PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Morning, October 11, 1961

The 118th annual session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee, held at Oaklawn Free Will Baptist Church, Pleasant View, Tennessee, was opened at 9:30 a.m., October 11, with the singing of "We're Marching to Zion," led by Brother Harold Teague. Rev. W. R. Carroll led in prayer.

Rev. Luther Reed, moderator, presented the Rev. Sidney Henry to bring morning devotions. Reading from Heb. 12:1, the speaker admonished the congregation about running the heavenly race.

Rev. Tom Johnson, host pastor, welcomed the association on behalf of the Oaklawn Church. Rev. James Smith responded for the association with words of gratitude, expressing appreciation for the privilege to meet with the Oaklawn Church.

The moderator appointed the Registration Committee to serve as Finance Committee: J. B. Reding, Elmer Felts, and Rev. Fred Hawkins.

The Committee on Committees was appointed as follows: Rev. Homer Willis, Rev. Sidney Henry, and Rev. E. A. Craft.

The moderator then called for the ministers, deacons, and delegates from the churches to stand, and he recognized them as the voting body for the association.

Visiting ministers were recognized and other visitors were welcomed.

Brother H. C. Burgess, superintendent of the Free Will Baptist Home for Children at Greeneville, Tenn., was introduced to give his annual report. One hundred and five children are being cared for at present, he reported. A total of \$3,957 was given from the Cumberland Association churches, an increase of approximately \$500 over the previous year, he said. An offering was taken for the Home amounting to \$203.68.

The moderator invited Dr. L. C. Johnson, president of Free Will Baptist Bible College, to make a report on the work of the school. He expressed thanks to the churches in the association which had participated in supporting the training program during the past year. He reported the largest enrollment this year in the school's history, 246 day students, 30 evening students, and a large summer school number, making more than 300 students already registered this year. He also challenged the churches to participate in the 20th Anniversary celebration this year in which 5,000 people are challenged to give one dollar for each of the 20 years of service the school has rendered in training the youth of the denomination.

The moderator dismissed the business session to enter the morning worship service. The congregation sang "Revive Us Again" and "Send the Light." Rev. Eunis Crowe led in prayer.

A duet from the Home for Children sang a special number, "Just Inside the Gate." The morning speaker, Rev. J. D. O'Donnell, was introduced by the moderator to bring the message. He read from John 12:23-32, using as a text "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me."

Brother Tom Johnson, host pastor, welcomed the guests to the noon

meal prepared by the church people.

Before the benediction was prayed by the Rev. H. A. Pitts of Canton, N. C., the report of the Committee on Committees was given by Rev. Homer Willis.

Wednesday Afternoon

Following lunch, which was served to approximately 300 people, the afternoon service began with the singing of "Loyalty to Christ."

Rev. Carl Wilson brought devotions, reading from Matt. 28:16-20 and closing with prayer.

Brother Luther Reed brought the moderator's message, using as a title "Meeting the Modern-day Challenge for Free Will Baptists," and using for his scripture Joshua 1:16-18.

Rev. Joe Haas assisted the moderator in leading the afternoon business session.

A report was given on the National League work by Mrs. Ray Turnage. Motion passed to receive this report.

The Resolutions Committee partial report was made by Rev. Dale Burden relative to new materials to be ordered from the National League Board. This resolution was passed.

Rev. H. C. Beasley read the report of the Western Quarterly Meeting. Motion passed to receive this report.

The Eastern Quarterly Meeting report was given by R. E. Felts. Motion passed to receive this report and to receive Blue Springs Church and Camp Grounds Church into the membership of the association and to seat their delegates.

A report of the Tennessee State Association was given by Rev. W. B. Hughes. He announced the 1961 meeting at Loyal Chapel Church, Columbia, October 17-19.

Rev. Charles A. Thigpen gave a report on the 1961 session of the National Association in Norfolk. He urged all the people to attend the 1962 session which is to be held in Nashville, Tenn.

The registration report was given by J. B. Reding, showing 40 churches represented and 247 people registered for the first day.

Rev. Rolla Smith reported on the National Foreign Missions work.

Rev. Homer Willis spoke on the work of National Home Missions.

Motion passed to adjourn until Thursday. The assembly sang "Come Thou Fount," followed by the closing prayer led by Rev. Billy Walker.

Thursday Morning, October 12, 1961

The services were opened with the singing of "He Keeps Me Singing," and prayer by Rev. J. L. Welch.

Rev. Fred Hawkins brought devotional thoughts, reading from John 7:38, 39.

The minutes of the previous day were read and approved.

