P R O C E E D I N G S

Wednesday Morning, October 14, 1959

The Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee met at its 116th annual session at Donelson Free Will Baptist Church, October 14, 1959. The first service began at 9:30 a.m. with the singing of "Glory to His Name," led by Rev. Fred Hall.

The Rev. Luther Reed, moderator, called upon Rev. Joe Hurst to lead in the devotions. Brother Hurst read a scripture lesson from Genesis and led in prayer.

The host pastor, Rev. James Davis, welcomed the delegates, associational officers, and visitors to the Donelson Church. A response in behalf of the association was given by Rev. Dale Burden.

The moderator appointed the registration committee to serve as finance committee, as follows: J. B. Reding, Rev. Charles Jennette, and Elmer Felts.

Appointed to the Committee on Committees were Rev. Roy Thomas, Rev. E. A. Craft, and Rev. A. B. Troutman.

The delegates, ministers, and deacons were called upon to stand and were then recognized as the voting body of the association. The visitors were recognized and welcomed by the moderator.

In the absence of H. C. Burgess, superintendent of the Home for Children, a report was given by Rev. Luther Reed. He reported an increase of \$600 in gifts to the Home from Cumberland Association churches during the past year.

The moderator appointed Rev. Donald Sexton as reading clerk.

A letter of greeting was read from Rev. Homer Willis, head of the National Home Missions Board.

The Superannuation Board Report was read. Rev. Charles Jennette gave a verbal report on the need of supporting the Superannuation work in the local area. Motion passed to adopt this report.

The associational treasurer's report was read and approved. Motion passed to approve the reimbursing of E. B. McDonald for \$5 expense to Owensboro, Kentucky, to organize two churches.

A report on the Youth Camp at Falls Creek Falls was read and the treasurer's report was included. Motion passed to accept this report. Rev. John Vick gave an encouraging report on the youth encampment and appealed for the churches to support the local youth camp at Hillmont.

The Committee on Committees report was read by Rev. Thomas and was accepted.

The Woman's Auxiliary report was given by Mrs. Robert Hill and was accepted.

After a brief recess Rev. Robert Hill read a partial report on Petitions and Requests. Motion passed that the report be received and the items be adopted item by item.

Item No. 1 was adopted and the four churches concerned were received and their delegates seated.

Item No. 2 was adopted (concerning Faith Church).

The morning worship service began with the singing of "Praise Him, Praise Him" and "Glory to His Name." Rev. Fred Hall sang "Face to Face" as a special song before the moderator introduced Rev. J. L. Welch as the morning speaker. Brother Welch read from Joshua 17:14-18 and brought a message on "Utilizing Our Possessions."

Following the morning service, Rev. James Davis, host pastor, welcomed the people to the lunch provided by the host church. Rev. W. B. Hughes dismissed the service with prayer.

Wednesday Afternoon

Following the lunch hour the afternoon service opened with the singing of "Tell It to Jesus." Rev. Robert Hill, assistant moderator, introduced Rev. Wallace Paul, who brought devotions and led in prayer.

The moderator read from John 13:34, 35 and spoke on the theme "Things that identify us as followers of Christ."

A report on the National Association was given by the national moderator, Rev. Charles A. Thigpen. He related activities at the recently held session in Asheville, N. C., and reported that the next session will be at Fresno, California.

The registration committee report was read and adopted.

The afternoon session was adjourned with prayer.

Thursday Morning, October 15, 1959

The Thursday morning service began with the singing of "Glory to His Name." The moderator introduced Rev. Douglas Roberson, who brought devotions from 1 Cor. 13 and led in prayer.

The minutes of the previous day were read by the clerk.

Ministers, deacons, and delegates were recognized as the voting body.

The following reports were read and approved:

Eastern Quarterly Meeting by Mrs. J. B. Stack

A report on the Bible College was called for and Dr. L. C. Johnson, president, introduced the young men's trio to bring special music. Brother Johnson then spoke about the Bible College being located in the Cumberland Association and reported on the past year's progress and gave a financial report on donations received by the Bible College from Cumberland Association churches. Motion passed to accept this report.

Motion passed to receive an offering for the local superannuation work. The people responded with an offering of \$45.97.

The business session was adjourned for the Presbytery Ordination service, which constituted the morning worship service. Dr. L. C. Johnson pronounced the benediction.

Following the morning service the host church again welcomed the people to the noon meal provided by the church women.

Thursday Afternoon

The afternoon service began with the assembly singing "Sunlight," led by Fred Hall. Rev. Don Sexton read Luke 5:1-5 as a basis for afternoon devotions followed by prayer.

A report on the Tennessee State Association was given by Rev. Robert Hill. This report was adopted.

