#### STANDING MOTIONS

All ordained ministers coming into the association be examined and ratification of their credentials depending on a letter in good standing

from the association from which they came.

Credential report adopted item by item: 1—Accept questionnaire. 2—Use said questionaire. 3—That all candidates be on trial for one year. 4—All ministers coming into association be examined by said questionnaires. 5—To put questionnaire into minutes with amendment that they be printed each year.

There be a ministers conference each year preceding the annual

conference.

Each board present a report to each quarterly and annual meeting. 5 year man be temporary chairman for the first meeting of the board he is on, and before 90 days are up, at this meeting elect a permanent chairman and clerk.

We resolve to give each quarterly meeting equal power and authority

to make rules and laws.

The Dibble Association have an annual Missionary Conference and the planning of this conference be in the hands of the Mission Board.

Dispense with the printing of complete church letters in the church minutes and only a statistical report be printed.

Motion to adopt cooperative plan. .

Read only the names of the delegates from the quarterly meetings.

Rental of camp grounds be only to Christian Organizations. There is a minimum rate of a 50.00 fee for use of the grounds and facilities if less than two days, or \$25.00 per day for indefinite number of days, or \$100.00 per week. An additional \$50.00 fee be charged to insure that the buildings and grounds will be left in the same shape and condition as when rented. Fees be paid in advance of the use with other temporary use being granted as determined by the property manager (Dormie Mills).

Executive Board serve as program committee for quarterly and annual

meetings, including selecting of the speakers.

At each quarterly meeting when Treasurer presents report that a special offering for the Association be taken at this time.

The Moderator, Rev. J. C. Morgan, called for letters to be turned to Clerk. Rev. Morgan introduced Rev. Lynn Wood,, OBC Promotional Director, who reported on training at the school and thanked Dibble Association for its support. Letters from 9 churches were read and accepted. No. 3. Motion that we recommend to the association that we elect a planning committee for future development of camp grounds. This to be a standing committee.

Motion that Moderator appoint Committee to evalute property of the Association at this meeting. Nominated were Joe Conn, Jack Richey, Bill DaVoult, Dormie Mills and Dale Lane.

Rev. J. C. Morgan reported for the Executive Board and stated that the loan of \$2000.00 for the boys dorm building had been acquired and the program committee had scheduled the speakers for the associational meetings during the current year.

Motion that Co-Op allocation be 25% local, 75% State. Seconded. Motion laid on table for discussion. Motion carried Motion to adjourn.

#### RULES OF ORDER

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomsoever he may request.

2. Ministers, deacons, church clerks, Associational clerks and elected

delegates, present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects and vote.

3. Those who speak shall arise and address the Moderator. Per-

sonal reflection shall be avoided in all debates.

· 4. No motion shall be discussed without a second.

- 5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall be dismissed.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.

9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all members

present.

10. No member shall absent himself without special leave of the Moderator.

11. Minutes shall be leisurely read and corrected before the close of the Association if necessary.

12. At all future sessions of the Association arrangements shall be made to insure two sermons or other devotional exercises equivalent thereto, during each day of the session and the chair shall announce just before adjournment, who shall fill the stand at the next meeting.

13. Rules of order shall be distinctly read from the chair immediately

after organization of the association.

14. Alternations may be made in these rules at any regular session of the Association.

#### CONSTITUTION

From long experience, we the members of the Church of God (denominated Free Will Baptist) being regulary baptized upon a profession of our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, do therefore ordain this constitution for our better church government.

ARTICLE 1. Membership. This Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches or Quarterly Meetings of our union, not exceeding three messengers from each church and upon producing letters they shall be entitled to seats. All ordained ministers and deacons of said union shall be regular members when presented by virtue of their office.

ARTICLE 2.. Name. The members thus chosen and convened in the yearly meeting or Association of the Church of God, denominated Free Will Baptist, being composed of sundry churches in Dibble Association, the Association having no power to Lord it over God's heritage, nor have any ecclesiastical power over the churches; reserving the right of withdrawing from any church becoming disorderly.

ARTICLE 3. Letters Letters from the different churches represent-

ing are to express their number in fellowship including the names and addresses of ordained and licensed ministers, the number of members received upon profession of faith, by letter or recommendation, by restoration or denomination choice; the number dismissed by letter, excluded and those having died since last Association. Churches sending their letters may send chittering of any who died during the year that their letters may send obituaries of any who died during the year that we may keep up the memorial of our dead.

ARTICLE 4. Officers. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, a treasurer, and an Executive Board which shall be composed of 5 members serving terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years.

ARTICLE 5. New Churches. Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the Association which are to petition by letter and delegates and, if upon examination, they are found to be orthodox and orderly, that they may be received into the Association, the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

ARTICLE 6. Questions. No questions from any church shall come under the consideration unless it has been first considered in its own рыстыстан такен таке

AR/TICLE 7. Motions. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the members who made it.

ARTICLE 8. Minutes. The Association is to endeavor to furnish

the churches with minutes of the Association.

ARTICLE 9.. Clerk. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association in a book to be kept by the Association for that purpose-

ARTICLE 10. Signatures. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected if needed, signed by the Moderator and Clerk before

the end of the association.

ARTICLE 11. Amendments. Amendments to this Constitution may be made when necessary by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

ARTICLE 12. Be it resolved that our Quarterly Meeting begin Friday nights before the Second (2nd) Sunday in the given months December,

March and June.

ARTICLE 13. Pe it resolved that the Dibble Association pay cooperatively of all monies taken in except those ear-marked otherwise. Allocate 25 percent District, 50 percent State, this to be put in the constitution and carried from year to year.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. THE BIBLE. The Scripures of the Old and New Testaments were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith

and practice.

2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Chost: yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.

3. Christ Christ is God manfest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, one crucified, He is now risen and is our ever present Saviour

and Lord.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy spirit

all the attributes of God.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity

All campers will register when entering camp with 5.00 registration fee supplied by camper or sponsored by church.

Each camper to bring cots, bedding and toilet articles.

The Association will acquire insurance on all children. The \$5.00 registration fee will cover this item.

Meals served to anyone not registered at the camp will be charged 50 cents.

#### DUTIES OF STANDING BOARDS
