GOVERNMENT AND CONSTITUTION CUMBERLAND ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

ARTICLE 1. Each church in this Association shall be entitled to one delegate for the first 50 members or fraction thereof, and an additional delegate for each additional 50 members or fraction thereof. Each delegate shall be entitled to cast one vote on all business transactions.

ARTICLE 2. Each member church of the Association shall send a letter to each annual meeting, giving members received during year, enrollment, members dismissed, name and address of pastor and other officers, and financial statement of receipts and disbursements, according to the form provided by the clerk of the Association.

ARTICLE 3. This Association, when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper code of rules which they are authorized to establish for themselves.

ARTICLE 4. They may elect a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer from among themselves, and they may hold their offices until their successors are elected.

ARTICLE 5. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except when withdrawn by consent.

ARTICLE 6. New churches shall petition the quarterly meeting for membership. The quarterly meetings shall have power to receive new churches as members, and in turn shall recommend them to the annual Association.

ARTICLE 7. This Association shall furnish each church with minutes of their proceedings, in proportion to the amount of money sent by each church; in order to enable the Association to print their minutes it is expected that each church will send such sums of money as they think proper, and when the money is received, it shall be placed in the hands of a trustee appointed for that purpose, and may be disbursed by order of the Association.

ARTICLE 8. For the purpose of ordaining ministers of the gospel and for trying all ordained members for un-Christian conduct, there shall be a Presbytery, which shall convene at the close of the session on the first day of the Association and at any time during the associational year, if called by the Moderator or his assistants or any five members of said Presbytery who deem it necessary to make such a call. The Presbytery shall consist of ordained members present, and they shall elect a Moderator and clerk from among themselves for the time being, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. It shall be the duty of said Presbytery to examine all applications for ordination sent with recommendations from their churches composing this Association, and if found competent, to ordain and set them apart for the work by laying on of hands. The Presbytery shall have full power to try all ordained members for un-Christian conduct, and on testimony their decision shall be final.

ARTICLE 9. It shall be the duty of each minister who shall organize a church to ordain deacons for the same. It is his duty, also, to ordain deacons where a vacancy occurs within his charge. It shall be the duty of each pastor to encourage the organization and support of the Sunday school in the church or churches where he

is pastor, as well as other organizations that may prove helpful to the work of the church.

ARTICLE 10. No person shall be ordained to the ministry nor shall the credentials of any minister be ratified until he is qualified to meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Timothy. The term "the husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife (that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage). This shall be tested by the Presbytery. The Presbytery shall have full power to propound such Spiritual questions as they consider necessary to determine his qualifications. All candidates for ordination shall be required to answer these questions satisfactorily.

ARTICLE 11. This Association may exclude from its body any minister who teaches heresy, or any church that countenances him in said teaching or that may be disloyal to the tenets of Faith as held by this Association and expressed in our Articles of Faith.

ARTICLE 12. All questions coming before this Association shall be determined by a majority vote, except exclusion of churches which shall require two-thirds majority.

ARTICLE 13. Representatives from five churches shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and no business shall be transacted without a quorum.

ARTICLE 14. The minutes of this Association shall be read before the body, corrected if need be, signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

ARTICLE 15. This Association may adjourn to meet with any church that is a regular member of it at any time it deems proper.

ARTICLE 16. Amendments may be made to this form of government at any time by a majority of the members present composing the Association, voting in behalf of the amendment.

ARTICLE 17. When this Association shall have convened, it is the privilege of all ordained members belonging to the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists to sit in council with us, and to propose resolutions coming before the body as though they were delegates from the church.

ARTICLE 18. This Association, having jurisdiction over all the churches within its bounds, shall discipline any church which calls a minister for a pastor who has been excluded by the Presbytery.

BOARDS

ARTICLE 1. All standing boards shall be composed of three members, except the Home Mission Board and Board of Retirement and Insurance which shall be composed of five members, and the Executive Board and the Youth Camp Board which shall be composed of seven members.

The personnel of each of the foregoing boards, exclusive of the Executive,

Home Mission, Retirement and Insurance and Youth Camp Board shall be elected as follows: the first named for a period of one year, the second named for a period of two years, and the third named for a period of three years. Succession of office thereafter shall be determined as order requires. The Home Mission Board, and Retirement and Insurance, shall be elected on a rotation basis with one member being elected each year for a five-year term. The Youth Camp Board shall be elected on a rotation basis with one member being elected each year for a seven-year term.

