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MINUTES

The Fourth Annual Sunday School Convention of the Free Will Baptist of the Cumberland Association met with Cofers Chapel, Nashville, Tenn., on May 31st, 1931.

Devotional Service, 10:00 A.M.: Opening hymn 131, "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name." Prayer by Rev. W. J. Paul of Columbia, Tenn. Hymn No. 17, title, "In the Garden."

A word of welcome to the ministers present by the President.

Welcome address by Brother C. E. Devers.

Response by Brother G. W. Fambrough.

The Convention was called to order by the President. Roll call and quorum present.

Reading of letters of the various schools as follows: Ashland City, Beech Grove, Bethel, Bethlehem, Cochran School, Cofers Chapel, East Nashville, Gorman, Heads, Mt. Zion, Miller's Chapel, Rock Springs, Royal Chapel and West Nashville.

Brother J. B. Reding gave an oral report of Olivet Sunday School, saying that they had a very good school, not a large attendance, but interest good.

Brother W. H. Stinson from Craigfield Sunday School gave an oral report of Craigfield. He reported a fine school, on roll about 60, and good attendance. Glad to hear from Craigfield.

Brother J. E. Felts reported a good school at New Hope. Reports called for.

The Treasurer's Report read and adopted.

Nominating Committee: There were two members of this committee absent, and a motion was made and carried that the chair appoint two to fill the places of Brother L. A. Hollis and Brother Scott Nicholson on this committee. The following were appointed: Brother Louis Hyle of Columbia, Tenn., and Brother P. E. Hagewood of Ashland City, Tenn. This committee to report in the afternoon.

The Vice-President of the Sunday School Convention read the Constitution of the Sunday School Convention.

Motion was made and carried to change wording in the letter to the Convention. Where it says "Number of daily Bible readers," make it "Average daily Bible readers. That means three hundred and sixty-five days a year.

The Convention welcomed the various denominations

present with us today by asking them to stand as their denomination was called.

The Training Class of Cofers Chapel which is studying the book "Training for Service" put on a demonstration of a training class.

Adjourned for lunch.

Brother L. A. Hollis came over from Beech Grove Sunday School and brought good news from his school. He also was a booster for the Convention. Remember what he said? His school had grown stronger since becoming a member of the Convention.

Brother Stewart of Bethel Sunday School said they had a good school and good attendance at Bethel.

Brother P. E. Hagewood of Ashland City spoke of their school. He said their school was progressing nicely and that they had a good school.

Miss Edna Sanders of Bethlehem was a booster for Bethlehem Sunday School. She spoke of the good attendance and the Home Department, stating they had a large attendance at the Sunday School Day Program.

✓ Rev. Oscar Davis of Cofers Chapel was also a booster for Cofers Chapel. He said they had one of the best schools, graded school, sixteen classes, Home Department, a Cradle Roll with thirty-nine on roll.

Brother Bud Simmons of Cochran School stated that the Sunday School was organized in 1926 with only 19 members. The school now has 68 on roll with good attendance.

The Convention repeated the Sunday School Motto:

Afternoon Session

Brother J. B. Parsons, Superintendent of East Nashville Sunday School, spoke of the increase in the membership in his school, and told of the new church and the fourteen rooms they now have.

Brother J. F. Gower and Brother Strange of Heads told us of the working condition of their school and stated they had organized a new class in their school.

Brother McCarroll spoke of the loyal members of their school at Heads and urged our people to be loyal to their schools.

Brother N. W. Walker, Superintendent of Mt. Zion Sunday School, said they had a real Sunday School at Mt. Zion. Average attendance 80, with good interest.

Brother C. G. Binkley, Superintendent of Oaklawn Sunday School, said his school had been on a decrease, but he was praying that it would grow, and that Oaklawn would have as good a school as we have in the Convention.

Brother M. F. Patterson, Superintendent of Rock Springs Sunday School, said that they had a real good school at Rock Springs, and were planning to build new class rooms to their church building. He said they were having good co-operation; that's a fine report.

Brother Carlos Craft, Superintendent of West Nashville Sunday School, stated that their school was doing fine, extra well, good attendance, and last Sunday they had 151 present. Brother Craft expressed the need of class rooms in his school.

Address by the President, "Plans for Improving the Free Will Baptist Sunday Schools for 1931."

Rev. Oscar Davis said the teachers were a vital factor in developing the Sunday School work.

Brother J. B. Reding, Superintendent of Olivet Sunday School, said they had five denominations in their school, that they did not have such a large school, but they had good interest.

Brother G. W. Fambrough, Vice-President, brought an

interesting message. He said that Bethel had the best school in the Convention. Say, that is a good way to feel about your school.

Brother G. T. Harris challenged the men to get busy and do something. He offered from \$25.00 to \$100.00 to the first church that he heard of that was building class rooms outside of the Ladies' Aid Society.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CUMBERLAND SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION

PREAMBLE—In order to bring about cooperation and unity of effort between the Sunday Schools of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptists, we, a representative body of said Sunday Schools, do hereby organize the Free Will Baptist Sunday School Convention of the Cumberland Association and adopt the following constitution for the proper government of the same.

ART. 1.—MEMBERSHIP. Any Sunday School organized within the bounds of the Cumberland Association may become a member of this Convention, and shall be represented in its meeting by its Superintendent and one delegate selected by the school and all teachers and executive officers of local Sunday Schools and pastors of churches attending the Convention shall be affiliated members, with the right to take part in discussions and vote on the election of its officers only.

ART. 2.—MEETINGS. The Convention shall meet in regular session semi-annual as such time and place as may be decided upon by the Executive Council.

ART. 3.—OFFICERS. The following officers shall be elected annually by vote of the Convention after being nominated by the Nominating Committee, and shall perform the usual duties of said officers at the will of the Convention.

A President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. No person shall be eligible for election as President of this convention unless he has had experience as a Sunday School Superintendent, or in some line of executive Sunday School work.

ART. 4.—BOARDS AND COMMITTEES. An Executive Council composed of the President, the Secretary and three members to be elected by the Convention, who shall arrange

for the meetings of the Convention, attend to any business that may come up between sessions, and assist the local Sunday Schools in solving their problems.

2. Special committees may be appointed at any time at the discretion of the convention.

ART. 5.—GENERAL ACTIVITIES. It shall be the duty of the Executive Council to conduct institutes, rallies and mass meetings in the interest of the work of the Convention, as conditions may permit, and the council shall have the power to secure any help necessary to the same.

ART. 6.—FINANCES. Each Sunday School holding membership in this organization shall be required to pay to the Treasurer of the Convention annually the sum of \$2.50, and shall bear their apportionate part of the expense of any special work that may be undertaken by the Convention.

ART. 7.—REPORTS. Each School shall be required to make annual reports to the Convention on blanks to be furnished.

ART. 8.—DECISIONS. All questions coming before the Convention and all elections shall be decided by the majority.

ART. 9.—SPECIAL LIMITS. No person shall speak on one subject more than fifteen minutes nor more than three times except by the permission of the President.

ART. 10.—AMENDMENTS. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the convention by a majority vote of all who are entitled to vote for officers.
