PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Morning, October 14, 1964

The 121st annual session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists met at Brandon's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, Bumpus Mills, Tennessee, on Wednesday morning, October 14, 1964, at 9:30 o'clock.

Rev. W. B. Hughes, moderator, called the association to order and called on Rev. Andy Lay to lead the song service. The group sang "He Leadeth Me." Rev. Gordon Hart led in prayer followed by the congregation singing "Our Best."

Rev. Leslie Carney led in opening devotions, reading Romans 1:1-8. Brother Herbert Jones of the host church gave the welcome to the association. Rev. Gordon Hart responded with appreciation for the privilege of the association to meet with Brandon's Chapel Church. The congregation then sang "He's A Wonderful Saviour to Me."

The moderator greeted the associational delegates, ministers and deacons and qualified them as the voting body. He appointed the Finance Committee and the Committee on Committees as follows: Finance—J. B. Reding, Bennie Stack, and Vernon Poole; Committee on Committees—Rev. George Ludwig, Rev. H. C. Beasley, and Rev. John Gibbs.

The moderator recognized visiting ministers and welcomed other visitors.

Ray Turnage, superintendent of the Children's Home, was presented to give a report on the Home. He reported on overall conditions and progress made in several areas and appealed for prayers for the improvement of the services offered to the children, after which the congregation was led in the singing of "A Volunteer."

Dr. L. C. Johnson, president of Free Will Baptist Bible College, addressed the association in behalf of the Bible College.

Previous to the morning worship service, the group sang "At Calvary," led by Rev. Norman Richards. Rev. Luther Reed led in prayer and an offering was received for the Children's Home amounting to \$91.21.

The Preacher's Trio sang "Until Then," and Rev. Van Dale Hudson, pastor of West Nashville Free Will Baptist Church, preached the morning message. John 7:40-53 was read as his Scripture, his text being "Never Man Spake Like This Man."

Following the message, Rev. H. C. Beasley welcomed the associational people to partake of the lunch provided by the church. The group sang "What A Friend We Have In Jesus" and Rev. Damon Dodd dismissed the service with prayer and gave thanks for the food.

Wednesday Afternoon

Following lunch at the church, the afternoon service was opened with the singing of "There Is A Fountain" and "Anywhere With Jesus."

Rev. Henry Melvin, assistant moderator, introduced Rev. Douglas Roberson as devotional speaker. Romans 12:9-21 was read, followed by prayer.

Rev. Hughes brought the moderator's message, reading from Exodus 14 and challenging the association about overcoming obstacles, after which Rev. Lay led the singing of a congregational number.

The Eastern Quarterly Meeting report was read by Rev. Andy Lay. Motion passed to adopt the report.

Mrs. Robert Picirilli, Cumberland District Auxiliary president, gave the Woman's Auxiliary report. Motion passed to adopt this report.

Rev. Richard Cordell gave a report on the National Association. Motion passed to receive this report as information.

Rev. W. B. Hughes gave report on the Tennessee State Association, which was received.

Rev. George Ludwig gave the report of the Committee on Committees, and motion passed to receive the report.

Partial report of the Registration Committee was read by Bro. Felts and received as read.

The church letter of Owensboro, Kentucky was recommended by the moderator of the Western Quarterly Meeting and motion passed to receive this church.

Motion made to receive the proposed constitution revision report. Motion passed to adopt the revision report.

Rev. Harrold Harrison gave an oral report on the work of the National Sunday School Department work.

Motion passed to adjourn, no other business coming before the association for the day. Rev. Gus Thompson led the closing prayer.

Thursday Morning, October 15

The Thursday morning service was opened with the singing of "Jesus Calls Us" followed by devotions by Rev. T. L. Burch who read from the 61st Psalm and led in prayer. The group then sang "Love Lifted Me."

The minutes of the previous day's business were read and approved.

The moderator recognized ministers, deacons and delegates. He then recognized and welcomed the visitors.

The moderator called for reports from the various boards. Rev. Luther Reed gave an oral report on the work of the Home for Children, in lieu of a written report, for the Cumberland Association board. Motion passed to accept this report.

Brother A. G. Caldwell gave the report of the Home Missions board. Motion passed to adopt this report.

The Superannuation board report was given by Brother J. B. Reding, which was adopted.

The report of the Education and Literature board was given by Rev. T. L. Burch, and this report was adopted.

The report of the Temperance Committee was given by Rev. Henry Melvin. Motion passed to adopt this report.

A partial report of the Nominating Committee was given by Rev. Damon Dodd, and the following were elected: Rev. Ralph Hampton to Education and Literature board; Rev. George Ludwig to replace Rev. Luther Reed on the Home for Children board and Jack Turrentine for a three year term; Rev. D. L. Sharp to Superannuation board; Rev. Andy Lay to replace Rev. Hughes Ellis on Youth Camp board and Rev. W. B. Hughes for a three

year term; J. S. Wall to replace Rev. Fred Hawkins on the Home Missions board and Elmer Felts for a five year term; J. B. Stack to succeed himself to the Hillmont Assembly Board of Trustees; Rev. Henry Melvin, Moderator; Rev. C. A. Craft, Assistant Moderator; J. B. Reding, Treasurer. Rev. E. B. McDonald declined the nomination as clerk, and nominated Mrs. Robert Picirilli who was elected.

Rev. Richard Cordell gave the report of the Youth Camp board, and motion passed to adopt this report.

The report of the Board of Trustees of Hillmont Assembly was given by J. B. Stack, which was adopted.

The Western Quarterly Meeting report was given by Rev. H. C. Beasley. Motion passed to adopt this oral report.

