PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Morning, October 12, 1960

The 117th annual session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee, held at the Scott's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Erin, Tennessee, was opened at 9:45 a.m. October 12 with the congregation singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms."

The moderator, Rev. Luther Reed, presented Rev. W. B. Hughes as the devotional speaker. Brother Hughes read from 1 Cor. 12 and led in prayer.

Rev. Virgil Smith, pastor of the host church, welcomed the associational delegates, ministers, and visitors to the Scott's Chapel Church and community. Rev. E. A. Craft responded for the association with words of gratitude, expressing appreciation for the opportunity to be with the Scott's Chapel Church.

The moderator appointed the following Finance Committee: J. B. Reding, Rev. Gene Anderson, and Elmer Felts. He also appointed the following to membership on the Committee of Committees: Rev. Fred Hawkins, Rev. W. B. Hughes, Rev. W. R. Carroll.

The moderator then called for the ministers, deacons, and delegates from the churches to stand, and he recognized them as the voting body of the association and charged them to act on any business items that should be taken up.

A good number of visiting ministers were recognized, and these were welcomed along with other visitors at the association.

Following the order of the program, the moderator called for the report of the Home for Children at Greeneville, Tennessee. Brother H. C. Burgess, superintendent of the home, promptly addressed the association, reporting the work of the home in satisfactory condition. A financial report showed \$3,490.82 in donations having been received during the year from Cumberland Association churches, about \$300 less than one year ago. Rev. Herbert Tutterow, a staff member from the home, conducted a discussion period during which he answered questions on the activities of the home.

The moderator next called on Rev. Bobby Poole, Cumberland Association missionary appointee to Brazil, to present his plans for leaving the United States December 14. Poole appealed for the people to pray that funds would come in to finance his expenses to Brazil. Mrs. J. E. Frazier challenged the association to underwrite Bobby Poole's expenses.

Motion passed to take an offering, one half for the Home for Children and one half for Poole's missionary work. The offering was \$88.

The morning worship service was entered into with Rev. Bob Ketchum leading the congregation of approximately 200 people in an enjoyable song service. "Heavenly Sunlight" and "Love Lifted Me" were sung. Rev. Eunis Crowe led the congregation in prayer. Brother and Sister J. B. Parsons sang "Haven of Rest" as a special number.

The moderator then presented Rev. Charles A. Thigpen, dean of Free Will Baptist Bible College, as the morning speaker. Reading from Luke 12:49-53 and Eph. 6:10-18, the speaker used the subject, "Militant Christianity," a most vigorous message of challenge to ministers. An altar prayer

was held with ministers rededicating their lives to preach God's truth as given in His Word. Rev. W. R. Carroll prayed the prayer of consecration.

The host pastor, Rev. Virgil Smith, welcomed all attending the association to share in the lunch provided by the people of the Scott's Chapel Church and community.

Wednesday Afternoon

The afternoon meeting opened with the singing of "He Keeps Me Singing," followed by devotions brought by Rev. Joe Haas, who read from 1 Thess. 2:1-11 and led in prayer.

The customary moderator's message to the association was brought by Rev. Luther Reed. He used 2 Tim. 4:1-4 to emphasize the preacher's responsibility of preaching the Word and exercising courageous leadership in the local church.

The afternoon business session was entered into. The Committee on Committees report was given by Rev. Fred Hawkins and was approved.

Rev. Virgil Smith gave the report of the Western Quarterly Meeting. Motion passed to adopt this report.

A report of the National Association was given by Rev. Charles Thigpen, the past national moderator. He reported a splendid meeting at Fresno, California, in July, and announced the 1961 meeting to be at Norfolk, Virginia, and the 1962 meeting scheduled at Nashville, Tennessee. This report was approved.

The registration committee report was given and approved. The number registering for Wednesday was 126 with an explanation given that many others were in attendance who did not register.

There being no further business of the day, the meeting was adjourned until Thursday morning. The congregation was dismissed by prayer.

Thursday Morning, October 13, 1960

The Thursday morning session began at 9:30 with Rev. Bob Ketchum leading in the singing of "I am Thine, O Lord." Rev. Tom Johnson prayed the opening prayer. Morning devotions were brought by Rev. Bill Robinson who used Acts 18:4-11 as his scriptural lesson.

The moderator again recognized the ministers, deacons, and delegates from the churches as the voting body of the association. The visitors were welcomed.

