Be it Resolved:

1. That the Cumberland District Convention set four quarterly workshop dates on its calendar of activities for ensuing year, dates to be the last Saturday of the months of January, April, July, and October, and using the themes and program outlines suggested by the National Convention.
2. That local chairmen be prepared to present quarterly reports to these Workshops.
3. That a study course on the new Manual of Methods be conducted as soon as possible in our local Auxiliaries.
4. That the Cumberland District Convention sponsor essay contests among our YPA and GTA's, using the subject suggested by the National Convention, "The Worth of a Family Altar," and that the best ones be read at our April Workshop.
5. That the judges for this contest be composed of the youth chairman, stewardship-prayer chairman, and a pastor selected by these two officers.

6. Whereas it has been several years since we adopted our present Constitution and By-Laws, and since there have been some changes in our plan of work, be it resolved that our Constitution and By-Laws be revised to correspond with the new Manual of Methods, and that a revision committee composed of three members, be elected at this session.
7. That this convention give a standing vote of thanks to East Nashville Church for its generous hospitality.
8. That, as an expression of this body's interest in and sympathy for Oaklawn Church, a love offering be taken during this session and sent immediately to the Oaklawn Church treasurer.
9. - e. 16 mm Movie Camera and Kodak, Tripod lens, film. To make films for National Foreign Mission Film Library, etc.
5. That each Auxiliary send her offering to the District Treasurer and she be chairman of this project.
6. That this Convention allocate \$25.00 to the treasury of the "C.Y.A." for incidental expenses.
7. That a love offering of \$25.00 be presented Mr. & Mrs. Miley for their untiring services.
