PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Morning

The One Hundred Ninth Annual Session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists in Tennessee was called to order by the moderator, Rev. E. A. Craft, at the Rock Springs Church on Wednesday morning, October 15, 1952, at 10:00 o'clock.

The opening hymn, "There's Power in the Blood," was led by Rev. Roger Reeds. Rev. Sidney Henry led in prayer.

Rev. W. R. Carroll who had charge of devotions based his remarks on verses 1-10 of Romans 12.

The very cordial welcome was extended to all by the host pastor, Rev. T. L. Burch, and Rev. C. A. Craft responded with words of appreciation.

Motion carried that the program as planned by the Program Committee be the order of business for this session.

The registration of sixteen ministers, ten deacons, and twenty-three delegates from eighteen churches was made. One church was represented by letter. Eight visiting ministers were recognized.

Motion carried that the moderator appoint a Finance Committee. The following were appointed: Mr. W. A. Binkley, Mr. Billy Hobdy, and Mrs. Walter Maxey.

Motion carried that the moderator appoint a Committee on Committees. The Committee was appointed as follows: Rev. W. R. Carroll, Rev. J. W. Boyte, and Rev. Sidney Henry.

Following a song service led by Rev. Roger Reeds, a testimony service was conducted by Rev. Daniel Merkh.

Rev. Bayless McDonald, pastor of Trinity Church, was introduced by the moderator to bring the morning message. A very timely message on "The Unfinished Task of Jesus" based on verses 1 and 2 of Acts 1 was ably presented in a searching and inspiring manner.

Brother Miles Gower led in the benediction.

Wednesday Afternoon

The afternoon session opened by singing "Showers of Blessing." Rev. N. R. Smith used a portion of Hebrews 12:1 "Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us" as the theme for his devotional remarks.

The report of the Committee on Committees as made by Rev. W. R. Carroll was adopted.

Rev. E. A. Craft, moderator, brought a message to the body, reminiscing the 109 years of service and the advancement record of the Cumberland Association. Brother Craft admonished the group to stop living in the past; instead, build on it and go forward, doing bigger and better things for the Lord.

The report of the Woman's District Auxiliary work was made by Mrs. J. E. Frazier.

The report of the Tennessee State Association held at Erwin, Tennessee, was given by Brother J. B. Reding.

Motion to adjourn carried. Rev. Roger Reeds dismissed the group with prayer.

Thursday Morning

The morning session opened at 10:15 A. M. with the congregation singing "Standing on the Promises" and prayer led by Rev. Roger Reeds.

Rev. J. C. Lynn used Psalm 36:7-8 and Psalm 17:15 as the bases for his devotional remarks on the subject "The Satisfying Christ."

The minutes of Wednesday's session were read and approved as read.

Late registration revealed six ministers, nine deacons, and fifteen delegates. Two visiting ministers were recognized.

Motion carried that the moderator appoint a Digest Committee. The following were appointed: Rev. C. F. Bowen, Brother Manford Pugh, and Rev. J. C. Lynn.

The Eastern Quarterly Meeting report was made by Miss Marjorie June Ellis.

The Western Quarterly Meeting report was made by Rev. Virgil Smith.

Brother I. L. Stanley, superintendent of the Tennessee Free Will Baptist Children's Home at Greeneville, Tennessee, was recognized. He brought some very timely remarks relative to the co-operation of churches in this association being given the Home and also some interesting facts about the operation of the Home.

An announcement concerning the correction relative to the date for the meeting of the State Associational meetings which are to be held at the Good Springs Church, was made.

Motion carried to recess all business until 1:15 P.M. in order for the Presbytery to have its ordination service and for the morning message which was brought by Dr. L. C. Johnson, President of Free Will Baptist Bible College. Dr. Johnson used verse 9 of 1 Cor. 1 as the basis for his message on the theme "Partnership with the Lord Jesus."

"God put into this partnership His blood, His all—What are we putting into it?" was the challenge left with the group by Dr. Johnson.

An offering of \$140.54 was made at this time for the new building which has been purchased for the Bible College. The benediction was made by Brother Johnson.

Thursday Afternoon

Rev. Oscar Davis led the congregation in singing "What a Friend We Have in Jesus."