The association recessed at 11 a.m. until the morning worship service.

Lunch was again furnished by the host church.

The afternoon session began with the singing of "When We All Get to Heaven." Rev. Jesse Webb led in prayer.

Rev. Leslie Carney gave the obituary report, which was adopted. The body stood in silent tribute to the memory of those who had died during the past year, after which the moderator led in prayer. The congregation sang "Where We'll Never Grow Old."

The Foreign Missions board report was given by Rev. J. Reford Wilson, and motion passed to adopt this report.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was given by Rev. Rolla Smith. Motion passed that the report be received to be considered item by item.

Following lengthy discussion vote was taken on item number 1 and motion was lost. Motion passed that the Executive Committee be charged with writing the duties of the various boards as by-laws of the Constitution.

Items 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Resolutions report were passed as read, each being voted on individually.

The Nominating Committee presented its final report by Rev. Damon Dodd. Rev. Norman Richards was elected to the Foreign Missions board.

The Petitions and Requests report was given by Rev. Wallace Hayes. The associational body voted to go to the West Nashville Church for the 1965 session.

The Finance Committee report was given by Bro. J. B. Reding, which was adopted. Bro. Reding also gave the associational report, and this also was adopted as read.

The Presbytery report was read by Rev. E. B. McDonald, and was adopted.

The Registration report was read by Bro. Elmer Felts and adopted as read.

Bro. J. B. Reding, Mrs. Georgie Ragan, Mrs. Bertie Pruitt, Bro. J. E. Frazier and Bro. Bennie Stack were elected as delegates to the State Association.

The Registration Committee for next year's session was appointed as follows: Bro. J. B. Reding, Mrs. Sandra Hudson, and Mrs. Bertie Pruitt.

Rev. Henry Melvin made an appeal in behalf of the Master's Men for the churches to support the annual tent revival sponsored by them.

Rev. Leslie Carney made an appeal for more churches to help the Hilltop Free Will Baptist Church to complete its new building.

Motion to adjourn was passed and the association was dismissed in prayer by Dr. R. E. Picirilli.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

- Whereas, the Board of Foreign Missions of the National Association has its headquarters in Nashville, Tennessee, in the midst of our Cumberland Association, and

Whereas, the services which would normally be rendered by the Associational Foreign Missions Board are taken care of by the National Board through their various agencies, and

Whereas, this virtually leaves the Associational Foreign Missions Board with little or no functions, therefore

Be it resolved, that the Board of Foreign Missions of this Association be dissolved. Be it further

Resolved, that article 1 (under Boards) of the Constitution be amended by striking out the term "Foreign Mission Board" wherever it may occur.

2. Whereas, the 1964 session of the Tennessee State Association will convene on November 11 and 12 within the bounds of the Cumberland Association (Donelson Church), and

Whereas, in the past the attendance at the State Association has been somewhat disappointing,

Be it, therefore, resolved that each pastor make a special effort to be present and that he strongly urge his congregation to attend.

3. Whereas, the Bible College continues to render an incalculable service to the Free Will Baptist denomination by offering a sound program of teaching and training for pastors, missionaries and other Christian workers, and

Whereas, churches in the Cumberland Association, because of their being in close proximity to the college, reap unique benefits from the institution, and

Whereas, the immediate needs for expansion are so great,

Be it, therefore, resolved that each church in the Cumberland Association re-evaluate its giving to the college and determine to support it financially with consistency and liberality.

4. Whereas, the Youth Camp has been such an instrument of blessing to the young people of the Cumberland Association, and

Whereas, there is an urgent need for additional equipment and improvements,

Be it, therefore, resolved that the Board of Trustees of the camp be encouraged to sponsor a campaign to retire the indebtedness on the property and

Be it further resolved that the Board of Trustees be assured of the full support of this body in such a venture.

CONSTITUTIONAL REVISION COMMITTEE

Proposed Revisions

BOARDS

Article 1. All standing boards shall be composed of three members, except the Executive Board, Home Mission Board, Superannuation Board and Hillmont Assembly Board of Trustees which shall be composed of five members. Standing boards include the Executive Board, Foreign Mission Board, Home Mission Board, Board of Education, Home for Children Board, Youth Camp Board, Hillmont Assembly Board of Trustees, Superannuation Board and such other boards as growth and expansion may justify.

The personnel of each of the foregoing boards, exclusive of the Executive, Home Mission, Superannuation and Hillmont Assembly Board of Trustees, shall be elected as follows: the first named for a period of one year, the second named for a period of two years, and the third named for a period of three years. Succession to office thereafter shall be determined as order requires. The Home Mission Board, Superannuation Board and Hillmont Assembly Board of Trustees shall be elected on a rotation basis with one member being elected each year for a five-year term.

Article 2. The personnel of the Executive Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer and the moderators of each quarterly meeting.



The Government and Constitution before Revision

BOARDS

Article 1. All standing boards shall be composed of three members, except the Executive Board, which shall be composed of seven members, and the Home Mission and Superannuation Boards which shall be composed of five members. Standing boards include the Executive Board, Foreign Mission Board, Home Mission Board, Board of Education, Orphanage Board, Youth Camp Board, and Superannuation Board.

The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the Executive, Home Mission, and Superannuation Boards, shall be elected as follows: the first named for a period of one year, the second named for a period of two years, and the third named for a period of three years. Succession to office thereafter shall be determined as order requires. The Home Mission Board and Superannuation Board shall be elected on a rotation basis with one member being elected each year for a five-year term.

Article 2. The personnel of the Executive Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and chairmen of the following boards:
