion and second and a vote to that effect.
15. Any member of the Association violating any of these rules shall subject himself to the forfeiting of voting privileges for the remainder of the day.
16. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order.
17. A minister seeking membership in the Association shall present a petitionary letter to the Association; and, after he has been recommended and approved by the

Examining Board, and upon a majority vote of the Body in session, his name shall be placed on the "Roll of Ministers of the Association". Each new minister coming into the Coastal Association shall be contacted by the Examining Board and notified of a date to appear before the board for approval. This should be done within two (2) months after he has arrived and begun his pastorate in the Association.

18. No one shall be licensed or ordained to the Gospel ministry or received into our Association who is divorced or married to a divorcee, homosexual, or immoral in his lifestyle; who uses tobacco, alcoholic beverages, or illegal narcotics; or who has a tolerant attitude toward liberalism, modernism, communism, Catholicism, or tongues speaking as a part of the practice of the Christian life and evidence of the Holy Spirit's presence and approval. One who seeks to be licensed to preach must be recommended by his local church to this body for membership. He should possess the same standards as the ordained minister. The license must be for a period of one (1) year.
19. The ministers are required to attend the Coastal Association meetings unless prohibited by a legitimate reason, approved by the body. If a minister does not report to the meetings over a continuous period of two (2) years by presence or letter, or he begins to pastor a church outside the Coastal Association, his name shall be dropped from the roll. Before the name is dropped, the moderator must contact him.
20. Each member church shall be required to make an annual report to the Association. Any church failing to report for two (2) consecutive years shall be declared out of fellowship with the Association until such a time

as report is made. Churches affected by this action shall be notified by the clerk and given one month to report. If a church fails to respond, a visit shall be made by the General Officers to the pastor. Those churches then failing to comply shall be notified that they are out of fellowship until such a time as they report.

21. The rules contained in *Robert's Rules of Order* shall govern this body in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Bylaws of this Association.
22. These rules may be amended and the order of business may be temporarily suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the body.

Proposed Guidelines for Organizing and Accepting New Churches into The Coastal Association of North Carolina Free Will Baptist.

- I. When a church or mission church desires the fellowship with the Coastal Association, the following procedures should be followed:
 - A. The church presents a written request at a regularly scheduled associational session.
 - B. The church provides for this session.
 - C. The representatives of the church meet with the Examining Board for questioning

pertaining to the church's former association, present organization, purpose, and doctrine practices.

- II. If the Examining Board recommends the church to our fellowship, the following procedure should be followed:
 - A. The church coming from other denominations or associations shall be taken under the watch care of the Association for one year.
 - B. The church submits a statistical report to the Examining Board's chairman at the end of each six months.
 - C. After one year's watch care, the Examining Board may recommend that the church be taken into full fellowship of the Coastal Association.
 - D. During the year of watch care, the church should send non-voting representatives to the Coastal Association.
- III. When a Mission Church desires fellowship with the Coastal Association, the following procedure should be followed:
 - A. The mission church should follow the above guidelines, with the exception of the one year waiting period, plus:
 - B. After becoming established enough to

operate as a church and having twenty-five charter members, organize into a church with a organizational service. The Coastal Association Moderator, Chairman of the Mission Board, and Examining Board should participate in the service.

- C. Recognize the KJV Bible as the only rule of faith and practice.
- D. Adopt the Free Will Baptist Church Covenant.
- E. Adopt a Constitution and Bylaws based upon the National Association Treatise.
- F. Request to be accepted by the Coastal Association in full fellowship at the next session.

August 3, 1996

The Coastal Association of Free Will Baptist Convened on August 3, 1996 at 10:00 am. at the Sherwood Forrest Free Will Baptist Church. The Session opened with the hymn "Praise Him, Praise Him" followed by prayer lead by Brother Dean Dobbs. The Moderator recognized the host pastor, Brother Jerry Rackley, who extended the welcome.

The morning devotion was given by Brother Mance Cason who spoke from Acts 20:27 on the theme of declaring the whole council of God. Brother Mance emphasized the need to learn how to listen, preach the Word and have proper relationships with others. He reminded us that 41 times the

scripture instructs us to have a right relationship with others.

