REPORTS OF THE VARIOUS COMMITTEES

Education and Literature

We, the Committee on Education, wish to submit the following report:

First.—We recommend that the Churches of this Association be made acquainted with the education plan as adopted by the Eastern Association, while in session at Smithville, Mississippi, June 8-9-10, 1938.

Second.—We recommend that the pastors of the above churches mentioned take it upon themselves to acquaint their congregation with this plan.

Third.—The plan as adopted by the Eastern Association is as follows: Each church shall raise the equivalent of 10 cents per member, and this money be sent to Rev. J. R. Davidson, Bryan, Texas. Bro. Davidson is treasurer of the Board of Education of the Eastern Association.

Fourth.—We approve the action of the Sunday School Convention in their plans to conduct Sunday School Training Institutes in the several Sunday Schools throughout the convention.

Fifth.—We request this Association to extend for another year their offer of fifty (\$50.00) dollars from the Educational Fund for the purchase of books and materials to be used in training courses to be conducted in Sunday Schools throughout the Cumberland Association.

Sixth.—We wish to urge our pastors and the laity of our churches to send more articles to the Free Will Baptist.

Seventh.—We wish to urge our people to make use of the good literature, especially the literature published by our publishing house at Ayden, North Carolina, and Purdy, Missouri. We would further urge the use of our own literature by the schools in all our churches.

Eighth.—We recommend that this Association authorize the treasurer to send \$100.00 at once to Rev. J. R. Davidson, Treasurer of the Board of Education of the Eastern Association. This education money to be drawn from the Educational Fund.

Home Missions

We, your Committee on Home Missions, wish to make the following report and recommendations:

First.—We recommend that the Home Mission Board be discontinued and that a Board to be known as the Church Extension Board be elected instead.

Second.—We further recommend that the duties of said Board shall be to extend our work into towns, cities and communities wherever an opportunity is found for a new church work to be established and to supervise such work, arrange for evangelistic services, and secure pastors until the work is fully established.

Third.—We also recommend that each church within the Association be asked to raise an amount equal to 20 cents per member annually for this work, and that all money in the Home Mission treasury be used by the above named Board.

Special Resolution.—Resolved, That this Association go on record as favoring the establishing of a Minister's Institute. This Institute to be conducted at a place and time to be determined by the quarterly meetings. Amendment was made and time and place set as follows: Beginning the first Sunday in July 1939 at Ashland City Church.

Resolved, the ministers of the neighboring churches of East Nashville Church urge their members to help in caring for the National Association, which convenes in November, at the East Nashville Church.

Resolved, That the Eastern Association of Free Will Baptists endorse and recommend that the following changes be made in the National Association; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of these suggested changes be carried by a delegation, officially appointed by this body, to the Western Association for its consideration; and be it further

Resolved, That if these changes are approved by both, the Eastern and Western Associations, the same shall be made effective in November at our National Association.

First.—An annual meeting of the National Association. The place of the meeting to be alternated each year, east of the Mississippi one year and west of the Mississippi the next year.

Second.—Representation to the National Association to be by states. All ordained ministers who hold church membership and are in good standing shall have the privilege to represent and to vote. Each state association shall be entitled to five (5) delegates elected from the laity regardless of the number of local associations composing the state association, but in addition to the five (5) delegates each state shall be entitled to one (1) additional delegate for each local association organized within the bounds of the state association.

Church Roll Revision Committee

We, your Committee, whose duty it is to formulate rules and regulations by which the churches of the Association are to be governed in revising their membership rolls, sincerely offer the following recommendations:

First, in matters of discipline which have to do with the moral character and conduct of members, we recommend our regular church discipline as a safe and an impartial guide.

Second, we recommend that the names of all members who are inactive in the church, whether they be resident or nonresident members, or whether their whereabouts is known or unknown, be placed on what shall be known as an "Inactive List." We further recommend, however, that each church make an earnest effort to contact each inactive member and to bring him or her into the service of the church again before the Inactive List is made.

Third, we recommend that all members who make fairly regular contributions to the church, either in a financial way or in attendance at the services of the church, and those also whose activities Providence hinders, be considered active. These are to be retained on the "Active List" of the church.

Fourth, we further recommend an annual roll call of each church, at which time each member is to be accounted for in keeping with the foregoing recommendations.

Fifth, we also recommend that the names of all members who remain inactive for a period of one year be dropped from the church list.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

Article 1. We believe in one true and living God, the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.

Article 2. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old Testament are words of Divine Inspiration, given to Abraham's children, and that the New Testament contains the only proper rules for faith of the Christian churches.

Article 3. We believe in the depravity of man, and in man's inability to recover himself from his fallen condition without a Divine Mediator.

Article 4. We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ, according to the Scriptures, suffered and died upon the cross, and thereby made full atonement for every human being, and by His obedient life, satisfactory death, triumphant resurrection and glorious ascension, ever advocating at His Father's throne hath brought an everlasting salvation for every sinner that will repent, believe and obey His word.

Article 5. We believe that the faithful Christian will not fall from grace; notwithstanding we believe in the free moral agency of man after jurisdiction, and that there is possible danger of falling into sin and being finally lost.

Article 6. We believe according to the Scriptures: Paul's letter to the Hebrews, 6th Chapter, 1st to 7th verses, that after a man has been partaker of the Holy Ghost, if he shall fall from grace, it is impossible to renew him again unto repentance, or restore him again into the favor of God.

