PROCEEDINGS

Resolutions Committee report was read. Each resolution was read separately, voted on, and approved as read.

Report of the Nominating Committee was accepted as read.

Work Shops for the coming year will be held at Bethlehem and Oaklawn.

The Auxiliary voted to hold our district convention at Eash Nashville next August.

A beautiful installation service, "A Garden," was presided over by Mrs. Richard Parham. Using a tape recorder, she challenged each new officer to fulfill her individual duties so that the completed, united work would be as a beautiful garden. A flannel board was used to portray this. Each officer put her part on the board and the final result was a lovely garden scene.

The new president, Mrs. L. D. Miley, took charge of the meeting and committed herself anew to the Lord and to the convention, so that great things will be accomplished in the coming year.
