PROCEEDINGS**Wednesday Morning, October 16, 1963**

The Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists met for its 120th annual session at Bethlehem Free Will Baptist Church near Ashland City on Wednesday morning at 9:30 o'clock, October 16, 1963.

Rev. W. B. Hughes, moderator, called the association to order with the Rev. Andy Lay leading the congregation in singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." Rev. Norman Richards led in prayer which was followed by the congregation singing "Praise Him, Praise Him."

The moderator then called upon Rev. Harrold Harrison to bring devotions. He read a passage from Psalms and closed with prayer. Following the singing of "Work for the Night is Coming," the moderator called for Brother George Ludwig, host pastor, to greet the association. Brother Ludwig welcomed the people and explained the accommodations that were available for the associational guests. Rev. J. L. Welch responded with words of appreciation for the association to meet at the Bethlehem church.

The moderator then formally opened the business session and appointed the following members on the Finance Committee: J. B. Reding, J. B. Hall, and Lonnie Ricketts.

The associational ministers, along with the deacons and church delegates, were called on to stand and were charged as the voting body of the association.

The Committee on Committees was appointed, as follows: Rev. W. B. Rodgers, Rev. Andy Lay, and Wallace Howell.

The moderator recognized visiting ministers and welcomed other visitors.

Rev. Harrold Harrison, representing the Sunday School Department of the National Association, spoke in behalf of his work. He appealed for all the Sunday schools to use the literature sold by the National office.

The Home for Children report was presented by Mrs. Ray Turnage, wife of the superintendent of the Home. Copies of the Home's financial report were furnished the audience. She brought greetings from the 68 children and reported that \$6791.02 was received from Cumberland Association churches during the past year. Rev. E. A. Craft led in a prayer in behalf of the Children's Home.

A report on the work of the Bible College was given by Dean Charles A. Thigpen. He ably set forth the purpose and ministry of the Bible College in the work of the denomination. A total of \$4147.30 was given from Cumberland Association churches during the past year, he reported.

Entering the morning worship service, the congregation was led by Brother Fred Hall in singing "Have Faith in God." Rev. Luther Reed led in prayer. The Bible College Choir, led by Donald Clark, presented a short program of choral music. Following a worship offering, the Rev. Charles A. Thigpen was presented as the speaker for the morning. He read from Acts 5:1-7 and challenged the congregation to seek God's help in solving their problems as did the early church.

Brother George Ludwig welcomed the people to lunch and instructed them in procedures during the serving of the meal. Rev. Damon Dodd prayed the benediction and gave thanks to God for the food.

Wednesday Afternoon

The afternoon service was opened with the singing of "Stand Up for Jesus" led by Brother Fred Hall. Rev. Luther Reed led in prayer which was followed by the congregation's singing "The Home Over There," and "The Uncloudy Day."

Rev. Don Sexton brought devotions, reading from Mark 14:3-9 and speaking concerning "Doing What You Can." He also told about the proposed Free Will Baptist mission in Chattanooga.

Rev. Henry Melvin, assistant moderator, presented Rev. W. B. Hughes to bring the moderator's message. Brother Hughes read from Hebrews 5:11-6:3 and challenged the audience to go on to Christian maturity.

Following the singing of "I Am Resolved" by the congregation, Rev. W. B. Rodgers read the Committee on Committees report (see reports), which was accepted by the body.

The Eastern Quarterly Meeting report was read by Mrs. Helen Roberson. Motion passed to approve the report.

The Tennessee State Association report was given by Brother Elmer Felts. Motion passed to receive the report.

The report of the National Association held in Detroit in July was given by Rev. Billy Melvin, executive secretary. Motion passed to receive this report as information.

The report of the Woman's Auxiliary was given by Mrs. J. E. Frazier, and motion passed to adopt this report.

Report on the first day's registration was given by Brother J. B. Reding. Motion passed to receive this partial report.

Motion passed that the morning's offering of \$100 be given to the Bible College for the Indebtedness Campaign.

Motion passed that an offering be taken Thursday morning and that it be given to the mission work in Chattanooga.

Greetings were brought by Rev. Norman Richards, foreign missionary candidate; and Rev. W. M. Ellison, who told of his plans to go soon as a missionary to Brazil.

Rev. J. L. Welch announced to the body the need at Union Hill Church to build a new building and expressed hope for the churches to cooperate in helping erect the building.

To close the first day's session, the group sang together "Redeemed," followed by a closing prayer.

Thursday Morning, October 17

The Thursday morning service was opened with the singing of "He Keeps Me Singing" and "To the Work." Rev. Hughes Ellis led in prayer.

The moderator introduced Rev. Sidney Henry for devotions. He read from the Scriptures and exhorted the ministers to preach the word.

Following the singing of "I Am Resolved," the clerk read the minutes of the previous day, which were corrected and approved.

The moderator called for reports from the various boards. Rev. Andy

Lay read the report of Education and Literature, which was adopted. Brother A. G. Caldwell gave the Home Missions report, which was approved. Rev. Fred Hawkins gave an oral report on Foreign Missions, which was adopted. Brother J. B. Reding read the Superannuation Board report, which was adopted.

Following discussion on how to help the family of deceased minister Rev. Orville Dobbs, motion passed to refer the matter to the Superannuation Board for a recommendation later in the day.