ARTICLE 2. The personnel of the Executive Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and the moderators of each quarterly meeting.

ARTICLE 3. The Executive Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the Cumberland Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary for its own government, and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the Association. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of the Association.

ARTICLE 4. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operations in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary and as may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of the Association.

RULES AND DECORUM

This Association shall be opened by singing and prayer. Only one person may speak at a time. All addresses made by the members shall be made to the Moderator, and the person thus speaking shall strictly confine himself to the subject in debate. No speaker shall cast any personal reflection toward any member of this body who has spoken previously.

No person shall be allowed to speak more than three times on any one subject without the permission of a majority of the Association.

The speaker shall not be interrupted during his speech by anyone except the Moderator unless he violates the rules of order.

No member shall absent himself without permission from the Association. Members shall use the word "Brother" or "Brethren" in all debates.

No member shall speak longer than fifteen minutes at any time without permission from the Moderator.

Any member who shall willfully and knowingly violate any of these rules shall be reported by the Moderator and shall be subject to the censure of the Association.

Adopted in Council this Saturday before the first Lord's Day in October, 1867, as a standing decorum, though subject to revision by a majority of members voting for revision.

PROCEEDINGS

The one hundred twenty-seventh annual session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee convened at First Free Will Baptist Church, Dickson, Tennessee on Wednesday Morning October 14, 1970.

The session was opened with the congregation singing, "Sunlight In My Soul" led by Rev. John Gibbs. Rev. Willard McCarroll led in prayer. The Rev. Gibbs then led the congregation in singing "Redeemed."

The clerk called the session to order and introduced Rev. Wallace Hayes, Moderator for the session.

Rev. Willard McCarroll gave the morning devotions. He read Psalms 62:1-2; 5-8, and after some remarks about the Scripture, led in prayer.

Rev. H.C. Beasley, pastor of the host church, gave the welcome. The response was given by Rev. John Lindsley.

The moderator appointed the following to serve on the Committee on Committees: Rev. Larry Hughes, Rev. Richard Cordell and Rev. Don Dungan.

Following the appointment of this committee, the delegates were seated and the visitors welcomed. Rev. Bill Van Winkle and Rev. Darnell Williams were welcomed as visiting ministers.

The report of Free Will Baptist Bible College was given by Dr. L.C. Johnson and Rev. Jack Paramore. They gave a statistical report of the giving of the churches in the association and presented a challenge to the churches to cooperate with the Bible College Expansion Program to raise \$36,000 to furnish the new cafeteria to be named the Cumberland Association Cafeteria. Motion made, second and carried to receive the report as information.

At this time the moderator declared a recess. Rev. Bob Trimble dismissed in prayer.

MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE

The morning worship service began with singing of "Oh How Marvelous" and "The Unclouded Day."

The report of the Committee on Committees was read by Rev. Larry Hughes. Motion made, second and carried that the report be adopted.

After the moderator explained the spiritual needs of the Association, Rev. Ralph Hampton led in prayer. Rev. John Gibbs led the congregation in singing "Higher Ground" and "Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus" and then introduced Brother Joe Buchanan for the special music. He sang "Sweeter Gets the Journey Every Day" and "Its In Your Hands."

Rev. Harvey Hill brought the morning message. He read Acts 2:37-47 and preached from the subject "United." He pointed out that there must be unity in oneness, unity in purpose, unity provides a way, in unity there is strength and power and unity brings results. He closed the service with prayer.

Following the message the moderator received an offering of \$121.63.

After announcements had been made concerning the noon meal, Rev. Sidney Henry dismissed the morning service with prayer and gave thanks for the food.

AFTERNOON SERVICE

The afternoon session was opened with the congregation singing "When We

All Get To Heaven" led by Rev. John Gibbs. Prayer was by Rev. John Culliver. The Moderator, Rev. Wallace Hayes, read Matthew 16:24-26 and Gal. 2:20 and brought a message on worldliness. He pointed out that worldliness is a matter of the heart. He closed with prayer.

Rev. Don Ellis gave the report from the Tennessee Home for Children. Motion made, second and carried that the report be received as information.

Motion made, second and carried that Rev. Willard McCarroll replace Rev. John L. Welch on the nominating Committee.

The report of the Western Quarterly Meeting was read by Rev. Larry Hughes and Bro. Fulton Edwards. Motion made, second and carried to adopt the report.

