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**GOVERNMENT AND CONSTITUTION
CUMBERLAND ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS**

ARTICLE 1. Each church in this Association shall be entitled to one delegate for the first 50 members or fraction thereof, and an additional delegate for each additional 50 members or fraction thereof. Each delegate shall be entitled to cast one vote on all business transactions.

ARTICLE 2. Each member church of the Association shall send a letter to each annual meeting, giving members received during year, enrollment, members dismissed, name and address of pastor and other officers, and financial statement of receipts and disbursements, according to the form provided by the clerk of the Association.

ARTICLE 3. This Association, when convened, shall be governed by a regular and proper code of rules which they are authorized to establish for themselves.

ARTICLE 4. They may elect a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer from among themselves, and they may hold their offices until their successors are elected.

ARTICLE 5. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association except when withdrawn by consent.

ARTICLE 6. New churches shall petition the quarterly meeting for membership. The quarterly meetings shall have power to receive new churches as members, and in turn shall recommend them to the annual Association.

ARTICLE 7. This Association shall furnish each church with minutes of their proceedings, in proportion to the amount of money sent by each church; in order to enable the Association to print their minutes it is expected that each church will send such sums of money as they think proper, and when the money is received, it shall be placed in the hands of a trustee appointed for that purpose, and may be disbursed by order of the Association.

ARTICLE 8. For the purpose of ordaining ministers of the gospel and for trying all ordained members for un-Christian conduct, there shall be a Presbytery, which shall convene at the close of the session on the first day of the Association and at any time during the associational year, if called by the Moderator or his assistants or any five members of said Presbytery who deem it necessary to make such a call. The Presbytery shall consist of ordained members present, and they shall elect a Moderator and clerk from among themselves for the time being, who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected. It shall be the duty of said Presbytery to examine all applications for ordination sent with recommendations from their churches composing this Association, and if found competent, to ordain and set them apart for the work by laying on of hands. The Presbytery shall have full power to try all ordained members for un-Christian conduct, and on testimony their decision shall be final.

ARTICLE 9. It shall be the duty of each minister who shall organize a church to ordain deacons for the same. It is his duty, also, to ordain deacons where a vacancy occurs within his charge. It shall be the duty of each pastor to encourage the organization and support of the Sunday school in the church or churches where he

is pastor, as well as other organizations that may prove helpful to the work of the church.

ARTICLE 10. No person shall be ordained to the ministry nor shall the credentials of any minister be ratified until he is qualified to meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Timothy. The term "the husband of one wife" means he shall not have more than one living wife (that is, he shall not be married to one wife at the present time and there be a wife still living from a previous marriage). This shall be tested by the Presbytery. The Presbytery shall have full power to propound such Spiritual questions as they consider necessary to determine his qualifications. All candidates for ordination shall be required to answer these questions satisfactorily.

ARTICLE 11. This Association may exclude from its body any minister who teaches heresy, or any church that countenances him in said teaching or that may be disloyal to the tenets of Faith as held by this Association and expressed in our Articles of Faith.

ARTICLE 12. All questions coming before this Association shall be determined by a majority vote, except exclusion of churches which shall require two-thirds majority.

ARTICLE 13. Representatives from five churches shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and no business shall be transacted without a quorum.

ARTICLE 14. The minutes of this Association shall be read before the body, corrected if need be, signed by the Moderator and Clerk.

ARTICLE 15. This Association may adjourn to meet with any church that is a regular member of it at any time it deems proper.

ARTICLE 16. Amendments may be made to this form of government at any time by a majority of the members present composing the Association, voting in behalf of the amendment.

ARTICLE 17. When this Association shall have convened, it is the privilege of all ordained members belonging to the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists to sit in council with us, and to propose resolutions coming before the body as though they were delegates from the church.

ARTICLE 18. This Association, having jurisdiction over all the churches within its bounds, shall discipline any church which calls a minister for a pastor who has been excluded by the Presbytery.

BOARDS

ARTICLE 1. All standing boards shall be composed of three members, except the Home Mission Board and Board of Retirement and Insurance which shall be composed of five members, and the Executive Board and the Youth Camp Board which shall be composed of seven members.

The personnel of each of the foregoing boards, exclusive of the Executive,

Home Mission, Retirement and Insurance and Youth Camp Board shall be elected as follows: the first named for a period of one year, the second named for a period of two years, and the third named for a period of three years. Succession of office thereafter shall be determined as order requires. The Home Mission Board, and Retirement and Insurance, shall be elected on a rotation basis with one member being elected each year for a five-year term. The Youth Camp Board shall be elected on a rotation basis with one member being elected each year for a seven-year term.

