Proceedings of the 66th Annual Session
of the
Cumberland District Free Will Baptist
Woman's Auxiliary Convention

The 66th Annual Convention of the Cumberland District Woman's Auxiliary convened August 9, 1986 at Fellowship Free Will Baptist Church. The theme for the convention was "God's Wonders for Tomorrow." The scripture text was Joshua 3:5.

The session was opened with the congregation singing "I Am Thine, O Lord," led by Janis Williams with Becky Williams accompanying.

Sue Larson, president of Fellowship Auxiliary, welcomed the CDWA. Rose Tidwell responded and led in prayer.

The Fellowship Trio (Sue Larson, Dee Kingsmill, and Janis Williams) sang "Why Should I Worry or Fret."

CDWA President, Carolyn Lane, introduced our devotional speaker, Lynette Morgan, missionary to Ivory Coast. She spoke of the numerous wonders of man that had come to pass in Ivory Coast in the past 25 years. But, compared to God's wonders they are insignificant. Our missionaries now live and work in much improved facilities and so many have believed. Like the people in Joshua 3:5, God requires His people to be sanctified today in order to see His wonders. As God works His wonders, Satan will also work. She used II Chronicles 7:14 ("If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.") to challenge the women to commit themselves to God's work and to cleanse their lives from sin and wrong attitudes in order to be used.

Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart shared highlights of the WNAC held in Tulsa, Oklahoma. There were 1,008 women registered. Sherwood and Vada Lee, missionaries to Ivory Coast, were the devotional and eleven o'clock speakers.

For the first time WNAC delegates adopted a national project--\$50,000 loan fund to be raised over the next five years in honor of Eunice Edwards. The fund will be used to establish churches abroad.

Dr. Wisehart reported that computers had been purchased for the WNAC office. She also reported that Yvonne Wolfenbarger has been hired as WNAC office manager. She reported that Co-Laborer magazine will be a bi-monthly format starting in January, 1987. There are also new booklets, manuals and poetry books now available.

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Dr. Wisehart ended her report by stating that 147 women from 23 states and two foreign countries submitted 402 entries to the Creative Arts Contest. Three Tennessee women were winners in the contest. They included first place winner Gladys Gragg, Nashville (needlework); second place winner Vicki Carmon, Greeneville (plastic craft); fourth place winner Anita Haney, Knoxville (programs).

Carolyn Lane gave the TWAC report, stating that the TWAC will be November 11, 1986 at First Free Will Baptist Church, Oak Ridge, Tennessee. Glenn Poston, home missionary to Memphis, Tennessee will be the speaker. She also reminded us of the 1987 fall retreat at Smoky Shadows in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee.

In the absence of Clara Picirilli, Peggy Outland called roll by asking each auxiliary present to say something descriptive about their auxiliary.

The morning worship service began with the congregation singing "My Savior's Love" and the receiving of the offering. The Fellowship Free Will Baptist Women's Trio (Janis Williams, Sue Larson, Dee Kingsmill) sang "For I Shall See Him."

Missionary speaker Clint Morgan began his message by recognizing the women for their labors of love and prayers. He made a special announcement and requested prayer for the new Bible Institute in the Ivory Coast.

Using the Children of Israel in Joshua 3:1-5 as an example, missionary Morgan emphasized the necessity of sanctification in order to prepare for God's wonders. God's timing and knowledge of the fact of God's promise to do wonders are essential ingredients in doing God's work.

The afternoon session began with the congregation singing "All The Way My Saviour Leads Me." Charlotte McClelland led in prayer.

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Mrs. Lari Harrison directed a very meaningful memorial service to honor CDWA members who have gone on to be with the Lord during this past year. Those whose memories were honored were: Bobbie Edwards (Olivet), Nettie Gower (West End), Ruby Caldwell (West End), Ruth Moon (West End), Thelma Nicholson (Good Springs), Nannie Williams (Ashland City), Laura Boyd (Shady Grove).

The business session was called to order by President Carolyn Lane.

Old Business:

Treasurer's report was given by Esterlene Barnett. There were 454 active members (representing 31 auxiliaries) who paid representation fees. MSC to accept the treasurer's report.

The secretary's report was given by Sue Larson in place of Anne Worthington. Twenty-six auxiliaries reported, with a gain of 44 members and a loss of 25 members. Enrollment at the beginning of the year 505. The present enrollment is 454.

CDWA FALL WORKSHOP MINUTES

"God's Wonders For Tomorrow" was the theme of the CDWA Fall Workshop held at Donelson Free Will Baptist Church on October 26, 1985. The scripture was Joshua 3:5.