Rev. Richard Cordell gave an oral report of the National Association. He brought to the attention of the association that the National Association would meet in Nashville, Tennessee next year. He stated that the State Association is asked to give \$2,500 for the expense of the National. Mr. Sam Johnson announced that 2,500 young people are expected at the National Youth Convention next year. Motion made, second and carried to receive the report as information.

Rev. Richard Cordell and Rev. W.B. Hughes gave oral reports from the Tennessee State Association. It was pointed out that the State Association asked that every church in the association be asked to give an amount equal to 5% of their outside giving. The 1971 session will meet with First Free Will Baptist Church, Elizabethton, Tennessee November 9-11.

Motion made, second and carried to receive the report as information.

A partial report of the Registration Committee was read by Mrs. Myrtle Parrish. Motion made, second and carried to adopt the report.

A partial report of the Resolutions Committee was made. Motion made, second and carried to receive the report and adopt it item by item. Items one and two were adopted. (See Report elsewhere in Minutes.)

The Moderator called for miscellaneous business. Bro. C.A. Craft made some statements concerning the Superannuation Board, urging the churches to give regularly for the support of elderly ministers.

Motion made, second and carried that the Chair appoint a committee to study the feasibility of buying back Hillmont Youth Camp. The committee was to report on Thursday. Rev. John Gibbs, Rev. Bob Jones and Rev. H.C. Beasley were appointed on the committee.

Motion made, second and carried to adjourn until 9:30 Thursday, October 15, 1970.

Dismissed in prayer by Rev. E.B. McDonald.

THURSDAY MORNING

The Thursday morning session began with the congregation singing "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes" led by Rev. John Gibbs. Rev. Larry Hughes led in prayer.

The devotional thoughts were brought by Brother Clarence Hudgens. He read from Ex. 14:15 and spoke on the subject of Moving Onward. He pointed out that we should Go forward in faith, Go forward against Evil, Go forward in personal religious living and Go forward to the promised Land.

The Moderator seated the delegates and welcomed the visitors. Bro. Bob Bagget was welcomed from the Middle Tennessee Association and Bro. J.C. Elliot from the Methodist denomination.

Rev. George Ludwig read the report of the Cumberland Presbytery and it was adopted.

Rev. C.A. Craft gave the report of the Superannuation Board. All money for this Board should be sent to Mr. Henry L. Morgan, 515 American Road, Nashville, Tenn. Motion made, second and carried to adopt the report.

Motion made, second and carried that the name of the Board of Superannuation be changed to the Board of Retirement and Insurance.

The report of the Cumberland Youth Camp Board was read by the clerk and it was adopted.

The report of the Board of Education and Literature was given by Rev. Roger Reeds and adopted.

The report of the Foreign Missions Board was given by Rev. Richard Cordell. He introduced Rev. Reford Wilson, National Foreign Missions Director, who brought greetings and news directly from the foreign fields. He pointed out that some of the needs on the fields are prayer, personnel and support. A motion was made, second and carried to receive the report.

The report of the Home Missions Board was given by Rev. Harvey Hill. The report was adopted. The Moderator introduced Rev. Homer Willis, Director of National Home Missions, who brought greetings from the home mission fields.

MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE

The morning worship service began with the congregation singing "He Keeps Me Singing" and "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart" led by Rev. John Gibbs after which an offering of \$44.64 was received. After Rev. Gibbs had sung "Ship Ahoy" the Moderator introduced Rev. Tommy Street for the morning message. He read Matt. 4:25-5:12 and spoke from the Beattitudes pointing out that pastors should preach and teach these things to their people. Following the message he gave an invitation and closed the service with prayer.

Several announcements were made including announcement about the noon meal. Brother Eddie Vincent dismissed with prayer and asked God's blessing upon the food.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon began with the congregation singing "Whosoever Meaneth Me" led by Rev. John Gibbs. Rev. Albert Halbrook led in prayer.

The minutes were read and approved.

The Moderator introduced Rev. Bill Van Winkle who gave a report of the new work in Murfreesboro. Motion made, second and carried that the report be received for information.

The report of the Cumberland District Woman's Auxiliary Convention was read by Mrs. Paul Pursell and adopted.

The report of the Obituary Committee was read by Mrs. Henry Read. Motion made, second and carried that the report be adopted. The Moderator asked the congregation to stand for a moment of silent prayer in memory of those whom God had called from our midst.

The report of the Committee on Petitions and Requests was read by Mr. Henry Read and adopted. The next session of the Cumberland Association will meet with Grace Church, Nashville, Tennessee.