ARTICLE 2. The personnel of the Executive Board shall be composed of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, and the moderators of each quarterly meeting.

ARTICLE 3. The Executive Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the Cumberland Association from one regular session to another, and shall have power to elect such officers as may be necessary for its own government, and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the Association. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of the Association.

ARTICLE 4. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operations in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary and as may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of the Association.

RULES AND DECORUM

This Association shall be opened by singing and prayer. Only one person may speak at a time. All addresses made by the members shall be made to the Moderator, and the person thus speaking shall strictly confine himself to the subject in debate. No speaker shall cast any personal reflection toward any member of this body who has spoken previously.

No person shall be allowed to speak more than three times on any one subject without the permission of a majority of the Association.

The speaker shall not be interrupted during his speech by anyone except the Moderator unless he violates the rules of order.

No member shall absent himself without permission from the Association. Members shall use the word "Brother" or "Brethren" in all debates.

No member shall speak longer than fifteen minutes at any time without permission from the Moderator.

Any member who shall willfully and knowingly violate any of these rules shall be reported by the Moderator and shall be subject to the censure of the Association.

Adopted in Council this Saturday before the first Lord's Day in October, 1867, as a standing decorum, though subject to revision by a majority of members voting for revision.

PROCEEDINGS

The one hundred twenty-ninth session of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists of Tennessee convened at Bethlehem Free Will Baptist Church, Ashland City, Tenn. on Wednesday October 11, 1972 at 9:30 A.M.

The session opened with the congregation singing "He Keeps Me Singing" led by Rev. Fred Hall with Mrs. Jane Bradley at the organ.

Rev. Larry Hughes gave the devotions. He read from 1 Cor. 9:16-17 and pointed out that we are commanded to "Preach the Word." God has called us to preach it and we are to be stewards of the Gospel. It should be preached to sinners for salvation and to the saints for their edification.

The welcome was given by Rev. Hughes Ellis, pastor of the host church and the response was by Rev. David Hicks.

The clerk called the session to order and introduced the moderator, Rev. Eugene Waddell. After some brief remarks he welcomed the visitors and seated the delegates. The Committee on Committees was appointed as follows: Rev. David Hicks, Rev. John Gibbs, Mr. Samuel Johnson.

The report of Free Will Baptist Bible College was given by Dr. L. C. Johnson and Rev. Jack Paramore. Brother Ray Turnage gave the report of the Free Will Baptist Home for Children. Motion made, second and carried to receive the reports as information.

The moderator declared a recess. Rev. Lonnie Ricketts led the prayer.

WORSHIP SERVICE

The morning worship service began with the congregation singing "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart," and "O Happy Day" led by Rev. Fred Hall. An offering of \$120.90 was received. After Rev. Fred Hall had sung "I Believe In Miracles," Rev. Don Lamb brought the morning Message. He used the first six chapters of Acts for his Scripture and pointed out that two things characterized the early church: Power and Preaching. At first the number of disciples was being added to and then the number began to multiply.

The host pastor made announcements concerning the noon meal and dismissed in prayer.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session opened with the congregation singing "I Am Resolved" and "Whosoever Will." The moderator read a letter from the Western the division of the Stone Association and recognized the fraternal delegates. Rev. Jack Taylor and Rev. Burdett Randolph were present. Rev. Eugene Waddell brought the moderator's message. He read from 1 Thess. 1:2-4 and emphasized the fact that we are to serve God because we love Him.

The report of the Executive Committee was read and adopted. The following were appointed as a committee to study the financial structure of the Cumberland Association: Rev. George C. Lee, Jr. Rev. Robert Crawford, and Miss Rebecca Stewart. The report of the Committee on Committees was read and adopted.

The report of the Western Quarterly meeting was read by Rev. Larry Hughes and the Northern Quarterly Meeting by Rev. Jesse Webb. The reports were received. The report of the Board of Retirement and Insurance was made by Rev. C. A. Craft

and adopted. Rev. Bill Van Winkle gave a brief but glowing report on the work at Murfreesboro. The following reports were made and adopted: State Association, Rev. Richard Cordell, Foreign Missions, Rev. Richard Cordell; partial report of registration committee, Mrs. Elsie Price.

Miscellaneous business was called for. Motion made, second and carried for the moderator to appoint a delegation to the Stone Association which meets October 13-14.

