**Proceedings of the 75th Annual Session
of the
Cumberland District Women Active For Christ Convention**

Seventy-eight women from 20 local groups/auxiliaries met August 26, 1995, for the 75th annual Cumberland District Women Active for Christ Convention at Richland Free Will Baptist Church, Nashville, Tennessee. The convention theme was "Great and Mighty Things Through Prayer" with Jeremiah 33:3 as the scripture text.

Song leader Diane Willey opened the meeting by leading the congregation in singing "In The Garden" and "Tell It To Jesus." Rebecca Davies accompanied on the piano and Ida Lewis on the organ.

Richland auxiliary president Lana Preston welcomed the attendees, stating that this was the first time they had ever hosted any group/auxiliary event.

After Lana read the theme scripture, the offering was received. The organist and pianist played "Bind Us Together."

Anne Worthington gave the following TWAC (Tennessee Women Active for Christ) report: A total of 65 registered for the 49th annual convention, November 15, 1995, at First Free Will Baptist Church, Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The theme was "No Prayer, No Power."

At the eleven o'clock hour missionary Paul Creech spoke on "No Water, No Life." Rhoda Creech developed the convention theme at the fellowship banquet.

Delegates endorsed the Plan of Work, adopting as the state project a total of \$2,500 to be applied to furniture for the women's lounge at Free Will Baptist Bible College.

Delegates also voted to make the following two constitutional changes:

Article III - Membership

Section 1: This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention, together with district officers, ten district delegates (duly accredited by the credentials committee) *local auxiliaries representing without a district*, and local presidents. Two additional delegates from each local auxiliary may be qualified to vote by paying a registration fee of \$1.00. *Local auxiliaries without districts may have two delegates plus the president.* (Bold italicized words reflect changes.)

Article IV - Officers

Section 1: The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, *and three field workers (one each from East, Middle and West Tennessee).* These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention as desired. Five of these shall compose a quorum. (Bold italicized words reflect changes.)

Executive Secretary-Treasurer Dr. Mary Wisehart gave the following WNAC (Women Nationally Active for Christ) report:

The theme, "Great and Mighty Things Through Prayer," permeated each part of the 1995 WNAC's Convention. 1,204 registered for WNAC. Next year's convention will be held in Forth Worth, Texas, July 22-23. Our 1996 theme is "*Hold the Light High*," Acts 13:47, emphasizing personal witnessing.

New officers were elected as follows: President, Everyl Getz (TX); Vice President, Marjorie Workman (TN); Secretary, Jo Ann Wood (OK); Members at Large: Annette Aycock (SC), Diana Bryant (FL) and Barbara Chaffin (OH).

Local Groups and Membership This year, WNAC showed 724 active local groups with a total membership of 7423. Eleven Actionette groups were also reported with 93 members. Tennessee reported 45 local groups with 590 members.

State treasurers and secretaries can help us get more accurate reports. Make sure all the local groups in your state submit annual reports and pay dues. State reports must reach the national office July 1 to get into the annual report.

Finances

We praise God for the financial support WNAC received this year. We have paid back the money borrowed for furniture from the Memorial Student Loan. Support to WNAC as well as designated giving is up this year.

In the past five years, WNAC gave a total of \$2,498,806.39. This total included non-cash gifts to the provision closet.

Last year, the women gave a total of \$575,320.36 including non-cash gifts to the provision closet. The women of Tennessee gave as follows:

Before missionary to Japan Ruth McDonald spoke, Diane Willey and Rebecca Davies sang "O For A Thousand Tongues To Sing" and "Come Holy Spirit, I Need Thee."

Ruth spoke on "What To Do When You Don't Know What To Do." She stated that the instructions of Jeremiah 33:3 are to call upon God when you don't know what to do. Her outline included the following points: **Problem** - Don't know what to do; **Plan** - Call unto me; **Promise** - I will answer you. She related seemingly impossible situation facing her ministry in Japan. She stated that God does impossible things when one prays -- great and might things. She closed by quoting Ephesians 3:20-21 and the words to the song "Got Any Rivers You Think Are Uncrossable."

Carolyn Lane dismissed the meeting with prayer at 12:00 noon. A delicious lunch was enjoyed by all.

**Constitution
of the
Cumberland District Women Active For Christ**

With the aim to involve every woman in the Cumberland District churches in some phase of group/auxiliary work, thus helping her to fulfill her place as given by Christ in the Great Commission, we adopt the following Constitution and By-Laws:

Article I

The name of this organization shall be the Cumberland District Women Active For Christ (CDWAC).