Rev. George Ludwig read the remaining portion of the Resolutions Committee report. Motion made, second and carried to receive the report and adopt it item by item. Items three, four and five were adopted.

Rev. Terry Boyd read the report of the Temperance Committee and it was adopted.

The report of the Nominating Committee was read by Rev. Willard McCarroll and the following officers were elected: Moderator, Rev. Wallace Hayes, Ass't Moderator, Rev. George Ludwig; Clerk, W.B. Hughes; Treasurer, Mr. Henry Read. (The remaining part of the report may be read elsewhere in the minutes)

The following delegates to the State Association were elected from the floor: Mr. Ernest Swearns, Mrs. Ernest Swearns, Mrs. Harvey Hill, Mrs. Don Lamb, Mrs. Willard McCarroll, Alternate: Mrs. Roy Matlock. Motion made, second and carried that the Moderator be given power to replace any delegate that does not represent at the State Association.

Motion made, second and carried that Brother Don Lamb be charged with the responsibility of giving a report of the State Association to the Cumberland in 1971.

The final report of the Registration-Finance Committee was made and adopted.

Report of the Associational Treasurer was read and adopted.

Motion made, second and carried that the Association send \$50.00 to the Home for Children in Greeneville, Tenn.

The report of the committee appointed to study the feasibility of purchasing Hillmont Camp Grounds was read by Rev. John Gibbs. Motion made, second and carried to receive the report.

Motion made, second and carried that the Moderator appoint a committee to meet with the National C.T.S. Board to investigate the possibility of purchasing Hillmont Camp Grounds. The following were appointed: Rev. Stanley Outlaw, Rev. Richard Cordell and Rev. Jesse Webb.

Motion made, second and carried that the report of this committee be made to the churches by letter; and when the decision is made by the local church, it is to be signed by both pastor and clerk and returned to the chairman of the committee. The expense of this committee is to be borne by the association.

The moderator of the Presbytery appointed the following on the Examining Committee: Rev. Richard Cordell, Dr. James Davis, Rev. E.A. Craft, Rev. Wallace Hayes, and Rev. E.B. McDonald.

After several announcements were made a motion to adjourn was made, second and carried.

Rev. George Ludwig dismissed the session with prayer.

As far as we can determine, there was no binding agreement between the Cumberland Association and the Church Training Service Board as to the resale of Hillmont property.

We recommend that if the Cumberland Association is interested in buying back this property, that a committee be appointed to approach the present owner or the C.T.S. Board and investigate the possibility. If the Association is not interested in buying the property, we suggest that the matter be dropped.

CONSTITUTION

of the Presbytery

Of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists

ARTICLE I

Name

This organization shall be known as the Presbytery of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee.

ARTICLE II

Purpose

The purpose of this Presbytery shall be to examine and ordain ministers and to discipline its members. This Presbytery will ordain deacons at the request of the church in which they are to serve.

ARTICLE III

Membership

The membership of this Presbytery shall consist of all ordained ministers and deacons holding cards of standing in the Presbytery.

This Presbytery may invite visiting ministers and deacons to sit in council with it in any assembly thereof. Licensed ministers in good standing with a member church of this Association are associate members of the Presbytery with no voting privilege.

ARTICLE IV

Officers

The officers of this Presbytery shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk and treasurer, who shall be elected annually and shall serve until their successors are elected. It shall be the duty of the moderator to appoint all committees for the purpose of examining all applicants for ordination to the ministry and to make investigations that may be deemed necessary to the body.

ARTICLE V

Meetings

This Presbytery shall hold annual sessions at the close of the first day's session of the Cumberland Association. Called sessions may be held at the call of

the moderator, his assistant, or any five members of said Presbytery who deem it necessary. Eleven regular members shall constitute a quorum, which shall be required in all assemblies for the transaction of legal business.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of Presbytery by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

Ordination of ministers

This Presbytery shall have the power to examine and ordain applicants to the full work of the gospel ministry. Applicants must have carried a license for at least one year immediately preceeding their applications for ordination and have a call to pastor a church or be engaged in full-time Christian service of such nature as to merit ordination. Any exception for the requirements for carrying a license for one year must pass by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present.

ARTICLE II

Ratification of Credentials

Ministers who are transferring from other associations may have their credentials ratified upon examination by the examining committee and approval of the Presbytery. This approval will be subject to a favorable letter of recommendation from the applicant's former association or quarterly meeting or other ordaining bodies.

