Coastal Association of Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina

Constitution

From long experience, we, the Original Free Will Baptist Churches, being convinced of the advantages of cooperative programs and united efforts for advancing the cause of our Lord, so purpose to establish and maintain an association of churches for the purpose of spiritual fellowship, united efforts in missions, Christian education and church extension upon the following plan:

- I. This Association shall be named the *Coastal Association of Original Free Will Baptist Churches of North Carolina* and shall be composed of such well-regulated Free Will Baptist Churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.
- II. The acting members of the Association shall be five (5) delegates from each organized church (chosen by the members of the respective church, while in session), associational officers and board members, and all ordained and licensed ministers, whose names appear on the roll of ministers of the Association belonging to any church composing this body.
- III. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, Clerk, who shall superintend the printing of the minutes, and an Assistant Clerk. These officers shall be elected annually and shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. An Executive Board of four (4) members is to be elected from the laity and/or retired pastors who hold Coastal Association membership. Their term of office shall be as follows: one elected for one (1) year, one elected for two (2) years, one elected for three (3) years and one elected for four (4) years. At the expiration of each of these terms, one shall be elected for four (4) years. The officers of the Association are named: Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Treasurer who shall be members of the Executive Board, and shall meet with the Board and shall have a vote on any and all matters that come before the Executive Board. There shall be an Assistant Treasurer, who is also an officer, but not a member of the Executive Board. This arrangement will constitute a nine (9) member board and eliminates the possibility of a "tie" vote.
- IV. Any regular organized Free Will Baptist Church maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practice as set forth in the Treatise of Faith and Practices of the National Association of Free Will Baptists and in favor of benevolent enterprises such as Sunday school, Missions, Temperance, Christian Education, etc., may be received into this body by presenting a Petitionary Letter requesting membership and upon examination and recommendation of the

Examining Board and by majority vote of the body in session. Moreover, any church holding membership in this Association reserves the right to participate or refrain from participating in any or all programs of the body or may withdraw from the Association at her own pleasure.

- V. This Association shall have the power to discipline its churches, exclude them for disorderly conduct if labor proves unsuccessful; to license and ordain ministers (such as give evidence of qualifications); to settle questions of doctrine and discipline as the churches may refer it; and to make any rule necessary to its regulation and not inconsistent with its internal regulations. The Association may not exert any ecclesiastical authority over the churches composing it (see National Treatise).
- VI. This Association shall convene quarterly at 10:00 a.m. on the fourth Saturday in January, July and October for fellowship and conducting of such business as may be deemed necessary. The annual business meeting shall be on the fourth Saturday in April, at which session the Association shall act upon questions and topics as may be referred to its committees and shall transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution or to the usage of the denomination, such business as, in their judgement, may promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches within the limits of the Association. The churches shall make such reports of their work as required by the Association.
- VII. It is the duty of this Association to provide for general union of churches, to point out their interests, and to aid them in securing pastors when requested, to put evangelists and other ministers in places where the gospel is needed, and to require an annual written report from each member belonging to this Association.
- VIII. Duties and job descriptions of the Boards of the Coastal Association:
 - A. **The Missions Board:** This board shall promote the cause of North American Ministries, International Missions, and North Carolina State Missions among the churches of the Association through information provided them as the associational meetings inquiries from various churches and actively promoting the actual ministry of various missionaries by scheduling services for them in the churches when requesting them to do so. In addition, the Missions Board shall maintain an up-to-date listing of all missionaries with their address and current needs to be used by the churches as a source of information.
 - B. **The Examining Board:** This board shall inquire as to the qualifications of ministers (the candidate must be a natural born male meeting the qualifications of 1 Timothy 3:1-7 and Titus 1:5-9; He must also complete the Association's

approved questionnaire), approving or disapproving them for recommendations accordingly. Its members shall serve as the investigating committee for new churches wishing to unite with this Association, and upon satisfactory recommendations, the church shall be recommended to the Association. This board shall examine the credentials of ministers transferring to this Association and shall make recommendation to the Association as to their reception.

- C. **The Church Training and Youth Relations Board:** This board shall promote the training program for the youth among the churches of this Association; shall be responsible for conducting team and individual competitions for the various youth competitive programs offered by the National CTS department; and shall be responsible for conducting youth camp sessions on behalf of the youth of this Association, the time and frequency to be determined by the board. They shall encourage area youth rallies.
- D. **The Executive Board:** This board shall transact all the business of the Association when this body is not in session. If any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association, the board shall fill such vacancies until the next session of the Association, all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve to such officers or as directed by the Association in session.
- E. The general responsibility of all boards of this Association shall be to promote the good of the cause of Christ among the churches of the Association and seek to help the churches to become more effective in the work of the Gospel.