Motion made, second and carried to adjourn until Thursday morning at 9:30.

THURSDAY MORNING

The Thursday morning session opened with the congregation singing "One Day" led by Mr. Henry Read with Mrs. Jane Bradley at the organ. Prayer was by Rev. Don Dungan. After Mr. Read had led the congregation in singing "Heavenly Sunlight," Rev. George C. Lee, Jr. gave the devotions. He read Matt. 26:34 and Luke 22:54-62 and spoke on the subject "The Gospel Rooster. He pointed out that 1. The Rooster did what he could, 2. His job was not highly esteemed. 3. He was not ashamed. 4. He was faithful. 5. His job was not popular. 6. He Never got discouraged. 7. He did his job well.

Rev. Eugene Waddell, moderator of the association, seated the delegates and welcomed the visitors.

The following substitutes were made on committees: Obituary Committee, Mrs. Guy Hampton to replace Mrs. Earline Hayes. Temperance Committee, Mrs. Myrtle Parrish to replace Rev. George C. Lee, Jr. and Rev. Don Dungan to replace Rev. H. C. Beasley. Study Committee Rev. Robert Crawford to replace Rev. Jerry Williams. Rev. Ken Riggs to replace Miss Rebecca Stewart.

The report of the Presbytery was read by Rev. George Ludwig and adopted. Reports of the following boards were read and adopted: Education and Literature, Rev. Roger Reeds, Home Missions, Rev. David Hicks, Camp Board, Rev. Wallace Hayes. Report of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention was read by Mrs. Don Lamb and adopted. Rev. Bill Van Winkle gave the report of the Southern Quarterly meeting and it was adopted. The report of the National Association was made by Rev. Bob L. Jones and adopted.

The following were appointed as fraternal delegates to the Stone Association: Rev. Richard Cordell, Rev. George Ludwig, Rev. Don Lamb, Rev. Carson Whitaker, Rev. J. L. Welch.

The Moderator opened the floor for nominations for delegates to the Tennessee State Association. The following were nominated and elected. Mrs. Rosa Dickey, Mr. Steve Ange, Mr. Don Johnson, Mrs. Mary Luna, Mrs. Tobie Hudgins.

Motion made, second and carried that the moderator appoint messengers to the Tennessee State Association when convened at Cofer's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, November 13-15, 1972, and the National Association of Free Will Baptists when convened at Macon, Ga. July 9-12, 1973. The following were appointed: State: Rev. John Gibbs, National, Mr. J. E. Frazier. After announcements were made, the moderator dismissed for recess.

MORNING WORSHIP SERVICE

The morning worship service began with the congregation singing "Footsteps

of Jesus" led by Rev. Fred Hall. Prayer was by Rev. Billy Hanna. After the congregation had sung "In the Sweet By and By" an offering of \$61.98 was received. For the special music, Rev. Fred Hall sang "Why Should He Love Me So?" Rev. J. L. Welch brought the morning message. He read from Rom. 1:14-16 and asked the ministers to give a reappraisal of their ministry. Why do we want to preach? Paul said, "I am debtor" to people. To the wise and unwise to the Greek and Barbarian. Paul further stated, "I am ready" to preach the Gospel to you who are at Rome, and "I am not ashamed." He pointed out that in some instances we have been afraid to preach the Gospel, afraid it won't work. Should not be ashamed because it is the power of God to deliver from the power of death.

Why should we feel in debt? Because Christ has done so much for us that He has put us in debt to others. We owe the people of this world a debt to give them the Gospel.

After announcements about the noon meal was made, Bro. Roy Jensen dismissed in Prayer.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The Thursday afternoon session began with the congregation singing "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story" led by Rev. Ken Riggs. Rev. Albert Halbrook gave the devotions. He read from Hebrews 2:1-4 and pointed out God's salvation is a great salvation, it is a common salvation and it is a present salvation. He concluded with prayer.

The Obituary Committee report was made by Rev. C. A. Craft and adopted. The moderator called for a moment of silent prayer in honor of those who have gone to be with the Lord.

The report of the Petitions and Requests Committee was read by Rev. George Ludwig and adopted. Rev. Bill Van Winkle read the report of the Resolutions Committee and it was adopted. The report of the Nominations Committee was read by Rev. Wallace Hayes. Motion made, second and carried to consider each nominee separately. All of those who were nominated were elected. The report of the Registration and Finance Committee was read and adopted. Rev. Don Lamb read the report of the Temperance Committee. Motion made, second and carried to adopt the report and to retain the committee throughout the coming year at their request.