Article 7. We believe Baptism and the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper and the washing of the Saints' feet are all ordinances ordained and instituted by our Lord Jesus Christ, and that true believers are the only proper subjects, and the proper mode of baptism is immersion, and that it is the duty of believers to attend these ordinances.

Article 8. We believe in the general judgment, and that the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal.

Article 9. We believe according to the Scriptures, 1st Cor. 10:6, that each individual, having been inducted into the Kingdom of Christ by an operative influence of the Holy Ghost, and having faith to exercise the free dictation of his conscience, is in communion with saints.

Article 10. We believe in the justification of infants by the imputed righteousness of Jesus Christ, in a passive state and thereby adopting them heirs of His Kingdom.

Government and Constitution

Article 1. Each church in this Association shall be entitled to one vote; and each church having more than fifty members shall have one vote for the first fifty, and one vote for every additional fifty members or fraction thereof. These votes shall be cast by one delegate from each of the various churches and this delegate shall be duly elected by the church to cast these votes. A roll call shall be made on all important questions when desired.

2. In the letter from each church shall be expressed the number received by experience, letter, recommendation, restoration, number dismissed by letter, excluded, died since last Association, and the total number enrolled. Also give name of present pastor and one called for the ensuing year, names of deacons and their addresses,

name of Sunday School Superintendent and Secretary and addresses, enrollment of Sunday School, and also amount collected since last Association, and amount paid out to pastor, to missionary, to minutes, and to any other expenses may have had, and amount left in treasury.

3. All subordinate churches shall be subject to the ruling of this Association.

4. This Association, when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper code of rules which they are authorized to establish for themselves.

5. They may elect a Moderator, Secretary and Treasurer from among themselves, and they shall hold their office until their successors are elected.

6. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except when withdrawn by consent.

7. New churches may be received into the union, who shall petition by letter or delegates, if they have been regularly organized upon a profession of our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and are walking according to the gospel order.

8. This association shall furnish each church with minutes of their proceedings, in proportion to the amount sent by each church; and in order to enable the Association to print their minutes it is expected that each church will send up such sums of money as they think proper, and when received shall be placed in the hands of a trustee appointed for that purpose, and may be disbursed by order of the Association.

9. For the purpose of ordaining ministers of the gospel, and deacons who shall come with recommendations from their churches, and for trying all ordained members for unchristian conduct, there shall be an annual Presbytery, which shall convene at the close of the Association at the same time and place, and at any time during the Associational year, if called by Moderator or his assistants or any five members of said Presbytery, who deem it necessary to make such a call. Said Presbytery shall consist of ordained members present and they shall elect a Moderator and Clerk from among themselves for the time being, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. It shall be the duty of said Presbytery to examine all applications or ordinations sent up with recommendations, from their churches composing this Association, and if found competent, to ordain and set them apart for the work by laying on of hands. Said Presbytery shall have full power to try all ordained members for unchristian conduct and on testimony their decision shall be final.

10. It shall be the duty of each minister who shall organize a church to ordain deacons for the same. Also, his duty to ordain deacons where a vacancy occurs in his charge. It shall be the duty of each pastor to support a Sunday School in the church or churches in his charge.

11. No person shall be ordained to the ministry until he is able to fill the requirements of Paul's 1st letter to Timothy 3 and this be tested by the Presbytery. Said Presbytery shall have full power to propound Scriptural questions as they see proper and all candidates shall be required to answer them satisfactorily.

12. This Association may exclude from its body any minister who teaches heresy, or any other church that countenances him in said teaching or that may be disloyal to the tenets of Faith as held by this Association and expressed in our Articles of Faith.

13. All questions coming before this Association shall be determined by a majority, except excluding churches, which shall receive a concurrence of two-thirds.

14. Representatives from five churches shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and no business shall be transacted without a quorum.

15. The minutes of this Association shall be read before them, corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

16. This Association may adjourn at any time and place it may think proper, so as to confine it among the churches composing the same.

17. Amendments may be made to this form of government at any time by a majority of the members present composing the Association, voting in behalf of the amendment.

18. When the Association shall have convened, it is the privilege of all ordained members belonging to the Cumberland Association of Freewill Baptists to sit in council with us and propose resolutions coming before this body as though they were delegates by the church.

Rules and Decorum

This Association shall be opened by singing and prayer. Only one person may speak at a time. All addresses made by the members shall be made to the Moderator, and the person thus speaking shall strictly confine himself to the subject in debate, nor cast any personal reflections toward any member of this body who has spoken previously.

No person shall be allowed to speak more than three times on any one subject, without leave of a majority of the Association.

The brother shall not be interrupted during his speech by any one except the Moderator, except he violates order.

No person shall laugh or whisper in time of public speaking.

No member shall absent himself without leave from the Association. Members shall use the word "brother" or "brethren" in all debates.

The names of the members of this body shall be enrolled by the Clerk, and called over as often as necessary, provided a call be made by a member of the Association.

No member shall speak longer than fifteen minutes at any time without leave of the Moderator.

Any member who shall willfully and knowingly violate any of these rules, shall be reported by the Moderator and be subject to the censure of the Association.

Adopted in Council, this Saturday before the first Lord's Day in October, 1867, as a standing decorum though subject to revision by a majority of members voting for revision.