- IX. This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority of all members voting at any regular session of the Association, written notice having been given at the previous session.

This Constitution was revised and adopted at the Annual Session of the Coastal Association on Saturday, April 22, 2017 at the First Free Will Baptist Church, Morehead City, NC

Guidelines for Organizing and Accepting New Churches into the *Coastal Association of Free Will Baptists of North Carolina*

- I. When a church or mission church desires the fellowship with the Coastal Association, the following procedure should be followed:
 - A. The church presents a written request at a regular scheduled association session.
 - B. A meeting between the Examining Board and the church representatives shall be scheduled.
 - C. The representatives of the church meet with the Examining Board for questioning pertaining to the church's former association, present organization, purpose and doctrinal practices.
- II. If the Examining Board recommends the church to our fellowship, the following procedure should be followed:
 - A. The church coming from another denomination or association shall be taken under the watch care of the Association for one year.
 - B. The church submits a statistical report to the Examining Board's chairman at the end of each six months.
 - C. After one year of watch care, the Examining Board may recommend that the church be taken into full fellowship of the Coastal Association.
 - D. During the year of watch care, the church should send non-voting representatives to the Coastal Association.
- III. When a Mission Church desires fellowship with the Coastal Association the following procedure should be followed:
 - A. The mission church should follow the above guidelines with the exception of the one year waiting period.
 - B. After becoming established enough to operate as a church and having twenty-five charter members, they should organize into a church with an organizational service. The Coastal Association Moderator, Chairman of the Missions Board and the Examining Board should participate in the service.
 - C. Recognize the King James Version of the Bible as the only rule of faith and practice.
 - D. Adopt the Free Will Baptist Church Covenant.
 - E. Adopt a Constitution and By-laws based upon the National Association Treatise.
 - F. Request to be accepted by the Coastal Association in full fellowship at the next session.

Coastal Association of Free Will Baptists

BY-LAWS

1. At every setting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded with prayer by the moderator or whomever he may request.
2. The Clerk shall place these By-laws in the hands of all delegates immediately after the convening of the Association.
3. The moderator shall call his assistant to fill the chair when he wishes to speak or otherwise vacate his place.
4. The moderator shall declare out of order any speaker who fails to speak on the subject or who makes unkind use of personalities.
5. The moderator shall not succeed himself more than once within a period of five (5) years.
6. The body shall elect all committees unless otherwise provided by the Association.
7. While the Association is in session, no member shall absent himself without the permission from the moderator.
8. Anyone wishing to speak shall rise and address the moderator and be recognized by him before speaking.
9. All visiting brethren may have the privileged to speak on any subject before the body but not to vote unless ruled otherwise by the body.
10. No person shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Association and not longer than five (5) minutes.
11. No subject shall be discussed without a motion and a second and the question having been stated by the moderator.
12. When a motion has been made and seconded and stated by the chair, and any member opposes its discussion, the moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If the majority response is negative, the question shall be dismissed.
13. A motion shall be put in writing if any member of the body requests it.
14. No report shall be adopted except by motion and second and a vote to that effect.

15. Any member of the Association violating any of these rules shall subject himself to the forfeiting of voting privileges for the remainder of the day.
16. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order.
17. A minister seeking membership in the Association shall present a petitionary letter to the Association, and after he has been recommended and approved by the Examining Board and upon a majority vote of the Body in session, his name shall be placed on the "Roll of Ministers of the Association." Each new minister coming into the Coastal Association shall be contacted by the Examining Board and notified of a date to appear before the board for approval. This should be done within two (2) months after he has arrived and begun his pastorate in the Association.
18. No one shall be licensed or ordained to the Gospel ministry or be received into our Association who is divorced or married to a divorcee, homosexual, or immoral in his lifestyle; who uses tobacco, alcoholic beverages, or illegal narcotics; or who has a tolerant attitude towards liberalism, modernism, communism, Catholicism, or tongue-speaking as a part of the practice of the Christian life and evidence of the Holy Spirit's presence and approval. One who seeks to be licensed to preach must be recommended by his local church to this body for membership. He should possess the same standards as the ordained minister. The license must be for a period on one (1) year.
19. The ministers are required to attend the Coastal Association meeting unless prohibited by a legitimate reason, approved by the body. If a minister does not report to the meetings over a continuous period of two (2) years by presence or letter, or he begins to pastor a church outside the Coastal Association, his name will be dropped from the roll. Before the name is dropped, the moderator must contact him.
20. Each member church shall be required to make an annual report to the Association. Any church failing to report for two (2) consecutive years shall be declared out of fellowship with the Association until such a time as report is made. Churches affected by this action shall be notified by the clerk and given one month to report. If a church fails to respond, a visit shall be made by the General Officers to the pastor. Those churches then failing to comply shall be notified that they are out of fellowship until such a time as they report.
21. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern this body in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with the By-laws of this Association.
22. These rules may be amended and the order of business may be temporarily suspended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the body.