The report of the committee appointed to study the financial structure of the Cumberland Association was made and by motion adopted.

A motion was made, second and carried that beginning in 1973 each church failing to report for two (2) consecutive years, provided the churches have been contacted by the associational clerk, shall be dropped from the associational roll. For these churches to be reinstated they must appear before the Petitions and Requests Committee.

Motion made, second and carried to accept the invitation from the Rock Springs Free Will Baptist Church for the 1973 session.

Rev. E. B. McDonald, Moderator of the presbytery, named the following on the Examining Committee: Wallace Hayes, Chairman, E. A. Craft, George Ludwig, John Gibbs, Terry Boyd.

Motion made, second and carried to adjourn.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The Executive Board of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists met in the conference room at the Headquarters Building, Nashville, Tennessee, June 21, 1972, Board Members present were: Rev. Eugene Waddell, Moderator, Rev. John Gibbs, Rev. Bob L. Jones, Rev. Larry Hughes, and Rev. W. B. Hughes.

Rev. Waddell gave the devotions and Rev. Bob Jones led in prayer. Brother Waddell stated the purpose of the called meeting was to discuss the increase in fees to the State Association and to prepare the program for the coming session of the Cumberland Association.

The clerk was asked to make a statement concerning the change in fees to the state association. The statement is as follows: "At the last session of the Tennessee State Association of Free Will Baptists in Jackson, Tennessee, November 15-17, 1971 a recommendation by the Executive Board to change the fees for local associations from \$10 plus an additional \$2 for each church to \$10 plus an additional \$5 per church comprising the association was passed." Since the Cumberland Association had made no provisions for such an increase in fees the following motion was made, second and carried:

. That each quarterly meeting be asked to send \$3 per church belonging to that quarterly meeting.

To avoid such emergencies in the future the following resolution was passed:

Whereas, the Tennessee State Association has raised the fees for each local association to \$10 plus \$5 for each church comprising that association; and

Whereas, the present fees are inadequate to take care of this increase; therefore be it

Resolved, that the Cumberland Association reconsider its method of securing funds for the expense of the association.

TEMPERANCE

We, the Temperance Committee, submit the following report:

1 Cor. 9:25 "And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things."

I. Dirty Literature or Pornography

We recommend that the Cumberland Association go on record as being opposed to the sale and distribution of pornographic materials. We also recommend that each church take a strong stand against "smut" both from the pulpit and the pew. We further appeal to the members of this body as individuals to strongly urge business establishments to discontinue sale of such materials.

II. Drink or Alcoholic Beverages

Since the church covenant so states, and since the Word of God reminds us that "Strong drink is raging", and since alcohol is medically known to damage the body "which is the temple of the Holy Spirit," we urge that members of our churches in no way sanction the use or sale of alcoholic beverages. We also urge in connection with this that we refrain from patronizing business establishments which traffic in same.

III. Dress or Modesty

Realizing that the Word of God teaches modesty in dress, we urge that all pastors, parents and teachers in particular and all Christians in general commit ourselves anew to the Biblical standard of modesty. Since the fashions of the world are drastically and immodestly changing, we urge that our pastors keep the principles of Biblical modesty before our people at all times.

IV. Drugs

Since the "drug scene" has found its way in the smaller rural areas and even into elementary education today, we recommend that our pastors, parents and Sunday school teachers acquaint themselves with the drug problem, and inform our youth against the tremendous dangers of using drugs.

V. Demonism or Satan Worship

Having been made aware of the tremendous impact that Satan worship is having with the youth of the world today, we recommend that all churches take a strong stand against such gross sin.

VI. Church Rock or Gospel Rock Music:

Having been informed by authorities that "gospel rock" is being accepted by fundamental churches and opposed by liberal churches, we recommend that all pastors and church music directors exercise extreme caution in this area.

In addition we recommend that we go on record as opposing the above mentioned things and that practical steps be taken against any and/or all of them.

Such as:

1. Writing to legislators, state representatives and the governor official letters from the individual churches.

2. Communications be sent to various authorities to inform them of our support and encourage them to take strong measures.

3. Being informed. Information can be had by contacting this committee who in turn will put forth every effort to stay informed and have materials available such as UTL, Books, lists of representatives, etc.

We recommend that this committee be allowed to continue in order to prepare a listing of resource materials that will enable our churches and pastors to more effectively fight these evils thereby bringing glory and honor to Christ's church today.