The session began at 9:30 a.m. with the congregation singing "Love Divine" led by Robin Williams. Teresa Snow accompanied on the piano. Agnes Frazier presented the opening prayer after which Jane Atchison, president of Donelson Woman's Auxiliary, welcomed everyone. Carolyn Lane, president of the CDWA, responded and then presented a devotional on God's promises using 2 Peter 1:4 and John 14:1-3 as the scripture texts. She then introduced the workshop theme emphasizing the three main subjects: "God's Leaders for Tomorrow," "God's Leaders for Today," and "God's Longing for Today and Tomorrow." The Donelson Trio, Jane Atchison, Lori Tallent, Robin Williams, sang "Send the Light."

Fifty women gathered to hear from "God's Leaders for Tomorrow" as the Olivet Free Will Baptist Church Actionettes told the history of actionettes and shared what their group does. Their meetings are conducted the same as auxiliary meetings.

The Donelson Trio sang "Lean on Me" as the offering was received. Recessed at 10:30 a.m.

The women reassembled at 10:45 and sang "Here Am I Send Me" after which Cofer's Chapel Free Will Baptist Woman's Auxiliary developed the theme "God's Leaders for Today" by presenting a skit entitled "A Missionary Arm Has Many Hands" by Bonnie Shelnut. The skit emphasized the goals of the WNAC.

In closing Carol Reid challenged all as she spoke on "God's Longing for Today and Tomorrow." She emphasized the fact that we must prepare today for what we will face tomorrow. She used Joshua 3:1-5 as the scripture text noting the experience of the Children of Israel preparing to cross the Jordan River. She emphasized that in order for the auxiliaries of the CDWA to grow there must be more emphasis on enlistment, listing some do's and don't's. She noted that the woman's auxiliary must go back and identify its purpose: Women fulfilling their place in the Great Commission. She closed by saying, "Meet needs. This is the bottom line. If you aren't meeting the needs of those ladies in your church, they will not attend. Don't be afraid to change. Be prayerful, follow God's direction, get excited about the potential of your auxiliary. Do your part!"

The session adjourned at noon with a congregational song, "Where He Leads, I Will Follow," and prayer. Food and fellowship followed.

CDWA SPRING WORKSHOP MINUTES

The Cumberland District Woman's Auxiliary Spring Workshop met Saturday, April 19, 1986 at Free Will Baptist Bible College with a registered attendance of 107.

The theme was God's Wonders At Work and the scripture verse was, "And Joshua said unto the people, Sanctify yourselves: for tomorrow the Lord will do wonders among you" (Joshua 3:5).

Rhoda Snow, song leader for the day and student at Free Will Baptist Bible College, lead the opening congregational song, "The Call For Reapers." The pianist accompaniment was Gena Hughes and the organist accompaniment was Becky Williams, both FWBBC students.

Marjorie Workman, dean of women, welcomed the group, reminding us that this is our college and that there would be a tour of the campus later.

Carolyn Lane, the CDWA president, responded with a thank you to everyone for the many preparations that were made on our behalf.

Lorene Miley, editor of Co-Laborer magazine, spoke on God's Wonders at Work Through the WNAC Plan of Work. We were caused to rethink the purpose of the woman's auxiliary as purposes and goals were presented in a different view. Goal 1. Think (Mink) Missions. 2. Enlist to service--not membership. 3. Be flexible--working schedules to meet needs of individuals. The duties of each officer were highlighted and we were challenged to live expectantly for Christ's return. This would set our priorities in order that Christ's message to others would be top priority with each of us.

"People Need the Lord" was sung in solo by Diane Antworth, FWBBC student.

Mary R. Wisehart, Executive Editor of Co-Laborer magazine and Executive Secretary/Treasurer of WNAC, gave a brief history entitled God's Wonders at Work Through United Effort. Using a slide presentation, she presented the influence of Free Will Baptist Women in the growing work of the WNAC from its beginning to present.

Laura Thigpen, professor at FWBBC, spoke on God's Wonders at Work Through Committed Women. She thanked us for the projects our women have undertaken in the past on behalf of FWBBC. Some of the more recent projects are flatware, tableclothes, and a 100 place setting of china.

The Evangel Players, directed by Joseph Jones, presented "God Appointed A Worm"--a drama depicting the truth of Jonah's rebellion against God. We were challenged to do the tasks God asks of us.

Sonja Barbour, FWBBC student, sang "Looking Through His Eyes."

Mrs. Thigpen gave several items of great need that the auxiliaries might take as projects for the Bible College. She asked especially for prayer for the faculty and staff.

We were challenged by our president to use the Plan of Work for the month of May for FWBBC. She also reminded us of the state project--Donnie and Ruth McDonald. She than thanked each one who was responsible for making the day a very special occasion.

We were dismissed in prayer. We reassembled in the Cumberland Cafeteria for lunch. The tables were set with tableclothes (material donated by one of our auxiliaries and made by various auxiliary women), and flatware donated as a special project by other auxiliaries. We had a delicious meal, after which college students directed tours of the campus.