Coastal Minutes

July 29, 2023

Convening at the New Life Free Will Baptist Church, New Bern, NC, on July 29, 2023, the Coastal Association was called to order by Moderator James Bradley. The congregation sang, "Jesus Messiah" and "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name." Welcome and prayer was given by host pastor Scott Coghill.

Motion carried to seat the delegates and visitors were recognized (Rueben Cason – Promotional Office; Carl Miller – Harvest Child Care; Daryl Grimes – Meadowbrook FWB Church).

The clerk was asked to call the roll of preachers and churches. Motion carried to excuse those that requested to be excused for the day. A time of reflection, memory and prayer was held for Rev. Gordan Hart who passed into heaven since our last meeting. Henry Potter then made a motion to receive the minutes as presented in writing. Motion carried. The morning offering was received.

A motion and second allowed the Moderator to appoint committees for the day then passed. Appointments were as follows: Finance: Henry Potter and Scott Coghill; Digest: Glenwood Kennedy and Jimmy Mercer; Resolutions: Caleb Smith and David Rackley. The Treasurer's report was given by Henry Potter. He showed a beginning balance of \$2,760.47, receipts of \$2,524.00, and disbursements of \$4,940.00 and a remaining balance of \$344.47.

The Youth Board report was given by Michael Smart. He reported a great week at camp held at the Anchorage Camp in Lake Waccamaw, NC. They had 90 campers and 20 sponsors. Matt Berry was the speaker with 1 salvation and 6 assurances, as well as, many other decisions.

If you have kids that want to attend camp, but the pastor or someone to sponsor the kids can't attend camp, please let the youth board know and arrangements will be made to get the kids to camp. Finances are good with a beginning balance of \$3,458.81. After receipts and expenses, a remaining balance was \$4,746.81.

The Mission Board report was given by Tim Thompson and Jimmy Mercer. A great report was shared concerning the mission church in Hickory, NC (Equip Free Will Baptist Church). Attending and giving a report were Trif Trifonov (Bulgaria) and Molly Barker (Uruguay).

The Moderator recognized the following persons to give greetings and reports:

Rueben Cason – NC Promotional Office. He reported on three things: (1) Praise – A great National Convention was just held in Raleigh, NC. He reminded us of the WMO on August 27 and the Minister's Retreat on September 25-26. (2) Promotion – Free gifts on the table out front. (3) Problem – he encouraged all NC churches to use D6 Family Ministry material for Sunday school.

Carl Miller – Harvest Child Care. He reported that a great time was had at the National Convention as Harvest had a booth this year with Newt Dotson, Director, and others attending. He reminded us that Have a Heart for Harvest campaign was to help eliminate the debt. Their goal is to have it paid off by August 5 for a note burning ceremony at the 30th Anniversary Celebration.

Glenda Fulcher – Leah Waddell Scholarship Fund. She reported that \$10,500.00 was sent to Welch College in May for students from North Carolina or descendants of Leah Waddell. Six students were chosen to receive the scholarship. The 2024 goal is \$10,500.00. She encouraged churches to help with the fund.

After a short recess, Henry Potter presented the Finance Committee report. He reported a beginning balance of \$344.47, receipts of \$551.00, and disbursements of \$500.00 with an ending balance of \$395.47. Motion to receive the report passed.

The Digest Committee report was given by Glenwood Kennedy. He reported 11 churches reporting; 14 members received; 5 members lost by death; 0 members lost by transfer; total membership of 793; number baptized – 7; number enrolled in Sunday school – 510; number enrolled in CTS – 159; number enrolled in WAC – 51; number enrolled in Master's Men – 2; average number attending mid-week – 28. Motion carried to receive the report.

