**Proceedings of the 79th Annual Session
of the
Cumberland District Women Active For Christ Convention**

Sixty-eight women from 18 local groups/auxiliaries met August 21, 1999, for the 79th annual Cumberland District Women Active for Christ Convention (CDWAC) at Donelson Free Will Baptist Church, Nashville, Tennessee. The convention theme was "Pass The Torch," with II Timothy 2:2 as the scripture text.

Worship team members Lisa Fleming, Deanna Hollifield, Renee McGowan and Melinda Sloan opened the meeting by leading the congregation in singing "Send The Light." Teresa Snow accompanied on the piano. CDWAC President Elizabeth Hodges led in prayer and appointed the following committees:

Missions Partners Coordinator Brenda Evans welcomed everyone to Donelson Free Will Baptist Church.

Mary Ruth Wisheart gave a brief history of WNAC, beginning with the early days. The worship leaders then led the congregation in singing "Song of the Nations," after which each CDWAC officer gave a brief description of her office. Then each officer conducted more extensive studies of the officers' duties in break-away sessions. Manual study certificates were dispersed to all attending.

At the end of the break-away sessions, the Donelson Missions Partners served a delicious brunch. During that time committees met.

The session reassembled at 11:00 a.m. with Angela Dooley and the worship team singing "Carry The Light." Lynette Morgan, missionary to Côte d' Ivoire, briefly shared how WNAC has ministered to her family throughout their missionary service. She mentioned the provision closet, special projects, cards and packages, financial support and prayers.

Sarah Fletcher drew attention to three deceased women from Cofer's Chapel who had faithfully served. They were Julia Gailey, Geneva Harris and Hattie Pack.

An offering of \$228.00 was received and designated for the Clint and Lynette Morgan missions account.

President Elizabeth Hodges called the meeting to order. Anne Worthington gave the credentials

report. A motion was made, seconded and carried (MSC) to receive the report and seat the delegates. (see reports) Two groups/auxiliaries petitioned for membership in CDWAC. They are Corner Stone, Murfreesboro and Faith, Nashville. Delegates voted to receive them.

Business Session

Marjorie Workman began the business session with the following WNAC report.

WNAC Report

Thank you for allowing me to report. It has been an exciting year serving you in this new role as Executive Secretary-Treasurer of WNAC. I wondered how I would be received and you've been great. We have some wonderful women across the country. I've traveled quite a bit this past year and it has been exciting seeing how God is using our women.

According to the 1998 reports we have 632 local groups with 6,499 dues paying members. That number is down, and we really need to work at increasing our membership. We would like to have a membership drive. Perhaps the theme could be "Each One Reach One." By that I mean, each member tries to reach one, each group tries to get a new group started, each district tries to get a new district, etc. Our dues seem to keep some people from belonging. They want to be a part but are not willing to share the responsibility of support.

We had a great National Convention. Every service was a good one. We heard Lynette Morgan give a stirring devotion, Shirley Combs share the children's ministry in Brazil, and Diana Bryant had a wonderful program on "Passing the Torch." The day ended with Brenda Vaughn speaking at our banquet. She shared the touching story of a tragic fire that nearly killed her and her two-year-old daughter.

At the Convention we passed four resolutions.

1. We voted to give a \$1,000 scholarship each to two African students who will be going to seminary.
2. We changed the name of the Foreign Student Scholarship Fund to the "Cleo Purcell Foreign Student Scholarship Fund."
3. We changed the name of the Memorial Student Loan Fund to the "Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart Loan Fund."
4. We recommended that local, district and state WAC groups consider increasing their monthly gifts to the WNAC office for the General Fund.

We have an organ fund started for Free Will Baptist Bible College in honor of Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart. The goal is to raise \$32,000 to purchase a Wicks pipe organ by the time the school moves to their new campus. This should be an easy goal to reach. We need 320 groups or individuals to give \$100 each. WNAC bought the first organ back in the 50's. Before word could officially get out, the women were sending their money in and the project was completed

in a short time. Surely we can do the same.

In the future we would like to organize a "Moms in Prayer" program to pray for our youth. This would be an exchange program where mothers send in names; then, women who were willing to commit to praying for two or three young people would be given the names.

Perhaps in the future we could also sponsor some women's missions trips. Some of our missionaries have mentioned a need for women to visit the field and help reach the women through various means such as doll making, quilting, or teaching English. This could be an excellent opportunity for retirees or those who have summers off.

The missionary provision closet continues to be a source of encouragement to the missionaries. We are thankful for all the groups who keep the closet stocked.

Thank you for all you have done. Pray for us. Come visit us at the office. Share with us your ideas.