CONSTITUTION
of the
CUMBERLAND DISTRICT WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION
of the
FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH

With the aim to involve every woman in the Cumberland District Churches in some phase of our Auxiliary work, thus helping her to fulfill her place as given by Christ in the Great Commission, we adopt the following Constitution and By-Laws:

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be the Cumberland District Woman's Auxiliary Convention.

ARTICLE II

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each local church together for the purpose of fellowship, sharing of information and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

ARTICLE III

The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, missions study chairman, missions prayer chairman and missions action chairman. These shall constitute the executive committee, FIVE of whom shall be a quorum for the transacting of business.

ARTICLE IV

This Convention shall be composed of the officers of the Convention, together with local President and two delegates (duly accredited by the Credentials Committee) from each local auxiliary.

If there are two auxiliaries--the General Director and two delegates from each auxiliary would be allowed to vote.

ARTICLE V

At least one annual session of the Convention should be held for the election of officers and transaction of business. Semi-annual or quarterly meetings may be held at the discretion of the Convention.

Notification of meetings shall be mailed to local presidents fifteen days before the date of meeting.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

Section 1. President--The president shall preside over all meetings and serve as chairman of the executive committee, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be an ex-officio member of all committees, see that reports are made promptly to the state, and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2. Vice President--The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the general work.

Section 3. Secretary--The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings and preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office. She shall also send a report to the state convention. The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping a historical record, submitting historical information to the state secretary annually.

Section 4. Treasurer--The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay same out only when authorized by the convention. She shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each meeting of the convention. The treasurer shall also send an annual report to the state treasurer. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving and special offerings.

Section 5. Field Worker--The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention. She should visit local auxiliaries, perhaps teach study courses and help in the organizing of new auxiliaries.

Section 6. Missions Study Chairman--She shall work with the local chairmen through personal contact or correspondence and shall secure the cooperation of the local chairmen in encouraging and promoting study groups in their churches.

Section 7. Missions Prayer Chairman--She shall work with the local chairmen to promote family alters, special seasons of prayer, prayer retreats, and the prayer fellowship through local auxiliaries. She shall offer them periodic suggestions for the promotion of family alters and other prayer endeavors, and encourage them to keep current missionary requests before their group.

Section 8. Missions Action Chairman--She shall promote mission action projects on local level through world-wide levels. She shall encourage each local missions action chairman to involve as many women in her church as she can in active participation in community missions, for example, the Bible Study Groups, Child Evangelism efforts, door-to-door visitation, hospital visitation.

ARTICLE II

The general officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee, and elected by acclamation unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the annual convention.

The general officers shall serve for a term of TWO years or until their successors are installed.

ARTICLE III

The general officers shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in performing their official duties subject to approval by the executive committee and presented in writing to CDWA Treasurer. All field promotional work is subject to the district executive committee who should approve work done by district officers in the interest of district work as well as expense for same. Other appropriations may be decided upon by the convention.

ARTICLE IV

Section 1. Executive Committee--The executive committee shall hold meetings for the transaction of business and to prepare the program for the annual meeting of the convention. It shall maintain an oversight of the work at large, having authority to call extra sessions of the committee when necessary and act for the convention concerning any matter and to FILL VACANCIES occurring between elections. A proxy may act for a member provided she has written authority from the member for whom she acts.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee--A resolution committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed.

Section 3. Nominating Committee-- The nominating committee shall be composed of members who are delegates nominated from the floor and elected by the body at its annual meeting. This committee shall select the slate off officers for the convention and present it for adoption.

Section 4. Credentials Committee--The secretary shall be the chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president. This committee examines the reports of the representing auxiliaries to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order. New auxiliaries organized since the last district convention, which desire to become members of the convention are examined by this committee and passed upon.

Section 5. Finance Committee--The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 6. Registration Committee--Members of this committee may be appointed by the president as needed. This committee registers those in attendance as the convention may desire.

ARTICLE V

Section 1. A membership fee in the amount of \$1.75 per active member shall be paid to the State WA Convention. (\$2.00 per active member to be received from each local auxiliary by July 31).

Section 2. Each auxiliary shall send \$5.00 per year for convention workshop, and study course expenses, receivable at any time during the fiscal year (8/1 - 7/31). This to be retained in District treasury.

ARTICLE VI

The CDWA shall submit a Treasurer's Report and Secretary's Report to the State WA Convention in accordance with the State Constitution and By-Laws. (The CDWA shall receive a like report from each local auxiliary by July 31.)

ARTICLE VII

The desired financial program for Woman's Auxiliary is missions offerings following each special season of prayer, Co-Laborer offerings and annual gifts to WNAC general fund and Student Loan Fund, and other gifts designated by the Convention.

ARTICLE VIII

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at any regular meeting of the District Auxiliary Convention.
