PROCEEDINGS

The One Hundred and Seventh Regular Annual Session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists convened with the Heads Church, Cedar Hill, Tennessee, Wednesday morning, October 11, 1950, at 10:30.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Rev. E. A. Craft.

The meeting opened with the congregation singing "Are you Washed In Blood", led by Rev. C. F. Bowen, accompanied by Mrs. W. M. White at the piano.

A very inspiring devotional was presented by Rev. W. B. Davenport, who read from Romans 4 and II Timothy I.

Rev. William Mischler, Pastor of the host Church gave a very cordial welcome. Rev. W. R. Carroll responded.

As requested by the Moderator, the clerk read the decorum.

The ministers, deacons and delegates were registered and the church reports were received. The following visitors were recognized; Rev. and Mrs. J. B. Bloss and Rev. Rickets.

A motion was carried that the Moderator appoint the Committee on Committees. The committee appointed included Rev. W. B. Davenport, Chairman, Rev. W. R. Carroll and Rev. C. A. Craft.

A motion that Rev. T. O. Terry, Rev. Charles Craddock and Rev. Walter Reynolds be received into and be given the opportunity to participate in the Association was passed.

By motion the Association was recessed until one o'clock Wednesday afternoon, for the worship service.

The worship service opened with Congregational singing led by Rev. T. O. Terry. Rev. J. B. Bloss led in prayer. The Moderator presented Rev. C. F. Bowen, Pastor of the East Nashville Church who delivered a most searching message. His text was "... I am the way, the truth and the life; no man cometh unto the Father but by me." John 14:6.

Dismissed with Prayer.

Wednesday Afternoon

The afternoon session opened at one o'clock with congregational singing led by Rev. T. O. Terry, accompanied by Rev. Henry Melvin at the piano.

Rev. J. B. Parsons gave the devotions. He read from I Corinthians. Rev. Henry Melvin led in prayer.

Ministers and delegates were registered and other reports were received.

The following visitors were recorded: Rev. Henry Melvin, Rev. L. C. Johnson and Rev. Charles Sapp.

Minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

The report of Committee on Committees, as given by Rev. W. R. Carroll was adopted.

The Moderator presented a very inspiring message. He read from Galations 4:4-5. Rev. Henry Melvin and Rev. L. C. Johnson discussed briefly the status of the Free Will Baptist Bible College. A motion that the Moderator appoint a special committee on Education was passed. The committee appointed included Rev. Adam Scott, Chairman, Bro. Garner Caldwell, and Rev. Lester Jones.

The report of the Western Quarterly meeting was presented by Rev. J. L. McIntosh. The report was adopted.

The report of the Eastern Quarterly meeting was given by Rev. Adam Scott. The report was adopted.

The report of the Sunday School Convention was adopted as read, granting the requests contained in the report.

The report of the Superannuation Board was read and adopted.

The report of the Treasurer was read. By motion the report was adopted.

By motion the Association adjourned to meet again Thursday morning October 12, 1950, at 10 o'clock.

The session opened at Ten o'clock with the song service led by Rev. T. O. Terry. Rev. W. C. Clearman led in prayer.

Rev. W. C. Clearman gave the devotions.

Minutes of the previous session was read and approved.

Several ministers, deacons and delegates were registered. A group of visitors from the First Free Will Baptist Church of Owensboro, Kentucky, was recognized.

The report of the Committee on Foreign Missions was read and approved.

The Treasurer's report of the Home Mission Board as presented by Rev. Adam Scott was adopted. Rev. William Mischler presented a report of the work done by the Home Missions Board. The report was adopted.

Rev. W. T. Hagewood gave a brief report of the progress being made toward the building of a church in Clarksville, Tennessee.

The Association recessed in order for the presbytery to meet.

Dismissed with prayer.

Rev. Damon C. Dodd, National Association Promotional Secretary, presented the Associational Sermon. He used the motto, "Every Free Will Baptist a Good Steward" as his theme.

Dismissed with prayer led by Rev. Bayless MacDonald.

Thursday Afternoon

The afternoon session opened with congregational singing led by Bro. W. M. White. Rev. G. M. Prewitt gave the Devotions. He used John 14:2 as his text.

Minutes of the morning session was read and approved

A motion was sustained that the Association elect a delegate to attend the meeting of stockholders of the Free Will Baptist Press in Ayden, North Carolina. Rev. Damon Dodd was elected to serve in this capacity.

The report of the Temperance Committee was rejected and returned for re-wording.

Report of the Obituary Committee was read and adopted.

The report of the Special Committee on Education was given by Rev. Adam Scott. By motion this report was adopted.

The report of the Committee on Finance was given. By motion this report was adopted.

The report of the Nominating Committee was given. By motion this report was adopted, duly electing the persons nominated.

Rev. Charles Craddock was nominated for Assistant Clerk, from the floor. He was elected by acclamation.

The report of the Committee on Petitions and Requests was read and adopted.

The Report of the Temperance Committee was read. By motion this report was adopted.

The report on Resolutions as given by Rev. T. O. Terry was approved.

A motion was sustained that the Executive Committee find a place for the next meeting of the Association.

Motion sustained that this association pay the clerk \$35.00, for the transcribing and distributing of minutes. Also the expense of the publishing of the minutes be defrayed.

Motion sustained that the Clerk and Moderator write a letter to Rev. J. E. Hudgens, retired minister, expressing appreciation for services rendered the Cumberland Association.

Motion made that the Moderator appoint delegates to the State Association. Those appointed were Bro. W. A. Binkley, Mrs. Lester Jones, Mrs. J. E. Frazier, Mrs. D. E. Teasley and Bro. J. B. Reding.

A rising vote of thanks was extended the Heads Church for the hospitality shown during the sitting of this association.

By motion the Millers Chapel Church and the Owensboro Church were accepted into the Association. A hand of Fellowship was extened to those persons present representing these churches.

The meeting was dismissed with prayer and adjourned to meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the third Sunday in October, 1951.

Lynn and Ronald Creech were examined and we recommend them for ordination, but we advise the ordination service be deferred to a later date when the Presbytery is called together by the moderator, and that the ordination of Brother Edward Corn take place at this time. We further recommend that the application of Brother G. A. Rachford be rejected because of unsound doctrine.

In addition to this we offer the following resolutions:

(1) That paragraph 5 of the constitution of the Presbytery be revised to read as follows: "This Presbytery shall have the power to examine and ordain applicants to the full work of the ministry who have held license from their churches in this association at least one year, and to issue them certificates of ordination."

(2) That, hereafter, any student in the Free Will Baptist Bible College, who wishes to apply for ordination in this Presbytery shall have the approval of and a recommendation from the President of the Bible College.

We recommend that Rev. Damon C. Dodd be received as a member of this Presbytery.