The morning business began with the reading of the Bylaws and minutes of the previous meeting. After the roll call of ministers and churches all the delegates were seated. The moderator was given the power to appoint the various committees for the day. They were as follows: Finance - Lee Zegelian, Alvin Keener, and Gil Fann; Digest - Fred Jenkins, Walt Golding and Herbert Thompson; Resolutions - Larry Ness and Tim Thompson. Brother Alvin Keener gave the Treasurer's report. The Treasurer's report reflected a beginning balance of \$487.68 with total receipts of \$1341.00 and total disbursements of \$1378.00 leaving an ending balance of \$450.68. Brother Dennis Wiggs gave the Youth Board report. The Coastal Youth Board report reflected a beginning balance of \$3414.18 with total receipts of \$7191.00 and total disbursements of \$8846.95 leaving an ending balance of \$1758.23.

The Morning Worship began with the hymn "He Lives" followed by prayer lead by Herbert Thompson. After the hymn "Love Lifted Me" the offering was taken. After prayer led by Brother Jerry Rackley, special music was presented by Brother Walt Golding.

The Morning message was given by Brother Joe Haas from Nehemiah 4:7-12. The people had a mind to work, a heart to pray and an eye to watch. We were reminded that we are not to be in competition with each other but we are to complement each other in our ministry.

The Afternoon session began with the hymn "To God be the Glory" followed by prayer led by Brother Earl Hanna.

The Afternoon Devotion was given by Alvin Keener from Phillipians 3:12-16. We were reminded that we need: Devotion to our task, direction for our task, determination in our task, and discipline to finish our task.

The committee and board reports were as follows:

The Mission Board report was given and the following recommendation was presented: We recommend that we erase the deficit in Sister Kim Zegelian's account. The Financial Committee report reflected a beginning balance of \$450.68 with total receipts of \$533.00 and total disbursements of \$934.29 leaving an ending balance of \$149.39.

The Digest committee report was as follows: Churches reporting - 15, Received - 39, Lost by death - 5, Lost by transfer - 7, Total Membership - 2,534, Enrolled in Sunday School - 1,966, Enrolled in CTS - 206, Enrolled in WNAC - 159, Enrolled in Master's Men - 5, Attending Mid-Week Prayer Meeting - 948, Amount sent to quarterly meeting - \$380.00. The Examining Board report was as follows: By request of the Emmanuel Free Will Baptist Church we met with Bro. Harold Moore on May 13, 1996 with the objective of encouraging that the necessary steps be taken in a Biblical Context to resolve all differences between him and the Emmanuel Church. On May 26, Bro. Harold Moore called and said after making the matter of reconciliation a matter of prayer and talking with his church people about the matter, his decision was to not pursue the matter any further at this time. The Resolution Committee Report was as follows: 1> Whereas Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee, has proved a positive spiritual training ground for it's denominational students since 1942, and Whereas this institution for higher learning has been highly respected over the years by the Nashville community and our denomination, in part, due to it's standards of excellence in areas such as academics, integrity, the personal

appearance and conduct of the student body, faculty, and staff, and it's emphasis on personal piety, missions, and local church ministries, and whereas our Coastal Association has historically supported our Bible College via praying, promoting (hosting fund-raisers, music and drama presentations, and various seminars, and by giving financially), and prompting (encouraging students to attend Welcome Days, Bible conferences, and eventually enroll to further their education), and whereas the recent vote by the Bible College Board of Directors permitting the female students to wear slacks on campus appears to be one more negative step in the subtle slippage of long-held standards (joining a previous vote for regulation attire for the male students playing sports, the college's embracing a more contemporary sound (beat) for the music department, and permission for the guys to grow goatees (risking a "gangsta rap" identification), therefore, be it resolved that the North Carolina Coastal Association of Free Will Baptists go on record as opposing this recent College Board vote, and furthermore, we politely request that the Board reconsider and rescind it's vote regarding slacks on the lady students.

2>Whereas the Sherwood Forrest FWB Church has been so gracious in hosting today's meeting by providing facilities, furnishing food, and extending fellowship, Therefore be it resolved that this body express our gratitude by a rising vote of thanks. Respectfully Submitted, Larry Ness, Tim Thompson.

Molly Barker gave report from her field and requested prayer for Dave and Becky Franks.

The Association was adjourned in prayer.

October 26, 1996

The Coastal association of Free Will Baptist convened on October 26, 1996 at the Stacy Free Will Baptist Church in Stacy, North Carolina. The session began with the Hymn, "At Calvary," followed by prayer led by Brother Henry Potter. The Moderator recognized Brother Ernest Laxton, the host pastor, who extended the welcome.

