PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Sixth Regular Annual Session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists Convened with Scott's Chapel Church in Stewarts County, Wednesday morning, October 12, 1949 at 10 o'clock.

The meeting was called to order by the assistant Moderator, Rev. E. A. Craft.

The meeting opened with congregational singing led by Rev. Sidney Henry.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. W. R. Carroll, who read Psalm 103:1-14.

Rev. D. A. Hatcher, pastor of the host Church extended a warm welcome to everyone attending this session of the association, to which Rev. Wm. Mishler responded.

Mrs. Nadyne Scott was asked to serve as clerk until one was appointed.

The ministers, delegates and deacons were registered and the church reports received.

The Moderator, Rev. J. L. Welch took over and appointed Rev. E. A. Craft, W. R. Carroll, and D. A. Hatcher to serve as a committee on committees.

By motion, the association adjourned until 1:30 in order for the Presbytery to elect a Chairman.

The worship service opened with congregational singing led by Rev. Sidney Henry.

The moderator presented the Rev. Charles Thigpen, instructor in the Free Will Baptist Bible College, who delivered the morning message. Jude 1:3 "Ernestly Contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints."

Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Carlos Craft.

Wednesday Afternoon

The afternoon session opened at 2:30 after the Presbytery meeting with singing led by Rev. Sidney Henry.

The report of the Committee on Committees, as given by Rev. W. R. Carroll, was adopted.

The report of the Home Missions Board was given by Rev. Adam Scott. The report was adopted.

Motion sustained that we recommend to the Home Mission Board that they donate \$500.00 to the National Stewardship Fund. An amendment was added to the motion that they be requested to give a substantial fund if they see they cannot give \$500.00.

The report of the Woman's District Auxiliary Convention was given by Mrs. Wm. White. By motion, the report was adopted.

The report of the Eastern quarterly meeting was given by Mrs. Adam Scott and was adopted.

The report of the Superannuation Board as read was adopted.

Motion sustained that the moderator appoint a committee to investigate the First Church in Columbia, who requested a letter of dismissal.

A committee was appointed.

Motion sustained that Mrs. Nadyne Scott serve in the capacity of clerk until the election of the officers.

Motion to adjourn to meet at 9:30 Thursday morning.

The session opened at 9:45 with the song service led by Rev. Adam Scott.

The report of the Sunday School convention as read was adopted.

The report of the Obituary Committee was read and adopted.

A verbal report of the Free Will Baptist Home for Children was given by Rev. Carlos Craft.

Motion sustained that visiting ministers be invited to a seat in council. Visiting ministers were: Rev. Henry Melvin, Rev. Lester Jones, Rev. Walter Reynolds.

The report of the Nominating Committee was read by Rev. E. A. Craft and adopted.

The Committee on Finance presented its report through Mrs. J. E. Frazier. By motion, the report was adopted.

The report of the treasurer, as given by Mr. J. B. Reding, was adopted.

The report of the Special Committee was read and adopted.

By motion, the association adjourned its business until 1:30 for the worship service.

The worship service opened with singing led by Rev. Adam Scott.

Prayer by Rev. C. B. Thompson.

The moderator presented Rev. Henry Melvin, business manager of the Free Will Baptist Bible College. Text, "We are laborers together with God."

Bro. Melvin gave a very encouraging report of the Bible College. The moderator called for a freewill offering for the college. The people responded with \$37.46.

Dismissed with prayer by Rev. Henry Melvin.

Thursday Afternoon

The afternoon session opened with congregational singing led by Rev. Henry Melvin

Prayer by Rev. Lester Jones.

The report of the Temperance Committee given by Rev. William Mishler, was adopted.

The report of the Committee on Petitions and Requests was read by Rev. Carlos Craft.

Motion sustained that the recommendation of the committee be accepted and we accept the invitation to go to Head's Church for the next meeting of the Association.

The report of the Resolutions Committee as read by Rev. Adam Scott presented three resolutions. The report was adopted.

Motion sustained the treasurer of this association reimburse the Program Committee for having the programs printed. The cost was \$1.50.

Motion sustained that this association pay the clerk \$35.00 for the transcribing and distributing of minutes. Also the expense of the publishing of the minutes be defrayed.

Motion sustained that the Executive Board of Cumberland Association locate a place for the meeting of the State Association next year.

Motion sustained that the Cumberland Association request the quarterly meetings to turn over their funds to the Association.

Motion made that the moderator appoint the delegates to the State Association. Those appointed were: Mrs. Agnes Frazier, Mrs. Nadyne Scott, Mrs. C. B. Thompson, Mrs. Bertie Mishler, Mr. W. E. Coville.

Motion sustained to accept Bro. Welch's resignation as moderator.

Rev. E. A. Craft was elected moderator for the next year.

Rev. Adam Scott was elected assistant moderator.

The meeting was dismissed with prayer and adjourned to meet with Heads Church on Wednesday and Thursday before the third Sunday in October, 1950.
