

February 15, 1969

MSC to instruct Larry Richmond to pay balance of youth funds to quarterly treasurer and instruct treasurer to write check for film rental.

Offering received for youth film and expenses \$23.55.

Dismissal followed by dismissal prayer by Leon Smith.

Morning worship began by singing, and prayer by Dot Reed. Missionaries Art Tyson and Ella Mae Jones told about their services in Ecuador and Art Tyson brought message on subject, Bible Missions.

An offering of \$147.45 was received for this work.

After prayer we adjourned to the basement where the noon lunch was served.

Afternoon service began by singing and prayer. Byford Campbell brought the message.

Signed Commit. M.S.C. to approve item one. M.S.C. to approve item two.

We also recommend that the minister annual reports be sent to the Canaan District with recommendation that ministers reporting receive cards of good standing." Motion to adopt Item I was carried.

Motion was passed to give Port Tyron and Ella Mae Jones \$10<sup>00</sup> from treasury today.

Latria Shaw preached on the subject, "I Am With You Always", using Matt. 28:20 for his text.

John Hiltibidal closed the service with prayer and offered "thanks to God" for the noon meal.

In the afternoon Marie Butger led the singing, George Capps led in prayer, and Barbara Harness sang a special number. Geraldine Oathout led in prayer before Jim Beaty brought the message. He used

Rev. 2:1 - 3:22 as a basis of the "Seven Churches of Asia" message subject.

Signed, David Shores, Howard Flota, George Capps

The report was accepted and a motion was passed to write the Foreign Mission Board and ask that the above mentioned monies be returned to our quarterly and sent to the missionaries via other means.

Motion was M.S.C. to support Ella Rae Jones for one year beginning with the August quarterly.

Motion to dismiss the Friday night service in November was carried.

Albert Bays was elected moderator and Jim Beatty was elected assistant, upon proper motion.

Meeting adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

Oral reports were given on the status of Ella Mae Jones and Patsy Tyson, missionaries to Ecuador, no longer with our Foreign Mission Board, by George W. Waggoner, Howard Flota, Albert Bays, and Emanuel Hilario. The Clerk reported that there had been no written response to the request to return money sent to them.

The session was recessed and dismissed prayer was by George Capps at 10:30.

The session was re-commenced at 10:45 for business. The pulpit Committee's report was approved. Selected were Claude Hampleman to preach the next

Saturday morning service and Tom Skinner for the afternoon.

The Examining Committee reported - "We the Examining Committee recommend Larry Cook to begin his year's waiting period for the ministry." Signed Committee. The report was adopted.

At 10:55 business was again recessed and worship service began.

After singing, prayer was offered by Melvin Ophout. John Hiltibidal used Rev. 3:18 & 22 as basis for his message.

Noon meal was served at the church. The afternoon session opened with singing, followed by prayer by George W. Waggoner. Howard Flota used St. Peter 3:18 as the basis of his message on Spiritual Vitamins.

In business action, the nomination committee reported as follows: Larry Shaw for Clerk; Byford Campbell for treasurer; George Waggoner for full term on Examining Committee; John Hiltibidal for full term on Business Committee; Meredith Willard for full term on Youth Committee. As there were no nominations from the floor, all were duly elected.

The business committee asked the quarterly to decide about the Friday night session in February.

MSC to have a service using a film, Geo. W. Waggoner to secure film for the quarterly.

The Closing Resolutions Committee reported "We the Closing Resolutions Committee wish to express our thanks for the delicious dinner. We would like to give you a special 'Thank You' for the warm hospitality." Signed Committee.

MSC to approve the report and give a standing vote of thanks to the ladies of the Church.

Byford Campbell gave an oral report of the balance in the treasury.

George W. Waggoner and Jim Beaty were nominated for moderator for the February 13-14 session. George Waggoner was elected.

Jim Beaty was then elected as assistant moderator.

Motion was passed to adjourn at 1:40 p.m. Larry Cook prayed the dismissal prayer
