STANDING MOTIONS

All ordained ministers coming into the association be examined and ratification of their credentials depending on a letter in good standing from the association from which they came.

Credential report adopted item by item: i—Accept questionnaire. 2—Use said questionnaire. 3—That all candidates be on trial for one year. 4—All ministers coming into association be examined by said questionnaires. 5—To put questionnaire into minutes with amendment that they be printed each year.

There be a ministers conference each year preceding the annual conference.

Each board present a report to each quarterly and annual meeting. 5 year man be temporary chairman for the first meeting of the board he is on, and before 90 days are up, at this meeting elect a permanent chairman and clerk.

We resolve to give each quarterly meeting equal power and authority

to make rules and laws.

The Dibble Association have an annual Missionary Conference and the planning of this conference be in the hands of the Mission Board.

Dispense with the printing of complete church letters in the church minutes and only a statistical report be printed.

Motion to adopt cooperative plan.

Read only the names of the delegates from the quarterly meetings. Rental of camp grounds be only to Christian Organizations. There is a minimum rate of a \$50.00 fee for use of the grounds and facilities if less than two days, or \$25.00 per day for indefinite number of days, or \$100.00 per week. An additional \$50.00 fee be charged to insure that the buildings and grounds will be left in the same shape and condition as when rented. Fees be paid in advance of the, use with other temporary use being granted as determined by the property manager (Dormie Mills).

Executive Board serve as program committee for quarterly and annual meetings, including selecting of the speakers.

At each quarterly meeting when Treasurer presents report that a special offering for the Association be taken at this time.

Obituary committee report given, memorial prayer led by Moderator. Treasurers report approved as read. Offering in the amount of \$62.62 received for General Fund. C.T.S. treasury report given and accepted. Motion to apply \$450.00 on our indebtedness of boys dorm. Motion to leave the securing of campgrounds insurance to the executive board and treasurer. Motion for a committee composed of Chickasha, Lawton and Duncan pastors, with Rev. J. C. Morgan Chairman, work with Executive Secretary on plans for 1971 State Association Convention convening in Lawton. Motion to abolish the Sunday School Board.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT: The board served as program committee in selecting speakers for the associational meetings. The board met with the Bryant Church at their request to disband the church and turn their property to the Association. Their balance in treasury was \$57.36, which was designated to be used on the boys dormitory.

MISSION BOARD: The board set a mission conference for March 13-15, 1971 with Jim Combs and Bill Fulcher. Received word from National Foreign Mission department that Lonnie Palmer, Ivory Coast, Africa, and from National Home Mission department that Roger McCarty, Nova Scotia, Canada, are the missionaries with greatest financial needs at present time.

CTS BOARD REPORT: God's blessings were abundantly showered upon our Youth Encampment which was held July 26-31, 1970. We thank God for all the children, sponsors, teachers, and cooks for making this a successful camp. Brother J. C. Morgan was the Director and Bro. John Kirkpatrick was the assistant Director. A total of 30

sponsors and workers, and teachers and 85 children comprised our enrollment. We praise God for the fine spirit of willingness to help which was shown by all concerned. We thank all the churches for their support and labor which made possible a very enjoyable and successful Youth Encampment. Our Evangelist, Rev. Burton Perry challenged each of us to totally commit our lives daily and to find God's direction for our lives. - RESOLVED: that this association shall adopt the Palmers as its missionary with each church sending in a monthly offering in the amount as shall be suggested by the mission board.
- WHEREAS: there exists a need for everyone to become involved in the missions program, be it
- RESOLVED: that each pastor challenge each family in his church to give a monthly offering over and above the tithe to missions, and te it
- RESOLVED: that we encourage all mission gifts be channelled through the church treasurer, then to the District Treasurer.
- WHEREAS: we consider it our responsibility to extend the Free Will Baptist witness into every area possible, be it
- RESOLVED: that we urge the Mission Board to investigate the possibility of establishing a mission church in every town in this association in which it would be feasible.
- WHEREAS: this association has been meeting on both Friday and Saturday before the second Sunday in the months of Sept., Dec., Mar., and June, for the purpose of transacting its business, and
- WHEREAS: the business of this association has proven to be of such a nature as to require only a one day session, and
- WHEREAS: the Friday sessions of this business conference have recently been so poorly attended as to restrict the amount of business that might be transacted on that day, and
- WHEREAS: it is the desire of this committee that as many members of the association as possible participate in the conducting of its business, and
- WHEREAS: Saturday is the day of the week that most of our members can be present for the business session, be it
- RESOLVED: that this association hereafter convene, for the purpose of conducting its business, at 9 o'clock on Saturday morning before the second Sunday in the months of Sept., Dec., Mar., and June. Be it.
- RESOLVED: A. That the Friday night session of the quarterly meetings (in Dec., Mar., & June) be used for District CTS Rallies with programs planned by the CTS Board.

WHEREAS: in times past some licensed and/or ordained ministers have been content to be called such without exercising the duties of such, and

WHEREAS: these licensed/and/or ordained ministers, showing no intention toward pursuing the ministry to which they profess to have been called, and making no effort to become involved in the ministry, but rather, in fact, publicly pursuing other fields of vocational endeavor, have lowered the prestige and shaded the public image of the ministerial office for those who are honestly pursuing that Heavenly calling, and

WHEREAS: we thus conclude that such ministers maintain their ministerial standing only because of the personal prestige and honor associated with the Divine call, be it

RESOLVED: A. that this assembly charge its credential board to either annually or bi-annually investigate the status of every licensed and ordained minister in the assn.