The Foreign Missions Board report from Rev. Douglas Roberson was read and approved.

The Home Mission Board financial report was given by A. G. Caldwell, which included a report on donations received from each church. He explained some of the work the Home Mission Board was helping with.

J. B. Reding gave the report of the Superannuation Board. Motion carried to approve this report. Motion passed that the Superannuation Board pay for its local obligations to ministers first before paying the 25% quota to the National Superannuation Program.

Rev. Joe Hurst gave an oral report on the Youth Camp program. This report was adopted. (Written report was promised for the minutes).

No report on the Home for Children was forthcoming since the superintendent from the home had presented a report the previous day.

Mrs. Bennie Stack gave the report of the Eastern Quarterly Meeting. This report was approved.

The moderator next introduced Dr. L. C. Johnson, presidentt, to give a report on the work of Free Will Baptist Bible College. The school official charged the Cumberland Association churches to increase their support to Christian education. This report was approved.

An offering of \$58.82 was taken for Superannuation and Home Missions.

The morning worship service began with the congregation singing "Revive Us Again." Rev. Harold Pitts, Canton, N. C., was introduced as the speaker for the morning service. Using John 12:20-22, the speaker spoke on the text, "We would see Jesus." A very fine message was delivered. An invitation was extended during the singing of "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood." Rev. L. C. Johnson prayed the dismissal prayer.

The host church again welcomed the people to another splendid dinner spread on tables outside the church.

Thursday Afternoon

The people sang "Victory in Jesus" at the opening of the afternoon session. Rev. A. B. Troutman led in prayer. Devotions were brought by Rev. W. R. Carroll, one of the association's oldest ministers. He read from the Scriptures and related how God had blessed him to preach for the past 40 years. He announced his retirement from doing pastoral work. He then led the assembly in prayer.

Rev. Gene Anderson read a report on Education and Literature. This report was approved.

Rev. W. B. Hughes reported on the 1959 session of the Tennessee State Association. Motion passed to adopt this report.

The report of the Cumberland Association Woman's Auxiliary was given by Mrs. J. E. Frazier. The report was adopted.

J. B. Reding gave the report of the Finance Committee and the report of the registration committee. These reports were approved.

The Obituary Report was given and approved.

Rev. David Joslin read the Petitions and Requests report, which was received for consideration.

Motion passed to adopt Petition No. 1.

Motion passed to table Petition No. 2 until the Resolutions report should be read.

Mrs. J. E. Frazier read the Resolutions report, which was approved to be considered item by item.

Items 1-4 were adopted.

Motion passed to table Item No. 5.

Motion passed to adopt Item No. 6.

Motion passed to adopt Item No. 7 with the following amendment by in-

section "that each church be requested to send the \$50 for the Bobby Poole equipment fund to the district associational treasurer.

Motion passed that Item No. 8 be tabled.

Item No. 2 of the Petitions and Requests Report relative to the placing of the next session of the association was taken from the table. Invitations from five churches were announced. The association voted to accept the invitation from Oaklawn Church for the 1961 meeting.

The Temperance Committee report was presented by George Allen. This report was adopted.

Rev. Joe Hurst read the Nominating Committee Report, which was received.

This led to the election of officers as follows:

Motion passed to approve the filling of the vacancies on the boards according to the Nomination Committee report. Delegates to the State Association were approved according to the report.

J. B. Reding gave the associational treasurer's report, which was approved.

Motion passed to give \$200 from the associational treasury to the Bobby Poole equipment fund.

REPORT OF RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

We, your committee on Resolutions, submit the following for your consideration.

1. That this body express appreciations, by a rising vote of thanks, to the following:

- (1) The pastor, members of the Scott's Chapel Church and all other churches and friends of this church for their welcome and fine hospitality and for the use of their facilities during this association.
- (2) To the officers and board members for their efforts and prayers which have, through the Lord's leadership, made this session such a blessing to our hearts.
- (3) To those who brought us such challenging messages, to the song director, the pianist, and everyone who had any part in this 1960 program.

2. Because the National Association is, by request, meeting in Tennessee

for its 1962 annual session, be it resolved that this body offer to the State Association during its annual session next week, whatever assistance that is desired of this body in preparing for the entertainment of the National body.

3. That each church be urged to send the requested delegate to the Tennessee State Association of Free Will Baptists, which convenes October 19-20, 1960, at Knoxville, Tennessee.