TWAC Report

A total of 58 registered for the fifty-third annual Tennessee Women Active for Christ Convention, November 10, 1998, at First Free Will Baptist Church, Elizabethton, Tennessee. The session focused on the theme, "Living Sacrifices."

For the 1998-99 state project, delegates voted to raise \$3,600 toward an organ for Free Will Baptist Bible College in honor of Dr. Mary Ruth Wisehart.

As a source of information, Recording Secretary Anne Worthington reported 37 auxiliaries reported, with a total of 459 paying dues.

Treasurer Gladys Gragg reported receipts for the year totaled \$34,524.92. Of that amount \$12,213.50 was designated for foreign missions, \$5,510.47 for home missions, \$1,119.49 for Free Will Baptist Bible College, \$2,380.58 for FWB Family Ministries, and \$9,875.96 for WNAC.

WNAC Executive Secretary/Treasurer Marjorie Workman reported Tennessee FWB women gave a total of \$37,717.76, ranking second nationally in giving to the *Co-Laborer* Offering, the *Emphasis* Offering and in total giving to WNAC.

She also reported Mary Ruth Wisehart's book *Beyond the Gate* is now available at the WNAC office for \$19.95.

She further reported that beginning with the 1999 January-February issue, *Co-Laborer* magazine costs will increase to \$8.75 for single subscriptions and \$8.00 for five or more sent to the same address.

Mrs. Workman reminded everyone of the retreat at Glorieta, New Mexico, September 24-26, 1999.

Five events highlighted the Tennessee Women Active for Christ Convention:

- President Dawn Sweeney paid tribute to newly elected Executive Secretary/Treasurer Marjorie Workman and presented her with flowers.
- Dawn also paid tribute to former Executive Secretary/Treasurer Mary Ruth Wisehart and presented her with flowers and a \$500 check from the Tennessee women.
- A first: A luncheon rather than a banquet. Trula Cronk spoke.
- Debbie Mitchell's slide presentation of women who have served - "Living Sacrifices."
- Limestone's Women Active for Christ presentation of the mission skit, *Is That a Tear In Your Eye?*, written by missionary Annette Aycock.

Plans are underway for the 1999 TWAC retreat to be held at the Holiday Inn Sun-Spree Resort in Gatlinburg, Tennessee, September 30 - October 2. There is still time to register. Registration forms are available at the registration table. It is important that you make your hotel reservations now. The cut-off date for reservations is September 9.

The 1999 Tennessee Women Active for Christ Convention will convene November 9, 1999, at Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Greeneville, Tennessee. "A Door Ajar" is the theme, with speakers Trymon Messer and James Forlines sharing the exciting things happening in home and foreign missions. Anita Forlines is the devotion speaker. The second annual luncheon will take place at the children's home.

Carol Reid gave the plan of work report. MSC to receive report. (see reports)

CDWAC Treasurer Barbara Nicholson gave both the treasurer and finance committee reports. She reported that 239 members representing 19 auxiliaries had paid dues. MSC to accept both reports. (see reports)

The floor was then opened for further business, and delegates were appointed to the TWAC convention at Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Greeneville, Tennessee, November 9, 1999. (see delegates)

In final business the nominating committee report was given. (see nominating committee) Mary Ruth Wisheart prayed a dedicatory prayer.

At 12:30 p.m. the 79th session of the Cumberland District Women Active for Christ Convention was closed with the congregation singing "Make Me A Servant."

Spring Workshop / International Fair

Seventy-five women registered for the April 17, 1999, Cumberland District Women Active for Christ spring workshop at Cross Timbers Free Will Baptist Church, Nashville, Tennessee. The theme was "Pass The Torch", with II Timothy 2:2 as the scripture text.. "And the things that thou has heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also."

The day's activities began with registration at 9:00 a.m. At 9:30 a.m. Jill Ketteman led the attendees in singing "Teach Me Lord To Care," after which Rebecca Davies presented devotional thoughts.

**Constitution
of the
Cumberland District Women Active For Christ**

With the aim to involve every woman in the Cumberland District churches in some phase of group/auxiliary work, thus helping her to fulfill her place as given by Christ in the Great Commission, we adopt the following Constitution and By-Laws:

Article I

The name of this organization shall be the Cumberland District Women Active For Christ (CDWAC).

Article II

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each local church together for the purpose of fellowship, sharing of information, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

Article III

The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, field worker, missions study chairman, missions prayer chairman, and missions action chairman. These shall constitute the executive committee, five of whom shall be a quorum for the transacting of business.