B. Upon the basis of such investigation, the Credential Board shall classify each minister as (1) ACTIVE (2) RETIRED or (3) SUS-PENDED. The Basis of the classification being that if a minister is involved in the ministry, is preparing for the ministry, or is seeking to become involved in the ministry, he shall be classified as ACTIVE. If the minister is retired, he shall be classified as such. If the minister is not actively involved in the ministry, and is not preparing for the ministry, and expresses that he is not willing to accept ministerial responsibility, he shall be placed on suspension and shall be so classified. The classification of any minister shall be changed at such time as his status shall change. The classification of any minister shall not be changed as a result of disability unless the minister shall so request. And be it

RESOLVED: that the classification of any minister shall be subject to review by the assn. upon request by the minister. And be it further RESOLVED: that suspension of any minister shall terminate his right to a standing vote in this association.

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomsoever he may request.
- 2. Ministers, deacons, church clerks, Associational clerks and elected delegates, present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects and vote.
- 3. Those who speak shall arise and address the Moderator. Personal reflection shall be avoided in all debates.
 - 4. No motion shall be discussed without a second.
- 5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall be dismissed.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.
 - 7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all members present.
- 10. No member shall absent himself without special leave of the Moderator.
- 11. Minutes shall be leisurely read and corrected before the close of the Association if necessary.
- 12. At all future sessions of the Association arrangements shall be made to insure two sermons or other devotional exercises equivalent thereto, during each day of the session and the chair shall announce just before adjournment, who shall fill the stand at the next meeting.
- 13. Rules of order shall be distinctly read from the chair immediately after organization of the association.
- 14. Alterations may be made in these rules at any regular session of the Association.

CONSTITUTION

From long experience, we the members of the Church of God (denominated Free Will Baptist) being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us, and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, do therefore ordain this constitution for our better church government.

ARTICLE 1. Membership. This Association shall be composed of members chosen by the churches or Quarterly Meetings of our union, not exceeding three messengers from each church and upon producing letters they shall be entitled to seats. All ordained ministers and deacons of said union shall be regular members when presented

by virtue of their office.

ARTICLE 2. Name. The members thus chosen and convened in the yearly meeting or Association of the Church of God, denominated Free Will Baptist, being composed of sundry churches in Dibble Association, the Association having no power to Lord it over God's heritage, nor have any ecclesiastical power over the churches, reserving the right of withdrawing from any church becoming disorderly.

ARTICLE 3. Letters. Letters from the different churches representing are to express their number in fellowship including the names and addresses of ordained and licensed ministers, the number of members received upon profession of faith, by letter or recommendation, by restoration or denomination choice; the number dismissed by letter, excluded and those having died since last Association. Churches sending their letters may send obituaries of any who died during the year that we may keep up the memorial of our dead.

ARTICLE 4. Officers. The Association shall have a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, a treasurer, and an Executive Board which shall be composed of 5 members serving terms

of 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years.

ARTICLE 5. New Churches. Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the Association which are to petition by letter and delegates and, if upon examination, they are found to be orthodox and orderly, that they may be received into the Association, the Moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

ARTICLE 6. Questions. No questions from any church shall come under the consideration unless it has been first considered in its own church.

ARTICLE 7. Motions. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the members who made it.

ARTICLE 8. Minutes. The Association is to endeavor to furnish the churches with minutes of the Association.

ARTICLE 9. Clerk. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association in a book to be kept by the Association for that purpose.

ARTICLE 10. Signatures. The minutes of the Association shall be read and corrected if needed, signed by the Moderator and Clerk be-

fore the end of the Association.

ARTICLE 11. Amendments. Amendments to this Constitution may be made when necessary by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

ARTICLE 12. Be it resolved that our Quarterly Meeting begin Friday nights before the Second (2nd) Sunday in the given months

December, March and June.

ARTICLE 13. Be it resolved that the Dibble Association pay cooperatively of all monies taken in except those ear-marked otherwise. Allocate 25 percent District, 50 percent State, this to be put in the constitution and carried from year to year.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. THE BIBLE. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of

faith and practice.

2. GOD. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost: yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.

3. CHRIST. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, one crucified, He is now risen and is our ever present

Saviour and Lord.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit

all the attributes of God.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come

to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST. The son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.

- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION. The conditions of salvation are:
 1. Repentence or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.
 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul comes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

11. SALVATION FREE. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all. The Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. PERSEVERANCE. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal

salvation.

13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.

14. TITHING. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2a.).

15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal com-

munion with God.

16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves

to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observances of the ordinances of the Gospel or fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

DUTIES OF STANDING BOARDS

EXECUTIVE BOARD: The Executive Board shall act in behalf of the association when not in session, and shall present a report to each quarterly and annual meeting of the Association.

CREDENTIAL BOARD: This board shall examine all applicants for ordination as well as ministers and deacons coming into the association. Each applicant shall be examined as to his Christian experience, call to the ministry (or desire to be a deacon) view of Christian doctrine, conviction concerning the denomination, and intentions concerning self preparation. Applicable questionnaires concerning doctrinal beliefs and practices will be completed. The Board shall present a report to each quarterly and annual meeting of the association.

CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD: It shall be the duty of this board to plan and assist in every way possible the CTS work throughout the Association. It will also be their responsibility to promote an active C.T.S. work in each church of the association. This board shall present a report to each quarterly and annual meeting of the association.

MISSION BOARD: It shall be the duty of this board to work to promote an active missionary program in and for the Dibble Association. They shall plan the annual Missionary Conference and shall preset a report to each quarterly and annual meeting of the Association.