4. That the various boards of this body be urged to read and to comply with article 4 under Boards on page 3 of the Constitution of this body.

5. That this body elect a district promotional secretary whose duties will be as follows:

(1) To visit each church comprising this association; (2) To present and encourage active participation in the association's plan of work; (3) Wherever desired, to conduct regional workshops relative to the promotion and extension of God's work in and through the churches of this district. Be it further resolved that this body pay 10¢ per mile for traveling expenses plus postage and whatever other supplies are needed to perform the work of this office.

6. That the following items be approved as this body's foreign missionary projects:

(1) *Whereas* Brother Bobby Poole, Cumberland Association's first foreign mission appointee, needs funds to enable him to go speedily to Brazil where God has called him to serve, that each church comprising this association be requested to contribute at least \$50 on or before December 1, 1960, and to send the amount designated "Bobby Poole Equipment Fund" to the district association's treasurer.

(2) *Whereas* Brother Bobby Poole and his wife will need living expenses while serving in Brazil, it is further recommended that beginning December 1, 1960 each church of this district send monthly thereafter at least \$5 designated "Bobby Poole Salary Fund," to the association's treasurer.

7. *Whereas*, one of the most basic of all American freedoms is the freedom to worship according to one's own conscience, and *Whereas*, the Roman Catholic Church calls the American doctrine of separation of church and state "absurd" and a "fatal theory" (Pope Leo XIII in his Great Encyclical Letters), and *Whereas*, one of the candidates running for the presidency of the United States in the coming November election is a member of the Roman Catholic church, and to be consistent and faithful to his religion, must consider himself bound to do all in his power to bring the United States government under control of the Roman Church,

Therefore be it resolved that the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee go on record as opposing the election of a Roman Catholic as president, regardless of political affiliations, and that we warn our constituency of the possible disastrous consequences of voting for such a candidate.

8. That *whereas* this association is a two-day meeting, it is recommended that the sessions be divided between two churches of this district.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE

The Committee on Temperance appointed October 12, 1960, begs to submit the following report:

After consultation and prayerful consideration, we have arrived at the following conclusions of exhortation and admonition. These we extend in a spirit of brotherly love to all Free Will Baptists and *particularly* to those who are in key positions of authority.

1. That a firm and uncompromising stand be taken against alcohol in all forms, *including* beer, and that our people be continually taught against the evils of it. Lev. 10:8,9; Rom. 14:21.

2. That a firm stand be taken against mixed bathing and *all forms* of indecent dress or immodest apparel, and that our people be continually taught against this evil which Satan is using even among the children of God. 1 Tim. 2:9; Matt. 5:28.

3. That a firm stand be taken against dancing and movies. 1 Cor. 10:31.

4. That Christians be very careful of *any manner* of communication which would grieve God's Holy Spirit, such as dirty jokes. Eph. 4:29.

5. That those who use coffee, tobacco, or cold drinks *do so in moderation*, and not become a slave to any habit. 1 Cor. 9:25,27.

6. That those who are called of God *practice moderation* in eating. Phil. 3:18,19; 4:5.

7. That pastors and churches practice moderation in the promotion of games or social gatherings which would tend to substitute for true worship. 1 Pet. 4:3; John 4:23,24.

8. That Christians not only strive diligently to keep God's commandments, but to "abstain from all appearance of evil," 1 Thess. 5:22.

We believe that power and strength in temperance come from God, as a result of much prayer and Bible study. We believe that abstinence from "all appearance of evil" and moderation in *all things* of the world is absolutely necessary if called children of God would swiftly promote the Gospel of our Lord. We must be living examples of the Word of God that lost souls may read Christ in our lives, and that our brethren be lifted up and strengthened in the faith. 1 Pet. 5:3. Jesus says, "If ye love me, keep my commandments," John 14:15.

175 Daily Bible Readers were reported, 91 family altars and 46 observing the W. N. A. C. Prayer Fellowship. A total of 14 weeks of prayer was conducted through this auxiliary, and self-denial offerings resulting from these seasons of prayer were \$489.77 for missions.

Children's Home gifts were cash \$353.80, clothing \$160, groceries \$60, and one quilt. Four children were individually sponsored and cared for.

Number attending cottage prayer meetings was 70, and there were 10 souls won. 196 visited the sick and 170 trays and baskets were prepared for the needy. 74 distributed tracts and 158 women subscribe to Free Will Baptist papers. We have 160 tithers with 23 new ones during the year.
