The morning devotion was given by Rev. John Ballard from scripture in Titus 2:10-14. Prayer was voiced by Rev. Ballard. Appointment of Obituary and Temperance Committees.

Morgan as 1967 State Board Member and motion made and carried that Rev. L. B. Steele be named to replace Rev. J. D. Williams as 1966 State Board Member.

CREDENTIAL BOARD REPORT: Recommend that Bro. Joey Howeth be ordained to preach and to serve the Lord whenever and wherever needed. Recommendation accepted and approved.

CTS REPORT: The CTS Board thanks all teachers, cooks and helpers in the Youth Camp — 1966. All did a wonderful iob The curriculum followed the National Association outline and material. Good services throughout. Only disappointment was in the low attendance, approximately 34 were enrolled. We were real happy with our evangelist Rev Dick Shade who proved a real blessing in both preaching and teaching. Camp Director was I. C. Morgan: CTS President, A Bales; Secretary. Linda Bagwell. The CTS Friday night programs were held at Byrant, Brockland and Bridgecreek. These were to be rotated alphabetically unless the church did not want to have the service. At each meeting an offering was to be taken for CTS to pay speaker.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT: During the year we voted to hire someone to look after the Camp Grounds, especially to ready for each Quarterly Meeting Youth Camp and Annual Asociation; voted to look into prospects of fixing up our present buildings; voted to partition the tabernacle and church building; voted to run concrete floor in tabernacle and fix west end for boys dormitory; voted to put screens on buildings; voted to raise insurance from \$1500 to \$4000. All of these motions have been acted upon to completion and the Board thanks all who contributed in any way.

OBITUARY COMMITTEE REPORT: We are sad to report the passing of our loved ones from the following churches: Blanchard, Sis. Effic Peters; Dibble: Sis. Josie Mills; Hawkins, Bro. Marvin Goyne and Bro. Silas Trammell. Our loss is Heaven's gain.

CREDENTIAL COMMITTEE REPORT: Recommend that the license of Bro. Vernon Stephens be extended for one year; and that Ronnie Ballard be accepted into full fellowship of the Association.

TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: We know that God's word teaches that strong drink is contrary to the doctrine of the Lord. Prov. 20:1 says wine is a mockery, strong drink is raging, and whosever is deceived thereby is not wise. Many other scriptures bear this out. We recommend that we as a denomination, urge all members to abstain from all worldly amusements, be temperate in all things, and oppose all manner of sin—Colosians 2:21-22. We believe our ministers and teachers should be uncompromising in our stand against intoxicating beverage as well as other forms of sin.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT: Resolution No. 1. Be it resolved that all quarterly meetings assemble at the Associational Camp Grounds for each setting and that the speaker and alternate for each introductory messge be selected at this annual meeting; and that a divine service committee be selected at each setting thereafter.

Resolution No. 2 May it be resolved that the Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Chairman of all standing Boards meet and make up the manuscript for the coming year and that the Clerk and Assistant Clerk edit and proof read the minutes before printing. Be it further agreed that this be a standing resolution.

STANDING MOTIONS

- II. All ordained ministers coming into the ass'n be examined and ratification of their credentials depending on a letter in good standing from their ass'n from which they came.
- IV. That the examination for deacons and ministers be more rigid, and that a set of examination questions for ministers and suggested qualifications (preparation for ministry) be adopted by this association.
- V. That the consitution be revised and that a study be made by the Executive Board and a report presented to the association.
- VI. That there be a ministers conference each year preceding the annual conference.
- VIII- That each board present a report to each quarterly and annual meeting. (Page 455)

Motion carried that 5 year man be temporary chairman for the first meeting of the board he is on, and before 90 days are up and at this meeting elect a permanent chairman and clerk. (Page 457).

CONSTITUTION

From long experience, we the members of the Church of God (denominated Free Will Baptist) being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, do therefore ordain this constitution for our better church government.

- Article 1. Membership. This Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches or Quarterly Meetings of our union, not exceeding three messengers from each church and upon producing letters they shall be entitled to seats. All ordained ministers and deacons of said union shall be regular members when presented by virtue of their office.
- Article 2. Name. The members thus chosen and convened in the yearly meeting or Association of the Church of God, denominated Free Will Bantist, being composed of sundry churches in Dibble Association, the Association having no power to Lord it over God's heritage, nor have any ecclesiastical power over the churches; reserving the right of withdrawing from any church becoming disorderly.
- Article 3. Letters Letters from the different churches representing are to express their number in fellowship including the names and addresses of ordained and licensed ministers, the number of members received upon profession of faith, by letter or recommendation, by restoration, or denominational choice; the number dismissed by letter, excluded and those having died since last Association. Churches sending their letters may send obituaries of any who died during the year that we may keep up the memorial of our dead.
- Article 4 Officers. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, a treasurer, and an Executive Board which shall be composed of 5 members serving terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years.
- Article 5. New Churches Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the Association which are to petition by letter and delegates and, if upon examination, they are found to be orthodox and orderly, that they may be received into the Association, the Moderator giving the right hand of fellow-
- Article 6. Questions. No questions from any church shall come under the consideration unless it has been first considered in its own church.
- Article 7. Motions Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the members who made it.
- Article 8. Minutes The Association is to endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the Association.
- Article 9. Clerk. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association in a book to be kept by the Association for that purpose.
- Article 10. Signatures. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected if needed, signed by the Moderator and Clerk before the end of the association.
- Article 11. Amendments. Amendments to this Constitution may be made when necessary by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

Article 12. Be it resolved that our Quarterly Meeting begin Friday nights before the Second (2nd) Sunday in the given months December, March and June.

Article 13. Be it resolved that the Dibble Association pay co-operatively of all monies taken in except those ear-marked otherwise. Allocate 50 percent District, 50 percent State, this to be put in the constitution and carried from year to year.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2 God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manfest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Hoyl Spirit all the attritributes of God-
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, The Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. Perserverance: All believers in Christ, who through grace perservere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.

- 13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (1Cor. 16:2a.).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil. to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in garce and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observences of the ordinances of the Gospel nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and de-nominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