The moderator again qualified the ministers, deacons, and delegates to vote in the business to come before the association.

The visitors were recognized and welcomed.

The reports of the boards were called for and approved as follows:

The Foreign Missions Board given by Rev. Fred Hawkins.

The Home Missions Board by the clerk.

The Superannuation Board report by J. B. Reding. An offering of \$61.27 was taken for Superannuation.

The Youth Camp Board report by Rev. W. B. Hughes.

The business session was adjourned to enter the morning worship service. Brother Bob Ketchum led the congregation in singing "I Am Resolved" and "The Wondrous Story."

The moderator introduced Rev. Malcolm Fry, pastor of the Ashland City Church, as the morning speaker. Brother Fry first sang "It Pays to Serve Jesus," and then brought a message from Gen. 41:57, preaching on "The Famines in the World Today"—Famine of Bible Preaching, Bible Living, and Bible Action.

Rev. Dale Burden closed the morning service with prayer. The host church again served the noon meal to approximately 300 people.

Thursday Afternoon

The afternoon service began with the singing of "At the Cross." Rev. George Ludwig brought devotions, reading from Eph. 4:1-6 and closed with prayer.

The moderator charged the delegated body as to the rules of decorum previous to going into the afternoon business session.

The District Woman's Auxiliary Convention report was read by Mrs. Ray Turnage. This report was received.

Rev. Joe Haas read the report of the Temperance Committee, which, after discussion, was adopted.

J. B. Reding gave the report of the Finance Committee, which was approved.

Rev. Tom Johnson read the report of the Petitions and Requests Committee. The body voted on the requests of Stony Point Church and Bethlehem Church to entertain the 1962 association. The association voted to go to Stony Point Church.

Rev. J. L. Welch read the Obituary Committee report, which was approved. The congregation stood in silent tribute to the memory of Rev. W. B. Davenport, revered minister of the association, as Rev. J. L. Welch closed with prayer.

Rev. Dale Burden read the report of the Resolutions Committee.

Item No. 1 passed.

Item No. 2 passed.

Item No. 3 passed.

Item No. 4 passed. Motion passed that the chair appoint a committee to study the constitution and by-laws. Rev. J. L. Welch, chairman; Rev. Homer Willis, and Rev. Dale Burden were appointed.

Item No. 5 passed.

Rev. E. A. Craft gave the Nominating Committee report.

J. B. Hall was re-elected to the Education and Literature Board.

Motion passed to elect the slate of officers as given by the Nominating Committee report.

Motion passed that the Cumberland Association moderator select delegates from the people attending the State Association.

Motion passed to adopt the Presbytery report.

The Associational Treasurer's report was read and adopted.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE

The Committee on Temperance submits the following report:

After consultation and prayerful consideration, we have arrived at the following conclusions of exhortation and admonition. These we extend in a spirit of brotherly love to all Free Will Baptists and particularly to those who are in key positions or authority.

1. That a firm and uncompromising stand be taken against alcohol and tobacco in all forms, and that our people be continually taught against the evils of it. Lev. 10:8, 9; Rom. 14:21.

2. That a firm stand be taken against mixed bathing and all forms of indecent dress or immodest apparel, and that our people be continually taught against this evil which Satan is using even among the children of God. I Tim. 2:9; Matt. 5:28; Deut. 22:5.

3. That Christians be very careful of any manner of communication which would grieve God's Holy Spirit, such as dirty jokes, slander, etc. Eph. 4:29.

4. That pastors and churches practice moderation in the promotion of games or social gatherings which would tend to substitute for true worship, and also take a firm stand against movies and dancing in our public schools. I Pet. 4:3; John 4:23, 24.

5. That Christians not only strive diligently to keep God's commandments, but to "abstain from all appearance of evil." I Thess. 5:22.

We believe that power and strength in temperance come from God, as a result of much prayer and Bible study. We believe that abstinence from "all appearance of evil" and moderation in all things of the world is absolutely necessary if called children of God would swiftly promote the Gospel of our Lord. We must be living examples of the Word of God that lost souls may read Christ in our lives, and that our brethren be lifted up and strengthened in the faith. I Pet. 5:3. Two weeks of youth encampment were held this year at Hillmont Assembly Camp Grounds, White Bluff, Tenn. Forty-three juniors attended August 6-12 and forty-two intermediates August 13-19. Rev. Freeman Edwards of Chipley, Fla., was camp evangelist for the juniors, and Rev. Bob Ketchum, pastor of Shady Grove Church, was evangelist for the intermediates. There were several conversions and rededications.