Article II

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each local church together for the purpose of fellowship, sharing of information, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

Article III

The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, missions study chairman, missions prayer chairman, and missions action chairman. These shall constitute the executive committee, five of whom shall be a quorum for the transacting of business.

Article IV

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention, together with local president and two delegates (duly accredited by the Credentials Committee) from each local group/auxiliary.

If there are two groups/auxiliaries--the general director and two delegates from each group/auxiliary would be allowed to vote.

Article V

At least one annual session of the convention should be held for the election of officers and transaction of business. Semi-annual or quarterly meetings may be held at the discretion of the convention.

Notification of meetings shall be mailed to local presidents fifteen days before the date of meeting.

BY-LAWS

Article I

Section 1. President--The president shall preside over all meetings and serve as chairman of the executive committee, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be an ex-officio member of all committees, see that reports are made promptly to the state, and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2. Vice President--The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president, or by her request, and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the general work.

Section 3. Secretary--The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings and preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office. She shall also send a report to the state convention. The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping a historical record, submitting historical information to the state secretary annually.

Section 4. Treasurer--The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay same out only when authorized by the convention. She shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each meeting of the convention. The treasurer shall also send an annual report to the state treasurer. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving, and special offerings.

Section 5. Field Worker -- The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention. She should visit local groups/auxiliaries, perhaps teach study courses, and help in the organizing of new groups/auxiliaries.

Section 6. Mission Study Chairman -- She shall work with the local chairmen through personal contact or correspondence and shall secure the cooperation of the local chairmen in encouraging and promoting study groups in their churches.

Section 7. Mission Prayer Chairman -- She shall work with the local chairmen to promote family altars, special seasons of prayer, prayer retreats, and the prayer fellowship through local groups/auxiliaries. She shall offer them periodic suggestions for the promotion of family altars and other prayer endeavors, and encourage them to keep current missionary requests before their group/auxiliary.

Section 8. Mission Action Chairman -- She shall promote mission action projects on local level through world-wide levels. She shall encourage each local mission action chairman to involve as many women in her church as she can in active participation in community missions, for example, Bible study groups, child evangelism efforts, door-to-door visitation, hospital visitation.

Article II

The general officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee, and elected by acclamation unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the annual convention.

The general officers shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors are installed.

Article III

The general officers shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in performing their official duties subject to approval by the executive committee and presented in writing to the CDWAC treasurer. All field promotional work is subject to the district executive committee, who should approve work done by district officers in the interest of district work as well as expense for same. Other appropriations may be decided upon by the convention.

Article IV

Section 1. Executive Committee -- The executive committee shall hold meetings for the transaction of business and to prepare the program for the annual meeting of the convention. It shall maintain an oversight of the work at large, having authority to call extra sessions of the committee when necessary and act for the convention concerning any matter, and to fill vacancies occurring between elections. A proxy may act for a member provided she has written authority from the member for whom she acts.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee -- A resolution committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed. This committee will also include the petitions and requests committee and the appreciation committee.

Section 3. Plan of Work Committee -- A plan of work committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee plans the monthly plan of work.

Section 4. Nominating Committee -- The nominating committee shall be composed of members who are delegates nominated from the floor and elected by the body at its annual meeting. This committee shall select the slate of officers for the convention and present it for adoption.

Section 5. Credentials Committee -- The secretary shall be the chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president. This committee examines the reports of the representing groups/auxiliaries to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order. New groups/auxiliaries organized since the last district convention, which desire to become members of the convention, are examined by this committee and passed upon.

Section 6. Finance Committee -- The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 7. Registration Committee -- Members of this committee may be appointed by the president as needed. This committee registers those in attendance as the convention may desire.

Article V

Section 1. A membership fee in the amount of \$10.50 per active member shall be paid to the CDWAC treasury by July 31. Of this amount the CDWAC treasurer will send \$10.25 to the Tennessee Women Active for Christ (TWAC) treasury. The remaining \$.25 shall be retained in the CDWAC treasury. Twenty-five cents shall be retained in the TWAC treasury, and the remaining \$10 sent to Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC).

Section 2. It is suggested that each group/auxiliary send the following amounts to the CDWAC treasury any time during the fiscal year (8/1-7/31. This is to be retained in the district treasury.

Article VI

The CDWAC shall submit a treasurer's report and secretary's report to the TWAC in accordance with the State Constitution and By-Laws. (The CDWAC shall receive a like report from each local group/auxiliary by July 31.)

Article VII

The desired financial program for WNAC is mission's offerings following each special season of prayer, Co-Laborer offerings, annual gifts to WNAC general fund, the Student Loan Fund, and other gifts designated by the convention.

Article VIII

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at any regular meeting of the Cumberland District Women Active for Christ.