The Obituary Report was given by Mrs. Fannie Polston. Rev. Fred Hall sang "Beyond the Sunset" in memory of those who had died during the past year. The moderator led in prayer. Motion passed to adopt this report.

Scott's Chapel Church was approved as the place for the 1960 session.

Rev. Wallace Paul gave the Resolutions Committee report. Motion passed to receive the report and to deal with each resolution item by item.

Motion passed to give a rising vote of thanks for the hospitality of the host church.

The moderator ruled out of order the resolution concerning church statistics.

Motion passed that resolution No. 2 as amended concerning superannuation offerings be adopted.

Motion passed to amend that we "direct" the local superannuation board instead of "urge" them to send the proper percentage to the National Superannuation program.

The Temperance Committee report was read by Rev. Don Sexton. Motion passed to accept the report and adopt it item by item.

Motion passed that item No. 1 be adopted.

Motion carried that item No. 2 be adopted and be amended by substituting "lust" for "love" in the body of the item.

Motion carried that item No. 3 be adopted.

Motion carried that item No. 4 be adopted.

The report of the Nominating Committee was given by Rev. John Vick. Since no nominations were forthcoming from the floor for the boards, the committee report was adopted.

Motion passed that the nomination of state delegates be referred to the Nominating Committee for further report.

The Presbytery report was read and adopted.

The Nominating Committee reported the nominating of five delegates to the state association and asked each pastor to elect one member from his church to attend the association as delegate.

Rev. Charles A. Thigpen was elected as the representative of the Cumberland Association stock in the Free Will Baptist Press and to vote for the association.

The registration report was given by J. B. Reding, as follows:

Whereas, The Hollywood movie industry has ignored its high opportunity to be a powerful force for good upon our land and has used its powers to wealth and influence, and

Whereas, The Hollywood movies of today are dramatized and produced by sinful, wicked people and their influence is a vile curse upon our land, and

Whereas, The theme of the vast majority of pictures is crime, love, and sex, and scenes with semi-nudity and immoral situations abound, and

Whereas, The "good" picture, the historical film, and the "recommended film," are a bait to lure into the movie theater those who have scruples against going, therefore be it

Resolved, That this body go on record as disapproving the sanction or attendance of Hollywood movies by those who profess to be Christians, and be it

Resolved, That this body recommend that her churches and pastors inform their people of the pitfalls and wiles of this wicked industry.

Whereas, the human body is to be used to the glory of God, and *Whereas*, The trend in our country today is toward immodesty in dress; therefore be it *Resolved*, That this body go on record as being against the wearing of shorts of any kind by both young people and adults of both sexes.

Whereas, the root of the dance's attraction is sex, and its intention is to arouse and stimulate passion, and *whereas*, the dance destroys modesty, promotes impure thinking in immorality, and *Whereas*, some public schools require dancing as physical education, therefore be it resolved, That this body go on record as disapproving social dancing of any kind and recommend that parents take a firm stand against this evil practice being taught to their children.

Three Point Program

1. Education

Since the liquor interests are propagandizing American youth from every angle, we must be alert. Education for personal abstinence should be a definite part of our religious teaching. Emphasis can be placed on total abstinence through the temperance lesson in the Sunday school and co-operation with organizations such as the National Temperance League.

2. Legislation

Put principle above party. Elect and support officials that are desirable.

3. Administration

Preach and pray. Over 200,000 devoutly praying Free Will Baptists should be able to make an impact upon the forces of unrighteousness.

REPORT OF THE HOME MISSION BOARD

Your Home Mission Board held five meetings during the year and discussed the possibilities for several new mission stations. Mission rallies were held at West Nashville Church December 7, Dickson Church June 7, and at Layne's Chapel, Whitwell, Tennessee, February 23.

The Home Mission Board and Brother Luther Reed organized the Faith Free Will Baptist Church with 36 charter members.

We have given financial assistance to the mission at Lewisburg and to the newly organized Faith Church. More than \$300 in designated funds was sent to the Pardue Memorial Church at Clarksville. Also designated funds were sent to the National Board for Brother Billows, Brother Owens and Brother Walker.

We feel that the missionary effort carried on with the National Board for the Clarksville church has been a success. The first unit of this building is almost completed and is large enough to accommodate a large number of people. It is constructed of concrete block and brick and at the present time is valued at \$25,000. The people here have bought an additional lot and have a parsonage under construction.

We have recently looked over some of the new sub-divisions for good sites for new mission stations and at the present time have a committee negotiating for a lot in a new housing area now being developed between the Dickerson and Gallatin highways, near Madison. This lot seems to be an ideal location; it is in the center of the project and can be seen from any place in it. However, this will not be ready to start building for a few months yet.

It is the prayer of this board that the churches of the Cumberland Association will make a special effort to contribute more to missions this year that we might make more progress in establishing new churches and spreading the gospel to the unchurched areas around us.