Rev. Virgil Smith brought a devotional message, using Phil. 4:13 as his Scripture. He challenged the people of the Association to start out in

the new church year with the strength of Christ, not trying to see how little we can do for the Lord but how much we can do.

No report was given by Foreign Mission Board.

The report was read for the Home Mission Board by R. E. Felts. The report was adopted by the body. A. G. Caldwell presented the financial report, which was adopted.

The report of the Home Mission Board recommended that the Board be authorized to purchase a church building in Barren Plains, Tennessee, and to start a Free Will Baptist church there. After lengthy discussion, the motion passed. Reports on the prospects of starting this church were given by Brother Russell Lee, A. G. Caldwell, and R. E. Felts.

Rev. J. L. McIntosh gave a report on the organization of a new church at Dickson, Tennessee.

The treasurer's report of the Superannuation Board was read and approved by the body.

Rev. J. L. Welch reported for the Christian Education Board on the work of the Bible College. Receipts at the College from Cumberland Association churches were approximately \$4500. This report was adopted.

There was no report from the Sunday School Convention.

Brother W. A. Binkley presented the report of the Finance Committee, which was adopted.

The Obituary Report was read and adopted. In respect to the memory of Reverends J. E. Hudgens, G. E. Gower, and G. M. Pruitt, who had died during the associational year, the body stood as Rev. C. F. Bowen led the congregation in prayer.

Motion was made and passed that the clerk send letters of sympathy to the families of the three former ministers.

The report on Petitions and Requests was read and accepted.

Unanimous vote was made to go to Shady Grove Free Will Baptist Church for the next year's session.

The Resolutions Committee presented their report with the motion made to accept the report and deal with the items separately. This motion passed.

Motion passed that a rising vote of thanks be made to the officers of this Association and thanks be extended to the host church for their hospitality of meals and homes for the delegates.

Motion made to adopt resolution as to allocating all funds into the Cumberland Association treasury.

Motion made and passed that this motion be tabled until later.

Rev. C. F. Bowen read the Digest Committee's report. Motion passed for its adoption.

Information was received about Board of Trustees of Cumberland Association. Their names are not carried in the Minutes because there is no property owned by the Association; therefore, the board has ceased to exist.

The Association's treasury report was given by Brother Jim Reding, which was adopted.

Motion was made and passed that the chair appoint delegates to the Tennessee State Association, who are: W. A. Binkley, Mrs. Agnes Frazier, A. G. Caldwell, J. B. Reding, and Mattie Maxey.

The Temperance Committee read its report, which was duly adopted.

Rev. Charles Sapp reported on the National Home Mission work, appealing for the churches to adopt measures to allocate funds to the National Home Mission Program.

At this time, Brother W. R. Carroll assumed the moderatorship in the absence of Brother E. A. Craft.

The report of the Nominating Committee was made by Rev. J. L. Welch. Motion was passed to receive the report.

Motion was made and passed that Rev. C. F. Bowen be elected for a period of two years to send in news of Cumberland Association activities to the Free Will Baptist paper.

Motion passed that 1500 minutes be printed and distributed among the churches according to proportionate membership.

Motion passed that the association be adjourned and go into the Presbytery meeting.

The meeting was dismissed and adjourned to meet on Wednesday and Thursday before the third Sunday in October 1953.

The Home Mission Board has worked with the First Free Will Baptist Church of Springfield and Oakland Church the most of this year, and we are glad to report them as coming along fine.

The Board is especially interested in a church in Barren Plains, Tennessee. This building is owned by the Primitive Baptists, but there is only one member left. This member has given the building to the membership in Nashville since they have lost their church building. They plan on taking this building down and moving it to Nashville.

The Home Mission Board has made several trips to investigate the possibility of the Free Will Baptists buying this building and lot to set up a Sunday School and church. On Sunday, October 5, three members of the Board met at the Barren Plains building to appraise the building and lot. The lot consists of four acres of fine level land, and there is about ten or twelve thousand feet of good lumber trees on it. The building is a frame structure, thirty-six by forty-eight feet, with metal roof, and in good condition. It has furniture in it.

The Board valued this property at three to four thousand dollars, and we offered two thousand dollars for it. We believe it can be bought for twenty-five hundred or three thousand dollars and would be a real bargain at this figure.

The Home Mission Board recommends that the Association authorize them to proceed with the purchase of this property.