The Resolutions Committee report was given by Caleb Smith. There were two items which both passed. (1) Whereas the New Life Free Will Baptist Church has graciously hosted today's Coastal Association, therefore, be it resolved that we indicate our sincere gratefulness by a rising vote of thanks. (2) Whereas August 27, 2023 is designated a World Mission Offering, therefore, be it resolved that we as the Coastal Association offer our prayers and financial support for our missionaries ministering in various fields for the cause of Christ.

The Examining Board report was given by William Sealy. He reported that the board had met with three men whose home churches had ordained them. The board recommends that their ordinations be ratified by the Coastal Association. These men are Moises Calop, Fuad Farhat, and David Fall. Motion carried. Also, they had meet with Michael Pugh and recommend that his membership from the Western Tennessee Association be received and he be transferred to the Coastal Association. Motion carried.

The congregation sang, "My Savior's Love" and "How Great is Our God" to commence the worship service. Prayer and special music was by Scott Coghill.

Daryl Grimes, pastor of Meadowbrook FWB Church, Black Mountain, NC, brought the message. He spoke from Amos 6:1-2 with the message entitled, "Ancient Mistakes We Need to Avoid in Today's World." An invitation was given.

Announcements were made and James Bradley dismissed in prayer asking the blessing of the food and fellowship.

The clerk, Jeff Davis, was asked to call the roll of preachers and churches. Motion carried to excuse those that requested to be excused for the day. Henry Potter then made a motion to receive the minutes as presented in writing. Motion carried. The morning offering was received.

A motion and second allowed the Moderator to appoint the committees for the day then passed. Appointments were as follows: Finance: Henry Potter and Tommy Bulla; Digest: Steve Petty and Glenwood Kennedy; Resolutions: Tim Thompson. The Treasurer's report was given by Henry Potter. He showed a beginning balance of \$344.47, receipts of \$901.00 and disbursements of \$500.00, and a remaining balance of \$745.47.

There was no Youth Board report. The Missions Board report was given by Jimmy Mercer. The Equip Church in Hickory is doing well. Thanks for your support and prayers. Molly Barker gave a brief report on the work in Uruguay. She desires to go down for Christmas. Thanks for your prayers and support. Convening at the Angola Free Will Baptist Church, Maple Hill, NC, on January 27, 2024, the Coastal Association was called to order by Moderator James Bradley. The congregational song, "Amazing Grace" was sung under the leadership of Tim Thompson with Jerry Rackley on the harmonica. Prayer was by James Bradley. The formal welcome was given by host pastor Tim Thompson. (Note: Community Free Will Baptist Church, pastor Glenwood Kennedy, co-hosted this conference).

Motion carried to seat the delegates. An oral report was given by James Bradley from Promotional Director Reuben Cason. In his letter, Reuben thanked the churches and the Association for their faithful giving during 2023. He encouraged us to look at the upcoming dates listed in the bulletin for 2024 (2/15 – Pastor's Hangout; 3/21-22 – Pastor and Wife Retreat; 4/20 – CTS Competition; 4/27 – State WAC; 6/3-4 – State Meeting; 7/21-24 – NAFWB; 12/9-10 – Leadership Conference)

Carl Miller was recognized from Harvest Child Care Ministries. He reported that 2023 was a year of "new": new building remodels, no debt, new employees, and new children. 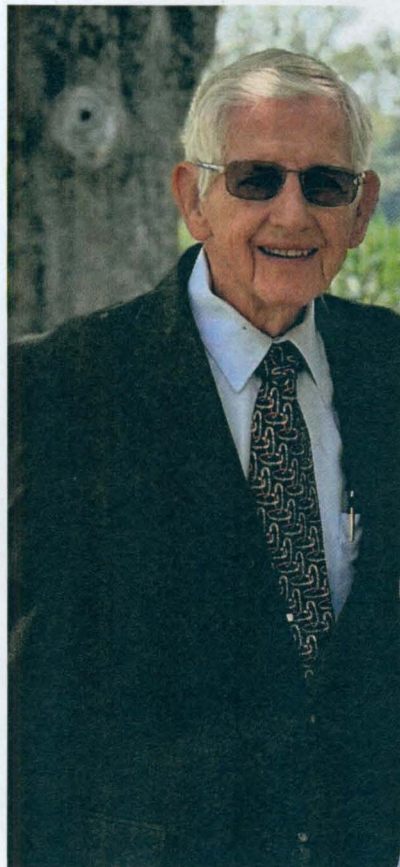