Rev. W. M. Ellison reported on the Youth Camp work, which was adopted. Rev. Hughes Ellis gave a financial report in connection with the operation of the youth encampment.

Brother Glenn Vann gave a financial report on the Hillmont Assembly Trustee Board. Motion passed to adopt this report.

The moderator was appointed to fill vacancies on the various committees, which was done.

Brother E. A. Craft gave an oral report on the Children's Home, and this report was adopted.

Rev. Virgil Smith gave the report of the Western Quarterly Meeting, which was adopted.

Preceding the morning worship hour, Miss Debbie Melvin gave a declamation reading.

The business session was adjourned for the morning worship service to be directed by the Presbytery with Rev. C. A. Thigpen, moderator, in charge.

Brother Fred Hall led the congregation in singing "Loyalty to Christ," which was followed by prayer led by Rev. H. C. Beasley. Brother Hall then sang as a solo "Jesus My Lord Is Real to Me."

Rev. Douglas Roberson, as the morning speaker, led the people in prayer and then read from 2 Tim. 4:1-8 before bringing a message concerning the preaching of the Word. Rev. Rolla Smith charged the ministerial candidates for ordination along with their wives. Rev. R. E. Picirilli presented the Bible as the message to be preached.

The moderator asked the candidates to kneel at the altar while the Presbytery members laid on hands as Rev. Henry Melvin led in the prayer of consecration. Ordained to the work of the full gospel ministry were Clarence Mays, Doyle Shepherd, and Joseph Hailey.

The congregation stood and while singing "Standing on the Promises" extended a Christian handshake to the ministers ordained.

An offering of \$65.88 was taken for the home mission work in Chattanooga. Rev. George Ludwig, host pastor, again announced the accommodations provided by Bethlehem Church in furnishing lunch for the people. The pastor of the Ashland City Church of Christ dismissed in prayer.

Thursday Afternoon

The afternoon service was opened with a song service led by Brother Fred Hall. Rev. H. C. Beasley brought devotions, reading from the Scriptures and leading in prayer. Judy Felts, Young People's Auxiliary member, gave a declamation speech concerning foreign missions.

Rev. Henry Melvin read the obituary report, and the body stood in silent tribute to the memory of those who had died during the past year as the moderator led in prayer.

The report of Petitions and Requests was given by Rev. Douglas Roberson. Motion passed to adopt the report and accept the invitation of Brandon's Chapel to hold the next session with them.

The Harper Road Church was received by vote as a new member in the association.

The Resolutions report was read by Rev. Leslie Carney, and motion passed that the report be received and the items be adopted individually.

Following lengthy discussion, motion passed that Resolution No. 1. read "that we recommend to the local churches that the pastoral year begin September 1 and end August 31 of each year."

(The Clerk was authorized to write each church, requesting the change in the pastoral year and to change minister's reports to Sept. 1 — August 31.)

Item No. 2 of the Resolutions report was passed as read.

Item No. 3 of the Resolutions report was passed as read and the congregation stood in acknowledgment of the hospitality extended by the Bethlehem Church.

Rev. Luther Reed read the Temperance report, which was adopted.

The Registration Committee report was given by J. B. Reding and was adopted.

The Finance Committee report was read by J. B. Reding and was adopted.

The report of the Presbytery was given by Rev. W. M. Ellison and was approved.

The Associational Treasurer's report was given by J. B. Reding, and along with the body's approval of his report went an authorization that he be refunded \$47.95 he put into the treasury personally to cover an overdraft.

The Superannuation report was brought to the floor again, and the Board recommended that the balance of \$158.54 be given to the Dobbs family. The report as originally read was adopted.

Rev. Richard Cordell presented the Nominating Committee report, and the following were elected:

Dr. J. D. O'Donnell to the Education and Literature board.

Rev. Luther Reed to succeed himself on the Home for Children board and

Rev. Leslie Carney to succeed Rev. Orville Dobbs.

Rev. Clarence Mays to replace Rev. Fred Hawkins on the Foreign Missions board and Rev. Rolla Smith to succeed himself.

Rev. Virgil Smith and Rev. Diamond Tucker to the Superannuation Board.

Rev. J. W. Love and Rev. Fred Hawkins to the Home Mission Board.

Brother W. E. Gentry to succeed Brother J. J. Poole on Hillmont Assembly Trustee Board.

Rev. Andy Lay to succeed Rev. Stanley Outlaw on Youth Camp Board, and Rev. Richard Cordell to replace Rev. W. M. Ellison.

Motion passed that the Hillmont Assembly Trustee Board be rotating with the older member going off and a new member being added annually.

The clerk was authorized to include the year by each board member's name to perpetuate the rotation system.

Motion passed for the revision committee of the constitution to be extended for another year. The members are Rev. W. B. Hughes, Rev. J. L. Welch, Rev. Homer Willis, Rev. Henry Melvin, and Rev. E. B. McDonald.

Delegates to the Tennessee State Association were elected as follows: Mr. and Mrs. Bennie Stack, Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Smith, and Mrs. Douglas Roberson.

The moderator appointed the following registration committee for next year's session: Brother Robert Castile, Mrs. H. C. Beasley, and Brother Elmer Felts.

No further business coming before the association, the group was dismissed with prayer by Rev. J. B. Parsons to meet at Brandon's Chapel Church in Bumpus Mills, Tennessee, Wednesday and Thursday before the third Sunday in October, 1964.
