PROCEEDINGS

The Twenty-fourth Annual Session of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention of the Free Will Baptist of the Cumberland Association of Tennessee was called to order by the president, Mrs. George Van Hook, on Wednesday, August 23rd, 1944, at Ashland City Free Will Baptist Church in Ashland City, Tennessee.

Devotional: "He Touched Their Eyes," by Mrs. Damon Dodd. Scripture: Matt. 9:29. Mrs. Dodd closed her remarks with a beautiful poem composed by Rev. Damon Dodd.

Welcome Address: Mrs. J. R. Davidson.

Recognition and Enrollment of Societies: Ashland City, Bethel, Bethlehem, East Nashville, Good Springs, New Hope, Olivet, West Nashville.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that due to transportation at the present that the business of the Convention be completed in one day if possible and if so that the session not be held on Thursday.

Fellowship Greetings were presented to the Convention by the president from Mrs. Eunice Edwards, president of Woman's National Auxiliary Convention who was unable to attend our Convention on account of a meeting being held in Missouri at this time. And also greetings from Mrs. Henry Melvin, third vice-president of this District Convention, who has gone back to North Carolina to make her home.

Report of Field Worker, Mrs. Fannie Polston. Mrs. Polston gave a verbal report saying that she had done very little on account of gas and tires. Had attended a few meetings and had encouraged the various auxiliaries through correspondence. She also reported no new auxiliaries organized this year.

Rev. Paul Woolsey gave the following oral report from the Orphanage: Amount of money given through the Cumberland Association from August of last year until this August was \$1,831.54 and also \$230.00 toward Trula Gunter's expenses for Bible College. Rev. Woolsey reported approximately \$124.00 for clothes and that approximately \$2,500 had been given by Cumberland Association toward all funds during the year. He also reported that the Orphanage had \$2,275 in War Bonds. Rev. Woolsey stated that the Orphanage would need \$10,000 above running expenses for next year. He reported 26 boys and girls now in the Orphanage and that three had been adopted during the year for clothing by the Cumberland District; Mr. and Mrs. E. D. Parker one, Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Dever one and the West Nashville Auxiliary one. He also said that there were only two children that had not been adopted for clothing. He thanked each and every one in the Cumberland Association for everything that had been done for the Orphanage.

The Convention was happy to have two of the girls from the Orphanage present.

Mrs. Fannie Polston presented to our Convention the Plan of Work that was presented to the National Convention this year, "The Free Will Baptist Fifty Thousand Co-Laborer Band," and challenged for 100% co-operation with this program. Mrs. Polston asked that 50,000 Free Will Baptists give \$1.00 this year. She suggested that each delegate and president take the leaflets back to their churches and distribute them among the members of the church and consult the pastor and solicit his co-operation with the plan.

Address—"The Task for Ye Saints of the Lord." Rev. Damon Dodd. Scripture: Acts. 1:8. Rev. Dodd delivered a most impressive message and urged that we answer the smallest call to serve and that we accept the task at hand. The crying need for every Free Will Baptist is a tarrying at Jerusalem, a good consecration service and a good season of prayer. We need to develop a genuine LOVE for all men everywhere. We must love the brethren before we can serve. There is work to be done at home that we're leaving undone.

The Lord intended that we serve in Jerusalem and the remotest parts of the earth at one and the same time. Do not neglect one to do the other. Rev. Dodd urged that we study the scriptures, it being essential that we know the word of God. Be sure that we know Christ personally and well. In order to keep a good acquaintance with Him we must serve Him continually, go with Him.

Do the task, Serve for the glory there is in it. Serve God determinedly. Serve Him with a zeal heretofore never known.

Motion was made and carried that the meeting adjourn to meet with East Nashville Free Will Baptist Church on Wednesday and Thursday before the fourth Sunday in August, 1945.

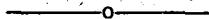

(4) That in wrestling with our own local problems and obligations, we do not forget that the work in the lands beyond the sea is as much our responsibility and our obligation as the work in our churches.

(5) That we urge all our people to pray earnestly and regularly for all our missionaries on the field and for all our denominational leaders, that God may guide them and bless all their efforts done in His name.

(6) That each Auxiliary only enroll for members those who are not on Auxiliary Organization rolls in other churches.

(7) That the "Honor Page" be put back in the minutes.