Article IV

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention, together with local president and two delegates (duly accredited by the Credentials Committee) from each local group/auxiliary.

If there are two groups/auxiliaries--the general director and two delegates from each group/auxiliary would be allowed to vote.

Article V

At least one annual session of the convention should be held for the election of officers and transaction of business. Semi-annual or quarterly meetings may be held at the discretion of the convention.

Notification of meetings shall be mailed to local presidents fifteen days before the date of meeting.

BY-LAWS

Article I

Section 1. President--The president shall preside over all meetings and serve as chairman of the executive committee, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be an ex-officio member of all committees, see that reports are made promptly to the state, and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2. Vice President--The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president, or by her request, and otherwise assist her in the oversight of the general work.

Section 3. Secretary--The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings and preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office. She shall also send a report to the state convention. The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping a historical record, submitting historical information to the state secretary annually.

Section 4. Treasurer--The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay same out only when authorized by the convention. She shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each meeting of the convention. The treasurer shall also send an annual report to the state treasurer. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving, and special offerings.

Section 5. Field Worker -- The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention. She should visit local groups/auxiliaries, perhaps teach study courses, and help in the organizing of new groups/auxiliaries.

Section 6. Mission Study Chairman -- She shall work with the local chairmen through personal contact or correspondence and shall secure the cooperation of the local chairmen in encouraging and promoting study groups in their churches.

Section 7. Mission Prayer Chairman -- She shall work with the local chairmen to promote family altars, special seasons of prayer, prayer retreats, and the prayer fellowship through local groups/auxiliaries. She shall offer them periodic suggestions for the promotion of family altars and other prayer endeavors, and encourage them to keep current missionary requests before their group/auxiliary.

Section 8. Mission Action Chairman -- She shall promote mission action projects on local level through world-wide levels. She shall encourage each local mission action chairman to involve as many women in her church as she can in active participation in community missions, for example, Bible study groups, child evangelism efforts, door-to-door visitation, hospital visitation.

Article II

The general officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee, and elected by acclamation unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the annual convention.

The general officers shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors are installed.

Article III

The general officers shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in performing their official duties subject to approval by the executive committee and presented in writing to the CDWAC treasurer. All field promotional work is subject to the district executive committee, who should approve work done by district officers in the interest of district work as well as expense for same. Other appropriations may be decided upon by the convention.

Article IV

Section 1. Executive Committee -- The executive committee shall hold meetings for the transaction of business and to prepare the program for the annual meeting of the convention. It shall maintain an oversight of the work at large, having authority to call extra sessions of the committee when necessary and act for the convention concerning any matter, and to fill vacancies occurring between elections. A proxy may act for a member provided she has written authority from the member for whom she acts.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee -- A resolution committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed. This committee will also include the petitions and requests committee and the appreciation committee.

Section 3. Plan of Work Committee -- A plan of work committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee plans the monthly plan of work.

Section 4. Nominating Committee -- The nominating committee shall be composed of members who are delegates nominated from the floor and elected by the body at its annual meeting. This committee shall select the slate of officers for the convention and present it for adoption.

Section 5. Credentials Committee -- The secretary shall be the chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president. This committee examines the reports of the representing groups/auxiliaries to see if fees are paid and if reports are in order. New groups/auxiliaries organized since the last district convention, which desire to become members of the convention, are examined by this committee and passed upon.

Section 6. Finance Committee -- The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 7. Registration Committee -- Members of this committee may be appointed by the president as needed. This committee registers those in attendance as the convention may desire.

Article V

Section 1. A membership fee in the amount of \$10.50 per active member shall be paid to the CDWAC treasury by July 31. Of this amount the CDWAC treasurer will send \$10.25 to the Tennessee Women Active for Christ (TWAC) treasury. The remaining \$.25 shall be retained in the CDWAC treasury. Twenty-five cents shall be retained in the TWAC treasury, and the remaining \$10 sent to Women Nationally Active for Christ (WNAC).

Section 2. It is suggested that each group/auxiliary send the following amounts to the CDWAC treasury any time during the fiscal year (8/1-7/31. This is to be retained in the district treasury.

Article VI

The CDWAC shall submit a treasurer's report and secretary's report to the TWAC in accordance with the State Constitution and By-Laws. (The CDWAC shall receive a like report from each local group/auxiliary by July 31.)

Article VII

The desired financial program for WNAC is mission's offerings following each special season of prayer, Co-Laborer offerings, annual gifts to WNAC general fund, the Student Loan Fund, and other gifts designated by the convention.

Article VIII

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at any regular meeting of the Cumberland District Women Active for Christ.