Brother Wingate Hansley brought the morning devotion out of Proverbs 3:5-6. We were reminded that we have a refuge in God and that we are not to put our trust in our friends or the government but in the Lord God.

The morning business began with the reading of the Bylaws and minutes of the previous meeting. After the roll call of churches and ministers the delegates were seated. Brother Tom Lilly was recognized as visitor. The moderator was given the power to appoint the various committees for the day. They were as follows: Finance- Alvin Keener, Volney Bryant, Fred Jenkins; Digest- Henry Potter, Jerry Rackley; Resolution- Lee Purifoy, Wingate Hansley, Phil Smith. The Treasurer's report was as follows: Beginning balance- \$450.68, Total receipts of \$638, Total disbursements of \$946.29 leaving an Ending balance of \$142.39. Brother Dennis Wiggs then gave the Youth Board report and reminded us that the youth board has requested that all churches in the Coastal that could donate \$100 to the Youth Board to strengthen the Youth Board fund. Resolutions: 1>In Light of Brother Tim Thompson's morning message and the upcoming elections be it therefore resolved that we, the coastal Association of Free Will Baptist, reaffirm our commitment to morality and stand politically against those whose political platform is not in accordance with God's Word. 2>Whereas we have enjoyed the hospitality of the Stacy Free Will Baptist Church in hosting the Quarterly Meeting of The Coastal Association and for providing the noon meal for all in attendance be it therefore resolved we give this church a rising vote of thanks. Both passed. After all the committee reports were

completed and approved by vote the association was dismissed for the day in prayer.

January 25, 1997

The Coastal Association of Free Will Baptist convened on January 25, 1997 at the Tabernacle Free Will Baptist Church in Kinston, North Carolina. The session was opened with the singing of a hymn and followed by prayer. The Moderator recognized the host pastor, Brother Johnnie Pike who extended the welcome.

Brother Freeman Edwards brought the morning devotion which challenged us to look unto the savior and to be faithful unto the task that was set before us.

The Morning business began with the reading of the Bylaws and minutes of the previous meeting. After the roll call of churches and ministers the delegates were seated. The Moderator was given the power to appoint the committees for the day. They were as follows: Finance- Alvin Keener, Ernest Laxton, and Herbert Thompson; Digest- Buster Radford, Lee Purifoy, and Joe Haas; Resolution- Dennis Wiggs, Tim Thompson, and Rudolph Outlaw. The Treasurer's report was as follows: Beginning Balance of \$142.39, Total Receipts of \$629.52, Total Disbursements of \$647.92, Leaving an ending balance of \$123.99. Brother Dennis Wiggs gave the youth board report. After the missions board report was given petitionary letters were asked for and the floor was opened for early business.

The Morning worship began with the singing of a hymn followed by prayer. After the singing of another hymn the morning offering was taken, followed by special music presented by the host church.

The Morning Message was brought by Brother Henry Potter. We were encouraged to stay true to the calling of God on our life, to strive for holy living and to be expedient in God's work.

Amount sent to Quarterly - \$430.00. Resolutions - 1>Whereas, Jacksonville's (Onslow County's) Sheriff Ed Brown has been successful in legally closing several of the "adult" establishments (smut houses) in Onslow county, and whereas this battle between citizens for decency and citizens for decadence (relative to these "businesses") has ensued for more than twenty years with little or no progress for the "morally-oriented" until Sheriff Brown's tenure, and whereas, Sheriff Brown is a capable leader and an outspoken born again Christian, standing unashamedly for the Gospel of Christ and the cause of righteousness, and whereas, because of his public identification with Christ, the Sheriff has been assailed and harassed by the enemies of the Cross (in particular , Onslow County's Free Thought Society) and threatened with the

possibility of a lawsuit by the A.C.L.U. (American Civil Liberties Union) Therefore, be it resolved that the Coastal Association of Free Will Baptist go on record in support of Sheriff Brown in his stand for Christ and morality and to commend him and encourage him in his defense of the Faith by sending him a copy of this section of today's resolution and also send a copy to the Jacksonville newspaper. 2> Be it resolve that the host church be given a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality. All the committee reports were approved as presented. The Examining Board report was as follows: We recommend that Jonathan Johnson be licensed by his home Church, Calvary, after which he will be placed on our association list of licensed ministers. The report was approved as read. After a time of announcements the association was dismissed in prayer.