Ministers desiring to be received from other denominations will be required to take the same examination as new applicants.

ARTICLE III

Cards of Standing

This Presbytery shall issue annually cards of standing to ministers upon the presentation of a report in person (or in case of sickness or some other legitimate reason letters may be accepted). Annual cards of standing shall be issued to

deacons upon the presentation of a letter of recommendation from their local churches. A donation of \$2 is requested.

Any minister or deacon failing to hold a card of standing shall not have a voice in this Presbytery. Any minister having lost his standing may be reinstated in this Presbytery upon the presentation of his report, and who manifests a sincere interest in the work of the Lord.

Ministers who are retired or who have reached the age of retirement and have continued to manifest a sincere interest in the work of the Lord may be issued a lifetime card of standing which they may hold as long as they hold membership in this Presbytery or as long as their conduct is unquestionable.

Ministers who are members of churches in the Cumberland Association who do not have cards of standing do not have the approval of this body to present themselves in other Free Will Baptist meetings as a Free Will Baptist minister in good standing.

ARTICLE IV

Discipline and Withdrawal

This Presbytery shall have the power to try and withdraw fellowship from any member upon evidence of guilt of unchristian conduct; or, who is teaching or preaching heresy, or who has proved to be disloyal to the tenets of Faith as expressed in the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist, as held by the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee.

ARTICLE V

Donations

Each member of this Presbytery shall be asked to donate \$2 annually upon the presentation of his report. This fund is to be used for acquiring necessary equipment, the printing of such materials as cards of standing, certificates of ordination, constitution and by laws, stationery, minutes or meetings, and for defraying of necessary traveling and mailing expenses.

ARTICLE VI

Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Presbytery by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present.

Amended October 15, 1969

GUIDELINES FOR LICENSED MINISTERS IN THE CUMBERLAND ASSOCIATION

I. RULES PERTAINING TO THE LICENSED MINISTER

A. Qualifications for the Licensee

1. He must be a member of a church which belongs to the Cumberland Association.
2. He must give evidence to his church that he is divinely called to preach, whereupon the local church is authorized to examine him for license. This examination should include the areas of the candidate's life, doctrine, reputation, and his convictions and abilities regarding the work of the ministry. His present and prospective educational and professional qualifications should also be considered. Upon completion of such an examination, the local church shall determine whether or not to grant license. The ministerial license shall be valid for a period of one year but is renewable annually.
3. He must have his license renewed annually by said church and kept in force until ordination.

B. The Activities of the Licensee

1. According to the general practices of Free Will Baptists, a licensed minister is urged to afford himself of every opportunity to preach the Word. He is free to exercise all the privileges and responsibilities of an ordained minister with the exception of pastoring a church and officiating at the observances of the ordinances and weddings.
2. The licensee should consider the years between his receiving license and being ordained as years of study and training in preparation for his calling.

C. His Relationship to the Presbytery

1. The clerk of the church should report the names of licensed ministers to the clerk of the Presbytery who will forward a copy of these guidelines to each licensee.
2. Licensed ministers will be eligible to hold associate membership in the Presbytery.

II. SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARATION FOR ORDINATION

A. Attend Free Will Baptist Bible College if possible

B. Seek the counsel of an experienced pastor or pastors.

C. Make as thorough a study as possible of the following:

1. The Holy Bible
2. Systematic Theology
3. Homiletics
4. Pastoral Theology and Church Administration
5. Evangelism
6. Church History (especially, F.W.B. history)

III. A SUGGESTED SCHEDULE OF WORK LEADING TO ORDINATION

- A. As soon as licensee feels that he is qualified to become a candidate for ordination, he should request a list of study questions from the Examining Committee of the Presbytery. We would strongly encourage him to proceed with his examination before entertaining a call to a church.
- B. At least two months before the Examining Committee meets, he should secure the examination. He should make five copies of the completed examination (one for each member of the Committee), and send them to the Examining Committee no later than two weeks before its meeting.

(Alternate)

The Candidate will be given a written examination based on some of the study questions in the presence of one or more of the Committee members.

- C. The Candidate is required to pass an oral examination administered by the Committee.
- D. The Committee will report to the candidate on whether he passed or what areas he may need additional study in.
- E. When the approved candidate has passed the examination and has received a call to a church or is engaged in some other form of Christian service that would justify his being ordained, the Committee will recommend his ordination to the Presbytery. This recommendation will usually be made only after the candidate has been licensed for one full year.
